

Josie Barnes Wins Nationwide Greater Cleveland Open

Greater Cleveland Open title.

Barnes, who now owns three career PWBA Tour titles, defeated Singapore's Cherie Tan in a thrilling finish at Yorktown Lanes, 223-213, to claim the title and \$10,000 top prize.

The stepladder finals were streamed live at BowlTV.com.

The title match came down to the final frame with Tan leading by a single pin. Barnes, finishing the match first, delivered three strikes in the 10th frame to force Tan to do the same to claim her second career title.

Tan, a left-hander who was the top seed at the PWBA Greater Cleveland Open, stepped up and made one of her best shots of the week to start her final frame but was denied by a 9 pin on her first delivery.

"I knew if I didn't strike

Jason Belmonte Wins DHC PBA Japan Invitational

on Sunday for his fourth title of the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour season and the 22nd of his career.

With the win, the 35-year-old Belmonte moved into a tie for 10th place on the PBA all-time titles list with PBA Hall of Famer Marshall Holman.

After qualifying third for the stepladder finals, Belmonte eliminated Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, 245-220, and Japan's Takuya Miyazawa, 227-189, to advance to the title match. Barnes defeated defending DHC champion Dom Barrett of England, 253-222, in the first match.

"I've traveled to Japan to bowl for fifteen years and I've never won," Belmonte said. "Winning in front of the Japanese crowd means a lot; I'm very honored.

Tournament leader Cherie Tan still had a chance to claim the title if she could strike on all three shots in the tenth, she would win 223-222, but Tan left a solid nine-pin on a perfect shot to give Barnes the title.

The one main takeaway for me was the excitement and energy level for the two players. Barnes was pumped and emotional as part of the celebration of throwing her three strikes.

Tan gets up, needing three strikes, throws a great shot,

leaves a solid nine (she's left-handed), turns around and walks back showing no emotion. While I do appreciate she kept her head in the game and all that, I just gotta have some emotion on a shot and result like that.

That is the part of the sport that I respond to, and I think most fans are the same. We want to know that winning or losing really matters to the athletes, in this case I'm sure it absolutely matters to Tan, but I couldn't tell that as a viewer and fan.

PBA Set to Launch Nine-Event Summer Tour in June

Incentives, schedule, FloBowling coverage figure to attract big names, offer unique opportunities for PBA players and fans

CHICAGO (April 26, 2009) – Much will be at stake when the 2019 Go Bowling! Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) Summer Tour begins at the end of June.

Entry into an historic PBA event in China, a new FloBowling PBA ATX Invite special event and the inaugural United States Bowling Congress (USBC) Cup all rest in the balance when the seven-city, nine-event PBA Summer Tour begins June 28-30, in Lubbock, Texas.

The Summer Tour then moves to Houston for the Storm Striking Against Breast Cancer Mixed Doubles in July before the heart of the schedule in August with seven more title events, punctuated by the FloBowling PBA Summer Swing presented by the brands of Ebonite, in Aurora, Illinois, Aug. 24-31.

All nine events will be streamed live from first ball to last by FloBowling. For subscription and schedule information visit www.flobowling.com.

"We're excited about the 2019 PBA Summer Tour because it gives more PBA fans around the country a chance to see our top players compete up close," PBA Tour CEO and Commissioner Tom Clark said. "The PBA Player Services Truck and lane maintenance team will be at all of the stops. The geography involved and the calendar are strategic, and the bonus incentives for top performers are big."

The 2019 PBA Summer Tour will have its own points list, with enticing and historic bonus incentives involving three inaugural competitions serving as top story lines throughout the Tour.

1) The inaugural USBC Cup will reward the top five players in PBA Summer Tour points with bonus cash prizes, including \$20,000 to the points leader.

2) The inaugural FloBowling PBA ATX Invite will award berths into a special event for the top eight PBA Summer Tour points leaders at Dart Bowl in the hometown of FloSports, Austin, Texas, on Sept. 21. First prize in the FloBowling Invite will be \$25,000 and all participants in the event will cash.

