In the 60s group, Rick Minier qualified fourth then won all 8 of his matches on Sunday to win his 30th SASBA title.



PORTLAND, Maine (April 18, 2018) – Dick Allen of Columbia, S.C., a 39-year-old 18-year Professional Bowlers Association touring player, captured his fifth career title in the Port Property Management Xtra Frame Maine Shootout at Bayside Bowl Wednesday.

Allen, who is known as a free spirit, embraced the equally free-spirited Bayside Bowl crowd in defeating journeyman John Furey of Howell, N.J., 269-226, 247-235, to sweep the best-of-three-game title match and end Furey's bid for his first PBA Tour title.

"I don't know what it is," Allen said. "I love this place. I always bowl well here. It's the fans, the atmosphere, every-

## Reno Welcomes 2018 Women's Championships

RENO, Nev. – Bowling and local dignitaries joined together Saturday at the National Bowling Stadium to help the 2018 United States Bowling Congress Women's Championships officially get underway.

The 99th edition of the world's largest participatory sporting event for women is making its 11th trip to The Biggest Little City in the World and eighth visit to the famed NBS.

The tournament kicked off Thursday, but Saturday's competitors and guests got to be part of the festive and formal opening ceremony. The 74-day event will run until July 1.

Bowlers on the 65-team squad Saturday were welcomed with warm wishes from Reno-Sparks Convention and Visitors Authority President and CEO Phil DeLone, Chair of the Washoe County Commission Marsha Berkgigler, City of Reno councilwoman Jenny Brekhus and USBC President Frank Wilkinson and treated to a performance from the Rossi



Brothers, who perform as part of Cirque Paris, which currently is showing at the nearby Eldorado Hotel and Casino.

After the ceremonial ribbon cutting, a pair of bowlers from each team participated in the Mass Ball Shot Ceremony, where one bowler on each lane rolled a ball at the same time.

While the ceremony marked the celebratory start of the 2018 event, several bowlers already have claimed their spots at the top of the leaderboard, setting the bar for thousands of competitors from all 50 states and several foreign countries.

Kimberly Kennedy of Manitowoc, Wisconsin, left her name all over the Amethyst

The 2018 PWBA season gets kicked off this week at South Point Bowling Plaza in Las Vegas.

This will be the first of eight straight weekends of bowling for the ladies that will conclude with the Women's U.S. Open in Orlando, FL on June 30th.

They will restart for the final six events on July 26th at the Striking Against Breast Cancer Mixed Doubles event, or "The Luci" as it is commonly known, and then complete the 14-event season with the Tour Championship in Richmond, VA September 16-19.

They will once again be making a stop here in North Texas with the PWBA Players Championship at Plano Super Bowl. That event will start on Thursday, Aug. 23rd and finish with the LIVE show to be televised on CBS Sports Network.

The big change for this year is the number of the games the lady pros will be bowling over the course of regular events.

They will have practice session on Thursdays, then bowl two 8-game blocks on Friday, and then cut to the top 32 for eight more games on Saturday morning, and then bowl six games of match-play before cutting to the livestream

stepladder finals.

So its practice, followed by 16 games, followed by 14 games. This is not for the faint of heart, or the weak of bowling hand.

16 games in one day is rough, getting up and doing it all over again the next is really rough. In previous years, it was 12 games of qualifying followed by six games, followed by six games of match-play. So 24 total games vs. the 30 this year.

Time will tell how the change is handled by the pros, and they are pros, so I'm sure they will be fine, but that is a significant physical challenge. But hey, don't they say that nothing worth winning comes easy...

I don't actually believe that, but it is what "they" say.

This weekend, I bowled the Boom Doubles with Tyson Branagan in Little Rock, AR. We bowled 16 games on Saturday, and if we would have made the cut, we would have had another 12 on Sunday, on about 4 hours of sleep.

I'm sure in my younger days, I could have done that, but my hand hurt so bad on Saturday when we got done that the last thing I could have done is rock another 12 games

ran off a string of strikes to take the lead into the final two frames where single-pin spares gave Furey a chance to throw two strikes and good count in his 10th frame to win. But Furey, the 2012 PBA East Region Player of the Year, left the 3-6-10 on his first shot in the 10th.

Allen earned his berth in the title match by denying 58-year-old PBA Hall of Famer

the next morning.

