

'The World' Beats USA in PBA World Series of Bowling X USA vs. The World Team Challenge

U.S. scorers to win the USA vs. The World team competition, 2-0, in a best-of-three Baker team format finals to conclude a historic week of PBA competition on FS1 at Thunderbowl Lanes in Suburban Detroit.

The World team, made up of Pontus Andersson (Sweden), Andres Gomez (Colombia), Dom Barrett (England) and Australians Sam Cooley and Jason Belmonte defeated the U.S. team of Bill O'Neill, Kyle Sherman, Tom Daugherty, Anthony Simonsen and EJ Tackett, to end the U.S.'s two-year reign as champion of the non-title WSOB "all-star" event.

The U.S. team, captained by PBA Hall of Famer Marshall Holman, jumped out to the lead in the first game of the second match 184-176 but The World team, captained by Hall of Famer Amleto Monacelli, came back to win the second game 204-156 to force a sudden death one-ball roll-off. Belmonte, who was coming off a historic PBA World Championship win Thursday, won the roll-off

The \$10,000 Classic is Coming to Town

PLANO, Texas – The \$10,000 Classic is coming to town

We haven't had many big money tournaments in the Southwest area in the last several years, but Chris Turner and Victory Bowlers would like to change all that.

"I've wanted to do something for the bowlers, something big. I tossed around some different concepts, but now that Boom Doubles is not happening, I wanted to do something with that same format because it was very competitive and fun," said Turner.

First place for the event is \$10,000 with the entry fee being \$400, \$200 per bowler with two main squads. You are also able to bowl the re-entry squad at 9pm with the same partner or different partner.

Teams will consist of 2 players, any gender mix. Teams may have only, but does not have to include the following: 1 PBA member, 1 PWBA member, 1 national title holder

within the last 10 years, or one National Team member.

Turner plans to have a lane condition that is fair for everybody, leaning more towards higher scoring, but not being a house shot. "I want the shot to be fair, a lot of times these big tournaments make the lane conditions so difficult and only cater to the highest level bowlers, but I want to make it so that a wider group of skill levels can be competi-

Jeanne Naccarato Wins 2019 USBC Senior Queens

LAS VEGAS – A year to the day after finishing as the runner-up at the United States Bowling Congress Senior Queens, Jeanne Naccarato of Tacoma, Washington, returned to the title match and came out victorious at the 2019 event.

Naccarato, a USBC Hall of Famer, defeated Australia's Lee Booth, 245-209, to win the title Monday at the Gold Coast Hotel and Casino. Naccarato received the coveted tiara and \$8,000 top prize awarded to the winner, while Booth received \$6,400 for the runner-up finish.

The stepladder finals were broadcast live at BowlTV.com. BowlTV provided wire-to-wire livestream coverage of the 2019

At the 2018 Senior Queens, also held at Gold Coast, Naccarato advanced to the title match but lost to fellow hall of famer Tish Johnson of Colorado

Open Championships Weekly Glance

LAS VEGAS - Defending champion leads four events at USBC Open Championships United States Bowling

Congress Open Championships titlist Ryan Mouw of Muskegon, Michigan, leads four events at the 2019 tournament in Las Vegas after rolling 299 in his final game March 24 in one of the most dramatic finishes in tournament history.

Mouw, a 39-year-old right-hander and a Regular Team champion in 2018, needed the first two strikes in his final frame to secure the lead in both Regular Singles (802 series) and Regular All-Events (2,156).

His clutch performance came just minutes after watching his teammate, and defending Regular All-Events champion Kurt Pilon of Warren, Michigan, and 2007 USBC Masters champion Sean Rash of Montgomery, Illinois, post the numbers to beat in each event, respectively.

Mouw was able to deliver two strikes, before a 6 pin on his final offering ended his run at the first perfect game of the year. His singles series started with games of 258 and 245, and he added sets of 708 in doubles and 646 in team to reach his leading total.

Pilon had closed his singles effort with five strikes to shoot 800, while Rash had raised the all-events number to 2,151. Pilon moved into third place in Regular All-Events in his title defense with 2,150, and Rash landed in third place in singles with 792.