3) The inaugural PBA China Tiger Cup will award the top eight PBA Summer Tour points leaders with expenses-paid trips to Shanghai, Nov. 19-21, for a 16-player singles event including eight Chinese bowlers, and a separate USA vs. China team match. All players will cash in



the PBA Tiger Cup singles event which offers a \$20,000 first prize, and in the team event the winning five-player team will divide \$15,000.

The 2019 PBA Summer Tour events will be open to non-PBA members as well as members, but non-members will not be eligible for any of the special events or bonus prizes.

Points earned during the PBA Summer Tour will also count toward 2020 DHC Japan Invitational and 2020 PBA Tour Finals eligibility, as well as figuring into consideration for the end-of-season Player and Rookie of the Year awards.

All Summer Tour tournaments except the Aurora Open will be Tier 3 events under the

PBA's Tier 1-2-3 points system (the Aurora Open will be a Tier 2 event).

all week. I feel for the leaders," he continued. "It's unfortunate to dominate a tournament and then lose it all in one game. It took me fifteen years but I feel quite certain Jakob will do it much sooner than that."

The difference in the tightly-contested championship match was Butturff's failure to convert the 3-5-6-9 "bucket" in the second frame. The loss prevented Butturff from claim-

ing his third title of the year, which would have put him in a title-tie with Belmonte. Instead, Belmonte further enhanced his bid for 2019 PBA Player of the Year honors.

"At 2:30 this morning, Tim Mack (his bowling ball rep) called me and said he had an idea to drill me a different ball and I bowled amazing with it today," Belmonte said.

PBA's live streaming partner, FloBowling, provided live coverage of the DHC PBA Japan Invitational. Full coverage of the finals, along with match



WRW Takes PBA50 National Championship Title to Start Season with Back-to-Back Wins

Hall of Famer beats reigning PBA50 Player of the Year Michael Haugen Jr. 278-243 in title match for 13th career and third PBA50 Tour major title

THE VILLAGES, Fla. (April 26, 2019) – PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. defeated reigning PBA50 Player of the Year Michael Haugen Jr. 278-243 in the title match to win the PBA50 National Championship presented by Spanish Springs Lanes and Radical Friday for his second consecutive PBA50 Tour title of the season and third career PBA50 Tour major title.

Down by nine pins in the fourth frame, Williams reeled off eight strikes in a row to win the match. After starting with four strikes in a row, Haugen ran into trouble in the fifth frame when he left the 3-10 split, made the spare, but then opened in the sixth after leaving the 3-6 which gave Williams the opening he needed.

"I was a little concerned because he (Haugen) had such a good ball reaction," said Williams, who is the all-time PBA Tour titles leader with 47 wins. "We both play a similar angle to the pocket, so I was watching him pretty closely in the first three matches. We both got off to a good start, but he ran into trouble in the middle of the match and fortunately I was able to keep striking."

Williams dominated Friday's match play rounds to earn the top seed for the finals posting a 12-4 record and 8,479 34-game

pinfall total (including bonus pins) outdistancing fellow hall of famer No. 2 qualifier Norm Duke by 337 pins.

The win also was Williams' 13th of his career on the tour for players 50 and over which moved him into sole possession of second on the all-time list behind John Handegard who tops the list with 14 wins.

"After this win I feel like the record is definitely in sight," said Williams, who won the 2014 and 2017 USBC Senior Masters for his other PBA50 major titles. "Over the past year I've been feeling like I'm bowling decent but just not getting the results. Now I feel like I'm at the top of my game and can get the job done when I need to, but you never know when you'll win again."

Williams' first win of the season came in last week's season-opening Johnny Petraglia BVL Open presented by Lucas Magazine and Brunswick where he beat finals top qualifier Sammy Ventura of Syracuse, New York, 288-205, in the title match.

