

Mookie Betts, Tommy Jones Win CP3 PBA Celebrity Invitational

CONROE, Texas – Boston Red Sox star Mookie Betts was still in the midst of celebrating a stunning baseball season in which he won almost every key award possible, including

helping his team to a World Series victory. But stuck in the back of his mind was the fact that in two previous appearances, he and his Professional Bowlers Association partners had finished second in NBA star Chris Paul's annual CP3 PBA Celebrity Invitationals.

Betts was determined to end that streak, and in the 10th anniversary CP3 benefit bowling event that aired on FOX on Sunday just ahead of

the Super Bowl, Betts found his stroke just in time as he and 18-time PBA Tour titlist Tommy Jones rolled to a convincing 101-86 victory over 2017 CP3 champions Pete Weber and Pro Football Hall of Famer Terrell Owens in the modified five-frame title match at Bowlero at the Woodlands.

"I finally got one," Betts said after hoisting his Heisman-style trophy. "Now I'm going to enjoy it and get ready for baseball."

The doubles competition involved a modified five-frame format in which the PBA partner bowled the sixth, eighth and 10th frames while the celebrity bowled the seventh and ninth frames.

Betts, a life-long bowler who has demonstrated his skills on the lanes as a competitor in the PBA World Series of Bowling twice – including bowling a 300 game in the 2017 WSOB – made a key speed adjustment in his delivery just in time to give Jones the help he needed. The 2018 American League MVP, batting champion, defensive

Hulsenberg, Macpherson, Conners Elected to PWBA Hall of Fame

ARLINGTON, Texas – Leanne Hulsenberg, Wendy Macpherson and Donna Conners will comprise the first class of the Professional Women's Bowling Association (PWBA) Hall of Fame in 16 years, following their election by the PWBA Hall of Fame committee.

Hulsenberg and Macpherson were elected in the Performance category, while Conners will go into the Meritorious Service/Builder category.

The 2019 PWBA Hall of

Fame induction ceremony will take place May 15 in Wichita, Kansas, in conjunction with the 2019 United States Bowling Congress (USBC) Queens, a major event on the PWBA Tour. Details on the ceremony will be announced later.

Hulsenberg, 51, captured 26 PWBA titles from 1987 through 2002, including the 1999 USBC Queens, and won her second major title at the 2011 U.S. Women's Open. She is third on the PWBA all-time titles list behind Lisa Wagner (32) and Aleta Sill (31), is one of just

Much love to Sean Lavery-Spahr and Billy Rogers, but this month we will move them to the back page, AKA the trash pile.

Welcome to the show Mr. Cruz.

Anthony and his partner, Sam Cooley finished 3rd in the PBA Doubles event in Shawnee, which also marked his first national televised PBA show, a remarkable accomplishment he has anxiously been waiting for.

Personally I was really excited to see Anthony bowl on TV because he deserves it and he earned it. Going into the last game of match-play the duo were pretty much locked into the top five, but only 20 pins separated them and the other 3 teams, so they did go out and handle business and stay in second. Seems easy right, well maybe for those that have a bunch of shows on their resume, but for ALS, this was his first real shot, and he and Cooley stepped right up to the challenge with a 260 game.

This certainly looks like the start of something special, as the following week in Lubbock Lavery-Spahr finished in 8th place. It appears he has figured out the finer points to push his game to the top-tier level.

"I always knew I could do it, I've made finals, made cuts,

and several top 10 finishes, so I knew I could get there, it was just a matter of consistency. I put in a lot of work this year to ensure that each week I would give myself a real chance. To see it pay off the past three events shows me I can do it every week," said Anthony.

Congrats to ALS, and keep on trucking.

Dimitri Cruz, 20, is a young, 2-handed bracket-destroying strike machine. He bowls league mainly at University Bowl in Denton which is owned by his family and his biggest fan, father, Daniel.

Cruz is most definitely a force to be reckoned with and I expect his name to be at the top of most of the events we see around here.

I would like say a BIG THANK YOU out to my two favorite teammates, Tina and Terry Taylor.

It's been said before, but we are just so very lucky to have them running tournaments in the DFW area. I bowled the NCTUSBC Mixed Doubles event last weekend, and it ran flawlessly, as usual might I add, but it's no accident.

