

Andrew Anderson Wins 2018 USBC Masters


SYRACUSE, N.Y. – Team USA's Andrew Anderson completed his schooling of the 360-player field at the 2018 United States Bowling Congress Masters as he captured his first career Professional Bowlers Association Tour title on Sunday.

The 22-year-old right-hander from Holly, Michigan, went undefeated in match play at the Oncenter Convention Center this week and held off Alex Hoskins of Brigham City, Utah, in the championship match, 213-199, to win the coveted title and \$30,000 top prize. Hoskins claimed \$25,000 for the runner-up finish.

The USBC Masters is a major on the PBA Tour schedule, and Sunday's championship round was broadcast live on ESPN.

"This is surreal," said Anderson, who is working toward a degree in elementary education. "You think about it all the time, how cool it would be to hold up that trophy, and it's unbelievable. I can't believe that just happened."

Anderson and Hoskins were even early in the title tilt, before Anderson surged into the lead with four consecutive

strikes starting in the fourth frame. He opened the door for Hoskins by chopping the 6-10 combination in the eighth frame, but Hoskins was unable to take advantage, recording an open of his own in the eighth frame.

Anderson finished the

match first and had the opportunity to lock out Hoskins with a strike on the first delivery of his 10th frame, but he left a 4 pin. After converting the spare, Anderson left another 4 pin on his fill ball to give Hoskins a chance to throw three strikes

64-Player Match Play Bracket Pairings Set for Port Property Management PBA Xtra Frame Maine Shootout

Live Xtra Frame coverage begins at 10 a.m. ET Tuesday from Bayside Bowl in Portland, Maine

PORTLAND, Maine (April 16, 2018) – Matchups for the Professional Bowlers Association's Port Property Management PBA Maine Shootout, a 64-player single-elimination match play tournament, were decided by random draw at Bayside Bowl Monday, heading into the two-day best-of-three-game competition Tuesday and Wednesday.

The Maine Shootout is the first of eight PBA Tour Xtra Frame events scheduled for 2018, and it will be the final qualifying event in decided the top eight players in combined earnings from 2016 through this event who will compete in the PBA Tour Finals in May at Thunderbowl Lanes in Allen Park, Mich.

The match play eliminations begin with Tuesday's starting field of 64 players, with winners advancing to the Round of 32 later Tuesday. Those winners will battle Wednesday in elimination rounds to determine the winner of the \$10,000 first prize and a PBA Tour title, if the winner is a PBA member. All of the competition will be covered live on PBA's exclusive online bowling channel, Xtra Frame.

Some of Tuesday's marquee opening-round matches will include: PBA Tour titlists Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill., vs. Dick Allen of Columbia, S.C., in Bracket A; 2018 Go Bowling! PBA 60th Anniversary Classic winner Jakob Butturff of

All qualifying and match-play rounds of both events will be shown live on BOWL.com's BowlTV, while the champions will be crowned on national television. CBS Sports Network will televise the semifinals and finals of the Intercollegiate

Just Paying Attention

Last week, International Bowling Hall of Fame and Museum Curator Jessica Bell laid out the Museum's first two projects of the year. That would be an Andy Varipapa with new restored footage, and also updating displays at the satellite museum inside the National Bowling Stadium in Reno.

"Along with adding to more Varipapa items to an online display, I've been working over the last several years with one of our Museum board members, Kevin Dornberger, on adding some online international-based exhibits. Bowling federations from Australia, Finland, Japan, France, Germany, Sweden, and the United Kingdom will be featuring their national histories and how the game developed in those countries," Bell said.

In June, a Junior Gold display will be placed in the main Museum in Arlington.

"With Junior Gold tournament in the area this year, it will allow junior bowlers, parents, and family to celebrate the history of the tournament."

Another project being worked on this week is an updated display at the NBS in Reno, featuring women

in bowling, in conjunction with the 2018 USBC Women's Championships. A new smaller display area promoting the updated displays downstairs will be added on the main concourse.

"It's more historical in nature showing how women came into the sport as competitors, and the development of the WIBC. There are a number of recently framed prints that haven't been on display in a long time, some not since the St. Louis museum location, including a couple of framed tournament posters from the 1930's," Bell added.

In this era of all sorts of viral videos on all sorts of subjects all over social media, is an entertaining and informative series on bowling and bowlers done by a pair of bowlers. Current PBA tour players Brad Miller and Kyle Sherman started their own YouTube Channel last June, simply named, 'Brad and Kyle.' They gathered 1,500 subscribers watching 61 videos to date totaling 122,000 views, Miller and Sherman feature themselves and their friends.

