


## Anthony Lavery-Spahr Wins Third PBA Regional Title in Odessa Southwest Open

Odessa, Texas, (March 20, 2017) – Anthony Lavery-Spahr from Pasadena, Texas, defeated Derek Acuff of Glendale, Ariz.,

234-199, to claim his fourth Professional Bowlers Association Regional title Sunday in the sixth annual PBA Odessa Southwest Open at Astro Bowl.

Lavery-Spahr, last year's runner-up, started the championship match with a spare and two strikes while Acuff struggled with two opens in the first three frames, and put up a minimal challenge the rest of the match while Lavery-Spahr continued to strike on his way to the title.

Lavery-Spahr, who finished the qualifying rounds in fourth place, received byes to the Round of 8 where he started his road to victory by defeating defending champion Clara Guerrero, a Colombia native now living in Pflugerville, Texas, 2-1, in their best-of-three-game match. In the semifinal round, he survived with a 173-164 victory over Jeff Hatt of Midwest City, Okla.

Acuff, who qualified second, advanced to the finals by defeating Joe Findling from Mesquite, Texas, 2-0, in the Round of 8, and prevented

a title match between twin brothers by eliminating Sean Lavery-Spahr in the semifinal round, 200-178.

Acuff earned \$1,700 for second place. Sean Lavery-Spahr and Hatt each received \$1,025 as semifinal round losers.

The PBA Southwest Region's next event is the PBA Grand Casino/Hotel/Resort Open in Shawnee, Okla., at FireLake Bowling Center, March 31-April 2. The PBA Houston Copperfield Southwest Challenge follows April 14-16. Challenge tournaments are limited to amateurs who have never won a PBA event, and to members who do not have a PBA title.

## Immediate Schedule and Policy Changes Ahead for Open Championships

LAS VEGAS - The remainder of the 2017 United States Bowling Congress Open Championships will have an adjusted squad schedule, with the evening squads pushing back to 5:30 p.m. and 9:30 p.m.

The change will be effective April 1, and all team captains will be notified by email, along with the traditional schedule notices sent out approximately one month prior to their competition dates (for teams bowling May 1 or later).

Data collected during the first five weeks of competition at the South Point Bowling Plaza has indicated that squads are running an average of 13 minutes longer than the two previous years using the current schedule, heavily impacting the start time of the later squads.



To lessen the inconvenience on bowlers competing later in the day, the final two squads have been changed from 5 p.m. and 8:30 p.m., respectively.

The schedule for the 2018 USBC Open Championships in Syracuse, New York, also will be adjusted to address the current trends. Team competition in 2018 will be held at 11 a.m. and 7 p.m., and doubles and singles will be bowled at 7 a.m., 2:30 p.m. and 10:45 p.m.

## IBMA 2017 Major Award Winners Announced



ARLINGTON, Texas - The votes have been tallied and the winners notified for the 2017 International Bowling Media Association major awards. Members were sent ballots to vote in five categories for the Luby Hall of Fame Award, Alberta E. Crowe Meritorious Service Award, Hennessy Award of Merit and Male and Female Bowlers and Senior Bowlers of the Year. Ballots were distributed in a single poll for each of the five categories. The ballot period was February 7 - 19, 2017.

For only the second time in the history of the organization, there was a tie for a major award. This time in the fledgling Hennessy Award of Merit Category (see below). Albert Matzell and Frank Esposito were both awarded the Meritorious Service Award in 1984.

Winners will be presented with their awards on Tuesday, June 20, 2017 during the BPAA International Bowl Expo Industry Awards Luncheon at the Gaylord Opryland Hotel in Nashville.

### JOHNNY CAMPOS - LUBY HALL OF FAME AWARD

While majoring in journalism at the University of Texas, Johnny Campos published his first bowling related article in the Daily Texan campus newspaper about a 6'8" star on the college basketball team who was also a very formidable bowler. He's been finding and writing stories like that ever since.

Because he has always written superbly, especially about a sport he loves to play, shortly out of college Campos started a bowling column at the Brownsville Herald. He took that column to bigger market sports writing gigs in Laredo and San Antonio.