As the No. 4 qualifier for the finals, Haugen, trying for his second major and fourth career PBA50 Tour win, came out of the gate strong with a 287-251 win over No. 5 qualifier, 2017 PBA50 Player of the Year Brian LeClair of Albany, New York, and then beat hall of famer and

eight-time PBA50 Tour winner Amleto Monacelli, who qualified third for the finals, 277-237, to advance to the semifinal match against Duke.

Haugen then managed to beat Duke, who was trying for his third major and sixth career title, in a hard-fought semifinal match, 214-206, to advance to the title match.

The PBA50 Tour heads to Mooresville, North Carolina for the PBA50 Mooresville Open presented by the Mooresville Convention & Visitors Bureau and Storm at Victory Lanes and Entertainment Center April 28-May 1.



United States Wins Team, Sweeps All-events at 2019 PABCON Men's Championships

LIMA, Peru - There aren't formal timeouts in bowling, but when Team USA head coach Rod Ross saw his team's energy and communication in need of a boost Saturday at the Pan American Bowling Confederation Men's Championships, he pulled the competitors aside and did what any coach would do - he explained what he was seeing from his perspective and offered words of inspiration.

The rallying moment came after the fourth frame of their first game at the new Bowling Center of La Villa Deportiva Nacional (VIDENA), and his encouragement ignited a fire in his well-balanced team, which is a combination of youth and experience.

The re-energized group then pulled away from the 16-team field and went on to win the five-player team gold medal by nearly 300 pins. It was the second consecutive time, and 15th time overall, Team USA claimed the title, and the momentum also helped the group sweep the all-events medals.

Team USA rolled games of 1,119, 1,186 and 1,112 on Saturday to remain atop the standings with a 6,929 six-game total, a new PABCON Championships record. The group posted three-game sets of 3,512 on Friday and 3,417 on Saturday.

This year's performance topped the previous record of 6,817, set by Team USA at the 2016 event in Cali, Colombia.

Canada, also the team runner-up to Team USA in 2016, earned this year's silver medal with a 6,636 total. Puerto Rico jumped over Colombia in the final game to secure the bronze medal with a 6,588 performance.

"We came out today a little flat, and it seemed like our guys were bowling more to protect the small lead we had from yesterday, rather than leaving that in the past and trying to win today's three games," Ross said. "To win the day, you have to win the games. To win the games, you have to win the frames. To win the frames, you have to win the shot. After I pulled them aside, they really turned things around, and we're excited to come away with the gold medal."

AJ Johnson led the way for Team USA in the six team games, posting a 1,441 total. That included a 279 finish and 783 series Saturday. He was followed by Darren Tang (1,410), Nick Pate (1,381), Sean Wilcox (1,294), John Janawicz (702),

Perry Crowell (701).

The team competition was the only event of the 2019 PABCON Men's Championships that was contested over two days (three games each day), compared to the singles, doubles and trios events, which all featured six consecutive games.

For some teams and bowlers, there was potential for a slowing of momentum, while others had an opportunity to regroup and consider a new strategy for attacking the 41-foot World Bowling Rome oil pattern.

Team USA experienced a little of both, as it took a few

Team USA's Wilcox and Johnson Break Record, Win Doubles at 2019 PABCON Men's Championships

LIMA, Peru - The Team USA bowling program is a brotherhood of sorts, where one generation teaches the next, and the players forever share a bond only they can understand.

Five-time Team USA member AJ Johnson is taking his leadership role this week at the 2019 Pan American Bowling Confederation Men's Championships very seriously, and he used a lead-by-example approach Wednesday on the way to the doubles gold medal with Team USA rookie Sean Wilcox.

Paced by Johnson's near-record 1,551 six-game block, the two shattered the PABCON Championships doubles record by 145 pins, posting a 3,062 total at the new Bowling Center of La Villa Deportiva Nacional (VIDENA).

Wilcox, a 20-year-old right-hander, was there every strike of the way, and his 258 final game helped secure the gold medal and their place in the record book.

He contributed a 1,511 total to the memorable effort that moved him and Johnson past hall of famers Patrick Allen and Walter Ray Williams Jr.,

who previously held the record with 2,917, rolled at the 2011 PABCON Men's Championships in Guadalajara, Mexico.

