LAS VEGAS - Hours after the announcement of her election to the United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame, Kelly Kulick of Union, New Jersey, added another special milestone to her resume by winning the 2019 USBC Team USA Trials.

# Just Paying Attention

What an eye-opening first couple of PBA shows on the Fox family of television networks. From Marshall Kent's win in the PBA Clash, featuring play-by-play man Rob Stone joyfully uttering the now-famous call of a four-bagger, to the potentially-historic win by Bill O'Neill, but the shows may be remembered for an additional item, the Fox Sports StrikeTracker, of the Kegel Specto ball tracking system.

The sports media world has taken notice that the PBA telecasts have arrived in the 21st century. Why is bowling doing this, they ask in wonderment? Why not? It's now time the rest of the sporting world to see what the eight regular readers of this column have known for decades, there is a great deal of physics and chemistry in this game. And oh, by the way,

the PBA on Fox does what our math teachers years ago had insisted – to show your work, that's what the live Fox StrikeTracker/Specto system does.

The Sunday morning FS1 ratings of January 6 were not too bad, either, only 220,000 on the first of scheduled multiple showings, more on that in a moment. But it was the December 23 PBA Clash show that showed signs of the doors being blown off. An average of 1.7 million viewers watched any part of the 90-minute telecast. Add in the viewers of replays not only on FS1, Fox Sports on demand, and on the Fox Sports app, you can see there are more viewing options that before.

One point that caused some despair was when your local Fox affiliate aired the show, partially depending when it

carried an early or late Sunday afternoon NFL game. Unfortunately, not all markets aired the show on Fox that day, so you may have had to wait for an airing several days later on FS1.

Don't fret, that 1.7 million viewers number may rise slightly, due in part to the Plus 7 secondary rating. As I've explained a few times, if you watched it after recording it within seven days, the Plus 7 rating is fed to your television provider right from your DVR box, adding to the original viewership number.

That 1.7 million number isn't a record by any means, but it is a fantastic number in the modern era of literally hundreds of channels at your disposal, with dozens of specialty sports channels available --- as long as your AA batteries inside the remote control don't die.

It's the highest-rated PBA telecast since 2005, especially in a time when we are used to seeing an average of 900,000 viewers as a great number. Unlike other wintertime shows when the ratings spike with a Midwest/Eastern Seaboard snow storm, no massive weather system was in play this time. As the Association found out airing next to an NBA on ESPN Christmas Day telecast a few years ago, the viewership before or after a highly-rated sporting event is a nice boost, thus the choice of a time slot before NFL playoff football.

International Bowling Museum and Hall of Fame Curator Jessica Bell took a few moments out of her hectic schedule to update us on what's coming up, as well as special exhibits at tournament locations. At this year's USBC Women's Championships in Reno, items from Diandra Asbaty's career will be featured at the display at The National Bowling Stadium. She was not yet at liberty to discuss other upcoming displays.

Bell has set up other exhibits at various USBC tournament sites in recent years, ranging from the Open Championship,

Women's Championship, and Junior Gold sites, and, of course, in The Museum on the Bowling Campus itself.

Bell also mentioned an infrequent, yet wonderful career experience. In the museum curator field, receiving instant feedback about a brand-new exhibit about a person who happens to be standing next to you is rare, providing a humbling thrill at the same time. The Hall hosted its first PBA Hall of Fame induction ceremony at part of the PBA Hall of Fame Classic.

The Hall's latest display honors each the in-going four





welcomed 34 men's teams and 16 women's teams, with the William Paterson men and Pikeville women walking away with the titles.

The William Paterson men found themselves just one pin out of first place after five traditional games and shined during Baker competition, averaging more than 209 to roll to the win with a 9,331 pinfall total. Wisconsin-Whitewater was second with 9,125, and Robert Morris-Illinois took third with 9,061.

