

Jason Belmonte Wins PBA World Championship for Record 11th Major Title

Australian two-hander beats Jakob Butturff 236-227 in title match for 21st career tour win

ALLEN PARK, Mich. (March 21, 2019) – Australia's Jason Belmonte successfully defended his PBA World Championship title Thursday for a record 11th PBA major crown, continuing to set new benchmarks of

performance for the PBA Tour's most prestigious and challenging tournaments.

The 35-year-old two-hander defeated Jakob Butturff of Tempe, Ariz., 236-227, in the title match of the stepladder finals televised live by FS1. The World Championship, the Go Bowling! PBA Tour season's third major, was the pinnacle event of the multi-event PBA

World Series of Bowling X at Thunderbowl Lanes.

In his 11th season on tour, Belmonte broke a tie with PBA Hall of Famers Earl Anthony and Pete Weber for most major titles, after winning his 10th major in the PBA Tournament of Champions in February. He had a chance to win his 11th major in the Players Championship a week after the Tournament of Champions but was defeated by fellow two-hander Anthony Simonsen in the title match of that tournament.

Having been top qualifier for the finals of the Tournament of Champions, Players Championship and the World Championship, Belmonte also set a new mark for earning the top qualifier position for the finals in three consecutive major tournaments in a season.

"I'm so overwhelmed right now that if I could express how I feel I don't know if anyone could understand me,"


Andrew Anderson Preparing to Defend 2019 Masters Title

ARLINGTON, Texas – Entering the 2018 United States Bowling Congress Masters, Andrew Anderson of Holly, Michigan, was a 22-year-old still looking for his breakthrough moment.

Now, he enters the 2019 event as the defending champion, the reigning Professional Bowlers Association Player of the Year and a world champion as a member of Team USA.

Anderson begins his title defense this week at the Gold Coast Hotel and Casino in Las Vegas and will be joined by 450 of the best bowlers in the world looking to work through the tournament's double-elimination bracket and earn a spot on the live televised finals April 1

at 9 p.m. Eastern on FS1.

Junior Team USA Girls Win Doubles at 2019 WBJC

PARIS - Junior Team USA's Kamerin Peters and Mabel Cummins may have been the center of attention Saturday at Paris' Institut du Judo, where their stage was a two-lane installation surrounded by bright TV lights and hundreds of bowling fans, but they seemed unfazed by their surroundings as they performed for the energetic audience.

The two were as calm as if the venue that didn't exist 24 hours before was their familiar home bowling center, and they worked together to earn the

doubles gold medal at the 2019 World Bowling Junior Championships with a 478-452 victory over Korea's Hong Soree and Jeong Youngseon.

"This feels absolutely amazing," said Peters, who made her Junior Team USA debut this week at the inaugural World Bowling Junior Championships. "We were able to block everything out and stay focused. We concentrated on making the best shots we could, and we communicated the whole time, which really helped us stay in the moment."

CBS Sports Network to Televis 19 Bowling Shows in 2019

ARLINGTON, Texas – CBS Sports Network will televise 19 bowling shows in 2019 with the finals of eight events televised live, including the stepladder finals of five major events.

The finals of every major on the Professional Women's Bowling Association (PWBA) Tour will be televised live, starting with the United States Bowling Congress Queens stepladder finals on May 21 from Northrock Lanes in Wichita, Kansas.

The U.S. Women's Open (June 23), the PWBA Players Championship (Sept. 8), and the PWBA Tour Championship (Sept. 18) also will have live



coverage of the finals.

The finals of the 2019 U.S. Open, a major on the Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) Tour, will be televised live on Oct. 30 from Victory Lanes in Mooresville, North Carolina.

In addition to the major events on the CBS Sports Network schedule, the first three Saturdays in August will have a live TV show starting 5 p.m. (Eastern) with the stepladder finals of the PWBA Elite-field events – the PWBA

Just Paying Attention

Five original shows, four of them were live leading to a breathtaking week. And you thought you were binge watching. Well, you were. Did I mention the PBA World Series of Bowling's championship final telecasts were breathtaking?

