

## Francois Lavoie Rolls 300 to Wins PBA FireLake/Grand Casino Resort Southwest Open

Shawnee, OK – Reigning PBA Rookie of the Year Francois Lavoie, who rolled the only nationally-televised 300 game in U.S. Open history on his way to the 2016 title, did it again Sunday at FireLake Bowling Center in defeating

collegiate amateur Wesley Low Jr. of Palmdale, Calif., 300-216, in the title match of the sixth annual PBA FireLake Grand Casino Resort Southwest Open presented by MOTIV.

Lavoie, who had advanced

to the championship round in his last two Southwest region events only to fall short of victory when his opponents bowled games of 279 and 266, left no opportunity for loss by tossing the event's second 300 game. After qualifying third place and receiving byes to advance to the Round of 8, the Canadian native eliminated Mike Edwards of Tulsa, Okla., 2-0, in a best-of-three-game match and then edged PBA Southwest Region Hall of Famer Nathan Bohr of Austin, Texas, 222-201, in the semifinal round.

Low, a two-handed left-handed player, qualified in ninth place and had a longer road to the final. In his opening match, he defeated Joe Findling of Mesquite, Texas, 2-1, and then put away PBA rookie and Team USA member AJ Chapman of Manchester, Iowa, 2-0. In his semifinal round match, Low easily disposed Mike Bailey of Irving, Texas, 258-180.



## Wes Malott to Defend Throne as PBA Revives "King of Bowling"



CHICAGO - After an eight-year hiatus, the Professional Bowlers Association is reviving its made-for-television King of Bowling special event as part of a new Xtra Frame Pay Per View series, with reigning "king" Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, defending his throne during the PBA's return to Bayside Bowl in Portland, Maine, next week.

The first event in the made-for-Xtra Frame series, which will be available for \$2.99 per event, will pit Malott against two of the PBA's hottest players, 2016 PBA Player of the Year EJ Tackett of Huntington, Ind., and Australia's Jason Belmonte, who won Player of the Year honors the previous three years, in a three-game total pinfall winner-take-all match. Coverage of the match on Wednesday, April 12, will

begin with a pre-game show at 6:30 p.m. ET.

Proceeds from each special pay per view event will determine the prize money paid to the King of Bowling winner. The one-time \$2.99 special event fee will apply to all viewers, including current Xtra Frame subscribers. ## PBA Returns to Maine for Bigger, Better, Louder Week of Competition

Roth/Holman Doubles Championship joins L.L. Bean PBA League in expanded Bayside Bowl

PORTLAND, Maine - The Professional Bowlers Association will return to Portland April 9-16 for a third consecutive year of competition that promises to be bigger, better and louder than ever.

Significant changes for 2017 include:

An expanded Bayside Bowl complex, with eight new lanes and a mezzanine overlooking the new lanes where five ESPN television shows will be contested, meaning there will be room for twice as many enthusiastic, energetic and boisterous Maine bowling fans compared to previous years.

New corporate partners: world-famous Maine-based retailer L.L. Bean will sponsor the 2017 L.L. Bean PBA League Elias Cup competition, and the Maine Office of Tour-

ism's MaineQuarterly.com will sponsor the Mark Roth/Marshall Holman PBA Doubles Championship.

A bigger field of PBA players, thanks to the expansion of Bayside Bowl which allows it to now host the field of 32 teams in the Roth/Holman PBA Doubles Championship.

In addition to live ESPN coverage of the Roth/Holman Doubles Championship on Sunday, April 16, PBA fans will be able to watch all rounds of the PBA League finals in real time via live streaming on the ESPN3/WatchESPN apps.

A new Xtra Frame "King of Bowling" Pay Per View event: the match will pit Wes Malott, who won the last King of Bowling match contested in 2009, against 2016 PBA Player

## Collegiate Titles to be Determined in Baton Rouge

ARLINGTON, Texas – Champions will be determined in three events – National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Women's Bowling Championship, Intercollegiate Team Championships (ITC) and Intercollegiate Singles Championships (ISC) – starting this week at the Raising Cane's River Center in Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

The NCAA Women's Bowling Championship will kick off the action at the River Center on April 13 as eight teams vie for the title. Qualifying and match play will take place April 13-15, and the championship round will be televised live on ESPNU on April 15 at 6:30 p.m. Eastern.

Stephen F. Austin, the 2016 champion, seeks to defend

its title and will be joined in the field by five-time NCAA champion Nebraska. Stephen F. Austin defeated Nebraska in last year's best-of-seven Baker final, 4-3, after falling to the Cornhuskers in the 2015 title match, 4-2.

