He then won 7 out of 8 of his matches including a 300 game in the final match to go

around Jim Stephens to win his 34th SASBA title.

Jim finished second, Kenny Tynan took third, Mike Warren fourth and Mark Williams finished fifth.

In the (70 and over) group, Roger West had a 60 pin lead over Phil Bailey going into the final match.

Phil beat him 258-229 plus 30 bonus pins, so Roger held on to win by 1 pin.

LUBBOCK, TX - Taking advantage of a missed 10 pin in the 10th frame by top qualifier Sean Rash in the title match, Dick Allen won the PBA Lubbock Sports Open Sunday for his sixth career Go Bowling! PBA Tour title.

Bowling on a dual lane condition - the PBA 42-foot Scorpion condition on the left lane and the 32-foot Wolf lane condition on the right

lane - the 40-year-old Allen, who qualified second for the finals, defeated Rash 201-200 in the title match at South Plains Lanes.

Down by 18 heading into the 10th frame, Allen doubled on his first two shots in the 10th and then got eight on his fill ball after Rash's misfortune which was just enough for the victory. Allen benefited from a late falling 2 pin on a light hit

ARLINGTON, TX - ARLINGTON, Texas - Competitors once again will earn direct entry into the 2019 U.S. Open and 2019 U.S. Women's Open fields based on last season's professional tour money lists and finishes at national events, and through expanded regional qualifying tournaments and

an on-site pre-tournament qualifier.

Limited fields were introduced in 2017 for U.S. Open and in 2018 for the U.S. Women's Open. Both events are a collaborative effort of the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America (BPAA) and the United States Bowling Congress

Grants Awarded to Four High Schools Through YES Fund Program

ARLINGTON, Texas – Four high school bowling programs have been selected to receive a \$2,500 grant through the Youth Education Services (YES) Fund. The High School Grant Program, administered by International Bowling Campus Youth Development, annually provides up to four grants to high schools requiring funds to start a new bowling program or to assist existing programs that show financial need because of budget cuts or other changes.

The four schools selected to receive grants are:

- Adams Central High School, Monroe, Indiana
- Pulaski High School, Milwaukee
- Washington High School, Washington, Indiana
- Whitehall High School, Whitehall, Michigan

The Adams Central High School bowling program is in its second season of competition in the 10-team Hoosier Conference and does not receive funding from the school. Two parents and a teacher volunteer

their time and the program was financially supported by local businesses its first season.

Team members use donated bowling balls and equipment and, of the 10 members on the team this season, only one has previously participated in league/competitive bowling. Coach Erin Everett plans to continue to seek support through sponsorships and fundraisers and the grant will allow the team to purchase equipment that is in better condition. It also will help to keep costs lower, so the team can be open to anyone who wants to compete.

The bowling program at Pulaski High School, the only bowling team in Milwaukee Public Schools, started in 2001 and competes in the winter season of the Wisconsin High School Bowling Club. Increases in league fees along with cuts to the school budget have created a funding challenge for the co-ed team that recently has had anywhere from seven to 15 students in the program.

Coach Ashley Newman



International Bowling Campus Youth Development

said most of the bowlers are new to the sport and said she appreciates the opportunity to help students build a love for bowling. The grant will help pay for tournaments, lineage for practice and administrative fees. Students will continue to fundraise throughout the season.

Washington High School's bowling program is a club sport and also does not receive any funding. As a student at the high school until 2009, coach Brandon Fitzpatrick started bowling because of the program and said he understands how bowling benefits students.

The team's home center, King Pin Bowling Center, supports the team by allowing fundraisers and reduced lineage. But the program, which does not charge players any fees to compete, struggles to raise funds each season and Fitzpatrick has absorbed some costs. He said the grant will





The Webber International women and men cruised to wins last weekend at the Peach State Classic in Athens, Georgia.

The event took place at Showtime Bowl and welcomed eight varsity women's teams and 10 varsity men's teams. Competitors bowled six traditional games and 16 Baker games, with total pinfall determining the winner in each division.

