Summers, Stephens, Oatman and Johnson Win Innaugural Rudy Garcia Memorial Foursome at Cowtown Bowling Palace

FORT WORTH, TX - The Jackson team (Jesse Jackson, Joe Lecroy, Mark Busscher, Eric Traylor) were in 9th place going into the last qualifying game of the SASBA Rudy Garcia Memorial Foursome at Cowtown Bowling Palace Saturday, March 31.

They won all 14 points to clinch the 5th spot in the Baker stair step finals.

The first match they faced Team Bailey (Phil Bailey, Doug Barron, Hank Jordan, Tyson Branagan) and were defeated 235-225 to claim 5th and

\$1,200.

Team Bailey then defeated Team Keenan (Bill Keenan, Mike Sams, Rick Cheshier, Mykel Holliman) 227-194. Team Keenan finished 4th and took home \$1,460.

In the third match, the Bailey team bowled Team Adam (A.C. Adam, Don Blatchford,

Pete Thomas, Ted Pritts) and lost 279-236 setting up the final match with leading qualifiers Team Summers (Randy Summers, Jim Stephens, Billy Oatman, Chris Johnson). Team Bailey placed 3rd and collected \$2,130.

Team Summers prevailed 244-223 to win the title and \$4,340 first place prize money.

Team Adam was runner-up for \$2,860.

It was the 33rd SASBA title for Jim, the 7th for Randy and the 5th for Billy.

Jared Hoover had the only 300 game. High averages: 70s- AC Adam 231.7; 60s- Doug Hayes 244.4; 50s- Pete Thomas 231.9; Guest - Ted Pritts 251.6.

As you may have noticed we have renamed this tournament after Rudy Garcia who passed away last week. Rudy was a regular at SASBA events for many years and will be sorely missed. RIP Rudy.

Belmonte Ready to Defend Title at 2018 Masters

SYRACUSE, N.Y. - Often, while most of Orange, New South Wales, Australia, is asleep, Jason Belmonte is on the lanes honing his skills.

The late-night practice isn't done to be secretive, it's done because being the best bowler in the world, as well as trying to be the world's best husband and parent, takes sacrifice and a well-balanced schedule.

So, the 17-time Professional Bowlers Association Tour champion hits the lanes when his wife, Kimberly, and their three children comfortably are in bed, most recently, preparing to put his title on the line at the 2018 United States Bowling Congress Masters.

The event will take place April 9-15 at the Oncenter Convention Center in Syracuse, the 48-lane custom tournament venue that will be home to the 2018 USBC Open Championships until July. The two events are sharing the biggest stage in bowling for the first time since 2011.

The 2018 Masters will conclude live on ESPN on April 15 at 1 p.m. Eastern, with the winner taking home a \$30,000 top prize.

Belmonte is in a familiar position, having won the USBC Masters a record four times, and he feels the unique format helps make the effects of traveling almost 10,000 miles a little less of a factor.

"I've been known to start events kind of slow, usually because I'm a little tired or jet-lagged, and my body and brain aren't working well together

yet," said Belmonte, who also won the Masters three consecutive times from 2013-2015. "This will be the first event of the trip, and the format, along with being the defending champion, will take off some of the pressure of having to get off to a blazing start."

As the defending champion, the 34-year-old two-hander is guaranteed the No. 64 spot in the double-elimination match-play bracket at the Masters, but he can improve his seeding by bowling well during the 15 games of qualifying.

In previous years as the reigning champion, Belmonte finished qualifying first (2014), tied for ninth (2015) and first (2016), and he has no interest in using his free pass this year in Syracuse.

"I definitely want to try to stay well ahead of that 64th spot, and I don't want to have to use the defending champion clause," said Belmonte, a four-time PBA Player of the Year. "But, I feel I can be patient and let my body get comfortable."

Belmonte has been home since the conclusion of a four-event swing on the Go Bowling! PBA Tour in late February, and while that stint did yield a doubles title with Bill O'Neill at the Mark Roth-Marshall Holman PBA Doubles Championship presented by BowlerX.com, it would be tough to harness the confidence and momentum from that successful swing because so much time has passed.