Starting with the Cheetah Championship on Monday night, I noticed a little something different in the background. If you thought you were hearing an audio signal bleed over into your telecast audio, no, you weren't.

Granted, this is just a professional guess on my part, over a couple of previous Fox and FS1 shows, there was an issue with crowd noise distracting player's mid-approach. If you've never been in a large room with several hundred people trying to be a quiet as possible, it's like trying to drive through Texas without a stop at Buc-ee's or Whataburger, almost impossible to do. Think about music being on in an empty bowling center during the day at just the right volume, sound being used to make a large space a little less empty. It masks any slight noise, or at least evidence

of audible noise.

Some matches it wasn't used while a player was on the approach, but at the WSOB, there weren't fans sitting up the lane, either, a common place for potentially distracting noise.

The next addition was a 3-D version of the StrikeTrack. Illustrating a full-sized version of a lane, it would compare two different ball paths down the lane, giving definition to the numbers seen on the now-familiar graphic, adding the entry angle number I had hoped for several weeks ago. Hope we see this on future shows.

The next great addition was the third man in the booth. Jason Belmonte, Kyle Troup, Chris Barnes, and Norm Duke gave Rob Stone and Randy Pedersen and viewer's fantastic material to comment about, allowing them to show off their personalities while giving great insight into on-lane adjustments and current life on the PBA Tour.

In this age of Tony Romo with his eerily accurate observations as to what will be the next play, the bar was raised not only for other NFL

television analysts, but other analysts, too, guest and regular.

Belmo said the format was advantageous for Kyle Sherman and Matt McNeil as this was their first singles finals appearances; because both could get used to the television environment in the first game without fear of losing that first game. Kyle Troup predicted what target and foot moves toward the middle of the lane were next, mostly a couple of boards left on the approach, half as much with the target and slightly closer to the foul line. Chris Barnes predicted Kris Prather would win his first title. His first comment, after removing the Kyle Troup-style afro hairpiece, specifically said he is the hottest bowler on tour no one is talking about. Over the last six months, he has been in the hunt numerous times, and would benefit in the four-man seeding match to make a few mistakes and not pay for them with a loss – all too familiar one-match-and-done scenario seen numerous times over the years in a traditional stepladder format.

Interestingly enough, Randy was not in agreement with Barnes' statement, responding with Prather's only strike of the match was in the seventh frame, but did agree Prather was ready to win after several third-place finishes.

Their next topic was about lane transition in the next match. Barnes said the four players broke down the pair playing the same area, giving an advantage to B.J. Moore, if he could manage his emotions and the bump in his pushaway.

Don't worry, Randy wasn't left out of deft observations. He spotted McNeil had inserted only his ring finger and thumb into the ball to shoot spares.

Sideline reporter Kimberly Pressler stepped up her game as well. With the various ball reps sitting near her work area off-camera, she was able to hear bowler/ball rep conversations (they can be almost in code to the untrained ear), allowing Pedersen to further translate and elaborate on the mentioned points.

The only noticeable presentation drawback was in the Scorpion Championship, when key shots late in matches were rolled, the technical director in the television production truck sets up a shot-in-a-shot with the StrikeTrack graphic on the far right. The middle image shows the ball going through the pins, the far left image from the downlane camera zoomed in on the face of the bowler capturing his reaction.

In a couple of Kris Prather's shots late in his title match with B.J. Moore, only the camera image showing the ball through the pins was on screen. When Prather walked the shot off to camera left, the camera zoomed out in full screen rather than zooming in on the ball heading downlane, with the graphic blocking the pinfall. A quick replay showed the pinfall, but the shot-in-a-shot effect was overlooked.

All this transpired in seconds, but was brought up in social media just as fast. There are enough experienced people in the truck to notice such an error, so I'm sure something was said. Television crews don't like to make mistakes in pressure situations either.

All in all, it was just like the network studio crew-on-field NFL playoff coverage. Finally, there was time to explain the X's and O's as to what is going on. Yep, Fox Sports indeed is serious about exposing

the techy side of the sport many of us have spent a lifetime acquiring.