Some videos are cute and fun, like what happened on the

South Korea trip and crashing the PBA Hall of Fame banquet, some are ball reviews, but many others are insightful interviews with the current crop of PBA and PWBA players.

As an example, Diana Zavjalova talks about her purpose of 'that' video she posted on Facebook, Brad Angelo explains why he doesn't practice much anymore, and Kyle Troup talks about giving a live interview on ESPN television days after last year's doubles win while learning a lesson on how to promote himself.

Well shot and well edited, these pieces are what you might call brain candy or little bits of a guilty pleasure. Brad and Kyle are a little busy this week in Syracuse bowling the USBC Masters, but hope to have them comment on what feedback they've heard.

Dallas Strikers Bid for Third Straight Elias Cup Title as PBA League Returns to Maine

PORTLAND, Maine (April 13, 2018) – Led by player-manager and PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke, the Shipyard Brewery Dallas Strikers will return to Bayside Bowl in Portland next week in pursuit of a third consecutive Professional Bowlers Association League title, cheered on by the most fun-loving fans in bowling.

The 2018 OceanView at Falmouth PBA League will celebrate its sixth season – and fourth year in Portland – with three days of team competition to decide the 2018 Elias Cup. The PBA League, which is part of the 2018 Go Bowling! PBA Tour schedule, will conclude the PBA's 38th consecutive year of ESPN coverage with four consecutive Sunday telecasts, including the PBA League Elias Cup finals on Sunday, May 13, at 1 p.m. EDT.

Duke, who won the 2017 Mark Roth PBA League Most Valuable Player Award, will return with a solid core of Dallas Strikers stars including 2016 MVP Tommy Jones, veterans Bill O'Neill and Rhino Page, and newcomer Kyle Sherman of O'Fallon, Mo.

Chasing the Strikers will be the hometown Port Property Portland Lumberjacks, managed by Tim Mack; the Go Bowling! Silver Lake Atom Splitters, managed by Mark

Baker; the Sysco Philadelphia Hitmen, managed by Jason Couch; bowlingball.com L.A. X, managed by Andrew Cain; the GEICO New York City WTT KingPins, managed by Carolyn Dorin-Ballard; the Barbasol Motown Muscle, managed by Del Ballard, and the OceanView at Falmouth Brooklyn Styles, managed by Johnny Petraglia.

Each of the 2018 teams will field a roster of previous team members, but a number of newcomers will get an opportunity to experience Portland's raucous fans for the first time. Rather than approaching their deliveries in silence, a long-time tradition in professional bowling, Bayside Bowl fans encourage the PBA players with loud chants, slogans and newly-created nicknames while waving "fatheads" and dressing

in sometimes strange costumes.

Players who will experience Portland bowling fans for the first time include 2018 PBA Tournament of Champions winner Matt O'Grady of Rahway, N.J., with the Brooklyn Styles; Japanese star Shota Kawazoe with the Motown Muscle; Anthony Pepe of Elmhurst, N.Y., with the NYC KingPins; 2017 PBA Rookie of the Year Matt Sanders of Indianapolis with the Philadelphia Hitmen; AJ Johnson of Oswego, Ill., with the Silver Lake Atom Splitters, and Thailand's Yannaphon Larpapharat with the Portland Lumberjacks.

The PBA League's return to Portland will get underway with the Port Property Portland PBA Xtra Frame Maine Shootout April 16-18, a singles

Team USA and a third-place finish at the PBA Tournament of Champions. Sunday marked the second TV appearance of his professional career, and he was able to put his experience to work as his game plan came together.

“It really gave me so much more confidence,” Anderson said. “I knew what to look for and was ready and more prepared. The game plan was always to be farther left than everybody, and the three right-handers ahead of me made a little more hook to the right for me, so that helped me feel comfortable going in.”

17-Year-Old Trey Ford III Wins PBA FireLake/Grand Casino Resort Southwest Open

Shawnee, Okla., (April 9, 2018) – Trey Ford III, a 17-year-old two-handed bowler from Bartlesville, Okla., threw three strikes in the 10th frame of the championship match to defeat David (Boog) Krol of Nixa, Mo., 245-229, in the seventh annual PBA FireLake/Grand Casino Resort Southwest Open presented by Hammer, to win his first PBA Regional title and become the youngest player ever to win a PBA Regional title.

Ford, who began bowling PBA events as a 13-year-old amateur, became PBA's youngest member ever when he joined the organization with parental consent at age 15 years, 157 days in 2016. He previously had a second-place finish in a PBA Southwest

Region event at FireLake last September, and won Sunday's \$2,700 first prize at the age of 17 years, 226 days.