Houston's Shawn Maldonado Leads Six Regional Champions into PBA TOC Field

FAIRLAWN, Ohio (Feb. 4, 2019) – Nine-time PBA Regional title winner Shawn Maldonado, a 32-year-old two-handed player from Houston, Texas, will lead a field of six PBA Regional champions into the PBA Tournament of Champions when qualifying in the first major championship of the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour season gets underway Wednesday at AMF Riviera Lanes.

Maldonado, who averaged 231.5 in Monday's eight-game pre-tournament qualifier, finished with 1,852 pins to easily out-distance fellow Texan Sean Lavery-Spahr of Pasadena, who had 1,726 pin. Also advancing to join the field of 60 PBA Tour titlists in the TOC proper will be Stephen Pavlinko Jr. of Sewell, N.J.; Patrick Dombrowski of Parma, Ohio; Nathan Bohr of Austin, Texas, and Darren Tang of Las Vegas.

After a practice session from 2-4 p.m. on Tuesday, qualifying in the TOC begins on Wednesday with six-game rounds at 11 a.m. and 6 p.m. ET. Qualifying continues with the third qualifying round at 11 a.m. on Thursday with a cut to the top 24 players advancing to robin match play round Thursday at 6 p.m., and Friday at 11 a.m. and 6 p.m. After 42 games, the top five players will advance to Sunday's live stepladder finals on FOX at 4:30 p.m.



PBA Tournament of Champions and Players Championship Already a Critical Stretch for Players in Young Go Bowling! PBA Tour Season

PBA Playoffs, \$1 million 300 game bonus come into focus in season's first major championships

CHICAGO (Jan. 30, 2019) – With the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour season barely a month old, players already find themselves at a critical juncture in the PBA Playoffs race with two majors back-to-back in February.

Both are Tier 1 points events under the PBA's new competition points system. The 54th PBA Tournament of Champions – PBA's signature event that requires a player to have a PBA title to compete – gets underway Feb. 4-10 at AMF Riviera Lanes in Fairlawn, Ohio. It will be followed a week later by the PBA Players Championship, Feb. 12-17, at Wayne Webb's Columbus Bowl in Columbus, Ohio.

The Tournament of Champions stepladder finals will be televised live on FOX at 4:30 p.m. ET on Sunday, Feb. 10 and the Players Championship finals will air live on FS1 on Sunday, Feb. 17 at 1 p.m. ET.

In addition to the PBA Playoffs race, the Tournament of Champions and Players Championship will be the first tournaments to feature a \$1 million bonus if a player bowls a 300 game in the title match of either stepladder final. While

there have been 26 televised 300 games in the history of the PBA Tour, only two have been accomplished in the title match and neither of those took place in a major championship.

The two other opportunities to win the \$1 million 300 game bonus will come in the title matches of the live Go Bowling! Indianapolis Open finals Sunday, Feb. 24 at 3 p.m. ET on FS1 and PBA World Championship that will air as part of the PBA World Series of Bowling X in suburban Detroit on March 21 at 8 p.m. ET.

In the upcoming majors stretch, four-time PBA Player of the Year Jason Belmonte will again try to tie, and or break, the record for most PBA major wins. The nine-time majors champion made a run at the record in 2018 by finishing fourth in the Tournament of Champions and second in the Players Championship when he lost to Tom Smallwood, 259-239, in the title match. PBA Hall of Famers Earl Anthony and Pete Weber share the record for most major titles with 10. Weber also will bowl in both events, trying to take sole possession of the record.

Tournament of Champions

defending champion Matt O'Grady of Rahway, N.J., made an incredible run to win the 2018 title, coming all the way from a pre-tournament qualifier to the stepladder finals where, as the No. 5 qualifier, he won all four stepladder matches culminating with a 207-193 title match win over Sweden's Jesper Svensson to win his first PBA Tour title.

Competition points earned in both majors will be valuable for players who are competing for 24 berths in the inaugural PBA Playoffs. Players will continue to compile points through the USBC Masters which concludes April 1. The preliminary rounds of the PBA Playoffs will be held April 7-10 at Bayside Bowl in Portland, Maine, which will air on FS1 throughout April and May with the top four players returning to Portland to compete for a \$100,000 first prize – the richest in bowling – during the live finals that will air over two days (June 1-2) on FOX. 