The ISC will be featured next as the top 24 men and 24 women will compete in a single-elimination bracket to determine the winner in each division. Qualifying and bracket play will take place April 18-19, while the semifinals and finals will be taped for broadcast April 22.

The women's ISC finals will air May 2 at 8 p.m. Eastern, while the men's championship round will air May 9, also at 8 p.m. Eastern. Both shows will

# Just Paying Attention

This time last year, Jodi Woessner was looking forward to her second season on the PWBA Tour. As you read here, her preparation included a higher priority in diet and exercise. She showed less wear and tear physically, but the results were well below her expectations. After a few adjustments near the end of the season, it was time for The Luci Doubles with long time doubles partner Dino Castillo. A fourth place finish led to a match play appearance and even a short stay in the lead at the U.S. Women's Open, salvaging the year. So JPA visits with Woessner again as she prepares for the 2017 tour.

**JPA:** How's the training for the 2017 PWBA Season going?

**Jodi Woessner:** It's going well. I've been balancing league, tournaments, practice and fitness to ensure I have a well-rounded plan going into the season. I'm definitely stronger physically and mentally this year than I was last year.

**JPA:** Any notable additions or subtractions to the workout regimen? (Core, legs, cardio, etc.)

**Woessner:** At the beginning of 2017, I started a hybrid

program of strength training and cardio kickboxing. I also changed my nutrition at the beginning of March focusing on a ketogenic diet and intermittent fasting which has helped my body burn fat for energy and provided me with more mental clarity. It's not something that works for everyone but I'm loving the results so far.

**JPA:** What additional information or workout changes has Beachbody given you, now that you've been using their services for well over a year now?

**Woessner:** I've been a Beachbody coach for over 5 years now. The ketogenic diet I'm following now was actually started by being involved in a beta test for a new program they are currently developing.

**JPA:** What differences in mental preparation have you done, this year versus last year, if any?

**Woessner:** What haven't I done!? Due to my struggles in the middle of last season, I started talking to a lot of experts along with reading and listening to books to aid in having the right mentality in certain situations. I've continued practicing the things I've learned and have seen and felt

a positive difference. Nothing will work 100% of the time, but I'm in a much better place than I've ever been.

**JPA:** How helpful has your husband Aaron been in your preparation for this year's tour? (As I recall last spring, he was going through some of the Beachbody cleansing.)

**Woessner:** Aaron is always my biggest supporter. He's always there to bounce ideas off of and give me advice. Even when he doesn't entirely understand or agree with my focus, like currently my diet, he still supports me in my desire to do something different and see what happens. If it doesn't work, we'll change it, which is the only way to continue getting better.

**JPA:** What differences have you seen, positive and negative, in switching to 15-pound equipment?

**Woessner:** My change to 15# has basically been a non-event. I've not noticed anything negative like worse carry or timing issues (after getting use to the change). The positive side would be ball motion, for example some of the balls I didn't match up with well in 16#, I've really liked in 15# like the Alpha Crux and Hywire and those I really liked in 16# like the Hyroad, I still love in 15#.

**JPA:** Are the physical and timing adjustments you made at the end of last year's tour season still working on league and local tournament conditions?

**Woessner:** It continued helping and are still items I focus on even after dropping to 15# and making additional changes in December.

**JPA:** Think I saw recently where you made a trip to the Storm plant in Utah. What adjustments were changed, physical or mental, if any?

**Woessner:** Yes, a few weeks after I changed to 15#, I had the privilege to visit the Storm Headquarters and work with Hank Boomershine and Chris Schlemmer. My main focus was a stronger position at the release point and ensure my timing wasn't negatively impacted by the change to 15#. In a two-step process, I ended up moving up from standing at the back of the approach to behind the first set of dots. Just the move itself allowed for my timing to be more delayed and instantly created more leverage at the line.

**JPA:** What are your PWBA goals this year?

**Woessner:** To win of course! But seriously, my focus this year is on being patient and living in the moment which will result in making good shots and good decisions. The only thing I can control is the way I react to situations and keeping my mind right will create better results. Also, I want to thank those supporting and believing in me: Storm Bowling Products, Vise Inserts, Apparel EFX, Dexter Bowling and Owens

# USBC Ensures Integrity of Championship Lanes in Baton Rouge



ARLINGTON, Texas – In one week, the Raising Cane's River Center in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, will be the talk of the bowling world as the first of four major events scheduled for 2017 gets underway at the custom-built 44-lane venue.