After leading the 13 games of qualifying and receiving byes into the Round of 8, Ford eliminated two Wichita State collegiate players to advance to the finals. Thomas McNeal Jr. of Puyallup, Wash., was Ford's first victim, losing 2-0 in the best-of-three-game Round of 8. Jacob Kersten, originally from Clarkston, Mich., came up short in the one game semifinal round, 236-222.

Krol, also a two-handed player, qualified in second place and had a similar road to the final. In his opening match, he defeated Scott McCleery of Lubbock, Texas, 2-0, and then

put away another Wichita State Shocker, Cortez Schenck of Scottsdale, Ariz., 192-191. Krol collected \$1,800 for second place while Schenck and Kersten each added \$1,125 to their SMART scholarship accounts.

The pro-am portion of the event on Friday included a fundraiser for the Shawnee area Big Brothers Big Sisters chapter. FireLake General Manager Chris Skillings announced more than \$10,000 was raised for that cause.

Singles Championships and the finals of the Intercollegiate Team Championships on tape delay starting April 24.

The Intercollegiate Team Championships, featuring the 16 men's and 16 women's teams to qualify at sectional events, kicks off Thursday with teams bowling 24 Baker games to determine seeding for the double-elimination match-play bracket. The first two rounds of match play (best-of-seven Baker matches) also will take place Thursday, and the final day of match play on Friday, April 20, will determine the two men's teams and two women's teams that will advance to the finals on Saturday, April 21. The finals will be a best-of-five Baker match.

Match play consists of three-game, total-pinfal matches except for the semifinals and finals, which are one-game matches.

Stephanie Schwartz of Stephen F. Austin will seek to reach the TV finals for the third consecutive year. She lost to eventual champion Sydney Brummett in the semifinals last year. Brummett did not make the field for this year's singles championship. The men's field includes Kenny Ryan of Robert Morris-Illinois, who made the ISC semifinals in 2016. Ryan made match play at last week's USBC Masters, going 3-2 and





Open Championships Weekly Glance



USBC Hall of Famer rolls 300 game, leads doubles at USBC Open Championships
 United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famer Steve Kloempken of Pleasant View, Utah, and former Team USA member David Haynes of Las Vegas turned in a balanced effort April 8 on the way to the Regular Doubles lead at the 2018 USBC Open Championships.

Kloempken, a two-time titlist at the Open Championships and also a past member of Team USA, kickstarted the effort with the first perfect game of this year's 107-day event at the Oncenter Convention Center in Syracuse, New York. The tournament began March 24.

The 47-year-old right-hander added games of 206 and 201 for a 707 series, and Haynes did the heavy lifting late in the set, following a 220 start with games of 268 and 258 for a 746 series and 1,453 total. South Africa's Francois Louw and Hong Kong's Michael Mak previously held the top spot with 1,437.

Kloempken, a Team All-Events champion in 1993 and Regular All-Events winner in 2003, admitted his fast start was a bit of a surprise, but a

bowling ball suggestion from his wife, Marcia, helped him create a special moment they'll remember each and every year. It also happened to be their wedding anniversary.

"It's pretty rare to shoot 300 in this arena, but to do it in Game 1 is definitely unexpected," said Kloempken, who made his 30th Open Championships appearance and added 597 in singles and 581 in team for a 1,885 all-events total. "No matter what set it is, you have the nerves going, and you're just trying to make good shots and get lined up. I was fortunate to get comfortable and confident, and I was able to catch a few hits, too. Marcia is the best tour rep I know, and today is our 12th anniversary, so it really makes this moment extra special."

Haynes, a 40-year-old right-hander making his 23rd tournament appearance, had 629 in singles and 583 in team for a 1,958 all-events total.

Three-time titlist leads Regular Singles at Oncenter Convention Center

Lennie Boresch Jr. of Kenosha, Wisconsin, a three-time USBC Open Championships titlist, struck on 27 of his first 30 deliveries during singles April 8, including a stretch

of 18 consecutive strikes, on the way to games of 280, 279 and 225 for a 784 series at the Oncenter Convention Center.

The 55-year-old right-hander passed Rameses Chambers of Kansas City, Missouri, who previously held the lead in Regular Singles with 771.

Boresch had 597 in doubles and 570 in team to finish his 37th Open Championships with a 1,951 all-events total.

Standard Singles also got a new leader this week as 10-time Open Championships participant Alex Houston of Rochester, Minnesota, put together games of 249, 207 and 230 for a 686 series.