William Paterson's Hunter Machin and Wisconsin-Whitewater's Josh Pate tied for the top individual honors as each finished their five-game block with a 1,145 total. William Paterson's Andrew Dekowski was third with 1,108, and Florida State's Robert Poole (1,088) and Robert Morris-Illinois' Daniel Hanson (1,081) rounded out the top five.

On the women's side, Pikeville held a slight advantage heading into the second day of competition and continued strong in the Baker portion of the event, claiming the top

spot with a 9,070 pinfall total. Wright State was second with 8,998, and Robert Morris-Illinois was third with 8,490.

There also was a tie at the top of the women's individual standings at the Lehigh Valley Classic as Pikeville's Lauren Piotrowski and Schenectady CCC's Melanie Lemke both finished with a 1,120 total. Wright State's Tori Pappas finished third with 1,116, while Campbellsville's Candace Gibson (1,114) and Pikeville's Mallory Liversedge (1,110) also recorded top-five finishes.


The Robert Morris-Illinois women and men swept the top spots at the Keystone Quaker Classic, pacing the field of 15 women's teams and 36 men's teams.



the top qualifier spot.

The Baker format requires each player to alternate frames in a game combining for one score.

Miller's best previous best tour finish was fifth in the 2015 Xtra Frame Iowa Midwest Open and Sherman's previous best was ninth in the 2017 U.S. Open.

"Our game plan was to stay slow in all parts of the game," said the 28-year-old Miller. "Our experience throughout the whole tournament was if we got too fast in our approach, or with our ball speed, we would leave a lot 10 pins. So, staying was the key for us."

Both players star in a popular YouTube channel called Brad & Kyle, with more than 10,000 subscribers, that chronicles their exploits on and off the bowling circuit.

"We'll have a lot of good content for that now," Miller said. "We're both a little bit in dreamland at the moment, so we want to just soak it all in and enjoy the experience of making our first TV show."

Another feature on the channel is the 24-year-old Sherman's recovery after hip surgery for a torn labrum in August. The PBA Oklahoma Open and Roth-Holman Doubles Championship are his

first tournaments back since then.

Also trying for their first PBA Tour titles will be No. 2 qualifiers Sam Cooley of Australia and Anthony Lavery-Spahr of Pasadena, Texas, and No. 3 qualifiers Canadians Patrick Girard and two-hander Zacharay Wilkins.

claim his second career win at the event.

Breanna Clemmer of Clover, South Carolina, and Wesley Low Jr. of Palmdale, California,

the runners up in the overall standings at the USBC Team USA Trials, each earned some redemption Monday night by taking the titles at this year's United States National Amateur Bowling Championships. Kulick finished the Team USA Trials on Monday with 49

ranking points, accumulated over five rounds, to secure a spot on Team USA for the 15th time. She also became the oldest woman to win the tournament, topping the mark set by last year's champion, Shannon O'Keefe of Shiloh, Illinois, who was 38.

Janawicz, the 2010 USBC Team USA Trials champion, became the second two-time winner on the men's side and the event's oldest winner at 46. He finished with 61 ranking points and will make his ninth appearance on Team USA.

Chris Barnes, who also will be inducted into the USBC Hall of Fame in 2019, won the 2014 Team USA Trials at age 43. The event first was held in 2008.

The players in the field earned points based on their finishing positions in each qualifying round. The top bowler of the block earned one ranking point, second place earned two points, etc., with the lowest total of ranking points after the five six-game blocks determining the 2019 Team USA Trials champions.

Clemmer finished the week with 57 ranking points, and Low collected 92.

Each round of the event was contested on a different oil pattern, varying in length from 36-45 feet.

Along with their automatic spots on Team USA, Kulick and Janawicz earned the chance to represent the United States at the QubicaAMF Bowling World Cup. The location of the 2019 QubicaAMF World Cup has not

yet been announced.

Janawicz made the first of his eight previous appearances on Team USA in 2007, and he was able to use decades of competitive and lane-play experience to handle the week's challenging lane conditions.

After the final qualifying round at the Team Trials, the top three amateur men and top three amateur women advanced to a stepladder to determine the U.S. Amateur champions. The U.S. Amateur champions also were guaranteed spots on Team USA.

