

Josh Blanchard Wins PBA Xtra Frame Reality Check Classic For Third Career PBA Tour Title

TAMARAC, Fla. (March 19, 2017) – Josh Blanchard of Mesa, Ariz., breezed through all three of his stepladder matches to win the PBA Xtra Frame Reality Check Classic Sunday at Sawgrass Lanes for his third career PBA Tour title.

Streamed live on PBA's online bowling channel Xtra Frame, Blanchard beat former McKendree University collegiate star and finals top seed AJ Johnson of Oswego, Ill., 232-204, in the title match for his first title of the season and first in two years. For Johnson, it was his third career runner-up finish.

"It feels unbelievable," said Blanchard, who won his last title in the 2015 PBA

Xtra Frame Maine Shootout. "Sometimes you doubt yourself but I have a lot of support from my family, friends and fans so I think it was just a matter of time before I could bring home another win."

By winning, Blanchard also takes the early lead in the Storm Cup points race which will award \$50,000 in bonus prize money at the end of the season. All eight Storm Cup events are streamed live on Xtra Frame.

Needing a strike on the first ball of the 10th frame to win the semifinal match, Blanchard struck out to beat four-time Tour winner Dom Barrett of England, 279-258, to advance to the title match.

In the opening match, Blanchard, who was the No. 3 seed, beat two-hander Shawn Maldonado of Houston, who was trying for his first Tour win, 236-175.

Upcoming Storm Cup Xtra Frame events this season will include stops in North Carolina, Arkansas, Texas, Tennessee, Virginia and Delaware before its final event in Coldwater, Ohio, in late August. The next stop for the Xtra Frame Storm Cup series will be the Xtra Frame Wilmington Open in Wilmington, N.C., May 26-29.

Disqualifications at OC Due to Violation of Average Requirement and Verification Rules

LAS VEGAS - The United States Bowling Congress has disqualified Standard Division scores for two bowlers at the 2017 USBC Open Championships for violation of the average requirement and verification rules.

As a result of the disqualifications, there is a new Standard All-Events leader for the event, which is being held at the South Point Bowling Plaza.

The Open Championships rules require:

* "Bowlers are responsible for verifying the accuracy of their averages, whether originally submitted by the bowler, team captain or others. If submitted average is lower than required and results in a lower classification, the bowler's score is disqualified." (Rule 2 -Average Verification)

* "Bowlers must attest to the accuracy of the information

provided, and an understanding of the consequences of their failure to provide the proper facts. Failure to report all re-rates and report prize winnings shall be cause for disqualification. Bowler will be disqualified for failing to submit adjusted average under Rule 319e." (Rule 1 - Average Requirements)

"Average integrity continues to be a point of emphasis at the USBC Open Championships," USBC Executive Director Chad Murphy said. "Our team works to educate competitors and prevent violations of the rules before scores hit the leaderboard, but we also will proactively investigate any new information that becomes available afterward. Bowlers are responsible for following the rules, and USBC will not tolerate bowlers competing

CBS Sports Network to Televis 23 Bowling Events in 2017



ARLINGTON, Texas – The best professional, collegiate and youth bowling tournaments once again will be nationally televised on CBS Sports Network as part of its agreement with the United States Bowling Congress.

The 23-event national television package features live coverage of the U.S. Open, a major event on the Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) Tour, and live or same-day coverage of the four major tournaments on the Professional Women's Bowling Association (PWBA) Tour – the USBC Queens, Go Bowling PWBA Championship, U.S. Women's Open and PWBA

Tour Championships.

"We are thrilled to showcase the sport of bowling on CBS Sports Network through this extensive national television package," USBC Executive Director Chad Murphy said. "From May to September, bowling will be appointment watching nearly every Tuesday in primetime for a national audience."