It takes a significant training regime to get your hand, body and mind in the right place to bowl that much. And not just to bowl, to bowl at the highest of levels.

I will be interested in hearing from the ladies after a few weeks into this years' season to see how it works.

Good luck to all, we shall be watching!

Walter Ray Williams Jr. a chance to win a record 48th PBA Tour title, eliminating the PBA's all-time winningest bowler, 2-1, in the semifinal round while Furey pulled off the upset of the tournament, sweeping Australia's Jason Belmonte, 254-248, 244-226, in the other semifinal match.

Allen lost the first game to Williams, 258-226, but won a one-ball, two-shot sudden-death roll-off after they tied at 258 in game two to avoid elimination. Both players struck on their first roll-off shots, but Williams left a 10 pin on his second and Allen struck again to force a third game which Allen won, 279-247.

The Maine Shootout was the first of eight PBA Tour Xtra Frame events scheduled for 2018. Xtra Frame's next event will be live coverage of the OceanView at Falmouth PBA League seeding tournament from Bayside Bowl Friday at 7 p.m. EDT. For subscription information, visit xtraframe.tv.

## Non-Member Warren Eales Out Strikes Walter Ray Williams Jr. in Title Match to Win PBA50 Lucas Magazine Classic

Eales strikes on last eight shots to become first non-member in 10 years to win PBA50 Tour event

NEW PORT RICHEY, Fla. (April 23, 2018) – Warren Eales of Chandler, Ariz., bowling as a non-member, fired the last eight strikes in the championship match against Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Oxford, Fla., to win the PBA50 Lucas Magazine Classic Monday at Lane Glo Bowl.

Eales, who is the Port Director for the United States Customs Service in Las Vegas, beat Williams 258-247 to become the first non-member to win a PBA50 Tour event since Nick Morgan of Sacramento, Calif., won the Senior Northern California Classic in 2008.

“Who knew this was going to happen,” said the 58-year-old Eales, who was the top qualifier for the stepladder finals of

the first PBA50 tournament of the season. “To strike out in the 10th frame to beat Walter Ray, how could you script it any better? It’s a once-in-a-lifetime bowling experience.”

Williams, who was trying for his 12th PBA50 Tour title, finished the match with his 247 game forcing Eales to throw the first two strikes in the 10th frame for the win but Eales left little doubt about the outcome when he threw three pocket strikes.

“I have a pre-shot routine and I executed it exactly the way I wanted,” Eales said. “I just had to concentrate on keeping my hand underneath the ball, throw a soft shot and let it roll. The first shot in the 10th went exactly according to plan and then I just thought to

myself I just need to do it one more time.”

Eales, who was a PBA member for two years in the mid-1980s, owns four USBC Open

# PBA Spare Shots

## A FUNNY THING HAPPENED TO AN-DREW ANDERSON...

Winning the United States Bowling Congress Masters Sunday in Syracuse, N.Y., was the biggest moment in 22-year-old Andrew Anderson's young bowling career, but it's what happened afterward that will make the experience unforgettable.

The second-year PBA member, riding a hot streak after a third-place finish in the PBA Tournament of Champions in February followed by his first PBA Tour victory in the Masters, was headed back home to Holly, Mich., when PBA CEO and Commissioner Tom Clark, fellow competitor Chris Barnes, the recently-inducted PBA Hall of Famer, and others convinced Anderson he should head to Portland, Maine, instead to bowl in the Port Property Management PBA Xtra Frame Maine Shootout.

Because Anderson had not been drafted by an OceanView at Falmouth PBA League team, which will compete later in the week at Bayside Bowl in

Portland, he had planned to bypass the Xtra Frame event preceding PBA League competition in Maine.

But with his plans changed, Anderson headed to the airport in Syracuse to fly to Portland. Clark, Barnes, PBA Vice President-Marketing Janay Haggerty, PBA Social Media Manager Kim Richter and a bunch of other PBA players and staff members also were at the airport when all flights out of Syracuse were cancelled. That's when the "fun" began as everyone scrambled to figure out how to get to Portland.

"I'm at the airport when Barnes texted me and asked what I was going to do," Anderson said. "I was headed off to rent a car when I ran into Kim (Richter) and Tom (Clark) coming down the stairs."