His work caught the attention of the PBA who hired him as Tour Press Director in 1983. Moving to the administrative side, Campos ultimately became the PBA's main man on the road when he succeeded retiring Tournament Director Harry Golden in 1990.

Eventually family and a career opportunity took him to Peoria, Ill., and a position with the Caterpillar Inc. It also provided an opening for Campos to take over a bowling column for the Peoria Journal Star that he continues to this day, providing readers with local and national coverage of the sport. He's also a frequent contributor to Bowlers Journal International.

### ROBERT THOMAS - ALBERTA E. CROWE MERITORIOUS SERVICE AWARD

Bob Thomas is currently the Assistant General Manager of the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nevada. He was introduced to the business by his dad and mom in the early

70's when they co-owned and operated a 12 lane bowling center in Blythe, California. After graduating from Northern Arizona University in 1983 with a BS in Business, Thomas moved to Tucson, working at Cactus Bowling Centers, honing his skills under Jack Cook. He quickly moved up the ranks working under Mike Kaufman who now oversees the Boyd Coast Bowling Centers.

In 1989 Thomas moved to Las Vegas to work at the Showboat where he became more involved with tournament bowling. The prestigious events were all held at the Showboat

and Thomas was able to learn how to conduct and promote tournaments with many different kinds of formats.

Thomas was hired to be the new bowling manager at the Reno Hilton in 1993 and moved his family to Reno to begin a new adventure. With his connections at the Showboat and his relationship with the PBA he was able to bring the PBA to Reno with Hilton Hotels sponsoring tournaments. Reno became his new hometown.

In 1996 Bob was hired to work at the National Bowling Stadium where he has spent

# Minnesota Bowler Records 900 Series

ARLINGTON, Texas - Brady Stearns of St. Cloud, Minnesota, never thought he'd see a 900 series, let alone bowl one of his own.

Now, he's happily wading through a flood of congratulatory messages after becoming the latest bowler to roll 36 consecutive strikes in United States Bowling Congress-certified competition.

The 23-year-old right-hander tossed three perfect games Tuesday in the City league at St. Cloud's Southway Bowl to join Darin Pomije of New Prague as the second bowler from Minnesota to achieve the score. Pomije recorded his 900 series in December 2004.

Stearns treated the night as a series of hurdles, rather than focusing on the end result - 900 - and that seemed to keep the nerves at bay.

After starting the night with the 18th perfect game of his career, Stearns kept striking and started to think about back-to-back 300s, something he's never done. As the strikes added up, his attention turned to the center's strike jackpot, but he still didn't let the idea of 900 creep into his mind.

"When we got to the last game, I did my best to treat it like another game and just concentrate on making good shots, one at a time," Stearns said. "I knew I had the strike pot around the eighth frame,

and after that was the first time I thought about the possibility of 900. At the time, I didn't want to worry too much about it. Whether I did it or not, my life wouldn't change too much, and I'd still be going to work in the morning."

Stearns did go to work Wednesday to assume his role as the manager at the local Little Caesars, but he felt a little different after all, more so as the messages rolled in and the magnitude of the accomplishment continued to sink in.

It also turns out the owners of the store he manages are bowlers and both were at Southway Bowl to witness his success Tuesday night.

They support Stearns' passion for bowling and allow him to have weekends off to compete, which he has done for the last few years alongside some of Minnesota's top performers.

Stearns specifically mentioned the likes of Dan Bock and Chad Nelson, whom he recently accompanied to the USBC Masters in Las Vegas, an event that is proving to be a turning point in his own bowling career.

"I bowled in the Masters for the first time, and even though I didn't cash, just getting that experience and watching all the great bowling really showed me what it takes to succeed at that level," said Stearns.

rns, who finished tied for 237th place in a field of more than 390 competitors. "I returned home extremely motivated and ready to work on my game, and it really has paid off during the last month or so."

