A pair of Southwest Intercollegiate Bowling Conference (SWIBC) events took place in northern Texas last weekend, highlighted by Spring Hill sweeping the men's titles.

The SWIBC V was held at Spare Time Lanes in Arlington, Texas, on Saturday, while SWIBC VI was at Plano Super Bowl in Plano, Texas, on Sunday.

Each event consisted of five traditional games and 16 Baker games with total pinfall determining the winner in each division.

The Spring Hill men cruised to victory at SWIBC V, leading the field by nearly 800 pins with a 9,007 total. West Texas A&M finished second with 8,222, and Central Oklahoma was third with 8,114.

Spring Hill's Ryan Hauck led the way, averaging 251.6 on his way to a 1,258 five-game total to earn the top individual spot. Hauck's teammate Charles Noble was second with 1,228, and Texas A&M's Matthew Odom finished third with 1,163.

The Spring Hill women distanced themselves from

West Texas A&M during the back half of Baker competition Saturday to win with a 7,625 pinfall total. West Texas A&M finished at 7,520, and Central Oklahoma was third with 7,199.

Central Oklahoma's Megan Rue led the women's individual standings with a 1,027 total, a 205.4 average. Spring Hill teammates Miranda Singer (1,019) and Jess Temple (1,017) just missed the top spot.

SWIBC VI saw the Spring Hill men rally in the final four Baker games, averaging more than 232 down the homestretch, to complete the weekend sweep with a 7,811 total. Central Oklahoma finished second with 7,656 and New Mexico took third place with 7,402.

Spring Hill's Hauck added another win to his collection, edging out the competition with a 1,049 five-game total. West Texas A&M's Tyler Albracht was second with 1,039, and Texas Tech's Bradley Edwards finished third with 1,034.

The West Texas A&M women made up the necessary

ground in Baker competition to sneak past Spring Hill for the win at SWIBC VI, finishing with a 7,119 total. Spring Hill finished with 7,096, and Central Oklahoma took third with 6,589.

Spring Hill's Singer narrowly escaped with the women's individual title, holding off teammate Rebekah Cowan by a single pin, 935-934. Central Oklahoma's Rue added another top-three finish as she took third with 922.

In other USBC Collegiate action over the weekend:


- At the Mid-Winter Invitational in Jonesboro, Arkansas, the Nebraska women defeated McKendree in the title match, 4-2.

- At the Frederick E. Underwood Lady Bulldog Classic in Laurel, Maryland, the Morgan State women captured the top spot by defeating Howard in the championship round, 4-2.

- At the Devil's Duel Invitational in Scottsdale, Arizona, the Arizona State men got out to a strong start on their way to the win.

Splitsville Will Bring Bowling Back to Long-Ago PWBA Site

The tournament ended a seven-year victory drought for Betty Morris and, if you check the upper right-hand corner of the screen following a few of the shots, you'll see a gum-chewing, mustachioed, much slimmer bowling writer now found in the back of Bowlers Journal International and the front of Bowling Center Management.

Industry veterans may recognize some other familiar faces in the audience, including Brunswick executives John Mihalovich and Hal Dunbar,

long-time ABC field representative Butch Wittman, and bowling writers Joe Lyou, R.F. Corderman and Frank Kietz.

Because I was there, I can tell you that the tournament was conducted not in Los Angeles, but rather at Brunswick WonderBowl in Anaheim, Calif. WonderBowl sat in the shadows of Disneyland, and closed when Disney purchased the property in preparation for its massive expansion that included the addition of a second theme park.

Now, bowling is returning to that property, as plans call for Splitsville Luxury Lanes to take over space formerly occupied by the House of Blues in the Downtown Disney entertainment district.