Mouw and Pilon also helped S and B Pro Shop 1 back into the top spot in Regular Team with a 3,254 total March 23

and into the lead in Team All-Events on March 24 with a 9,967 total.

The two were joined on the lanes at the South Point Bowling Plaza by three-time USBC Open Championships titlists Bill Orlikowski (1,949) and Kerry Kreft (1,889), and Andrew Burke (1,823) completed the roster.

Singles champion won't repeat, leads doubles at South Point Bowling Plaza

Cotie Holbek of Burlington, Wisconsin, won't repeat as the Regular Singles champion at the USBC Open Championships, but he has put himself into position to claim a Regular Doubles title in 2019 after taking the lead with Steven Fisher of Winthrop Harbor, Illinois.

The duo catapulted to the top of the standings March 25 with a 1,478 total at the South Point Bowling Plaza, besting the previous leaders by 128 pins.

Holbek, a 25-year-old right-hander who rolled the lone 800 series of the 2018 event in Syracuse, New York (802) to win the singles title, led the doubles effort this year with



games of 266, 234 and 276 for a 776 series. Fisher, a 33-year-old right-hander, fired games of 219, 270 and 213 for a 702 set.

Justin O'Hara of Belleville, Michigan, and Brad Smyth of Oxford, Michigan, previously held the top spot with a 1,350 total, shot just 24 hours earlier.

Holbek added sets of 647 in singles and 559 in team for a 1,982 all-events total, the best of his three tournament appearances. Fisher rolled a 608 series in team and 577 in singles for a 1,887 total.

Two 800s rolled at 2019 Bowlers Journal Championships

Packy Hanrahan of Wichita, Kansas, a 23-year-old lefty two-hander, set the bar in Open Singles at the 2019 Bowlers Journal Championships presented by USBC with games of 299, 279 and 235 for an 813 series March 25.

Less than 24 hours later, with strategic advice from Hanrahan, AJ Rice of Phenix City, Alabama, also a two-hander who uses the left side of

averages of 156-175.





against Tackett with a nine-count to seven for Tackett, who left the 2-8-10 split, for the title.

In the first match, the U.S. team also took the early lead, winning the first game 234-227 but then lost to The World team in the second game 213-202 to force another one-ball roll-off. five 2018 rostered players, will then make the final selection to complete their five-player roster.

In order to be eligible for the draft pool, PBA members must be ranked in the top 40 in the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour competition points standings at the conclusion of the 2019 USBC Masters on April 1. The PBA points list heading into the Masters is noted below, with players in bold already selected for 2019 and an asterisk identifying players who were on a 2018 roster, but not protected and therefore returned to the draft pool.

Once the PBA Playoffs point list is finalized, eligible players will have until Wednesday, April 3, to declare their intent to enter the draft. Following the draft, managers will have until Monday, April 15, to make

player trades if they are so inclined.

April 8 will not only be "draft day" in Portland but will also debut the inaugural round of PBA Playoffs matches that will air later in the evening, live on FS1 at 7 p.m. Eastern. The PBA Playoffs is a new Go Bowling! PBA Tour singles competition that will feature the season's top 24 players in competition points in a single-elimination match play series. The entire PBA Playoff series will air in eight FS1 telecasts in April and May, leading up to the live FOX telecasts of the semifinal and final rounds on June 1 and 2. The winner will earn a PBA Tour title and \$100,000. Bayside Bowl will host the entire PBA Playoffs series.

PBA League players will return to Bayside Bowl for the 2019 PBA League Elias Cup competition on July 16, 17 and 18. All rounds will air live on FOX Sports' FS1 in prime time.



Just Paying Attention

The PBA World Series of Bowling (WSOB) television ratings were pleasing to Fox Sports network executives, according to PBA Commissioner Tom Clark.