Following his 15 games of qualifying at the Masters, Stearns got some feedback and advice from Professional Bowlers Association Tour star Bill O'Neill, whom he'd crossed with all week at The Orleans Bowling Center.

Having some of the best bowlers, both locally and nationally, in his corner helps reinforce the lessons Stearns learned from his father, Bob, a former PBA Tour player, who was part of the team that brought Southway Bowl into existence in the early 1970s.

Bob taught Brady and his brother, Scott, how to bowl about 10 years ago, and Brady has worked hard to get better.

The 2017 Masters, and the confidence and success that have followed, have Stearns more motivated than ever. However, he's not quite ready to give up his day job.

"I've been fortunate to be able to bowl with some great bowlers the last few years, and it definitely has helped me improve," Stearns said. "It has been a progression, thanks to bowling more and against better competition, and it has me wanting to get even better and learn as much as I can. In a perfect world, I'd be able to go bowl on the Tour, but for now, I'll continue working and plan to return to the Masters and do better there each year."

Stearns' achievement is pending approval from USBC and would be the 33rd USBC-approved 900. It marks the fourth perfect series of the 2016-2017 season and third of 2017.





Koprowitz is the top-ranked student at North Mac High School with a 4.33 grade-point average (4.0 scale). She has taken college prep classes in algebra, biology, physics, trigonometry, calculus and genetics, is an Illinois State Scholar and president of the National Honor Society.

She is a Worldwide Youth in Science and Engineering and Gifted Olympiad member, is president of the Science Club and Student Council vice president. As secretary of the Key Club, she helped organize quarterly blood drives through the Central Illinois Community Blood Center. She also volunteers at the Girard Food Pantry.

Koprowitz was introduced to the sport of bowling when she was 3.

"My father bowled growing up, and he started my three older brothers and me in league at young ages," Koprowitz said. "Having my older brothers to compete against on the lanes really pushed me. It wasn't until my early teenage years that I really began to bowl competitively. Both of my par-

ents have been a huge support for me, and I can't thank them enough."

On the lanes, she won high school regional and sectional individual titles in 2017 and finished eighth in the Illinois High School Association state tournament. She had top-four individual finishes in the IHSA regionals and sectionals both her sophomore and junior seasons and was named to the 2015-2016 Dexter/USBC All-America Team.

She finished 87th in the U20 division at the 2016 Junior Gold Championships and was 32nd in U20 in 2015. As a U15 participant in 2015, she qualified for match play but lost in her third match in the bracket.

Koprowitz will continue her bowling career at St. Ambrose University in the fall. She plans to major in nursing and currently is enrolled in a Certified Nursing Assistant course, so she can get an early start in the field.

The Alberta E. Crowe Star of Tomorrow Award is named in honor of the USBC Hall of Fame member who was a seven-term president of the Women's International Bowling Congress. It first was awarded in 1961.



Some other observations:  
The average rev rate on tour is about 450.

Tommy Jones is now a power tweener.

In a completely unrelated note – size DOES NOT matter! (Player of the Year, E.J. Tackett's rev rate maxes out at 600 rpms at 140 pounds soaking wet). If you want to be better than your peers at a younger age – max out your rev rate.

We've had the two youngest major winners ever within the last year – Jesper Svensson and DFW's own Anthony Simonsen.

In a very related note – 2 handed bowling is not illegal, creates a lot of power, and is here to stay.

Note to self – teach sons to bowl two handed.

XtraFrame now has two live feeds... 8 lanes is better than 4.

Kyle Troup does not need an afro to get attention.

Belmonte just ended a 16 show television streak without a win.

16 shows in 2 years does not constitute "a slump."

**My top 5 "under 25 – I think I bowled with him in the Jr pro-am once."**

**E.J. Tackett -**

His rev rate maxes out at 600RPM (I know – right?!). He has caught some breaks and is starting to win on TV. He is the reigning Player of the Year.

Yeah – I'm really stepping out on a limb here.