Jakob Butturff Continues to Shine; Canadians Impact 2018 PBA Regional Awards

CHICAGO (Feb. 1, 2019) - Jakob Butturff of Tempe, Ariz., continued to be the player to beat in the PBA Northwest Region, winning another title and finishing second in his other three Northwest Region tournaments to retain his Player of the Year title in 2018. But across the PBA's seven regions, players with Canadian roots made a major impact in 2018, claiming three regional Player of the Year honors and a Rookie of the Year award.

While the 24-year-old Butturff only bowled in four PBA Northwest tournaments in 2018, he also won PBA Regional titles in the Central, Midwest and West Regions while running his career titles total to 19 by the end of the year.

Butturff's accomplishments in 2018 were among the highlights of the PBA Regional Award winners, announced today by Director of the PBA Regional and PBA50 Tours John Weber, recognizing Players of the Year, Rookies of the Year, PBA50 Players of the Year and Pat Patterson Award winners,

for contributions to the regional program, in each of its seven domestic regions.

Award winners were selected by the PBA's regional managers: Russ Mills, East Region; Sam Zurich, South Region; Bobby Jakel, Central Region; recently-retired Rich Weber, Midwest Region; Pete McCordic, Southwest Region, and Gary Mage, West and Northwest Regions.

Here's a summary of the 2018 PBA Regional Award winners:

SOUTHWEST - Two of the PBA's Tour Canadian stars, Francois Lavoie and Mitch Hupé, won the Southwest Region's top honors. Lavoie repeated as Player of the Year after winning a pair of titles and posting two additional top-five finishes. Hupé, a Wichita State University alum like Lavoie, earned Rookie of the Year cashed in four of five events with a fifth-place finish. Beaumont, Texas proprietor and PBA Hall of Famer Mark Williams won the region's Senior Player of the Year honors along with the Southwest Pat

Patterson Award.

EAST - Darren Andretta of Wantagh, N.Y., bowled in six events, winning two titles and finishing second in a third to earn Player of the Year. Rookie of the Year is Todd Sigeti of Lititz, Pa., after a seven-for-seven record as a casher and a 13th place best finish. Rick Graham of Lancaster, Pa., won Senior Player of the Year after recording six top-five finishes in eight tries, including one title. Steve Pavlinko Sr. of Sewell, N.J., was recipient of the East Region's Pat Patterson Award.

SOUTH - PBA Tour veteran Dick Allen of Lexington, S.C., won PBA South Region Player of the Year honors for the first time since the 2004-05 season,

making match play in nine of 12 events, winning three titles and added three other top-five finishes. Former Teen Masters champion and two-time Junior Team USA member Mike Coffey of Melbourne, Fla., won Rookie of the Year honors after winning one title and recording two other top-five finishes in his first five tournaments. Veteran Stoney Baker of Canton, Ga., with three titles and six total top-five finishes in PBA50 events, was a dual honoree - winning Senior Player of the Year honors along with the South Region's Pat Patterson Award.





In this era of media near-overload, there are various video series' we've started to see in recent years. As social media took off, some teams and players produced their own videos. HBO took this concept

to the next level in their series, "Hard Knocks", as does Showtime with "Total Access", showing various sports behind-the-scenes happenings.

Up Your Average
By Susie Minshew

Bowling's Biggest Demon - Part II
Last month we talked about how efficient and freeing a tight thumbhole will make your swing. To get that snug feeling, the thumbhole needs to be drilled big enough to accommodate your thumb when it's at its biggest. Your thumb shrinks and swells with use, humidity, cold weather, what phase the moon is in - for all kinds of reasons. The thumbhole can't. Unless you're one of those rare people who never shrinks or swells, the only way to assure it

fits all the time is with the use of tape.

Feel just a feather touch on the sides of your thumb. A thumbhole that's too tight on the sides causes calluses and soreness and your thumb will begin to look like a cobra head. "Bowler's thumb" is unnecessary and can be painful. If a hole is only tight on the sides and it gets worked out all the way around, the entire hole will be too big.

If there's no friction created between the thumb and the hole, eventually any swelling

and calluses will be reduced. As your thumb size shrinks, the thumbhole will need to be redrilled to keep that snug feeling. The process may take months, so don't get discouraged. After all, your thumb didn't get that big or sore overnight!