In the women's division, Webber bounced back after a slow start, rolling 1,080 in its second game Saturday and never looked back, recording the victory by more than 430 pins with an 8,652 total. Florida State was second with 8,220, and Emmanuel took third with 7,948.

The top four spots in the individual standings also went to Webber as Lauren Snipes led the field with a 1,179 score. Snipes was followed by fellow Warriors Sanna Tetri (1,168), Taishaye Naranjo (1,155) and Jessica Larsson (1,148), while Florida State's Rachel DeVillier was fifth with 1,135.

The Webber men put together a wire-to-wire win, claiming the top spot by more than 730 pins with a 9,435 total. Emmanuel was second with 8,698, and Florida State was third with 8,316.

Student-athletes from Webber also posted the top three individual scores at Showtime Bowl. Matt Russo won his third consecutive individual title, posting a 1,430 total, and

he was joined in the top three by Stephen Delong (1,399) and Adam Glickman (1,273). Emmanuel's Joshua Doneghy (1,265) and David Hooper Jr. (1,221) rounded out the top five.



Twins x 3 – How three sets of Texas twins (Pete and Paul McCordic, Mike and Mark Scroggins, Anthony and Sean Lavery-Spahr) put their stamp on the game.

20 x 3 – Story behind Jakob Butturff's unprecedented run to his first 20 (there will be many, many more) PBA regional titles one week shy of a three-year span, taking only 59 tournaments.

Well, he did it. Wasn't sure if there was another regional before the date of his first win on January 31, 2016, but there was on the off week before the national tour stop in Lubbock. So yes, Jakob Butturff has won 20 PBA Regionals within a three-year window, as I alluded to in the "What If" item.

The lefty with the most unique release this side of the internet era has done something no one had done before or that any of us will be alive long enough to see again. As back in the October 11, 2018 JPA after Butturff won his 19th regional, I first explained he took three years to win forty percent of regular regionals as the all-time

leaders.

The year-by-year totals are mind-boggling enough. Nine wins in 2016, four in 2017, six in 2018, and one in 2019, thus far. Yep, that's twenty, good for about 40th all-time. Thirty wins is good for 15th place all-time. The top five players on the list have at least forty wins. As Bill Vint explained in last week's PBA Spare Shots, it took only 59 tournaments. That may be the most stunning statistic of all, especially to those of us who have won a PBA regional tournament.

Butturff is only 24 years of age. Hope you were sitting down when you read that.

Speaking of sitting down, no, it was not a mirage or time travel experiment you were part of on Sunday's PBA telecast on FS1. Yes, it was Dave Lamont who pinch hit for Fox lead bowling announcer Rob Stone with analyst Randy Pedersen and sideline reporter Kimberly Pressler.

Lamont told me in a message last week he wasn't going to use the phrase – announcer's code (trust me, there is one). And you thought just baseball had an unwritten code.

Finally this week, an item brought to my attention (there's that word again) I just couldn't

save until next week.

If I did a Texas-based Top 25 TV Bowling Moments list, this show would be in the top ten. Three of the five finalists are Texans, a fourth has worked in DFW for some time. The Texan who won this tournament won in back-to-back weeks, kicking off a time when he became a regular on PBA telecasts over the next six years.

This week's JPA Lost Classic is Del Ballard Jr.'s win thirty years ago this week at Forum Bowl in the 1989 PBA Quaker State Open. The other Texans were David Ozio, Pete McCordic, and more recently, Steve Wunderlich. The fifth bowler was another regular TV finalist of the time, Don Genalo.

This was Del's fourth career title, having defeated Bob Benoit for the Showboat Invitational the week before, who had won the PBA Quaker State Open the year before with his dramatic TV 300 game. Of his six television finals in 1989, he won three times, culminating three months later with a Firestone Tournament of Champions triumph, his third major win to go with the '87 U.S. Open and '88 ABC Masters.



DAVE LAMONT TO FILL IN AS FOX SPORTS ANNOUNCER FOR LUBBOCK SPORTS OPEN

Veteran PBA announcer Dave LaMont will fill in as the lead announcer for the Lubbock Sports Open live on FS1 on Sunday, Jan. 27, at 3 p.m. EST, replacing Rob Stone, who has previous commitments with FOX and won't be available for Sunday's PBA telecast.