**Anthony Simonsen –**

He is the real deal. In his case, age doesn't matter. Life circumstances have made him wise beyond his years and driven to succeed. He is in the process of transitioning from the underdog/great story to one of the favorites, week in and week out. While that sounds like a great thing, the expectations both internally and externally can be pretty overwhelming. He is a passionate and driven guy and there will be some frustrations that will show through from time to time. Not an easy task, but I think he will get through to the other side and be a force for a while.

**Frankie Lavoie –**

Another one weighing in at 140 lbs. after "pizza day" (these skinny guys are starting to annoy me), this guy is the consummate shot maker. He can play everywhere on the lane, has good, bordering on great speed control and is very accurate. So basically, except for being a French speaking Canadian, I pretty much want to be him.

Speaking of Ciminelli company, for the past 20 years, this would normally be a shoe in. 2 PBA titles and 9 regionals breaking Mike Scroggins regional wins in a season record. A very Rhino-esque type season, can he repeat it again after switching companies?







# THE SOUTHWEST REPORT



**Saying "I missed my target"**  
I hear this all the time. People roll the ball and then whirl around disgustingly, muttering "I missed my target." They turn from the lane as soon as they miss, ignoring what happened to the shot. By doing that, they miss the most important part of the discovery process.

Self-handicapping, as Dr. Dean Hinitz says, is like closing your eyes to shoot free throws and then saying the reason you missed was because your eyes were closed. Well, this is the same type of thing. It's as if missing the target is the excuse that negates anything the ball does. Missing the target is not the panacea

for what happened. It's just a symptom. Don't let missing the target be an excuse for not watching the ball all the way down the lane or through the deck. That's a great mistake to make. To assume a shot has no value because you didn't roll it where you intended is a very costly error. Those who watch what the ball does learn a lot more a lot faster than those who don't. You give the watchers an incredible advantage by ignoring the information your shot is giving you.

**Being overly analytical**  
I'm not just talking about accountants and engineers here. Many different personality types can do something well and then think they can repeat

it by analyzing the squatchy out of it. I don't believe I have ever seen that work. Of course, you have to be aware of what has happened on the lane and analyze what to do with all that data you've been gathering but once you've decided, get on with it. Don't second guess or question your decision.

Analyzing it, thinking about it, gritting your teeth, analyzing it again to be sure, pursing your lips and really, really focusing on it won't get

you any closer to being able to repeat it. I'm not saying that if you are the analytical type you'll never make a great bowler. I don't want you to deny your experiences or try to be someone you are not when you're bowling. If you want to analyze, go for it. And then ACT ON YOUR ANALYSIS.

It's the second guessing and doubts and hesitation that kills your execution, not the analysis. Flow and repeatability are mindless. You know you can

do it. You already have. It's not that you can't; you just aren't. Make your decision, believe in whatever you've decided, and go for it. Your body already knows how if you can just get your mind to shut up!

evening squads to have a great experience at the event and not spend extended time waiting," USBC Executive Director Chad Murphy said. "Our staff will take steps to encourage faster play, but we also believe it is best to adjust the evening squad times for Syracuse in 2018."

Additional slow bowling enforcement will be implemented moving forward to help keep competition running on time.

Per tournament rules, the recommended time allotment for team event is three hours and 20 minutes, while doubles and singles competition should take approximately three hours and 40 minutes.

Beginning April 1, teams that have not reached the halfway point of their second game (or bowlers who have not completed doubles) through half of their squad time, will receive a formal warning for slow bowling and be given the rest of the squad to get back on time. After being warned, those who exceed their allotted squad times will be assigned to the last squad of the day in 2018.

Information collected earlier in the 2017 Open Championships and running lists of habitually slow bowlers tracked during the 2015 and 2016 events also will be used to determine squad assignments in 2018.

If you've noticed on the big four (PBA XtraFrame USBC bowl.tv onYouTube, BowlStreamTV, and InsideBowling.com), camera angles do get changed going from qualifying to match play, and from match play to stepladder finals. With play limited to one pair, it's easier to move cameras into more familiar spots we've become accustom to on network television. But with qualifying across a whole house at the same time, those camera positions are almost impossible right now. Without camera unit tilting and panning, watching qualifying can be a bit tedious.