Appearing in-studio on the weekly "Castle Lanes Spare Time Bowling Show" on Milwaukee's Sports Radio 105.7FM The Fan on Sunday March 24, Clark told hosts Steve 'Sparky' Fifer, Dwight Albrecht, and Xtra Frame on FloBowling's Phil Brylow, that Fox told him ratings were 30% above Fox's primetime programming that week last year, adding each night's ratings increased as the week progressed. Clark's comments are in the first segment of the two-hour show heard here: (<https://1057fmthefan.radio.com/media/audio-channel/pba-boss-tom-clark-talks-wsob-x>).

The Commissioner also detailed how fans are more energetic during qualifying and match-play, how Fox executives were pleased at the energy and drama on each of the shows, how the weekly replays are a bigger plus than first thought, and how they were able to air four live shows on four straight nights for the first time in Association history.

The "Spare Time Bowling Show" runs Sunday mornings from 9:00 am to 10:00 am Central from December to April and will end for this season Sunday April 7. Past shows on the 105.7FM The Fan radio.com page can be accessed on demand in podcast form, often featuring spirited discussion and a wide variety of interviews from many familiar names from the PBA Tour to local high school coaches and bowlers.

Linda Walbaum of Brighton, Colorado had just reached eligibility as a senior bowler. To start the next chapter of her competitive bowling career, she looked forward to bowling the National Golden Ladies Classic (NGLC) and USBC Senior Queens several weeks ago. An original PWBA regional champion in the 1990's and having bowled and cashing in a handful of PWBA events the past few years, she did suffer the enigma of bowling the last two Luci tournaments as the partner of a certain charming and delightful bowling writer. So at least, I showed her what not to do. I'm not going to take credit for it, but even after my + 38 last year while sort of

bowling on one leg following knee surgery, and after what she called not her best year, she looked forward with hope.

You normally don't think about winning your first senior event ever, but sometimes things happen whether you are ready for them or not, but it did happen. Walbaum won the National Golden Ladies Classic on March 13, defeating top-seeded and two-time defending champion USBC Hall of Famer Jeanne Naccarato (who won the USBC Senior Queens several days later), 226-186.

"I got lucky this year and was able to get enough time off from work to bowl both the National Golden Ladies Classic, the Senior Queens, and the Open Championships in between. Many of us still work and can only get time to one bowl one, not all three," Walbaum told me last week. (The NGLC drew 113 entries, the Sr. Queens drew 84.)

"The atmosphere in the NGLC was nice and relaxed, the Senior Queens was a little more serious. Once I started to bowl, I got relaxed and fell right back into tournament rhythm," she added.

Using a Hammer Black Widow Gold Pearl, she felt comfortable and score well enough to

qualify in the top ten, easily making match play.

"I used that ball pretty much the whole tournament. The only thing I did to it was hit it with a 1000 Abralon pad by hand to knock the shine off, getting it to read a little earlier in the

midlane for the first block of match play, then shining it back just before the stepladder," Walbaum added.

After a stellar 12-6 match play record, she qualified second and would have to bowl against another USBC Hall of Famer, Lucy Sandelin, in the semifinal. Walbaum filled frames, downing Sandelin, 202-149, setting up the title match with eventual Senior Queens winner Naccarato.

After the win, Walbaum took the momentum into the Senior Queens and got close to pulling off back-to-back stepladder appearances, doing something usually reserved for USBC Hall of Famers (like Naccarato). "Made a few moves there

I shouldn't have. It left a bad taste in my gut, but my confidence got a great boost from those two tournaments. I'll be ready for the Luci and both of those next year."

Look for her and partner Kris Koeltzow at this year's Storm PBA/PWBA Striking Against Breast Cancer Mixed Doubles at Copperfield Bowl in July. I wouldn't be surprised if they make it to the at least the cashers/semifinal round.


Later that summer at a national stop I bowled, the PBA Greater Grand Rapids Open,

NEVER EVER Walk Toward Your Target - Part I

Drift is a very important and often misused word in bowling. We talk about it being too much or too little - we shouldn't do it - no, it's really okay if you only do it two boards - no, that's not right - it doesn't matter how much you drift only that you do it in the same direction the same amount every time - whew! You can see there are a lot of ideas about drift. Here's mine: drift is ending up more left or right than your "normal." If you usually drift two left and you ended up four left, you drifted two.