This year's silver medal went to Colombia's Santiago Mejia (1,470) and Manuel Otalora (1,398) with a 2,868 total, and Canada's Zachary Wilkins (1,399) and Mitch Hupé (1,367) held on for the bronze medal with 2,766.

"My whole outlook for this week, and anytime I travel for Team USA, is to help get as many medals for the team as possible," said Johnson, a 26-year-old right-hander. "The whole day, I just felt really calm and aware of everything, because I wanted to make things as easy as possible for Sean to not get too worked up. There's just something about team bowling. It's just different, and I truly enjoy helping a team find success. To break a record is just unbelievable to me. Just unbelievable."

The gold medalists started their block in a high-scoring meeting with Peru's Aldo Gibu and Kenny Kishimoto, both of whom started the opening game with eight consecutive strikes. Gibu finished with

279, while Kishimoto shot 265. Johnson and Wilcox had 278 and 244, respectively, and were able to maintain that pace throughout the block.

Johnson's performance included games of 278, 269, 269, 262, 269 and 204. He fell nine pins short of matching the PABCON Championships six-game record of 1,560, posted by Team USA's Bill O'Neill, also at the 2011 event. With three strikes in his final frame, Johnson would've finished with 1,561.

Johnson credits the guidance of players such as Chris Barnes and Tommy Jones for his own understanding and appreciation for what it means to bowl with USA on his back.

Barnes and Jones combined for nearly three decades on Team USA but chose to retire after 2018. The last gold medal they won together - in the team event at the 2017 World Bowling World Championships - also included Johnson, who is excited to share the things his predecessors taught him.

"I've always been an emotional guy, and I wear my heart on my sleeve, but I had amazing mentors in Chris Barnes and Tommy Jones, and I really tried to pay attention to how they handled themselves in different situations," said Johnson, who also earned an all-events bronze medal at the 2017 World Championships. "I had to dial a lot of my emotions back early on today, and I kept telling Sean to keep looking

forward and stay on the gas. We needed to stay focused and save the celebration for when the job was done."

Both high-speed, high-rev players, Johnson and Wilcox see the lane in a similar fashion. That, along with great communication, gave them a clear picture and strategy during the six games Wednesday, and moves and ball changes came easily as well.

The two have been friends since Wilcox found his way into the youth spotlight in 2012, and those years of familiarity and friendship have helped make Wilcox's international debut a smooth and memorable one.

His contribution to the doubles win was steady and included games of 244, 277, 248, 227, 257 and 258.

"This is absolutely surreal," Wilcox said. "Being my first time on the team and being picked to travel already was a dream come true. Then, coming out and doing what we did today was amazing. I've known AJ for a long time, and he's been nothing short of amazing to look up to. We

just worked so well together today, kept each other's heads on straight, talked through the moves and bowled to the best of our ability. To break a record and win the gold medal is just awesome. I've accomplished a few great things in my short career, but this is the one that's left me almost speechless."

Team USA's Darren Tang and John Janawicz set the bar with a 2,707 total on the day's opening squad. Tang, who earned the singles silver medal, led the effort with a 1,444 total, and Janawicz added 1,263. They finished sixth overall.

The final Team USA tandem on the lanes Wednesday was another pair of first-time participants, Nick Pate and Perry Crowell IV, who posted sets of 1,387 and 1,241, respectively, for a 2,628 total. They finished tied for 10th.

The United States entered the 2019 PABCON Men's Championships as the defending champion in the doubles event. John Szczerbinski and AJ Chapman claimed the gold medal at the 2016 PABCON Adult Championships in Cali, Colombia.

This week's tournament is the first event to take place at the newly constructed bowling center, which is part of an expansive athletic complex that will be home to the 2019 Pan American Games this summer.



frames on Day 2 to find the right energy level and pace, while a few lanes away, Janawicz's clear mind allowed him to catapult up the all-events standings and into the cut for the week-ending Masters event.