Heading into the Masters,

Open Championships Weekly Glance

SYRACUSE, NY (March 28 - April 3) - Michigan group makes statement at USBC Open Championships

Kurt Pilon of Warren, Michigan, has excelled at many levels of the sport of bowling, and he helped his two-team group find success at the 2018 United States Bowling Congress Open Championships this week in Syracuse, New York.

Pilon averaged nearly 243 over nine games at the On-center Convention Center and leads Regular All-Events with a 2,186 total. The effort included sets of 763 in team, 752 in doubles and 671 in singles.

The 45-year-old right-hander first helped S&B Pro Shop 1 to the lead in Regular Team with a 3,322 total on March 28 and carried the momentum into the next day, where he teamed with Andrew Burke of St. Clair Shores, Michigan, to claim the top spot in Regular Doubles with 1,331. Burke, a 31-year-old right-hander, finished his 2018 tournament campaign with a



1,895 all-events total.

Burke and Pilon were joined by Ryan Mouw (1,950), Marcus McClain (1,940) and two-time USBC Open Championships titlist Bill Orlikowski (1,737) for a Team All-Events-leading 9,708 total.

"We've put together a decent group, we found some success and we hope to continue to grow from there," said Pilon, who made his 24th Open Championships appearance. "I'm very happy with the results, even though as a player, you always feel like you left something out there. We bowled well, but I am sure the scores will be improved upon."

Just Paying Attention

Eighteen months ago, I made a suggestion in this column that was called outlandish, bizarre, strange, and very much out of left field. And those were by the eight loyal regular readers who have been here since the beginning. I won't mention what the critics had to say. It's just the first step in a long and detailed process, but who knows.

In an exclusive to The Bowling News, JPA has confirmed the Harris County County Houston Sports Authority (HCHSA) has submitted a bid to the United States Bowling Congress host the 2022 Open Championships in Houston.

HCHSA Events Manager Holly Kesterson said they are in communication with USBC on venue specifications as part of the bidding process.

What is yet to be determined is which facility will host the tournament, if the bid is accepted by the USBC. Kesterson was not able to provide more information on the bid at this point. Other involved sources in this story have acknowledged to me off the record there have been informal discussions, as first reported in JPA here in the October 6, 2016 TBN.

The Harris County Houston Sports Authority is the local government agency that owns, operates, and assists in the marketing of convention centers, designated venues, as well as arenas and stadiums used by each of the city's four professional sports teams (MLB Astros, NFL Texans, NBA Rockets, MLS Dynamo).

In a March 27th USBC media conference, USBC Executive Director Chad Murphy addressed the 2022 OC site selection process and why this one is taking longer than it has for other years.

"We have a couple of different cities the we are still working actively with and talking about it," Murphy stated, "it's the future that we are looking at, rather than the present. We'd like to be able to shift the (convention center) model to be able to be in more locations."

Much current convention center business today consists of many smaller events in shorter spans of time, rather than one bigger event like the OC, which needs a larger space for six to eight months from build up to the event itself to tear down.

According to the HCHSA website, houstonsports.org,

both NRG Center and the George R. Brown Convention Center have the necessary square footage and space requirements to accommodate the Open Championships.

However, both buildings, especially the Brown Convention Center, just blocks from Minute Maid Park and BBVA Compass Stadium on the east side of downtown, host many weekly and weekend events. You may have heard about the Brown Center, as it was a relief and supplies station during Hurricane Harvey.

If those two are not available based on the time frame, that would present the need for another third choice. One potential choice is scheduled for a repurposing project starting in this October and if plans stay on schedule could be ready by 2020.

The Harris County Commissioners Court voted in February to approve design plans and begin renovations to the 'Eighth Wonder of the World', the iconic Houston Astrodome.

According to the Houston Chronicle, part of which was also detailed in that October 2016 column, the \$105 million dollar plan adding two levels of parking, raising the current stadium floor to street level, creating 130,000 to 174,000 square feet of floor space, more than the USBC-required amount for a tournament site. The moveable swiveling seat decks allowing conversion from baseball to football and rodeo would be removed. Construction would begin in this October and be completed in the spring of 2020.