Haggerty was off looking for a car to rent for the PBA staffers drive to Portland, and they asked Anderson and Barnes if they'd like to ride along.

"I'm waiting for Chris, who was trying to get a refund for his flight, when Janay rolls up with a mini van," Anderson said.

Despite horrid weather conditions, including freezing rain and frigid wind, the fivesome headed to Portland - about a half-hour behind PBA Deputy Commissioner Kirk von

Krueger and his wife, Mary, who had gotten a head start. Richter was behind the wheel at the start, and Barnes took over driving duties as they headed through New Hampshire, when the van's digital reading suddenly indicated the left rear tire was losing air...at a rapid pace.

"There was no exit for about five miles," Haggerty said, "but we finally got to a gas station in the middle of nowhere that was still open at around midnight on Sunday.

"Tom and Barnes went into the gas station, and Tom comes out with a can of inflate-a-tire," the 6-foot-2 Anderson said. "He wasn't sure what to do with it, so Janay (who is 5-foot-4) loaned me her jacket, and I tried to inflate the tire for 15-20 minutes in cold, freezing rain. The tire looked better, but then I saw big hole blowing air out as fast as it was going in."

So Anderson gave up and went inside for a cup of hot chocolate. "I had \$1 in my pocket," he grinned. "...And a check for \$30,000," Haggerty added with a laugh.

The station attendant "comped" the hot chocolate, and told the group he had a buddy who did roadside repairs. So a quick call summoned help.

The PBA group never got his name, but afterward they nicknamed their rescuer "Lugnut." Haggerty's earlier call to the car rental company had resulted in little help other than learning most rental cars these days do not include a spare tire...and that help would not be on its way until Monday morning.

"Lugnut," however, knew there was a "secret compartment" in the van that housed an emergency "tire" of sorts. After unloading all of the luggage and bowling equipment in the van, Lugnut found the emergency tire, inflated it and the group was almost ready to resume the trip as Lugnut drove away. But suddenly Lugnut put his tow truck in reverse and roared back at high

speed.

"I forgot to check lugnuts," he said. "I wouldn't be able to sleep if I didn't check the lugnuts." Hence the nickname...

Like all good stories, this one ended at almost 4 a.m. when the cold, weary PBA travelers checked into their hotel rooms in Portland, fortunate that there was no serious activity other than a practice session scheduled for Monday.

"I'm going to tell this story the rest of my life," Anderson said. "Who would have thought... I had no plans whatsoever about coming to Maine, but those guys all

talked me into coming, so it's their fault..."



months ahead.

The co-branded PBA-PWBA semi-trailer – one of two that transport bowling equipment for the professional tours – prominently features PBA stars Jason Belmonte, EJ Tackett and Dom Barrett on one half, and PWBA stars Shannon O’Keefe, Daria Pajak and Liz Johnson on the other, with additional players shaded in the background. The 53-foot trailer is expected to travel roughly

65,000 miles in a given year. For perspective, that translates into roughly 21 one-way trips between Portland, Maine, and the Pacific Coast.

**BAYSIDE BOWL INTRODUCES “PBA SPECIALITY PIZZAS”**

Before Bayside Bowl opened a few years back, co-owners Charlie Mitchell and Justin Alford did considerable research into bowling center menus to plan their food service offerings. Since bringing PBA competition to Portland, Maine, Bayside Bowl has expanded its



## Las Vegas to Host USBC Convention in 2019, 2020

ARLINGTON, Texas – The United States Bowling Congress Convention and Annual Meeting will have a two-year run in Las Vegas, as both the 2019 and 2020 events will be held at The Orleans.

The 2019 Convention will take place April 29 through May 2 and coincides with the USBC Open Championships taking place at the South Point Bowling Plaza. The Orleans also was the convention host in 2017 when the Open Championships visited Las Vegas.

In 2020, the USBC Convention will run from April 27-30.

The Women's Championships, which in 2016 became the first major USBC tournament held in the South Point Bowling Plaza, returns to the venue in 2020.

In its commitment to hold the annual convention in the same host city as a USBC Championships event, the USBC Board of Directors approved the convention site.

Both the 2019 and 2020 conventions also will run on a Monday-Thursday schedule. Feedback from convention delegates, mostly volunteers, has determined a weekday schedule is preferred, and helps


with rates and accommodations for delegates and guests.