If Thunderbowl Lanes is home to future WSOB's with lanes 11-12 used, perhaps viewers will become familiar with the characteristics of each lane, as golf viewers have with the back nine holes at August National every April for The Masters. Lane 11 became more difficult as each show progressed, lane 12 offered a little more area at the breakpoint if the ball pace was good.

With the slippery pattern transition, there weren't many blow-out matches. A vast majority of the matches featured lead changes literally turn-by-turn in the ninth and tenth frames. Plenty of drama, plenty of great production, and with bowlers specifically asking, even on the opening night of the NCAA men's basketball tournament, shows Foxifying the PBA is off to a great start. Let's just say there was enough of an audience, live and on the replay airings. Overall WSOB television ratings won't be out until later this week.

USBC Masters is Last Chance to Qualify for PBA Playoffs

 CHICAGO, IL - An intense, season-long competition to qualify for the inaugural PBA Playoffs at Bayside Bowl in Portland, Maine, beginning on April 8 will reach its conclusion next week in the United States Bowling Congress Masters, the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour's fourth major championship and a Tier 1 points event in the PBA Playoffs scenario.

With 7,500 points awaiting the Masters champion, and significant points at stake throughout the Masters' final standings, how players perform at the Gold Coast Bowling Center in Las Vegas next week may prove pivotal in not only earning berths in the 24-player PBA Playoffs field, but in other related competitions:

- The top eight in points at the conclusion of the Masters on April 1 will earn byes for the first round of the single-elimination PBA Playoffs match play competition. Australia's Jason Belmonte has locked up the No. 1 berth, but the next seven positions are still up for grabs.

- The top 24 in points also earn berths in the PBA Playoffs.
- The top 40 in points will

be eligible to participate in the 2019 PBA League draft that will take place on April 8 at Bayside Bowl in Portland, Maine.

- 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour points through the Masters will be combined with 2018 points to determine the eight players who will compete in the Barbasol PBA Tour Finals July 19-21 at Red Rock Casino Resort & Spa in Las Vegas.

- 2019 points will qualify players for priority entries into future PBA Tour events.

- Points status will be an important factor in consideration for 2019 PBA Player and Rookie of the Year voting at the end of the year.

Heading into the Masters, the top 40 in PBA competition points are listed below. A number of additional players could advance based upon how they finish in the Masters. For the complete 2019 points standings, click here: <https://www.pba.com/SeasonStats/PointsList/132?list=1>.

The USBC Masters will conclude with a live two-hour telecast on FS1 on Sunday, April 1, at 9 p.m. Eastern.

said Belmonte, who also won his 21st career tour title. "To break a record held by two of the greatest players of all time is just something I never thought was possible when I first started on tour more than 10 years ago. I'm proof that you can achieve your dreams."

Belmonte got off to a fast start in the title match with strikes in the first three frames,

while Butturff, trying for his first major and sixth career tour title, struggled until striking in the third frame. Butturff ran into trouble again in the sixth frame when he missed a seven pin but recovered to throw the last six strikes of the match to eventually force Belmonte to strike on the first ball in the 10th and then finish the frame with a spare. Belmonte doubled in the 10th to seal the win.

"Jakob is a great player and I knew what he was capable

SAINT-MAXIMIN, France - With each day at the 2019 World Bowling Junior Championships, Junior Team USA's

Mabel Cummins became more comfortable on the 41-foot World Bowling Montreal oil pattern. The 16-year-old right-hander averaged 208.3 over four days and 18 games (six games in singles, doubles and team) at Plaza Bowling Saint Maximin to finish 17th in the all-events standings and advance to Masters match play, which featured the top 24 girls and top 24 boys. And that's when things fell into place for Cummins, a team gold-medalist at the 2018 World Bowling Youth Championships. In four matches between Thursday and Friday, Cummins bowled 10 additional games, averaging more than 229.



2-1 (234-256, 201-186, 221-214), before losing to Korea's Jeong Youngseon, 2-1 (277-196, 246-255, 213-225) in the Masters semifinals.

Cummins earned a bronze medal for the performance, while Jeong advances to Saturday's gold-medal match, where she will face her teammate, Hong Soree, a 2-1 semifinal winner over Norel Nuevo of the Philippines (223-235, 244-210,

222-201).