According to the Disney Food Blog, the venue will feature bowling, dining and live entertainment in one gigantic setting, similar to the Splitsville Luxury Lanes

PBA Spare Shots

JESPER SVENSSON NAMED SWEDEN'S "ROOKIE SPORTSMAN OF THE YEAR"

A year after earning PBA Rookie of the Year honors, Sweden's Jesper Svensson received one of his home country's most prestigious awards when he was recognized as Sweden's Rookie Sportsman of the Year at the annual Swedish Sports Gala.

Sharing the stage with Olympic gold medal winners from other sports, the 21-year-old two-handed player took center stage during a live nationally-televised black-tie gala to accept the award in front of millions of television viewers. After winning three of his five career PBA titles in 2016, including the 51st PBA FireLake Tournament of Champions, Svensson was chosen

by a jury from the Swedish newspaper Svenska Dagbladet over football (soccer) player Victor Nilsson Lindelöf, world champion Thai-boxer Patricia Axling and talented skier Ebba Andersson.

The award is presented to a young and upcoming athlete. According to Swedish Bowling Federation reporter Markus Hegnelius, it marked the first time a bowler has received an award at the biggest stage of Swedish sports, bringing tenpin bowling onto the front pages of the newspapers.

FORMER PBA PLAYER OF THE YEAR DAVID OZIO ELECTED TO USBC HALL OF FAME

Eleven-time PBA Tour champion and 1991 PBA Player of the Year David Ozio of Beaumont, Texas, has been elected to the United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame in the Superior Performance category. He will be inducted, along with one-time PBA Tour titlist Mike Shady of Fairview, Pa., during

Just Paying Attention

A month after announcing an agreement with World Bowling, The Olympic Channel aired its first bowling program last week, the 2016 World Bowling Singles Championships from Dubai. World Bowling reached an agreement with channel organizers in December to provide content, joining thirty-six other international sports federations in a 24/7 channel. The channel is currently available through a personal electronics app.

NBCUniversal, who plans to start an American version of the channel sometime later this year, has the television contract for Olympic coverage through 2032. They also secured programming from a prior channel, Universal Sports, which they owned a portion until it went off the air in 2015.

In a related story, a previous program supplier gets to show off its goods on SiriusXM satellite radio, also starting last week. Joining ESPN Radio, NBC Sports Radio, and Mad Dog Radio, plus major sports league owned networks, is Fox Sports Radio. Yes, they were on SiriusXM before until 2013, but now will combine content with sister network FS1. As of last Friday January 20, its first day, Fox Sports Radio will oc-

cupy channel 83 on the Sirius lineup.

If you haven't noticed, SiriusXM Radio is still quite the draw, or listen, as the case may be. A current media and advertising theory, and quite the proven one over the years, is to use cross-branding to maximize exposure of your product. That involves getting the name of your league, network, or service out to as many people as possible, using different forms of media.

And just so you know, nothing is yet confirmed, but there may be an item using that same statement over the coming months. Stay tuned.

As you'll see elsewhere in this week's issue, Jesper Svensson was chosen at the annual Swedish Sports Awards as its 2016 Rookie of the Year by a panel assembled by the prestigious Stockholm-based newspaper, Svenska Dagbladet. Keep in mind, these nationally-televised awards are usually dominated by Olympic medalists, especially those in downhill ski racing and biathlon.

After reading a Facebook post by long time Swedish national team member and fellow Motiv and Turbo staffer Nina Flack, its impact on her

and the Swedish bowling community was overwhelming. As you might expect, the response was quite emotional and extremely gratifying. I asked her to explain the impact of a bowler winning this award really was.

"It is incredible what Jesper achieved this Monday night. He was named 'Rookie of the Year' beating out (others in) sports like football, skiing and Thai boxing. It has been some busy days for Jesper and he has got a lot of attention after this - it's so much fun! This is big, not just for him, but for our sport in Sweden, Europe and the world!" Flack said.