### PBA'S "60 MOST MEMORABLE MOMENTS" UNVEILING CONTINUES: 26 - 30

The countdown to unveil the complete list of the PBA's "60 most memorable moments" in its 60-year history continues, one a day, Monday through Friday, on all PBA Network outlets. Last week, "memorable moments" 26 through 30 were unveiled. Here are those five moments as the countdown continues:

26) The PBA Hall of Fame's inaugural class included one

of the most talented groups in bowling history: Ray Bluth, Don Carter, Carmen Salvino, Harry Smith, Dick Weber and Billy Welu in the Performance category, and Frank Esposito and Chuck Pezzano for Meritorious Service.

27) Bob Benoit, in his first game ever on national television, defeated Mark Roth, 300-255, to win the 1988 PBA Quaker State Open, becoming the first player to throw a perfect game in a nationally-televised title match.

28) PBA Hall of Famer Johnny Petraglia became the first player in PBA history to win a national tour or national senior tour title in six different decades after winning the 2012 PBA Senior Dayton Classic. Petraglia joined the PBA in 1965 and won his first title in the 1966 PBA Fort Smith Open. In 1971, Petraglia won five titles including three consecutive wins culminating with his first major championship - the 1971 Firestone Tournament of Champions. The TOC title, coupled with his 1977 BPAA U.S. Open and 1980 PBA National Championship wins, made him the

second player ever to win the PBA's prestigious Triple Crown (joining Billy Hardwick). Today there are six players who have completed the Triple Crown.

29) During the PBA's 25th anniversary season, Norm Duke became the youngest bowler to win a PBA Tour title when he won the 1983 Cleveland Open at the age of 18 years, 345 days.

30) In 1965, Firestone begins its sponsorship of the PBA Tournament of Champions, a partnership that started at Firestone Bowlarama Lanes in Akron, Ohio. The partnership, which was the first commercially-titled sports event ever on national network television, lasted 29 consecutive years. In 1966, Fairlawn (Akron), Ohio-based Riviera Lanes hosted its first Firestone Tournament of Champions and would become the iconic home to the Tour's most prestigious major through 1994.

matches, which are part of the 2018 Go Bowling! PBA Tour schedule, aired Sunday on ESPN.

In the first best-of-two-game match of the 2018 PBA League competition, the underdog Motown Muscle knocked out the top-seeded bowlingball.com L.A. X team, 233-194 and 219-210. The first game of the Baker format match included two strings of four strikes by Motown's Josh Blanchard, Shota Kawazoe, Francois Lavoie, Anthony Simonsen and EJ Tackett while L.A. X threw only one strike in the first eight frames.

Game two was a nail-biter heading into the 10th frame where Tackett, working on a strike, left a 4 pin. L.A. X anchor bowler Jakob Butturff

needed two strikes and nine pins to send the match into a one-ball sudden-death roll-off, but he left a 7 pin to hand Motown's its first sweep in the PBA League's six-year history.

"That was exciting," Motown manager Del Ballard Jr. said. "I thought (Butturff's) second shot was better than the first, but he didn't get the strike.

"We obviously weren't overconfident (after qualifying eighth)," he added. "We've always had a good team on paper, but not when it counts. Today was a different day than yesterday. I just tried to keep my guys loose. I told them, when you think about it, we had a USBC Masters champion (Simonsen), a U.S. Open champion (Lavoie), a two-time PBA World Champion (Tackett), the best player in his home country (Japan's Kawazoe) and we still didn't

stack up against (L.A. X's Jason Belmonte, a 17-time PBA Tour champion and four-time PBA Player of the Year).

"But the PBA League is about the team, not one guy. I didn't want my guys overthinking so we narrowed things down to one or two balls for each player to make decisions simpler, and it worked out perfectly."

In the second match, the 2014 and 2015 Elias Cup champion Atom Splitters got off to a slow start against Brooklyn, but Jesper Svensson, Dick Allen, AJ Johnson, Tom Daugherty and anchor bowler Chris Barnes combined for a string of five strikes, taking the lead when Brooklyn's PBA Hall of Famers Walter Ray Williams Jr. and Parker Bohn III left back-to-back splits. A late string of five strikes wasn't enough as the Atom Splitters took a 223-212 decision.