"I bowled a really great three-game set, but I had some inopportune pin carry that ultimately hurt me," said Cummins, a two-time member of Junior Team USA. "Overall, I'm really pleased with how I did in the Masters event. It's a big improvement from the World Youth Championships last summer, where I lost my first match.

"I've been working a lot on my match-play skills and being mentally tough in stressful situations, and I think I really

excelled at that today."

The journey to the Masters medal round was one that took Cummins and Junior Team USA head coach Bryan O'Keefe through her six-ball arsenal and from one side of the lane to the other, multiple times during the week. But, they got there.

"The more they stripped and oiled the lanes, the cleaner the fronts got, which really helped out my ball reaction," Cummins said. "Early on, I had trouble getting the ball through the front part of the lane and still have it maintain energy, but as the week went on, my ball reaction got better."

Junior Team USA's Kamerin Peters was eliminated in the opening round of the Masters on Thursday, while Anthony Neuer, who had a first-round bye, and Solomon Salama, both were defeated Friday morning in Stage 2.

Cummins will have one more opportunity to conquer the Montreal pattern and claim the team's first gold medal of the inaugural World Junior Championships, and it will include a rematch with Jeong. The two won't be alone, however, since they'll be competing for the doubles gold medal.

Jeong will be joined on the lanes by Hong, while Peters will join her Junior Team USA teammate.

Another difference will be that the action at the World Junior Championships now shifts from Plaza Bowling Saint Maximin to a special two-lane setup inside Paris' Institut du Judo.

While the environment will be different and the lane characteristics they've experienced all week will be irrelevant, Cummins and Peters are versatile enough and will have a solid game plan, and some backup strategies, for the final match.

"I'm 100 percent confident in Kam's ability and my ability to execute 10 really great shots tomorrow, and we're really looking forward to it," Cummins said. "Yes, it's a new venue and a completely different environment, but it's still just bowling, and we've all had experience in unique settings."

The doubles finale will be part of an all-day extravaganza that will include the doubles, team and Masters finals, for both the girls and boys, in a venue that will help showcase the sport to a large in-person crowd and the countless bowling fans watching the broadcast across the world.

All of Saturday's gold-medal matches will be livestreamed on BowlTV. The action will get underway at 7 a.m. Eastern and last approximately five hours.

All qualifying rounds and semifinals, plus the singles

finals, at the 2019 World Junior Championships took place at the 28-lane Plaza Saint Maximin and were livestreamed by World Bowling. The event included more than 100 bowlers, ages 13-18, from 35 countries.

Another twist for the first edition of the tournament was the use of the Current Frame Scoring system, where a strike counts for 30 pins, a spare

counts for 10, plus the first-ball count and an open frame counts for actual pins knocked down. The 10th frame counts the same as all other frames, and with only 10 first balls each game, the maximum score still is 300.

Peters left a 10 pin on her first shot but quickly shook off any nerves, rattling off six consecutive strikes on the way to a 277 effort in the one-game match. Cummins added a 201 game to secure the gold medal.

The Junior Team USA girls led by as many as 22 pins, but a 4-6-7 split from Cummins in the eighth frame opened the door for the Koreans. Peters and Cummins led by three pins heading into the final frame, and strikes from each ended Korea's hopes.

"It was really exciting out there, and even with the potential for so many distractions, we were able to block it out and stay focused," said Cummins, also a Masters bronze medalist this week. "Kam and I worked so well together, and it's an honor to say I have won a gold

medal with her."

The Current Frame Scoring system was used this week at the World Junior Championships.

In the new system, a strike counts for 30 pins, a spare counts for 10, plus the first-ball count, and an open frame counts for actual pins knocked down. The 10th frame counts the same as all other frames (there's no fill ball), and even with only 10 first balls each game, the maximum score still is 300.

Current Frame Scoring has been featured in recent World Bowling Tour events, the Asian Bowling Federation Tour Finals and the Asian Games.

Saturday's doubles finals didn't end as well for the Junior Team USA boys, who fell to Korea in a high-scoring match, 534-502.