He started the final day in 30th place and used a 748 series to move himself up to 16th place, earning the final spot in match play with a 5,300 total, a 220.83 average for 24 games.

The Masters portion of the tournament will feature the top 16 players in the all-events standings, who will bowl best-of-three head-to-head matches Sunday. All-events included six games in each event (singles, doubles, trios and team).

Team USA's Tang, Johnson and Wilcox sat comfortably in the top three spots in the all-events standings heading into the final game, but only 10 pins separated first and third place. Canada's Francois Lavoie was 50 pins behind with a game to go.

In the finale, focused solely on making sure Team USA locked up the team gold medal, Johnson rolled his highest game of the week, 279, to secure his second and third gold medals of the tournament. He and Wilcox won doubles earlier in the week with a record total.

Johnson's 5,690 all-events total, a 237.08 average, also was a PABCON Championships record, topping the previous mark of 5,644, posted by Canada's Zach Wilkins in 2016.

"The individual things are nice, but we came here with one goal, and that was the team gold," said Johnson, a 26-year-old right-hander and five-time Team USA member. "I wanted to make sure we kept our foot on the gas the last game because the talented teams we were up against could put together a big game at any time. Sean had a hard time seeing things the last game, but we're a team, and I wanted to do my part to help pick him up."

Tang (5,655) came away with the all-events silver medal, finishing 35 pins behind Johnson, and Wilcox, despite a 137 final game, held on for the bronze (5,547). Lavoie needed a mark in his final frame to pass Wilcox, but a 4-6-7-10 split, which he was unable to convert, left him seven pins short (5,540).

Pate also advanced to the Masters event with a sixth-place all-events finish (5,469), but Crowell fell below the cutline, finishing 35th with 5,105.

Johnson's success couldn't have come at a better time for him, during a year that has been a little bit challenging.

He's still getting comfortable

with some new bowling equipment, he made a switch from 16-pound balls to 15, and after not initially being selected to this year's Team USA roster, he did all he could to be ready for this event after finding out he'd been added to the team.

"I'm not really having the greatest (Professional Bowlers Association) Tour season so far, and I was fighting some things, so it took a lot of extra work to try to figure things out," Johnson said. "I've been trying to find myself, and it has progressively gotten better. When I got the call inviting me to be on the team for 2019, I worked extra hard to make sure I was sharp for this event and could contribute as much as possible."

Janawicz, a 46-year-old right-hander and United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famer, also hoped to contribute to the team's success this week, whether it be with his scores or knowledge and experience. He has been a regular on the PABCON stage during his nine Team USA appearances, and he has collected nearly two dozen medals along the way.

Though he struggled compared to his teammates at times this week, he never stopped trying to find the right ball, trick or strategy that would help him help the team.

Entering the final three games as the sixth man, his plan was to scout the lanes his teammates would be going to, so he could relay information toward the conclusion of their gold-medal run. If he could manage a big day of his own, finishing in the top 16 would be a nice bonus.

"I got off to a good start today, and knowing I was about 100 pins off the pace, I'd need a big overall effort,"

said Janawicz, who has earned multiple Masters gold medals at the PABCON Championships. "I tried something different on the fresh I hadn't tried all week, and that was to curve it more, which worked pretty well. I was fortunate to make the Masters cut, and we won the team gold, so it was a pretty great day all the way around. You just have to keep going and keep fighting, and today was

one of those days."

The 100 bowlers at the 2019 PABCON Men's Championships competed for medals in singles, doubles, trios, team and all-events.

This week's tournament featured countries from North, Central and South America and the Caribbean, including Argentina, Aruba, Bahamas, Bermuda, Brazil, Canada, Co-



Just Paying Attention

After a wide variety of results in four prior PWBA seasons, Jodi Woessner was ready for something different this season. In what has become an annual feature, JPA sat down with the Customer Operation Team Leader in the Roofing Division of OwensCorning just before this past weekend's PWBA season opener in Cleveland as she discussed not only newer physical and mental training points, but also an unexpected health concern.