One third of the project's funding would come from the county's general fund of property taxes, one third from hotel occupancy taxes, and one third from county parking fees. A referendum on a similar plan was voted down by Harris County voters in 2013, one of several put to voters in recent years. That would have essentially stripped the building down to the steel beams

holding the Dome itself aloft, rebuilding everything inside from scratch.

The current plan has not been totally embraced with many areas of Harris County still rebuilding from Hurricane Harvey late last August. Harris County Commissioner Judge Ed Emmett told KPRC-TV News one major reason is the project can start paying for itself quickly as well as in the long term years from now.

"It's important that the Dome start raising revenue that can help pay for upgrades to the stadium and all of NRG Park," Emmett said.

NRG Park campus also includes a smaller exhibit hall NRG Arena, the larger NRG Center, just north of the Astrodome, and NRG Stadium, 200 feet west of the Dome, home of the NFL Houston Texans (also host to Super Bowls 38 and 51 and the 2016 NCAA Final Four), and the Houston Livestock and Rodeo Show.

For those of you north and west of the Ohio River, 'Rodeo' is a three-week long festival every March with rodeo competitions in the day and major-headliner concerts at night, annually drawing two and a half million people (Astrodome hosted from 1966 to 1999). Garth Brooks was the first act to open AND close the 2018 Rodeo nighttime concert schedule. Yes, it's very much

Texas-sized, too.

According to the USBC in a communication to me several weeks ago, the Open Championships in a non-bowling center environment requires 130,000 square feet, 90,000 of it has to be unobstructed (pillar free) with a 30-foot unobstructed ceiling within an air-cooled environment. In the March 27th press conference, Murphy cited a 105,000 square foot requirement with a 30-foot ceiling.

In either case, with a potential of three to four acres inside the Dome, the roof is about 150 feet to the apex (it was 184' from the original 1965 playing surface to the gondola at the apex). Using only the new and larger circular area, a unique design would be needed for the locker and scale room, staff offices, vendors, and pro shops.

Since plans have yet to be drawn, it is unclear whether existing concession space would be used or new space would house the food service and preparation. With the floor on the same level as the existing original circular concourse level, either pro shops or support staff could be housed there, opening up more area on the new circular floor space.

The only submitted bid I've been able to confirm to the USBC is from Harris County

lington and also at its website, www.bowlingmuseum.com
"With help from USBC, pictures and video from the collection were used, but digitized video from the Frame4Frame project was included, some of which has not been seen in a very long time. Later this summer, the video will be part of an online exhibit as well featuring pictures, collection objects, and historical archived material as well," Bell said.

To illustrate F4F project issues, Bell explained technology advancement has not slowed how footage has been restored.

"Ten years ago, everyone was transferring everything to DVD, and it is the nature of technology of how quickly things change. Now, we are changing everything into a completely digital format. Once we have it transferred (to digital), it's not going to disintegrate. We have that history forever, and that's one of the amazing things about the Frame4Frame project," Bell added.

Among other projects she's putting together this year are two new 'Hometown Heroes' kiosks in the National Bowling Stadium's satellite museum in time for this year's USBC Women's Championships. An original feature of the museum going back to its St. Louis days in the 1980s, the kiosks allow bowlers to look up those who have rolled honor scores.

The USBC Hall of Famer hanging plaques are being updated, including adding 2018 inductee plaques, as well as several new displays inside the larger glass cases. Bell will be busy this week with an updated display for this year's USBC Women's Championships featuring a display in the main concourse at the NBS.



That opportunity got away from Belmonte at the recent PBA Tournament of Champions, where he finished fourth, and the Barbasol PBA Players Championship, where he was the top seed and lost to Tom Smallwood of Saginaw, Michigan, in the title match, 259-239.

"At the first two majors this

year, when I had a chance to tie the record, it wasn't in my mind," Belmonte said. "I certainly would like to have one shot back from the Tournament of Champions, but I bowled the best game I could at the Players Championship. Tom bowled a great game at me. Winning a 10th major would be incredibly special, but I won't be thinking about it. I just want to stay focused on knocking down as many pins as I can."

The 2018 Masters will feature a total prize fund of \$270,000 and again is a major event on the PBA Tour.