The National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Women's Bowling Championship will kick things off April 13-15, followed by the Inter-collegiate Team and Singles Championships, United States

Bowling Congress Women's Championships and USBC Queens.

The championship atmosphere will be second to none as the USBC Championships Production team has spent the last eight weeks constructing the venue from scratch, and the playing environment will be as fair as they come thanks to the teamwork of USBC and Brunswick.

"It's difficult to imagine a better venue for these events," said USBC Executive Director Chad Murphy. "The effort and dedication by USBC Championships Production and Brunswick have ensured a fair playing environment for each competitor that bowls in this facility. As the governing body for the sport of bowling, we will continue to keep tournament integrity at the forefront of our events."

Brunswick is the official lane installation provider for USBC Championships builds.

USBC rules dictate the tolerance for crowns and depressions, plus cross-tilt, must be within forty-thousandths of an inch of flat to be certified by USBC. For USBC Championships events and convention-center builds,

USBC tightens the tolerance to twenty-thousandths of an inch to further ensure the integrity of the playing field.

In all, each lane took an average of 175 man-hours to construct and adjust to fit within the specifications.

After a champion is crowned at the NCAA Women's Bowling Championships, the ITC and ISC will head to Baton Rouge from April 18-22, and the 98th Women's Championships will take place at the River Center from April 23-July 10. The Queens will be held at the convention center from May 17-23.

Kegel will be the official lane maintenance provider for these events and will work with USBC and its lane pattern development team to set the lane patterns for competition. Kegel also will provide the staff at the River Center with lane maintenance equipment and supplies as well as technical and on-site support.

I'm starting to hear some nice feedback on the Biondillo TV 300 game story, and I'm thankful to those who enjoyed it and took the time to send their best wishes.

When doing the research to the sports pages of the Akron Beacon-Journal from that week, Monday March 27 through Sunday April 2, 1967. In a good way, it was stunning.

There was more detailed coverage about who made a huge jump on the leaderboard, who stumbled, and even talking to some of the players' wives about what they do in a typical week on tour traveling with their husbands. There wasn't the tech talk we see now, of course, but the big splash was made on the first day with three 300 games, which was pretty much unheard of fifty years ago.

The Sunday edition first sports page was no different. Looking like the local NFL team played a playoff game, or local college team played in a bowl game, there were six pictures and the start of two stories. One was about Jack's game, the other a recap of the final match as Jim Stefanich defeated Don Johnson in a two-frame rolloff after tying at 227. Johnson was runner-up again the following year and a fifth place showing in '69 before rolling his mythic 299 finale for the win in 1970.

One of the biggest things making the 'Firestone' unique was the prize money. The purse was \$100,000, with \$25,000 to the winner. According to the 1971 PBA Media Guide, most of the other stops on the winter tour telecast on ABC-TV had \$25,000 purses

Defending champion Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Oxford, Fla., highlights the list of approximately 150 players ages 50 and over who are entered in the Pasco County Florida Open which will be the first of 14 tournaments during the 2017 season.

Williams, the PBA Tour’s all-time titles leader with 47 wins, won his 10th career PBA50 Tour title in Pasco County last year by defeating fellow PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke of Clermont, Fla., 245-

225, in the title match.

The Pasco County win was part of another milestone chapter in the Hall of Famer’s more than three decade career in which he won his record 100th career overall title in PBA competition (including PBA Tour, PBA50 Tour, PBA regional and PBA50 regional wins). He achieved the century mark last December in the Decker Appraisal Services Trios regional tournament in Harrisonburg, Va.

Williams’ win total now stands at 101 after winning the PBA50 Fayetteville Southern Open regional tournament in Fayetteville, N.C., in March.

Other PBA50 Tour stars expected to compete in New Port Richey will be a host of other Hall of Famers including Tom Baker, 2015 winner Parker Bohn III, 2014 winner Amleto Monacelli, Dale Eagle, Bryan Goebel and Brian Voss. Baker and Eagle will be doing double duty as they will also compete in the PBA60 Killer ‘B’ Open. # Open Championships Weekly Glance



March 29 - April 4, 2017  
New leaders in Regular Team, Doubles at 2017 USBC Open Championships

HoF Silver Lanes 1 of New Hartford, Connecticut, became the first team to reach the 3,200-pinfall mark in team competition at the 2017 United States Bowling Congress Open Championships, and a group of bowlers from the East Coast took over the top two spots in Regular Doubles.