More labor would be needed for more graphics, more cameras, even a variety of camera angles and positions, but that

also means additional funding to make that happen. Commercials would help, I think the equipment and manpower of a television network. But right now, that's what separates national television from live streaming.

It's out for purchase now, the April edition of Bowlers Journal International. The chat I had with Jack Biondolillo was another couple of hours I won't soon forget. It's the fifth TV 300 game I've written about. Why? The background and details about what happened before, during, and after those games is simply stunning, and in a few cases mind-boggling to overcome the odds those games did to stick in our collective craw.

# Just Paying Attention

As the eight regular readers of this column and many of you also know, I spent a vast majority of the 1980's in St. Cloud, Minnesota. First, there were four years at St. Cloud State University, then working at radio stations and bowling centers in town before moving to Chicago in the early 90's.

First thing that struck me about Minnesota was the stoic nature of the people. Egos are at a minimum, at best. If you achieve success, or do something extremely noteworthy, the achiever is quick to credit others with the help it took to achieve that feat. That last sentence explains much of what you will read later.

I've featured a few 900 series in the column, but this one is different, very different for me. I had a great chat in November with Sean Osbourn (seen in this column), who set the Texas state record with his effort at Houston's Copperfield Bowl, besting Bill Fong's legendary 899 at Plano Super Bowl. Then there was the 900 rolled weeks ago in a Chicagoland center I bowled league in the 1990's.

Brady Stearns' 900 last week at Southway Bowl was rolled on the pair next to my then-association record 826 series pair almost thirty years ago. SCSU hosted the old Association of

College Unions International (ACU-I) multi-sport tourney in 1983, with the the second day of the bowling competition at Southway Bowl. It was also a league house for me for seven seasons after that. Brady's dad, Bob, built and opened Southway in 1974 as the original owner.

So, when my phone blew up on my way home Tuesday night, I had to pull over and start confirming what had been reported on Facebook. One thought was about his dad, Bob. He had mentored dozens of bowlers with PBA dreams, several of whom made their mark nationally and several others winning PBA Regional titles, which I am proud to be one of that very small group.

The younger Stearns was a little unhappy about his performance at the USBC Masters a month ago. After sitting down with cross partner, PBA standout Bill O'Neill, he explained to Stearns what he saw and offered a few other pieces of advice. With much work and fine tuning, the young Stearns still didn't do as well as he wanted. Physical adjustments took longer to become familiar, but when they did, the result on Tuesday night March 28 was something no one could have foreseen. Although born outside

Austin in Cedar Point, 23 years ago, the Minnesota way of life in him came out in how he answered one of the first questions I asked. He talked about getting a helping hand from O'Neill.

"He pulled me aside after qualifying to tell me a few things, the main thing was my pushaway tends to go a little to the right, which gets it behind my back. That makes it difficult when I need to play the lanes a little straighter. He added the straighter pushaway can get you into a better leverage spot at the bottom of the swing would get me to what I wanted to try to accomplish. Once I started to work on that, everything kinda clicked," said Stearns.

After opening up with the front 24, he didn't think too much about what might happen in the next game. As usual, his lead-off man father didn't say too much to Brady, the team anchor.

The house strike pot hadn't been hit for a while and was at a noticeably nice figure. The eight frame strike took care of that and the airfare to Vegas for the USBC Open Championships at the end of the month was now paid.

Brady's dad is arguably the best bowler ever to come out of St. Cloud, having seen it for myself. Bob had changed his primary ball roll from a spinner he used on tour, to one with a 90-degree axis rotation, one of only two bowlers I've seen in person to do this with success. That's when you put a piece of tape on a ball's axis point and find it smack dab in the middle of the image of the ball as you look at it from the foul line as it rolls down the lane until it begins to flare. Oh, and the other bowler I've seen do this live and on television? Pete Weber.

I really haven't seen Brady bowl much until the Facebook live video and the local television story airing last Thursday

### Week of March 8