JPA: How's the training for the 2019 PWBA Season?

Jodi Woessner: I've focused on a few changes from last year. A few physical changes such as my footwork and rounding my push away to get my ball into the swing a little faster, as well as rolling the ball forward more off my hand especially focusing on my ring finger. I started really focusing more on that at the end of last season which has resulted in my grip going up by one half size.

JPA: Any notable additions or subtractions to the workout regimen?

Woessner: Primarily the same regime as in the past with focus on legs and core with a few days of cardio each week. I slacked a bit over the winter with both my workouts and nutrition, so it's been a struggle to get back on it. That has been a focus the last few months, for sure.

JPA: Have you done as well as you've liked in local tournaments since last fall?

Woessner: I've had some success but struggled a bit more on house shots which I think is due to the slight change in my release. The ball is reading the lane sooner than it used to and instead of getting into what I would consider bad habits by changing my release back, we've tried different balls and layouts to attempt to compensate for the difference.

JPA: What differences in mental preparation have you done, this year versus last year, if any?

Woessner: I've been more focused on accepting what I can do and doing that really well instead of focusing so much on what I can't do. I've always put so much pressure on myself to be as versatile as possible which is great when it works. When it doesn't, I end up having so many options that when I end up confusing myself and don't commit to one thing, I end up getting frustrated that

I can't make something work instead of cutting myself some slack and going back to something I can do really well.

JPA: What things did you learn from your trip to the WSOB at Thunderbowl Lanes?

Woessner: Sitting back and watching the best in the world reminded me that we are all human and regardless of how good you are, you have times when you struggle too. The biggest thing is to remember to have patience. Without patience, you get ahead of yourself and before you know it, you have buried yourself so far in a hole that it's too hard to dig out instead of just accepting that maybe it's a bad pair or you just didn't match up and not carry it over to the next game.

JPA: You posted on your Facebook page about a recent melanoma scan. What situation developed that led to having a scan?

Woessner: I had a few spots develop on my leg. As they weren't going away and I'm not one to shy away from the sun, I had them checked out. All the spots on my leg were of no concern but I did have a mole they determined to be abnormal that I will be having removed on our break in July.

JPA: What are your PWBA goals this year?

Woessner: Honestly, I want to have fun doing what I love. I put so much pressure on myself that is really not necessary. When I don't do that and think clearly, I'm much more successful. I will focus on staying in the moment, believing in myself, trusting my moves, communicating well with my staff reps and as my brother told me to do 8 years ago, just relax and be me because when I do that, I'm hard to beat. By doing those things, I will have success and of course, the ultimate goal is always to win.

A 266 game near the end of qualifying pushed her past the low cash spot into the Round of 32. Woessner's two eight-game qualifying blocks were 1742 and 1739, good for 3481, a plus 281 total, tough to do if one is mentally up and down. So the "relax" thing worked. But sometimes it's hard to tell by just looking at someone if a new mental strategy is in use. And sometimes, it's easy to tell, especially by someone who knows you well. Woessner told me this in a message after finishing in 29th place in the

Round of 32.

"Even my hubby Aaron said he's never seen me remain as composed and even tempered through all the 9-counts and splits as I was this weekend."



Up Your Average

NEVER EVER Walk Toward Your Target - Part Deux

Since your body is always inside of your swing, walking parallel to the target path can often mean walking a diagonally straight line toward the foul line rather than perpendicular to it.

There are only three kinds of shots in bowling - Up the Boards (right-to-left), Down the Boards (same direction the boards are going), and Away shot (left-to-right)? Here's how a righty would line up for each:

Up the Boards - Since the projection is right-to-left, you walk right-to-left. You will, appropriately, end up farther left than the board you started on. That is not drift. You are walking perfectly straight; it's just not straight with the boards.

How much left you walk depends on the severity of the angle you are playing. A ball laid down on the 2nd board and sent to the 17th board at the pocket has a more severe angle than one laid down on the 10th board and sent to the pocket. Since the shot from the 2nd board creates a greater angle than the shot from the 10th board, it will require you to walk a more severe angle.

