

Norm Duke Wins Go Bowling! PBA Indianapolis Open for 39th Title

PBA Hall of Famer upsets top qualifier Jason Belmonte, 237-219, for first singles title since 2012

INDIANAPOLIS (Feb. 24, 2019) – A month shy of his 55th birthday, PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke of Clermont, Fla., defeated top qualifier Jason Belmonte of Australia, 237-219, to win his 39th PBA Tour title in the Go Bowling! PBA Indianapolis Open Sunday at Woodland Bowl.

Duke, who is third on the all-time PBA Tour titles list behind Walter Ray Williams Jr.'s 47 and Earl Anthony's 43, never trailed after starting the title match with three strikes and then converting the 4-9 split. Belmonte, who entered the finals as the top qualifier for a record-tying third consecutive

tournament, kept the match close throughout, but when the Australian two-handed player left the 3-10 split on his first shot of the 10th frame, all Duke needed to clinch was seven pins in his 10th frame.

Duke immediately turned to Belmonte, who led the stepladder qualifiers by nearly 400 pins, and said, "We've been watching you dominate us, and

we know it hurts to lose. We've all been through it enough, but I'll never forget this as long as I live."

Duke, who hadn't won a singles title since the 2012 PBA Dick Weber Playoffs – also at Woodland Bowl – said he knew he'd win again. His doubles win with Malott in 2015 also was at Woodland, where he now has had more success than any other PBA player.

"I was in control," Duke said. "I've been there before. I knew what to do. It was hard, but the shot was there and the stepladder format gives you a chance to win, so I'm grateful for that chance."

"I always believed I'd win again," he said. "The first game I ever bowled on television was against Earl Anthony, and I won. In my mind, Jason's the best ever, in spades. I feel for him, because I've been there, but for me, I get to say I bowled Earl, and Walter, and Pete, and

Just Paying Attention

Another week, another great Nielsen television rating for the PBA, with an average of 478,000 viewers on Fox Sports 1 (FS1) for the Touring Players Championship finals. That figure also includes the Plus 2 (P2+) viewership number, the total amount of viewers who watch within 2 days of the original airing, according to the media website showbuzzdaily.com.

Having one of the major faces of the PBA, Jason Belmonte, in the title match three weeks in a row is certainly helping, including this week's PBA Indianapolis Open. Curious to see not only the week-by-week ratings progression, but also the potential spike if someone gets to the late frames for a title match 300 game \$1 million jackpot.

Remember Dave LaMont's amazement of the two pocket 7-10 splits by Belmonte in that

title match with Simonsen, especially the second one? Here's what Fox should do (if they haven't done so already), for the next informative chart using the Specto/Fox StrikeTrack chart numbers. Much like the graphic seen on NFL telecasts illustrating offensive drive charts, the ones ending in punt, fumble, or INT, the four main numbers are listed below the result of the frame, strike spare, or split.

Let's take Belmo's last four shots on the left lane, frames 4 though the fateful first shot in the tenth. They were in order, 7-10, X, X, 7-10. Have the usual frame-by-frame line score, then go total stat-geek and list in order the ball speed, rev rate, breakpoint location, and arrows position as we seen them in the StrikeTrack from top to bottom.

The fourth frame numbers were 16.7 mph, 563rpm, 8.2 breakpoint, 27.1 arrows. Sixth

Sectional Assignments Determined for 2019 Intercollegiate Team Championships

ARLINGTON, Texas – The sectional assignments for the 2019 Intercollegiate Team Championships, based on

results during the 2018-2019 United States Bowling Congress Collegiate season, were announced Wednesday.

The sectional qualifiers will

take place March 9-10 at four sites – 30 Strikes in Stratford, New Jersey; Smyrna Bowling Center in Smyrna, Tennessee; Stardust Bowl in Addison, Illinois; and USA Bowl in Dallas.

The top four men's and top four women's teams from each sectional will advance to the ITC, which will be held April 17-20 at Poelking Lanes South in Dayton, Ohio.

Robert Morris-Illinois is the top-ranked team in the men's field and will head to the Addison sectional. The Eagles finished second at the ITC in 2018 and are fresh off a victory at the 50th Annual Columbia 300 Hoosier Classic. McKendree, the defending ITC men's champion, will go to the Dallas

sectional.

Lindenwood finished the regular season in the top spot in the women's field and also will travel to the Addison sectional. The Lions are the defending ITC champion and will look to become the first team to successfully defend a title in the women's division since West Texas State (now West Texas A&M) won back-to-back titles in 1987 and 1988.

frame was 17.9 mph, 534 rpm, 8.7 breakpoint, 27.8 arrows, eighth frame 17.2 mph, 532 rpm, 8.5 breakpoint, 27.3 arrows, tenth frame 18.1 mph, 516 rpm, 8.7 breakpoint, 27.9 arrows.

Here's where Rob (or Dave) and Randy can explain what happened. Randy takes the tele-strator, circles the tenth frame numbers, sees the subtle differences in the mph and rpm numbers, combines those with how the nearly one mile-an-hour faster speed and slightly less rpm got the ball just a pinch behind the head pin, causing the split as Dave described on the replay to "avert your eyes, if you're easily made sick."

One number I hope they add later might be pocket entry angle, a number used to magnify the differences in mph and rpm. Belmo's 10th frame 7-10 leave may have had the ideal angle, but it would provide a talking point not only to Randy, but to charming and delightful guests on bowling radio talk shows and podcasts the following week (like the next time I'm on the "Let's Go Bowling" program Wednesdays at 11:00 am at gobowlingshow.com).

There will be other charts and graphs, all explaining why balls struck, left a flat dime, or

wiggled the 9-pin as the ball went by, but giving the audience a better idea of the how and why.