The performance also catapulted the 30-year-old right-hander into the top spot in Standard All-Events with 1,855. The effort included sets of 612 in team and 557 in doubles.

The Regular Division at the Open Championships includes bowlers with entering averages of 210 and above, and bowlers in the Standard Division have entering averages of 181-209.

LeClair enters the 2018 season with some trepidation because of an aggravated ACL injury to his left knee. He sustained the injury while bowling in a local tournament in early March and has been able to bowl only a few games

over the last several weeks.

"I started bowling last week for the first time in more than a month," said the 53-year-old LeClair. "I probably won't know how well it will hold up until I start competing. I'm not so much worried about the pain because I can bowl through some of that – it's the stability that I'm worried about."

Ironically, it's the second consecutive year that LeClair has had to deal with an injury shortly before the start of the season. Last year it was a recurring back injury.

"Last year I had an issue with my back but was able to get it worked out before the season started," he said. "Now, I have this issue with the knee, which is very disappointing because I've been looking forward to the start of this season since the day after last season ended."

LeClair got his player of the year season off to a fast start with a 191-187 win over Norm Duke to win the 2017 Pasco County Florida Open. It was the first of two wins that made him the only player to win more than one title in 2017. His second win came in the Johnny Petraglia BVL Open.

He spent nearly two decades competing regularly on the PBA Tour without a win but his lengthy career was finally rewarded when he won PBA50 Player of the Year honors thanks to his two titles and a runner-up finish in the Suncoast PBA Senior U.S. Open.

"I'm anxious to get back out there if all goes well and prove that last season wasn't a fluke," LeClair added. "As I said before, it was the most satisfying accomplishment in my career because I was able to achieve it bowling on a tour that included some of bowling's all-time greats."

Among those greats scheduled to compete in the opening events of the season will be a

host of Hall of Famers including Walter Ray Williams Jr., Pete Weber, Parker Bohn III, Amleto Monacelli, Johnny Petraglia, Mark Williams, Bryan Goebel and two-time PBA50 Player of the Year Ron Mohr, who was inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in 2018.

While not a major in 2017, top qualifier Lennie Boersch Jr. of Kenosha, Wis., led The Villages event wire-to-wire and beat Bob Learn Jr., 264-213, in the title match for his second Sun Bowl In The Villages win and third career PBA50 Tour title.

Competition begins with Florida Open qualifying on Sunday, April 22 at 8 a.m. ET with one 10-game qualifying round followed by cashers and match play rounds beginning at 8:30 a.m. on Monday, April 23. After match play the top five players will advance to the stepladder finals scheduled for 7 p.m. Practice for the event is scheduled for 9 a.m. - Noon on Saturday, April 21.

The PBA50 National Championship will get underway with the first of three six-game qualifying rounds on Wednesday, April 25, beginning at 9 a.m. followed by second and third rounds on April 26 and 27. The top 32 players will then advance to the first eight-game match play round at 9 a.m. on April 28 before a cut to the top 16 players for the second match play round at 2 p.m. which will determine the top five for the stepladder finals at 7 p.m. The practice session is scheduled for April 24 from 9 a.m.-12:30 p.m.

Richard Burdick of Conneaut, Ohio, Charles Johnston of Madison, Wisconsin, and Bob Ruhland of Fitchburg, Wisconsin, became the latest members of the 50-Year Club at the USBC Open Championships.

Burdick, a 90-year-old right-hander, was the first of 15 competitors scheduled to reach the plateau this year at the Oncenter Convention Center. He competed April 3-4.

Burdick made his tournament debut at the 1968 event in Cincinnati, and he has made the annual trek each year since 1973, which also was

one of the event's five visits to Syracuse.

Johnston, 82, and Ruhland, 70, are longtime friends and have shared much of the journey together. Their milestone appearances took place April 6-7. They also competed as doubles partners this week in Syracuse.

Johnston also started his Open Championships career at the 1968 event and hasn't missed a tournament since 1973. Ruhland made his debut in their home state at the 1969 event in Madison, Wisconsin.

All three bowlers received plaques, chevrons and diamond lapel pins to commemorate the milestone.

PBA Spare Shots

FURTHER REVIEW COSTS PETE WEBER A REGIONAL TITLE

Research into Trey Ford's first PBA Regional victory also uncovered a mistake dating back to 1979 when Pete Weber won his first regional in early fall in St. Louis, also at age 17. At the time, however, Weber was credited with a PBA Regional title although he didn't become a PBA member until Nov. 30 of that year. So while he was the youngest player ever to win a PBA Regional at that time, he should not have been credited with a title because he wasn't a member.