Many Swedes feel this was the breaking of a barrier. There isn't a rookie of the year winner in the annual Associated Press male and female athletes of the year, or in the annual ESPN ESPY Awards, but this would be in that level of award. From a country that has produced game-changing athletes of their time, like what Bjorn Borg did for tennis and Annika Sorenstam did for golf, for example, this could also be game-changing for bowling in and out of Sweden.

In preparation for a certain event coming to town Sunday February 5, what some refer to as a modern national holiday, I'll have an item or two in the next couple of JPA's surrounding the 51st version of the Sunday holiday.

Had another visit from retired ABC and Houston television sportscaster Dan Lovett to the pro shop the other day. Of course, that meant another list of humorous stories, one of which I can report here.

Lovett is one of three local reporters still living around Houston today who covered the first Super Bowl in town, the Super Bowl VIII win by the Miami Dolphins over the Minnesota Vikings 24-7 at Rice Stadium in January 1974. Lovett covered the game for Houston ABC-TV affiliate KTRK.

In a story he tells long time KPRC-TV Channel 2 news anchor Bill Balleza airing this week, Lovett recalled a tale from his memoirs, 'Anyone Seen Dan Lovett? Memoirs of a Media Nomad' about a Viking cheerleading squad he claims to have organized for the game. For its home games at old Met Stadium, the Vikings asked the varsity cheerleading squad of nearby St. Louis Park High School to cheer. Trust me, this Super Bowl squad were not current high school students. I'm not going to spoil the story, but I'll say it could have easily fit into the first version of the movie, 'Anchorman.' Easily fit.

Lovett will also be attending this year's game as a fan, in addition to the seventeen others he covered as a local or network reporter. With his help before attending this year's game, there may be a pleasant surprise in store for bowling viewers earlier that day. If we can pull this off, I'll have full details in the February 16 JPA. Once again, stay tuned.

Sad to report the first bowling-related passing in JPA this year. Known to many Twin Cities bowlers in the 1970's and 80's, former 'Bowling for Dollars' and 'Bowlerama' host Johnny Canton has died at the age of 75. Best known for his very smooth voice as midday host on several Twin Cities radio stations over the years, Canton was also the face and voice of the Twin Cities area bowling commercials. He was the first disc jockey in the country to play John Denver's 'Take Me Home Country Roads', and also played a ticket agent in the movie, 'Airport.' Canton is a 2006 inductee of the Minnesota Broadcasting



Hall of Fame.

I had the fortune and pleasure of working with Canton for a local cable telecast of a PBA Midwest Regional finals at Cedarvale Lanes in suburban Eagan in 1995. He was as professional and kind to me as anyone I've worked alongside, being the same person whether the little red light on top the camera was lit or not. At his suggestion, we traded play-by-play and color analyst roles during each of the four matches. It's a tape I never acquired, so I didn't see or hear how well things looked or sounded.

The biggest chuckle he gave me (it was probably a test he gave other broadcasters, too) was to be sure I knew the pronunciation of his hometown outside Kansas City. He smiled

when I spit out 'o-LAY-thee' for his town of Olathe, southwest of Kansas City, Kansas.

As a tribute, here's this week's JPA Lost Classic, a 30-second commercial with his face and voice, tagging the end of what is most definitely a 1980's BPAA commercial promoting open bowling. 





Ozio, 62, was a 1995 inductee into the PBA Hall of Fame. Among his titles was the 1991 Firestone PBA Tournament of Champions. Throughout his career, Ozio was considered the prototype stylist based on his technically-flawless delivery. He also had a brief but successful career on the PBA50 Tour, winning two titles including the 2004 Senior U.S. Open and PBA50 Rookie of the Year honors that same year. In 2009, Ozio was recognized as the 34th best player on the list of the 50 greatest players in PBA history.

"When you spend your whole life practicing, bowling 200 games a week and living in bowling centers, recognition

like this means a lot," Ozio said. "After all these years, I wondered if it was going to happen, and if it did, it would be great. It was a welcomed phone call and a sigh of relief."