Korea's Park Donghyuk and Ji Geun combined for 15

strikes and posted matching 267 games, while Junior Team USA's Solomon Salama and Anthony Neuer tossed 14 strikes of their own on the way to games of 255 and 247, respectively.

The Koreans were in control the whole match, and a few hiccups along the way were the difference for Salama and Neuer. Neuer missed a 6 pin the second frame and left a 7-10 split in the seventh, while Salama's four-strike start was halted by a 2-4-7-8 combination he was unable to convert.

"If you would've told me before the final that we could've had 502, I would've taken it, for sure, and I would've liked our chances," Neuer said. "They bowled phenomenally, and there wasn't much more we could do. I'm happy with how we performed, even though we didn't win."

Salama and Neuer, both 16-year-old left-handers, are two-time winners at the Junior Gold Championships presented by the Brands of Ebonite, so they, too, were not affected by the grandeur of the venue or the moment.

There were nerves before the action got going Saturday in the custom setup, but they were able to draw on past experi-

ence and find comfort in their camaraderie.

"It meant a lot to be able to find success on the world stage and show how competitive the bowlers from the United States can be," Salama said.

In all, 105 bowlers (58 boys and 47 girls) representing 35 countries competed in the 2019 World Junior Championships this week, and they bowled for medals in four disciplines - singles, doubles, mixed team and Masters. Medals also were awarded for all-events.

All qualifying rounds and semifinals, plus the singles finals, were held at Plaza Bowling Saint Maximin in nearby Saint-Maximin, France, and livestreamed by World Bowling.

The doubles, Masters and team championship matches all were contested on the special two-lane installation inside the Institut du Judo in the center of Paris, allowing for a more elaborate TV setting and exposure via broadcast to countries and channels around the world.

Korea's dominance continued in the Masters finals, where Hong and Ji emerged as the gold medalists. Hong defeated her teammate, Jeong, 2-1 (223-264, 215-196, 262-225), and Ji downed Finland's Pyry Puharinen, 2-0 (244-231, 267-236). Jeong and Puharinen each earned silver medals.

Ji's command of the left side and mastery of the week's 41-foot World Bowling Montreal oil pattern resulted in gold medals in singles, doubles, all-events and Masters, and he finished the week by helping Korea top Mexico, 2-0 (220-167, 222-197), in the best-of-three Baker team final.

The four-player mixed team event included the two boys and two girls competing for each country.

Korea and Finland topped the medal table this week in France with 10 medals each and were followed by the United States and Mexico with three apiece. Germany, Philippines and Singapore each earned two medals, and England and Lithuania took home one apiece.

Junior Team USA's three medals were gold in girls doubles, silver in boys doubles and bronze in girls Masters. Neuer just missed an all-events medal, finishing fourth overall. Junior Team USA head coach Bryan O'Keefe had nothing but praise for all four team members.

"We didn't know what to expect from the lane pattern and the brand new install, but once we got going, the lanes seemed a little cleaner and played like they did toward the end of the week, which was much more comfortable for us,"

O'Keefe said. "Kamerin bowled an incredible game, and both girls threw about the best shots you ever could ask for in the 10th frame when it mattered most. They were composed and didn't let the elements get to them, and I couldn't be any more proud."

Peters and Cummins, both 16-year-old right-handers, have bowled on TV before. Cummins is a past Junior Gold Championships winner, and Peters made the televised finals of the team-based USA Bowling National Championships.

A two-time Junior Team USA member, Cummins picked up her first world championship last summer. She helped Junior Team USA to the team gold medal at the 2018 World Bowling Youth Championships in the Detroit area.

"We did have a couple of open frames on the boys side, but we did plenty of striking as well, against a team that was dominant all week and carried that momentum into the final," O'Keefe said. "We gave it our best and gave them a good match, and that's all I could ask for. We put up 500 on TV, and that's an amazing score. It just wasn't enough today. Ultimately, they represented us well and bowled for a gold medal. It was a successful week, and I'm proud of the whole group."

of so for him to come back from that missed spare really didn't surprise me," Belmonte said. "He put together a clutch performance to the very end.