The correction means Weber now has 46 standard regional titles, one behind Chris Warren of Grants Pass, Ore., and Weber, who has won five PBA50 regional titles, has 51 overall – one behind Dale Traber of Cedarburg, Wis. (39 standard and 13 PBA50).

NEXT 10 DAYS WILL BE MEANINGFUL FOR TOM SMALLWOOD & FRIENDS

The next 10 days will be especially meaningful to Tom Smallwood of Saginaw, Mich., and, presumably, fellow PBA Tour competitors Bill O'Neill of Langhorne, Pa.; Ryan Ciminelli of Clarence, N.Y.; Canada's Francois Lavoie; two-hander Kyle Troup of Taylorsville, N.C., and Texan Wes Malott as

they pursue the eighth and final berth in the 2018 PBA Tour Finals which will take place May 4-5 at Thunderbowl Lanes in Allen Park, Mich.

The PBA Tour Finals, which will be televised by CBS Sports Network as part of the 2018 Go Bowling! PBA Tour schedule, will include the top eight players in combined PBA Tour/World Bowling Tour earnings from the start of the 2016 season through this week's USBC Masters and the Port Property Management PBA Xtra Frame Maine Shootout April 17-18 at Bayside Bowl in Portland, Maine.

Heading into the Masters, the top eight players in combined earnings were EJ Tackett (\$380,828), Jason Belmonte (\$380,357), Jesper Svensson (\$296,456), Dom Barrett (\$254,490), Anthony Simonsen (\$236,834), Marshall Kent (\$223,745), Tommy Jones (\$175,652) and, in the No. 8 position, Sean Rash (\$154,472).

With a \$30,000 first prize at stake in the Masters and \$10,000 to the winner in Maine, Smallwood has the best chance to break into the elite eight-man field. Smallwood's combined earnings are \$153,057, just over \$1,000 behind Rash. Longer shots, but still mathematically in contention, are O'Neill (\$147,275), Ciminelli (\$137,080), Lavoie (\$128,055), Troup (\$125,780) and Malott (\$118,883).

The final results will be

PBA'S "60 MOST MEMORABLE MOMENTS" UNVEILING CONTINUES: 31 THRU 35

The countdown to unveil the complete list of the PBA's "60 most memorable moments" in its 60-year history continues, one a day, Monday through Friday, on all PBA Network outlets. Last week, "memorable moments" 31 through 35 were unveiled. Here are those five moments as the countdown continues:

31) Mike Aulby won the 1996 Bayer/Brunswick Touring Players Championship to become the only player to win bowling's "Super Slam" consisting of all five majors (U.S. Open, PBA National/World Championship, PBA Tournament of Champions, USBC Masters & PBA Touring Players Championship). Aulby also won Showboat Invitational and Brunswick Memorial World Open titles, and remains the only player to win every 56-game format tournament the PBA has offered. Aulby also

was the first player to earn PBA Rookie (1979) and Player of the Year (1985) honors.

32) In 2017, Jason Belmonte became the only player to win the USBC Masters four times, defeating then-amateur Michael Tang, 279-212, in Las Vegas for his eighth PBA major title. By winning the 2015 Masters, Belmonte became the only player to win the event three consecutive times, defeating AJ Johnson in Green Bay, Wis.


33) In 1981, Bill Beach defeated Bill Lillard, 200-191, in the first "PBA Senior Tour" event, the PBA Senior Championship in New Orleans, La. The re-named PBA50 Tour has provided 50-and-older players with numerous memorable moments, including Mark Roth becoming the first player to earn both "PBA Senior" (2001) and PBA Player of the Year honors (1977-'79 and 1984), and where Joe Scarborough bowled the first certified 900 series in PBA history in his first three games of the 2013 PBA50 Sun Bowl at The Villages.

34) In 1975, Earl Anthony became the first player to earn \$100,000 in a single season with his victory in the Buzz Fazio Open in Battle Creek,

Mich. Anthony's seventh win of the year was worth \$5,000 and put his season earnings at \$100,890. Earlier that year, Anthony won a record third consecutive PBA National Championship in Toledo, Ohio...a feat he repeated in the same event in 1981, '82 and '83. In 2009, Anthony was selected as No. 1 on the PBA's list of the 50 Greatest Players during its 50th Anniversary Gala in Las Vegas.

35) "Wrong Foot" Lou Campi of Dumont, N.J., won the PBA's first event, the 1959 Empire State Open in Albany, N.Y., and collected a \$2,500 first prize.