Down the Boards - You'll end up very close to the board on which you started. Since your projection is parallel to the boards, your walk path will be as well.

Away - Since the trajectory of an away shot is left-to-right, you'll walk left-to-right and end up right of your starting board. That is not drift. You

are walking perfectly straight; it's just not straight with the boards. The away shot requires you to end up outside of where you started. How far outside depends on the severity of the angle.

I often see people lined up too far left to execute a down the boards shot, that "walk toward your target" stuff. Standing on 25 to send the ball down 10 won't work. On the way to the foul line, that ever-dependable body says "Yo, Nimrod! We can't get there from here," so it compensates for the alignment error, sends you toward your target, and you either pull it or send it to the ditch.

Another danger with that stand-25-hit-10 alignment is that instead of walking to the outside, you just walk "straight with the boards" and land on 25. You are not too far to hit the 10th board at the arrows but you are certainly too far to hit it going in the direction you intend to be going (down).

You could swing the ball through the second arrow and to the outside from that position if the lane would let you but that is not your intended path. You intend to play down the boards but lined up and walked as though you were going to swing it. Sure enough, that listing to the right will cause you to either pull the squatchy out of it or toss it out in the weeds.

Just as the severity of the angle you are playing dictates how far left you walk when rolling an up the boards shot,

how close you finish to where you started on an away shot also depends on the severity of the angle you are playing. If you are only bellying the ball a couple of boards, you will probably end up on or very close to the board on which you started. But if you're trying to send the ball from 15 at the arrows out to the 2nd board, you are creating more of an angle on the lane; therefore, you need more of an angle on the approach.

Even that 15 to 2 shot doesn't allow you to walk ten boards in the direction you're throwing. Walking ten boards to the outside in the short 15-17 feet of approach is a very severe angle in a short amount of space. And that walk distance only applies if you stand at the back of the approach. If you stand on the first row of dots (11-12 feet behind the foul line) or you stand on the second row of dots (14-15 feet behind the foul line), a walk of ten boards

right creates an even more severe angle.

Crossing ten boards on the approach is a much more severe angle than crossing ten boards on the lane from the foul line to the deck or even from the foul line to the breakpoint. Crossing

ten boards in that 40 or so feet is much different than crossing ten boards in the 17 feet of approach. To walk ten boards and throw the ball on the angle that walk creates would require a very wide lane indeed. Visit Susie at strikeability.com!

Anthony Simonsen, Andres Gomez Advance to PBA Playoffs Round of 8

Two more Round of 16 matches to air on May 6 at 9 p.m. ET p.m. on FS1

 PORTLAND, Maine (April 29, 2019) – Anthony Simonsen of Little Elm, Texas and Colombia's Andres Gomez filled two more spots in the PBA Playoffs Round of 8 after winning their Round of 16 Race to 2 Points matches that aired Monday on FS1 from Bayside Bowl.

Simonsen and Gomez joined Jason Belmonte of Australia, who leads the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour season with four wins, and 2019 PBA Scorpion Championship winner Kris Prather of Plainfield, Illinois, who advanced by winning their Round of 16 matches that aired April 22 on FS1 and will meet in the Round of 8 on May 20.

Simonsen, who became the youngest to win two majors at 22 with his win in the PBA Players Championship in February, beat Page in the first game of their Race to 2 Points match, 237-214, but Page, a six-time tour winner with four top-five finishes this season, came back to win the second game, 226-214, to send the match to a ninth and 10th frame roll-off. Simonsen won the roll-off, 49-39, to advance to the Round of 8.

"The adrenaline was really flowing after the first game and I was a little too pumped up heading into the second game,"

said Simonsen of dealing with the energy from the boisterous Bayside Bowl crowd. "When we got to the second game the crowd got a little quiet for some reason and that actually threw me off a little bit.

"Rhino got off to a good start in the second game, but I knew with one game in the bank I still had an opportunity in the roll-off," Simonsen added. "I looked at the roll-off as another game – just make the best shots I can."