That gave Clemmer and Low a second chance at leaving Las Vegas with a coveted trophy and title, and both were able to capitalize on the opportunity, earning their first berths on Team USA.

Clemmer, a 21-year-old right-hander, eased past 16-year-old Mabel Cummins of Elburn, Illinois, 217-181. Clemmer followed a second frame split with six consecutive strikes and was able to pull away for good.

The two were Junior Team USA teammates in 2018 and helped win the team gold medal for the United States at the 2018 World Bowling Youth Championships.

Low, a 21-year-old two-hander who attacks the lane from the left-side, got his redemption with a 216-198 win against Janawicz in the men's final.

Needing a mark in his final frame, Low nearly left a 9 pin on his first offering, but it

slowly and dramatically tipped forward to lock up the title. Low earned five world championships in five years on Junior Team USA.

The victory came just a few months before he's scheduled to graduate from Wichita State University and may have been his last opportunity at the U.S. Amateur title, depending on whether he decides to join the Professional Bowlers Association in 2019 or 2020.

In the opening matches of the stepladder finals, Low defeated fellow two-time Junior Gold Championships winner Solomon Salama of Beverly Hills, California, 204-173, while Cummins downed 2017 U.S. Amateur champion Julia Bond of Aurora, Illinois, 252-198.

By virtue of their top-four finishes in the overall Team USA Trials rankings, Low and Salama (116) also earned automatic spots on Team USA. They finished second and fourth, respectively. Nick Pate of Inver Grove Heights, Minnesota, a 2017 Team USA member, finished third with 101 points, guaranteeing his return to the team.

Additional automatic spots on the women's side went to Clemmer, Bond (73 points) and 2018 Team USA member Sydney Brummett of Wichita, Kansas (78 points).

## IT'S EARLY, BUT BILL O'NEILL TAKES PBA PLAYOFFS POINTS LEAD

It's a small sample and there's a long way to go, but after the opening event of the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour season, PBA Hall of Fame Classic winner Bill O'Neill of Langhorne, Pa., is the leader in the race to the inaugural PBA Playoffs.

Why bring it up when there are still 12 events to be held between now and the USBC Masters – the final PBA Playoffs qualifying event that will conclude on April 1 in Las Vegas.

A new PBA Playoffs link is under construction and will have a prominent presence on the pba.com home page.

After the PBA Hall of Fame Classic, O'Neill took the lead with 2,500 points for winning the event, which was ranked as a Tier 3 event in the PBA's three-tier rating system because it was both a limited field and an abbreviated format tournament. Butturff joined Hall of Famers Earl Anthony, Johnny Petraglia and Walter Ray Williams Jr. as the only players to earn a top seed for the stepladder finals in three consecutive PBA Tour telecasts. Had he lost, he would have become the first player to lose three consecutive tournaments from the top qualifier position.

"I knew I would break through with a win sooner or later because I've had experience winning out here (on tour)," Butturff said. "I feel like I'm in good company when you think of the greats in the game who were in a similar position that have had their share of second-place finishes.

"I will say that I think after all I've been through recently, this is probably my most satisfying win so far," he added.

Svensson, who qualified third for the finals and was trying for his eighth tour title, advanced to the championship

match by beating No. 2 qualifier Patrick Girard of Canada, 239-218, in the semifinal. Girard was trying for his first PBA Tour title and to become only the third Canadian to win on tour.

In the opening stepladder match, No. 4 qualifier, seven-time tour winner Dom Barrett of England beat No. 5 qualifier, two-time Tour winner Tom Daugherty of Riverview, Fla., 245-162, to advance to the second match against Svensson. Svensson then beat Barrett in the second match, 267-231, to advance to the semifinal.

The next stop for the PBA Tour will be the PBA Lubbock Sports Open Jan. 22-27 at South Plains Lanes. The finals will be televised live by FS1 at 3 p.m. ET on Sunday, Jan. 27.