The national television schedule kicks off May 2 with the Intercollegiate Singles Championships, and CBS Sports Network will televise at least one bowling show each week through the PWBA Tour

Just Paying Attention

It may go back about fifty years to the original large-sized scoreboard at The Eighth Wonder of the World, not more than twenty minutes from where I write this column. I'm speaking of scoreboard-generated messages and sound encouraging fans to do the same, more than likely first seen at the Houston Astrodome.

At first, some thought it to be intrusive. Crowd murmur and buzz seemed to be constant, picking up when the home team started a rally, scored a touchdown, had a big inning, or on an outstanding defensive play. Slowly, the messages and sound became more frequent and a bit louder. Nowadays, scoreboard-generated messages and sound can supply rhythm to the players, themselves, minus crowd noise. This occurs at sporting events at just about every level from high school on up. Back in the day, it was special and unique, but just make sure you had enough hot dogs, popcorn, and cold beer. Today, it's as expected as individual seats in the bleachers, sushi, gourmet tacos, three-foot hot dogs with the works, and twenty five microbrews on tap.

This became more evident

at the March 5th Golden State Warriors 112-105 win over the New York Knicks at Madison Square Garden. According to New York Newsday, there was no music, videos, or on-court entertainment during time-outs during the first half. None. The only noise heard was from the players themselves. Sneaker squeaking, coaches' instructions, players shouting offensive sets, players complaining about foul calls, officials explaining fouls to the scorer's table, even vendor calls was all that could be heard. Oh yes, fans cheering on their own was audible, too. So what was wrong, experiencing a game like it was in the 1970's? Depending on whom was asked, everything.

Warrior shooting guard Klay Thompson said it felt like an open gym. Point guard Stephen Curry said it felt like a middle school game, even to a point where the players were pumping themselves up after they walked out for the opening tip. Coach Steve Kerr said the silence made it feel like church. Power forward Draymond Green said it even changed the flow of the game to a point where it was disrespectful.

Starting at the PBA World

Series of Bowling finals last November, the PBA enlisted Orlando Magic game day in-arena host/emcee Dennis McCamery, to keep crowds energized and entertained during commercial breaks. On site, those breaks can be a bit tedious, as you're waiting three to five minutes for action to resume.

I first saw his work at the Super Clash. The TV pair at Main Event Katy was on the high end of a 26-lane higher ceiling section of the building, which unfortunately muffled crowd noise. With carefully-positioned speakers, he and a DJ crafted a show of sound that kept the pace and rhythm flowing for those in attendance.

For a while in the late 1990s, the PBA experimented with encouraging crowd noise as bowlers were delivering balls during matches. If you remember Steve Jaros' TV 300 (yes, it's also on YouTube) in February 1999 had crowd noise throughout that game, as well as the other three matches. Before then, and as the practice has reverted back, the crowds were told to listen for the ball hitting the lane, then make all the noise they want. As we

have seen from time to time, sudden noises and sudden fan movement down lane (hand held signs, for example) can be a distraction to a player releasing a shot.

We've gone way, way past fans doing 'The Wave' at

sporting events, although fans at some venues, like Wrigley Field, are discouraged by other fans trying to do 'The Wave'. This is a different time and age. Fans, especially younger ones, expect a bigger sensory

from the Standard Division. Additionally, USBC will disqualify their scores from all Standard Division bracket competition.

Bracket results involving the disqualified scores will be corrected, and additional bracket prize money will be sent to those affected.

Scores rolled for Regular Division events will stand, as the bowlers involved did not violate average requirement rules for Regular Division events.

“When we catch individuals attempting to manipulate the system, those involved will be subject to the most severe penalties available under USBC rules,” Murphy said. “USBC encourages continued reports from members and tournament bowlers about average-integrity

issues. We are committed to consistent and firm enforcement of these rules and improving this issue for our sport.”

Any bowler found using an average below the player’s ability will be disqualified and may be subject to suspension charges initiated by USBC under USBC Rule 17a, Grounds for Disciplinary Action - Unfair Tactics.

The bowlers involved have been notified of the disqualifications. Under USBC Rule 329, those disqualified may appeal the decision to USBC Headquarters.