In the second Round of 16 match, Gomez, a three-time tour winner, beat 2016 PBA Player of the Year EJ Tackett of Bluffton, Indiana in both games – 231-228 and 245-193 – to advance.

Gomez put together a string of five strikes heading into the 10th frame of the first game to overtake Tackett after being down 37 pins in the fifth frame.

"In the first half of the first game I was still trying to figure it out," said Gomez. "I needed

to do what I do best and that was slow down. I don't have the power that these guys have out here on tour so having the right hand position and ball speed are critical for me to get a good ball reaction."

Gomez found the right combination in the second game, striking in seven of the first nine frames to breeze past a struggling Tackett.

The winner of the Playoffs, which features the top 24 players in competition points after the first 13 Go Bowling! PBA Tour tournaments of the 2019 season, will earn a \$100,000 first prize.

Round of 16 action continues on FS1 on May 6 and May 13 with both two-match telecasts airing at 9 p.m. EDT. The eight survivors will bowl Round of 8 Race to 2 Points matches on May 20 and May 27, reducing the field to the four survivors who will return to Portland for the semifinal and final rounds

more than 220 pins to earn the top seed. She started the title match using a urethane bowling ball, but switched back to a ball with a reactive coverstock in the sixth frame after three consecutive spares.

"Shannon (Pluhowsky of Dayton, Ohio) was using urethane, so I thought I'd give mine a shot," said Tan, who won the 2016 PWBA Storm Sacramento Open. "It was reading really nicely, and my reactive ball was struggling a little in the mids, so I decided to start with urethane. I threw the first shot in the 10th really well, and that's the only thing you can do. I can only control how well I throw it, and the rest is up to the pins, not me. But, it feels really great to bowl well since I was struggling during the second half of last year. I made some changes to my game, so I'm glad they're holding up."

Barnes advanced to the title match after delivering in the 10th frame against Singapore's Jazreel Tan, 234-232.

Jazreel Tan finished the semifinal first, rolling three strikes to force Barnes to fill 26 pins to win. Barnes delivered a double and toppled seven pins on her fill ball to advance.

Jazreel Tan started Saturday's stepladder finals by rolling nine strikes on her way to a 266-225 victory over Pluhowsky.

Competition this week at the Nationwide PWBA Greater Cleveland Open included two eight-game qualifying blocks on Friday to determine the 32 players for Saturday's Round of 32. An additional eight-game block Saturday morning narrowed the field to 12 players, who bowled six additional games to determine the stepladder finalists.



USBC Extends Partnership Agreement with South Point Hotel's Tournament Bowling Plaza

ARLINGTON, Texas – The United States Bowling Congress and the South Point Hotel and Casino have extended their partnership agreement to bring USBC Championships events to the Tournament Bowling Plaza in Las Vegas through 2033.

The extension of the agreement will have the USBC Women's Championships taking place at South Point Hotel's Tournament Bowling Plaza in 2029 and 2032, while the USBC Open Championships will visit the venue in 2030 and 2033. The extension keeps each event at the Tournament Bowling Plaza every third year.

"The South Point Bowling Plaza was designed to be a top bowling tournament facil-

ity, and in its short five-year existence, quickly has become a favorite venue of USBC tournament bowlers," said South Point Hotel General Manager Ryan Growney. "We appreciate the support of the bowlers and we're excited to host these major events for many years to come."

This year's Open Championships at the Tournament Bowling Plaza will have approximately 10,500 five-player teams participate in the 116th edition of the event. It is the tournament's fourth trip to Las Vegas and second time at South Point Hotel's 60-lane bowling tournament facility, where it first was held in 2017.

The Open Championships will also visit the Las Vegas

facility in 2021, 2024 and 2027.

The Women's Championships was the first major USBC tournament held inside South Point Hotel's \$35-million Tournament Bowling Plaza when 6,123 four-player teams competed in 2016.

In addition to 2029 and 2032, the Women's Championships will return to the venue in 2020, 2023 and 2026.