Led by Jon Wilbur's 746 series, HoF Silver Lanes 1 rolled games of 1,001, 1,131 and 1,107 for a 3,239 total March 30 at the South Point Bowling Plaza.

Wilbur was joined by Todd Lathrop (676), Tony Reynaud (622), Jon Matunas (610) and Scott Widmer (585). Kruse's Pro Shop of Fargo, North Dakota, previously held the lead with 3,198.

On April 2, Steve Arehart of Chesapeake, Virginia, and Charles Richey of Concord, North Carolina, raised the bar in Regular Doubles with a 1,385 total. Minutes after finishing their set, they watched their teammates, Chris Hans of Battleboro, North Carolina, and Kyle Troup of Taylorsville, North Carolina, move into second place with 1,365.

Arehart and Richey got off to a quick start, averaging better than 253 as a pair through the first two games, but Richey ran into trouble the final game, recording four open frames. Arehart led the effort with games of 244, 238 and 224 for a 706 series, and Richey added 279, 252 and 148 for 679.

Hans rolled games of 259, 226 and 237 for a 722 series, and Troup, a Professional Bowlers Association Tour titlist, added 216, 201 and 226 for 643.

Two honor scores rolled this week at South Point Bowling Plaza

Steve De Kerf Jr. of Sheboygan Falls, Wisconsin, and Todd Lathrop of Colchester, Connecticut, each recorded honor scores during their singles sets March 31 to make their respective runs at the top of the standings.

De Kerf, 32, rolled the second 800 of the 2017 USBC Open Championships and moved into a tie for the lead in Regular Singles with 802. Matt Gasn of Clarksville, Tennessee, posted his 802 on March 25.

De Kerf started his first game of singles with 10 consecutive strikes, before leaving a 10 pin on his 11th shot. He followed the 289 start with 234 and put himself in position for a dramatic finish by opening the finale with four strikes.

After converting a single pin in the fifth frame, De Kerf had no room for error if he was going to reach Gasn's total. He delivered seven consecutive

strikes to finish his set with 279.

Lathrop, 53, carried the momentum of an exciting team event into doubles and singles.

He started singles with 12 consecutive strikes for the first 300 game of the 2017 event at the South Point Bowling Plaza and added 257 and 213 for a 770 series, moving him into third place in Regular Singles.

Lathrop, a 2015 Open Doubles champion at the Bowlers Journal Championships presented by USBC, added 676 in team and 659 in doubles to take over second place in Regular All-Events with 2,105. Jacob Boresch of Kenosha, Wisconsin, leads with 2,122.

Lathrop's effort in team competition helped HoF Silver Lanes 1 of New Hartford, Connecticut, take the lead in Regular Team on March 30 with 3,239.

First-timers take lead in Standard, Classified Divisions at 2017 Open Championships

Three first-time USBC Open Championships participants made waves in their debuts this week, taking the lead in Classified Doubles and Standard All-Events at the South Point Bowling Plaza.

Mark Nelson of Clitherall, Minnesota, and Lynn Good of Battle Lake, Minnesota, found their stride in doubles March 30 on the way to a 1,102 total. Nelson, 43, led the effort with games of 174, 194 and 198 for a 566 series, while Good, 62, added 211, 206 and 119 for 536.

Charles Lindeman of Belt, Montana, and John Lindeman of Fort Benton, Montana, previously held the lead in Classified Doubles with 1,058.

On March 31, Stephanie Sanders of Bakersfield, California, finished with a clean 219 game to take the Standard All-Events lead with 1,826, surpassing the 1,801 posted by Mike Thielen of Eagle Grove, Iowa.

Sanders, 38, started strong with a 659 series in team and added 590 in doubles and 577 in singles.

Standard Doubles also got new leaders this week, as Ramon Pagan (644) and Raymond Haran (547) of Chicago combined for a 1,191 total April 4.

A look ahead  
Defending Regular All-Events champion Brandon Novak of Chillicothe, Ohio, will put his title on the line starting April 5 at 8:30 p.m. Eastern.

The 28-year-old right-hander captured the 2016 title at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nevada, with sets of 742 in singles, 703 in doubles and 688 in team for a 2,133 total, outdistancing more than 40,000 bowlers.

John Lamm of North Mankato, Minnesota, is scheduled to become the next

member of the tournament's 50-Year Club on April 6 at 8:30 p.m. Eastern. He is one of 23 bowlers slated to reach the milestone during the 2017 event at the South Point Bowling Plaza.