It's difficult to execute consistently when you walk screwy (scientific bowling term). Maybe you don't end up at the foul line on the board on which you started. Good! Maybe you shouldn't. (Such blasphemy!)

Shot Shapes

There are different terminologies across the country for what I am about to discuss. In this BNN series, here are my definitions as they apply to a righthander:

- An up-the-boards shot is a shot which goes from right to left. This means at no point on the lane does the ball travel farther outside than the board

on which it was laid down. If the laydown point is 7, the ball would then go to 8 and then to 9 and then to 10 on its way toward the 17th board at the pocket. This is not something a righty gets to do very often in league.

- A down-the-boards shot is one which goes in the same direction as the boards until some point where (you hope!), it moves toward the pocket. This is sometimes mistakenly called "up the lane" or "up the boards."

- An away or out and in shot is also known as swinging or bellying the ball. Any shot which goes farther out than the board it first touched is an away shot. If the ball is put down on 12 and goes out to 11, it is an away shot. If it's put down on 12 and goes to the 1st board before moving toward the pocket, it's an away shot. How many boards it crosses doesn't


Mythological Bowling



Springs, Colorado, in the finals, 267-191.

This year, Naccarato secured the top seed and left little doubt in the finals, delivering strikes on seven of her first eight deliveries on her way to the title. Booth, who started the championship round with three consecutive strikes, only was able to record one more strike in the game.

Naccarato, a 61-year-old right-hander, moved closer to the outside portion of the lane on this week's 40-foot oil pattern as the rounds of competition continued at Gold Coast, which played into her strengths.

"During qualifying, the lanes were very touchy and the scores reflected that," said Naccarato, who's also a Professional Women's Bowling Association Hall of Fame member. "As the days progressed, the lanes kept getting tighter, so I just kept inching my way out there. In practice, I always try to throw some shots outside, and I thought I may have found something. I found a couple of balls that reacted really well, and I've always been pretty sharp playing outside."

Naccarato, a 10-time champion on the PWBA Tour, had several close calls at the USBC Queens, including four trips to the stepladder finals and a runner-up finish at the 1991 event.

Her win at the 2019 Senior Queens gave her the opportunity to realize one of her dreams.

"This means the world to me," Naccarato said. "I was never able to win the Queens. I finished second, third, fourth, you name it. To be able to win it this week with so many great competitors really means everything."

Naccarato went undefeated in match play to earn the top seed and clinched her spot in the stepladder by defeating Booth, 640-599. With the tournament's true double-elimination format, Booth would

have needed to defeat Naccarato twice to claim the title.

Booth bested Laura Hardeman of Chula Vista, California, to move onto the championship round, 201-171. Hardeman was the top qualifier at the 2019 event, averaging more than 206 through Saturday's and Sunday's qualifying rounds.

Hardeman advanced to the semifinals by defeating Johnson, 197-169. Johnson was looking to join fellow hall of famer and three-time Senior Queens champion Robin Romeo of Newhall, California, as the only player to successfully defend a title at the event.

Since 2012, Johnson has advanced to the stepladder finals seven times at the Senior Queens. In addition to her win in 2018, she had four consecutive runner-up finishes from 2013-2016 and a fourth-place finish in 2012.

Hardeman survived a 10th-frame open to win Monday's opening match against Debbie Ayers of La Mesa, California, 182-174. Ayers needed to deliver a double in her final frame to advance but left a 6-10 combination on her first attempt.

A four-player shootout round determined the No. 3, No. 4 and No. 5 seeds for the stepladder. Johnson paced the group with a 638 series to earn the No. 3 seed. Hardeman was next with 596, while Ayers grabbed the final spot with a 586 total. Linda Walbaum of Brighton, Colorado, was eliminated in sixth place with a 562 series.

The 2019 Senior Queens welcomed 84 of the top female

players age 50 and older to Gold Coast this week. All competitors bowled 15 games of qualifying over two days to determine the 31 players joining Johnson in match play.

Bracket play consisted of three-game matches leading up to the stepladder finals, with total pinfall determining who advanced.