Grip the ball with a flat thumb - no knuckle bend. You may need to build up the thumbhole more toward the bottom of the hole with tape so that the end of your thumb has something to feel. This is because that part of your thumb wants to get in on the action. It's jealous of the base of your thumb being so involved (this is the true origin of the phrase "green thumb"!).

There is a wedge type device called Thumb Straight™ the pro shop operator can install. It's easily placed in the hole and

provides a place for the end of the thumb to feel. It helps alleviate the need to bend your knuckle to provide the "feel" the thumb needs. You can also cut a piece of 3/4" tape in half (width not lengthwise) and place it on the back and

in the middle of a whole piece of 3/4" tape. The slight build up in this strategic place can help alleviate the need to squeeze. It's also a great taping technique for a person with hyperflexibility.

Idaho; Rich Foran of Billings, Montana; Bo Goergen of Sanford, Michigan; and Lowell Lovgren of Kelso, Washington.

While there are no incumbents among this year's slate, Colangelo served one term on the USBC board from 2013-2016. He currently is the IT Manager for the Boise Centre, the convention center in Boise, Idaho.

Foran is a director on the Montana State USBC board and has served as director of the senior, open and youth state tournaments. He worked for UPS and the United States Army and now is retired.

Goergen, the center manager of Northern Lanes in Sanford, has worked in the industry for the last 35 years. On the lanes, he set the USBC Open Championships record with an 862 series in singles in 2009.

Lovgren is president and youth league director for the Cowlitz USBC association and previously served on the Washington State USBC board as president and association manager. He worked as a quality control technician for Weyerhaeuser.

The board positions became open as two current board members, Frank Wilkinson and Mark Martin, have reached their term limit. Jeff Ussery, who will complete his first term in July, chose not to seek another term.

Delegates also will decide on eight proposed amendments

– three on league rules, one for a tournament rule change and four bylaw proposals. Any changes to bylaws require a two-thirds majority vote for adoption while league and tournament rules will require a majority vote to pass.

Delegates will vote on the legislative proposals and the open USBC Board positions on Thursday, May 2, during the USBC Annual Meeting.

four competitors to surpass the \$1 million mark in career PWBA earnings and made more than 100 appearances on television.

"I am so honored to be included in the return of the PWBA Hall of Fame and look forward to the ceremony in May," Hulsenberg said. "My entire life has been, and continues to be, dedicated to the great sport of bowling, and to be recognized for that is very sweet. My sincerest gratitude goes out to the people who nominated me, the PWBA and the hall of fame committee."

The 1987 PWBA Rookie of

the Year, when she won three titles, Hulsenberg became the first bowler to capture back-to-back PWBA Player of the Year honors in 1990 and 1991. She was selected to the Bowlers Journal International All-American Team 18 times in her career, including 12 selections to the first team, and was named Women's Pro Bowler of the Year three times (1990, 1991, 2002) by Bowling Digest.

She led the PWBA in season average four times and was the PWBA Robby Sportsmanship Award winner in 1990 and 1991. She was inducted into the USBC Hall of Fame in 2008.

Macpherson, 51, was an 18-year-old high school senior in 1986 when she became the youngest bowler to win the

U.S. Women's Open, the first of her 20 PWBA titles. She joined the pro tour that summer, claiming PWBA Rookie of the Year honors, and won five more major titles in her career – three USBC Queens (1998, 2000, 2003) and two Sam's Town Invitational (1990, 1999) titles.

"Being selected to the PWBA Hall of Fame is an awesome feeling," Macpherson said. "It is a feeling of being voted in, and added to, the greats of my sport. Bowling was, and still is, my life. I work every day running tournaments for High Roller Inc. and give many lessons and clinics for Storm. Every time I am involved with people in the bowling centers, they always tell me how they watched me on ESPN. I am often reminded of my career through these interactions, and I am honored to now say that I am in the PWBA Hall of Fame."

She was named PWBA Player of the Year four times over a five-year stretch from 1996-2000 and is the PWBA all-time career earnings leader with more than \$1.2 million. In 1997, she posted the highest single-season earnings mark with \$165,425. She was selected to the Bowlers Journal All-American Team 12 times and selected as the publication's Female Bowler of the Decade

“When I received the call, I couldn’t believe what I was hearing,” Conners said. “I’m so deeply honored to be a part of the PWBA Hall of Fame in what it represents in our sport. For me to be speechless is unheard of, to say the least. It absolutely means the world to me.”