Lamm made his Open Championships debut at the 1965 tournament in St. Paul, Minnesota, and has knocked down 83,121 pins in 49 appearances for a career average of 188.

The King of Bowling series will continue throughout the season with the winner defending his crown in an upcoming PBA Xtra Frame King of Bowling Pay Per View event to be announced. Details will be announced later.

To recap Malott's dominant reign in the 2009 series held at the Kegel Training Center in Lake Wales, Fla., the then 32-year-old "Sir Strikes-a-lot" defended his King of Bowling crown five consecutive weeks and became the first bowler in PBA history to bowl two nationally-televised 300 games in defeating Parker Bohn III of Jackson, N.J., 300-223, in the KOB finale. During his run, Malott defeated Chris Barnes, 268-214; Patrick Allen, 258-234; Walter Ray Williams Jr., 300-238, and Rhino Page, 257-233, before closing with his perfect victory over Bohn in the made-for-ESPN2 series.

For perspective, Tackett (the winner of the 2016 PBA World Champion and 2017 FireLake PBA Tournament of Champions) was 16 years old when Malott won his last King of Bowling match. Belmonte (the winner of the 2017 Barbasol PBA Players Championship and USBC Masters) had just won his first PBA title in West Babylon, N.Y., on his way to winning 2008-09 PBA Rookie of the Year honors. While the King of Bowling didn't count for any titles, Malott went on to win three PBA Tour titles and PBA Player of the Year honors for the 2008-09 season.

# LaCaze leads Open Singles at 2017 Bowlers Journal Championships

LAS VEGAS - Seeing Anthony LaCaze's name at the top of the leaderboard at the United States Bowling Congress Open Championships has been a common thing since 2013.

The Northwood, Illinois, resident also has found success at the Bowlers Journal Championships presented by USBC, which has run in conjunction with the USBC Open Championships for more than seven decades.

LaCaze, a past champion at both tournaments, again made his presence known as he moved into the lead in Open Singles at the Bowlers Journal Championships on Friday. His effort also helped him to the top spot in the Dual Entry standings, a special prize list for bowlers who choose to enter doubles and singles at the same time, using their three games for both events.

The 34-year-old right-hander edged his way into the lead at the South Point Bowling Center with games of 279, 279 and 213 for a 771 series, one pin ahead of Matthew O'Grady of Rahway, New Jersey, in Open Singles, and eight pins past Kyle Sherman of O'Fallon, Missouri, in the event's Dual Entry category.

LaCaze also paired with

Erik Vermilyea of Eagan, Minnesota (647), and Jeffrey Mersch of Orlando, Florida (611), during the set to move into a tie for second place (1,418) and ninth place (1,382), respectively, in Open Doubles. Casey Shephard of Portage, Michigan, and Andrew Klingler of Grand Rapids, Michigan, lead Open Doubles with 1,483.

After back-to-back 279 games, LaCaze knew he was in a great position to raise the bar at the event, but an open in the seventh frame of Game 3 put the top spot in jeopardy. He responded with three consecutive strikes.

"After that kind of start, of course you start to think about putting up a big number," said LaCaze, who won the 2010 Open Doubles title with Vermilyea. "I was happy to regroup after the missed spare. I just wanted to concentrate on what I had to do to execute a good shot, and I put together three good ones. I'm pretty happy about that and being able to put myself in contention to win here. It's a very prestigious event, and it would be an honor to call myself a champion here once again."

LaCaze made his way into the Open Championships record book by becoming the

second bowler in tournament history to win a title in three consecutive years.

With his victories in 2013 (Team All-Events), 2014 (Regular All-Events) and 2015 (Team All-Events), LaCaze matched USBC Hall of Famer Les Zikes, who captured four of his six Open Championships titles from 1962-1964.

LaCaze joined Vermilyea and Mersch, along with Steve Novak and Matthew Tuckfield, in both of the Team All-Events wins at the Open Championships. Their team, Junior Team USA Support 1, was back on the lanes this weekend at the South Point Bowling Plaza.

The group hoped its time spent at the Bowlers Journal Championships would translate into another run at Team All-Events on Sunday after finishing their team event Saturday night with a 2,986 total.

Vanilla Salsa of Roseville, California, leads Team All-Events with 9,743, and HoF Silver Lanes 1 of New Hartford, Connecticut, leads Regular Team with 3,239.

"We know they'll play a little different, but the score will be out there," said LaCaze, who won the 2010 Earl Anthony Memorial Classic on his way