Granted, there may not have enough time to prep this type of chart, late in a telecast, but I won't be surprised if this is done as early as the Indy Open finals.

Here's an update on an item from several weeks ago. Beaver Valley Bowl in Rochester, Pennsylvania isn't going anywhere anytime soon. As I reported here, its home building was up for sale on an online auction block, but bidding did not reach the minimum amount, and was not sold, as confirmed to me in person by BVB owner Brad Davidson on a recent trip to the 'Burgh to visit family.

In person, you ask? My advice is if you are there to visit, even if there are no customers in the center and you wish to pose at the infamous ball return where the Roy Munson character in "Kingpin" (played by Woody Harrelson) lost his right hand, please ask Davidson. He didn't recognize me at first, freaking out my sister, who later took this photo.



Another photo shows the main 10 of the 14 lanes as seen in the movie. One confirming trait of the center is how mortar around the pillars by the gutters is rounded at the floor at the gutters.

The bucket list item I mentioned last week was to visit a center only 90 miles from my childhood home I had yet to see in person. On the return trip home, I finally made it to the one and only AMF Riviera Lanes in the Akron suburb of Fairlawn, Ohio.

While the following week's TPC finals show on FS1 was on most of the flat screen TV's at Riviera during my visit, I walked in under the famous sign, and right in front was the legendary television pair in use the prior Sunday, Lanes 27-28.



It appeared to be a normal everyday center on this day, but I couldn't help but imagine how it had looked for many April weeks in the four decades when it hosted the tournament my generation knew only as the

"Firestone."

As a family with two youngsters left after two games on Lane 27, I went down into the settee, where Carmen Salvino gave Belmo his third ToC trophy the week before and just sat there, trying to absorb what a half-century of history happened literally steps away.



The original wood approaches still in use caught my eye, surviving a second wood lane bed installation in the late 80's, then AMF SPL lane beds in the early 2000's. The sports

drama produced on this pair of lanes has filled many Top 25 TV Bowling Moments lists' over the last twenty years.

From this spot, I could see Schissler picking up Biondolillo from his knees after throwing the first TV 300 in '67, Don Johnson laying face down upon the Lane 27 approach after THAT 10-pin in 1970, Earl Anthony and Mark Williams each winning twice, Durbin three times, Steve Cook's front ten strikes in '81, Wayne Webb's 15-bagger over two matches in '80, Del's '89 win, Ozio's win with the bomb scare in '91, George Branham III's '93 win, then Norm Duke's '94 victory, the final ToC at Riviera for 29 years, all on that pair of lanes.

ANTHONY SIMONSEN ADVANCES TO FOURTH PLACE IN PBA PLAYOFFS POINTS RACE

Thanks to his victory in the PBA Players Championship Sunday, Anthony Simonsen moved into fourth place in the race to qualify for the inaugural PBA Playoffs.

Finishing second in the second Tier 1 event on the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour schedule helped Jason Belmonte expand his lead in the 2019 PBA Playoffs points lead to 15,550 points while EJ Tackett, moved into second place on the basis of his second straight top five finish in the PBA's first two major championships of the year.

Under the new PBA competition points structure in play this season, a win in a Tier 1 (major championship) event is worth 7,500 points - triple the value of the base points total

for a victory (2,500 points) in a Tier 3 (limited entry and/or modified format) tournament. Tier 2 (standard PBA Tour) events award double the Tier 3 points.

Sean Rash dropped one spot to third, Jakob Butturff fell from third to fifth, and Kyle Troup advanced to sixth. Rounding out the top eight heading into the Go Bowling! PBA Indianapolis Open (a Tier 2 event) were Dick Allen in seventh place and Bill O'Neill in eighth. Marshall Kent and Jesper Svensson dropped out of the top eight to ninth and 10th, respectively.

The race for the 24th-and-final berth in the PBA Playoffs currently involves Kyle Sherman in 24th with Darren Tang, Patrick Girard and Zachary Wilkins in hot pursuit.

Finishing in the top eight as of the end of the USBC Masters on April 1 means those players will earn a first-round bye in the single-elimination PBA Playoffs. Finishing in the top 24 is a necessity to qualify for a place in the Playoffs; finishing in the top 40 is required for eligibility to enter the 2019 PBA League Draft. The PBA Playoffs begin on Monday, April 8, with live coverage of the opening Round of 24 matches on FS1 at 7 p.m. Eastern from Bayside Bowl in Portland, Maine.

Sectional assignments are based on Team Ranking System (TRS) points earned throughout the season. USBC Collegiate attempts to place no more than two of the top eight schools and no more than four of the top 16 schools in a sectional based on the final TRS totals. Sectional qualifier fields take geographic distance, economics and field size into consideration.

The sectional format consists of 32 Baker games each day for a total of 64 Baker games. Total pinfall for the 64 games will determine which teams advance to the ITC.

The four hosting centers also will conduct qualifying sessions for the Intercollegiate Singles Championships on March 8. Student-athletes at each of the four sectional events will bowl six games with 24 men and 24 women - the top four men and top four women at each sectional plus eight additional individuals based on field size - advancing to the national singles tournament on April 16-17 (qualifying and match play) and April 20 (semifinals and finals) at Poelking Lanes South.

Registration for the ISC will open Friday, Feb. 22 at 10 a.m. Eastern and close March 5 at 6 p.m. Eastern. Student-athletes can register at BOWL.com/ISC.

Each sectional will be broadcast live at BowlTV.com.

I beat 'em all."

Belmonte said, "Today I watched my idol (Duke) bowl the most impressive game against me. I tried my best to keep up, but a few stubborn corner pins...ended my chances. Norm's a treasure."