"Going into the 10th I knew my ball had to be perfect going through the pins and those were two of the best shots of

my life," Belmonte added. "I can't think of a better way to win this tournament."

Belmonte also became the season's first three-time winner having also won the Chameleon Championship on Tuesday. He also extended his record of career tour wins in WSOB competition to six.

The stepladder finals started with Butturff, who qualified fourth, beating No. 5 qualifier

BJ Moore of Greensburg, Pa., 236-183. Moore, who was trying for his first PBA Tour title, finished fifth which tied his best finish in a major when he also finished fifth in the 2018 Tournament of Champions.

The 24-year-old Butturff then beat 10-time tour winner No. 3 qualifier Bill O'Neill of Langhorne, Pa, 235-226, to advance to the semifinal match where he beat part-time tour player and No. 2 qualifier Matt McNeil of Minneapolis, 184-179, to advance to the title match against Belmonte.

The next stop for the Go Bowling! PBA Tour will be the USBC Masters March 26-April

1 at the Gold Coast Bowling Center in Las Vegas where Belmonte will try for his 12th major win. After the season's fourth major has concluded, the top 24 players in points will earn berths in the PBA Playoffs which begin April 8 with the Round of 24 eliminations at Bayside Bowl in Portland, Maine.




first of three rounds of qualifying start Wednesday at 11 a.m. Eastern and all rounds leading up to the stepladder finals will be broadcast on FloBowling.

At the 2018 Masters in Syracuse, New York, Anderson went undefeated in match play to earn the top seed for the stepladder finals, and he defeated Alex Hoskins of Brigham City, Utah, 213-199, for his first career title.

Anderson would add another PBA Tour title to his collection in 2018, and his overall body of work for the season helped him earn the Chris Schenkel PBA Player of the Year award.

His 2018 campaign came to a close as a representative of Team USA at the World Bowling Men's Championships in Hong Kong, where he claimed a gold medal in trios with EJ Tackett and Kyle Troup and added three silver medals and a bronze medal.

Despite his quick ascension to becoming one of the top players in the world, the now 23-year-old still is humble and gracious in reflecting on his first major championship.

"I'm really looking forward to making it to Las Vegas," Anderson said. "Being able to hear my name announced as a

Masters champion and knowing going forward that I'll always be a part of that great history is really special for me."

Anderson also returns to the Masters in search of his first breakthrough performance of the 2019 season. A torn tendon in his middle finger late in 2018 has slowed down the right-hander in the first stretch of this year's PBA Tour schedule, but he's been adapting to the changes he's had to make to his grip.

"I'm still nowhere near 100 percent, but the last month and a half or so I've been pain free, so that's good," said Anderson, a two-time Team USA member. "It took away a lot of my confidence just because I was bowling so well. I was really happy with what I had going on, and having to change that in the middle of one of my best stretches of bowling, mentally was really tough. It's become a little more comfortable – you could say it's growing on me – but getting back into it mentally has been the hardest part."

Anderson recently put together his best performance of the season last week at the PBA Scorpion Championship, recording a 12th-place finish.

He hopes the advantage of having a guaranteed spot in the 64-player bracket will let him continue to improve and

get familiar with the venue. Anderson is guaranteed the No. 64 spot in the bracket but can improve his seeding through qualifying.

"I've had some good stretches over the last few weeks," Anderson said. "I'm hoping that it all kind of comes together sooner than later, and I think not having to worry about making match play will allow me to get comfortable. It's going to give me the chance to try some extra bowling balls and look at different options, even if I sacrifice a little bit of score to get prepared for match play."

Regardless of his spot in the bracket, Anderson knows there's no easy path to return to the stepladder finals. However, he hopes the experience gained from his win in 2018 will serve him well.

All players will bowl 15 games of qualifying over three days to determine the 63 players joining Anderson in the double-elimination bracket. All bracket matches leading up to the stepladder finals will be three-game total-pinfall contests to determine the advancer.

The 2019 USBC Masters will award \$30,000 to the champion and has a total prize fund of \$315,000.