A USBC Silver coach, she is co-owner of Carol Norman’s Pro Shop and has done layouts and ball drillings for numerous PWBA players. She has supported the women’s bowling program at Stephen F. Austin with bowling balls and layout advice, and supports Pat Costello’s girls high school bowling team in Oviedo, Florida.

Conners is a member of the Houston and Texas Bowling Halls of Fame and has won seven PWBA Regional titles.

The 2019 PWBA Hall of Fame class was selected by the PWBA Hall of Fame committee based on applications received. The committee is comprised of three PWBA Hall of Fame members, three Bowling Proprietors’ Association of America (BPAA) board members, three USBC board members, and three media members.

The committee also voted to count major titles earned in the USBC Queens and at the U.S. Women’s Open during the PWBA’s hiatus from 2004-2014 as PWBA Tour titles.

Nominees in the Performance category had to be at least 50 years of age and needed a minimum of 10 PWBA Tour titles or a minimum of five PWBA Tour titles including

PBA LEGEND CARMEN SALVINO TO COMPETE IN TOC AT AGE 85

There seems to be no stopping PBA legend Carmen Salvino.

The 85-year old PBA Hall of Famer will compete in his 29th PBA Tournament of Champions, extending his record as the oldest player to compete in a Go Bowling! PBA Tour event.

PBA’s most famous showman is one of the few remaining links to the storied tournament’s origin dating back to the inaugural event in 1962.

“I’m in shape and ready to go,” said the 17-time tour winner. “I’m working out and doing a lot of bowling to get ready. My weight hasn’t changed in 63 years. I’m 195 (pounds) and haven’t fluctuated five pounds either side of that.”

Salvino began planning to bowl in the 2019 TOC after competing in last season’s PBA 60th Anniversary Classic in Indianapolis.

“People have no idea of how it feels to go into the locker room of one of the great tournaments and see all the guys,” Salvino said. “For me, it goes beyond bowling—just to be there with those guys is a thrill.”

The 1962 TOC was held at Play Bowl in Indianapolis and was actually billed as the Indianapolis 500 Festival Tournament of Champions according to the Indianapolis Star’s coverage of the tournament. It’s an often-overlooked event because the tournament would not be held again for three years. In 1965, Firestone began

its landmark sponsorship, the classic moved to Bowlarama in Akron, Ohio and then to AMF Riviera Lanes the following year where it remained for 29 years.

The first TOC was a two-day event featuring 25 PBA Tour champions – everyone who had won a title since the PBA’s formation four years earlier. It was conducted immediately after the Indianapolis PBA Open, the final regular event of the Tour season, which also was held at Play Bowl. Salvino finished third in the inaugural tournament (his best finish in the classic). Joe Joseph won with a two-game total of 480 pins followed by fellow Michigan star Billy Golembiewski with 413 pins and Salvino with a 409 total.

“I’m an example of not letting your age stop you,” Salvino added. “I’m looking forward to showing those young guns a thing or two.”

LIVE LUBBOCK SPORTS OPEN TELECAST CONTINUES STRONG FOX VIEWERSHIP GAINS

Sunday’s live FS1 telecast of the PBA Lubbock Sports Open continued a strong trend of viewership gains under the PBA’s new relationship with FOX Sports.

“We are gaining momentum with our new broadcast partner FOX Sports,” said PBA CEO and Commissioner Tom Clark. “Our fans are finding us.”

Sunday’s telecast of the PBA Lubbock Sports Open finals was the most viewed show on FS1 so far this year, Clark said, producing a 28% gain over the previous week’s Roth-Holman PBA Doubles Championship telecast, and an 83% gain over the PBA Oklahoma Open telecast the Sunday before the doubles show. The original airing of the Lubbock Open averaged 345,000 viewers with the first re-air later Sunday evening tallying another 157,000 viewers. The live Lubbock show also had 316% more viewers than the program FS1 aired in the same time slot the previous year.

For the year to date, through five original shows plus re-airs on FOX, FS1 and FS2, the PBA has attracted 6,921,000 viewers, up 26% over the first five shows in 2018 on different network, Clark noted.

LIVE FOX TELECAST HELPS SPARK MEDIA FRENZY OVER KYLE TROUP’S HAIR...AND FLAIR