TRUE OR FALSE: BO BURTON MAY HAVE CONTRIBUTED TO WEBER'S TROPHY CRASH

Bowling fans who watched the televised finals of the 1991 U.S. Open from Woodland Bowl in Indianapolis will never forget the trophy presentation when winner Pete Weber hoisted the majestic ceramic

eagle trophy, gave it a shake and saw it crash and shatter into a thousand pieces on the approach.

How that actually happened came to light during the 2019 PBA Hall of Fame ceremonies in Arlington, Texas, when PBA HOF legend Nelson (Bo) Burton Jr. told the crowd he may have contributed to the trophy incident. According to Bo, when he saw the trophy sitting off to the side before the ABC-TV telecast, he decided to show the eagle to the crowd, so he unscrewed the nut that held the eagle to the base...and forgot to re-attach the nut when he replaced the eagle on the base. So, bottom line, one of PBA's historic moments was actually his fault.

Was the story true or a fable invented by Burton? When asked to confirm the story, he laughed and said, "You decide. It remains a mystery. What I actually did was mention to Chris Schenkel that it was a

really pretty trophy, so I picked it up and staged it for a camera shot," Burton said. "Whether or not I loosened the eagle, who knows? I honestly don't know what happened...but it's a good story."

PBA REGIONAL UPDATE: BUTTURFF JOINS ELITE GROUP WITH 20TH REGIONAL TITLE

Jakob Butturff of Tempe, Ariz., overcame a tightly bunched leaderboard in the final position round match to win his 20th PBA Regional title Sunday in the PBA Lubbock Sports Southwest Open at South Plains Lanes, reaching the 20-title milestone in only 59 tournaments.

At age 24, Butturff is believed to be the youngest player to reach that title milestone. He is the 38th player in PBA history to win 20 regional titles.

Butturff, undoubtedly the hottest player in the PBA, held a 38-pin lead over Sam Cooley of Australia going into

the 21st and final game of the tournament while snapping at their heels were former PBA Player of the Year Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill., and Tom Daugherty from Riverview, Fla. Only 66 pins separated the top four players. In the final game, Butturff suffered a first-frame open, but rebounded with a plethora of strikes to win his match against Cooley, 248-202. He earned an additional 30 bonus pins for winning the match and won the tournament going away by completing an unbeaten 8-0 round of match play.

The tournament was a prelude event to the Go Bowling! PBA Tour's Lubbock Sports Open that begins Wednesday in Lubbock, Texas.

Rash defeated Daugherty, 222-210, to jump to second place as Cooley claimed third while Daugherty maintained fourth place. Butturff earned \$4,000 for the victory, Rash collected \$2,400, as Cooley added \$1,600, while Daugherty settled for \$1,200.

The PBA Tour's Lubbock Sports Open follows at South Plains with the finals to be televised live on Fox Sports' FS1 channel on Sunday at 2 p.m. Central.

Brian Kretzer of Dayton, Ohio and partner Ronnie Russell of Marion, Ind., defeated Eugene McCune of Munster, Ind. and non-PBA member

Ryan Burks of Valparaiso, Ind., 2-0, in a best-of-three-game title match to win the PBA/PBA50 Don Vay Memorial Central Doubles Classic title at Legend Lanes in Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio, Sunday.

Teams in the PBA Central Region's first tournament of 2019 included one bowler age 50 or older, and one bowler under the age of 50. The title was the Kretzer's 25th and Russell's ninth. They also split a \$4,000 first prize.

Kretzer and Russell blanked Larry Verble of Mason, Mich., and T.J. Schmidt of Mishawaka, Ind., 2-0, while McCune and Burks topped Doug Kent of Newark, N.Y. and Tim Pfeifer of Oakdale, Pa., 2-1, in the best-of-three semifinal round to set up the championship match.

The only regional event on tap for the Jan. 26-27 weekend is the PBA Japan Region's Roto Grip Cup and Shark Open at PBA Fuji Bowl in Iruma, Japan.