Game two wasn't as close. Silver Lake struck on seven of its first eight shots and ran away with a 257-205 victory after the Styles left seven single pins.

"The first game is always nerve-racking," said Silver Lake manager Mark Baker. "The adrenalin kicks in for everyone. You can't explain to first-time bowlers what it's going to be like with the crowds here. Even my heart started pumping."

A pivotal shot involved Barnes converting the 2-5-8 in the 10th frame of game one, which gave the Atom Splitters

the win.

"Chris making that spare was huge," Baker said. "We won the first game, and when that happens, you know you will at least tie. When you win the first game, you know you've got a free swing at it in game two. It got all of our guys a little looser."

Motown, which has never won the Elias Cup, will meet the Atom Splitters in the first semifinal round match that will air on ESPN on Sunday, May 6, at 1 p.m. ET.

The final two quarterfinal round matches – New York City vs. Dallas and Philadelphia vs. Portland – will air next Sunday, April 29, at 1 p.m. ET with the winners advancing to the second semifinal match on May 6. The Elias Cup finals will air on Sunday, May 13, at 1 p.m. All ESPN telecasts are being simultaneously streamed on ESPN3 and the WatchESPN app.

PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Oxford, Fla., rolled the final five strikes to defeat Adam Chase of North Babylon, N.Y., 237-235, in the title match of the PBA Bowlers Discount Eastern Open presented by Hammer at AMF Towson Lanes in Towson, Md., Sunday, boosting his all-time PBA titles record total to 107.

Williams, who had a free weekend between the USBC Masters and the Port Property Management PBA Xtra Frame Maine Shootout in Portland, qualified second behind Australia's Sam Cooley. He disposed of Eric Cornog of Cherry Hill, N.J., 2-1, in the best-of-three-game Round of 8 before slipping past Ryan Shafer of Horseheads, N.Y., in the semifinal round, 172-163, when Shafer failed to strike in his 10th frame.

Chase, who was looking for his first PBA title, qualified fourth and eliminated Gary Haines of West Babylon, N.Y., 2-0, before ousting Steve Pavlinko Jr. of Sewell, N.J., 213-157, in his semifinal match. Chase saw his chance to beat Williams disappear when he left a 10 pin on his second shot in the 10th frame after striking on his first shot.

For the 58-year-old Williams, the win meant \$2,500 in prize money along with his 33rd standard PBA Regional title to go along with 47 PBA Tour, 11 PBA50 Tour and 16 PBA50 Regional titles.

-As the PBA50 Tour season closes in, PBA50 players will have a final tuneup opportunity in the PBA50 Sarasota South Open at Sarasota Lanes in Sarasota, Fla., April 18-20.

Division standings, taking the lead in doubles, singles and all-events, while the mother-daughter tandem of JungShin Kim and MiYoung Kim set the pace in Sapphire Doubles.

Kennedy, a 37-year-old righthander, rolled sets of 512 in doubles, 486 in singles and 466 in team for a 1,464 all-events total. She and Manitowoc's Gail Sheridan (405) lead Amethyst Doubles with 917.

Kennedy made her second Women's Championships appearance this week, and though she felt she was getting into her own head during doubles and singles, she was able to make adjustments on the way to the top spot.

"I was constantly thinking about my footing," Kennedy said. "It seemed to throw me off a couple of times."

Kennedy's performance at the NBS already has served as encouragement to continue her young career at the Women's Championships.

"It hasn't fully hit me yet," Kennedy said. "It feels good."

The Amethyst Division includes bowlers with entering averages of 130-144, and Amethyst Doubles features players with combined entering averages of 260-289.

In Sapphire Doubles, MiYoung, of Edmond, Oklahoma, turned in a consistent performance with games of 148, 192 and 168 for a 508 series, and JungShin, of Woodward, Oklahoma, added 159, 173 and 167 for 499 and a 1,007 total.

JungShin made her second Women's Championships

appearance, while MiYoung made her tournament debut this week in Reno.

Like many first-time participants, MiYoung was impressed by the championship atmosphere found at the NBS.

"It was a little nerve-racking, but exciting," said MiYoung, a 34-year-old righthander. "I haven't bowled with this many people before."

Although the Kims were excited to find themselves at the top of the standings, the opportunity to spend time together was the most important part of the experience.

"To have this happen the first time we bowled together is a neat experience," MiYoung said. "To bowl and travel with my mom always is a fun thing to do."

Sapphire Doubles includes bowlers with combined entering averages of 290-319.

The 2018 Women's Championships will feature more than 4,300 four-player teams and 17,000 total bowlers competing in four-average based divisions in team competition and six divisions in doubles, singles and all-events.

The Women's Championships will step aside in May to welcome the USBC Queens, a major championship on the Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour, to the 78-lane venue. The Queens will take place May 16-22 and conclude with a live televised broadcast on May 22 at 8 p.m. Eastern on CBS Sports Network.

# Just Paying Attention

As she has been kind enough to do for JPA the last two years, Jodi Woessner will spell out her training regimen, routine, and goals as she begins another season on the PWBA Tour this week. She has been kind enough to share with us what she does to stay in peak physical and mental shape year-round to compete on a professional level.

Woessner will also check in from time to time this season providing our loyal readers her insights. This week, the four-time Ohio Women's Bowler of the Year recaps her off-season preparations for the opening

tournament in Las Vegas.

JPA: Last year's tour was certainly not what you had expected. Now that you've had some time away to reflect, what things worked and didn't work as well, both mentally and physically week-to-week?

Jodi Woessner: There were a few things happening last year that made me more inconsistent than I would have liked. I was still getting used to the change from 16# to 15# and the difference in my ball motion. I struggled with splitting a lot and found that part of the reason was due to collapsing my shoulder during my release. I worked with John Gaines at the Orlando stop and was able to get more in line which made a positive difference my last few tournaments. I also struggled with my thumb and feel. During the US Open, I made a change to urethane Vise IT slugs from vinyl which I've continued to use.

JPA: Any notable additions or subtractions to the workout regimen as you train for the PWBA season?

Woessner: I'll be finishing a Beachbody 80 Day Obsession program the week before tour starts which primarily focused on strength training for legs and core with a few days of cardio each week.

JPA: Will there be any different mental or physical preparations this year?

Woessner: I've continued to focus on what I worked on last year with John Gaines and feel that my timing is better than it's ever been. I've also focused a lot on my mental game. I was letting too many things outside of my control affect me and in turn, just wasn't having much fun. I've worked hard on communicating better both during and after competition by reflecting on what happened, thinking through my options and talking through ideas instead of getting frustrated for not being able to figure it out on my own and shutting down.

JPA: Is your body still fresher after several straight days of competition, and also in general?

Woessner: Yes, I typically have no issues in soreness after days of competition however I know this year the tour will be an even greater challenge with the increased number of games in the regular format tournaments. In order to make stepladder on Saturday night, you'll have bowled 30 games in 2 days plus practice bowling from 9am to 9pm on Friday and 8am to 4pm on Saturday. This, along with the travel and my "real job" on days in between, will be an even bigger test of stamina, focus and patience than it has been in previous years.

JPA: What differences have you seen with your current ball weight, like pin carry, tendon strain, etc.? This time last year you had just switched to 15 lbs.

Woessner: No I stayed with 15#. I'm very happy I switched primarily due to the difference in ball motion I see that I didn't see in the 16# equipment

for me. Too often it seemed like everything was reacting the same whereas now, I can definitely see a difference. Still and always, I will be learning but I have more faith and confidence in my knowledge and selections now.

JPA: What is your PWBA outlook for 2018?

Woessner: To enjoy it! I've learned a lot the past few years and look forward to it all coming together this summer. BUT when it doesn't, I'll learn from it so I can apply the next time.

## Cyber Report

### USBC Agrees to In-Person Hearings, Per USOC

The United States Bowling Congress Board of Directors has adopted and modified the due-process procedures in its governing documents following a report and recommendation from the United States Olympic Committee.

The changes are effective April 30, and include providing any USBC member the right to an in-person hearing when charged with a rules violation that could result in suspension of USBC membership. As a result, the USOC has lifted USBC's probation and returned USBC to full National Governing Body status with continued membership in USOC.

The previous policy offered an automatic right to an in-person hearing for Team USA members and actively engaged athletes, as defined in the USBC Bylaws, and gave the Rules Department and the Legal and Legislative Committee discretion on whether to conduct an in-person hearing in all other cases.

The USOC Board voted to approve the report and recommendation confirming USBC's good standing on Wednesday.
