RENO, Nev. - The United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame grew by six members on Wednesday with the induction ceremony of the 2018 class at the Grand Sierra Resort.

The 2018 USBC Hall of Fame Class includes Tennelle Milligan and Danny Wiseman, who were elected in the Superior Performance category, Kendra Gaines and John Janawicz for Outstanding USBC Performance, Jeri Edwards for Meritorious Service, and Tim Mack in the Pioneer category.

Wiseman, 50, of Baltimore, joined the Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Fame in 2013 and was rated No. 42 on

# New Mexico Open Added to World Bowling Tour

15th Annual Tournament will offer \$64,000 prize fund plus WBT points

Rio Rancho, NM - The 15th New Mexico Open, to be held at Tenpins & More in Rio Rancho from August 17-19 has been added to the 2018 World Bowling Tour calendar as a tier 3 event which rewards bowlers with two times the number of WBT Rankings points towards their rich year-end tournament.

It's the culmination of a quest by local tournament director, Steve Mackie that began almost a decade ago seeking first to be admitted to the European Bowling Tour then more recently the World Bowling Tour after they decided on a tier system of entry for events with less than \$100,000 in prize-money.

"We are just thrilled to be able to bring the prestigious



World Bowling Tour to our 24-lane Center, as the feature event in three months of our 35th Birthday celebrations," said Mackie.

# Shayna Ng Wins First Career PWBA Title at Las Vegas Open

LAS VEGAS - Shayna Ng of Singapore captured her first Professional Women's Bowling Association title, winning the 2018 PWBA Las Vegas Open on Saturday night at South Point Bowling Plaza.

Ng, the No. 2 seed, defeated top seed Diana Zavjalova of Latvia, 231-211, in the championship match. The stepladder finals were streamed live on Xtra Frame, the Professional Bowlers Association's online bowling channel.

A 28-year-old right-hander, Ng opened the championship match with strikes in the first six out of seven frames, but the match was far from decided. Zavjalova, despite beginning the match with an open frame, stayed patient with spares in frames two through four and then rolled four consecutive strikes.

Trouble struck Ng in the

eighth frame, as she left the 4-6-10 split, to give Zavjalova the opportunity to shut out Ng with strikes in the ninth and 10th frames.

# Tulsa to Host Multi-Event 2018 PBA Fall Swing

Three Go Bowling! PBA Tour titles to be decided in exclusive Xtra Frame series

CHICAGO – The Lanes at Coffee Creek in suburban Tulsa, Okla., will host the 2018 revival of the Professional Bowlers Association Fall Swing Oct. 14-20.

The multi-event tournament package, open to a field of 120 PBA members only, will be covered exclusively on Xtra Frame, PBA's online live streaming service.

The PBA Fall Swing, which will award Wolf Open, Bear Open and Tulsa Open titles, will precede the U.S. Open which takes place Oct. 24-31 at Northrock Lanes in Wichita, Kan. The Fall Swing and the U.S. Open – the final major championship of 2018 – are both part of the 2018 Go Bowling! PBA Tour schedule.

Defending champions from the last PBA Fall Swing, held at Thunderbowl Lanes in suburban Detroit in 2016, were Tom Daugherty of Riverview, Fla. (Wolf Open), EJ Tackett of Huntington, Ind. (Bear Open) and Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill. (Detroit Open vs. this year's re-named Tulsa Open).

Following an official practice day on Oct. 14, the Fall Swing will get underway with two seven-game qualifying rounds on the PBA Wolf 33 oiling pattern on Monday and Tuesday, Oct. 15-16. After 14 games, the top five will advance to the live Xtra Frame stepladder finals on Tuesday at 7:30 p.m. CT.

Wednesday and Thursday, all players will bowl two more seven-game qualifying rounds on the PBA Bear 39 pattern, with the top five bowling for the Bear Open title at 7:30 p.m.

Based on the combined 24-game qualifying totals on

the 33-foot Wolf and 39-foot Bear oiling patterns, the top 18 players will advance to the Tulsa Open finals, a 18-game round robin match play event that will be contested on the Dragon 45 oiling pattern Friday and Saturday, Oct. 19-20. After a total of 42 games, including match play bonus pins, the top five will compete for the Tulsa Open title at 1 p.m. Central on a lane condition selected by the leading qualifier.

All rounds of the Fall Swing will be covered live, exclusively on PBA's Xtra Frame live streaming channel. For subscription information, visit [xtraframe.tv](http://xtraframe.tv).

# Dallas Strikers, Philadelphia Hitmen Advance to PBA League Semifinal Round

PORTLAND, Maine – The two-time defending champion Shipyard Dallas Strikers will carry their bid to become the first three-time OceanView at Falmouth PBA League Elias Cup champion into the semifinal round after a thrilling extra frame victory over the

GEICO NYC WTT KingPins, but standing in the way will be a determined Sysco Philadelphia Hitmen team that has its collective eyes focused on winning its first Elias Cup. The third and fourth best-of-two-game quarterfinal rounds matches, which are part of the

2018 Go Bowling! PBA Tour schedule, were contested at Bayside Bowl and aired Sunday on ESPN.

Dallas lived up to its nickname, roaring out of the gate with a string of six strikes by Bill O'Neill, Rhino Page, Kyle Sherman, Tommy Jones and player-manager Norm Duke to build a 40-pin lead after five frames. The KingPins, fired up by PBA Hall of Famer Pete Weber, rallied with a late string of four strikes, but couldn't overcome Dallas' early lead.

With a 241-224 victory in hand, Dallas looked like it was going to run away with a two-game sweep, starting game two with four strikes. But Duke left a 3-10 split in the fifth frame, which he converted, but the KingPins got on a roll while the Strikers stumbled late in the game, losing to New York City, 237-208, to force the first one-ball sudden-death roll-off of the 2018 competition.

The matter was settled

quickly when KingPins' anchor Marshall Kent left a ringing 10 pin, and Duke, a PBA Hall of Famer and 38-time PBA Tour champion, struck.

"We had them; we started with four in a row and I made about the worst shot you can possibly make (in the fifth frame of game two)," Duke said, "and then it was a series of mistakes. But that's the thing about winning game one. You're still in it. In this format, unless you're dominant and sweep, it's going to come down to one ball and we all know it.





# Lennie Boresch Jr. Wins PBA50 National Championship for First Major And Fourth Career PBA50 Tour Title

Boresch throws two clutch strikes in 10th frame of championship match to beat top qualifier Norm Duke 198-192

THE VILLAGES, Fla. (April 28, 2018) – Throwing two pressured-filled strikes in the 10th frame of the title match, Lennie Boresch Jr. of Kenosha, Wis., beat PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke of Clermont, Fla., in the championship match to win the PBA50 National Championship presented by Spanish Springs Lanes and Radical Saturday for his first PBA50 Tour major and fourth career title.

Boresch, a United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famer, defeated Duke 198-192 to also win his third title at Spanish Springs Lanes after winning the Sun Bowl In The Villages in 2017 and also in his 2012 rookie season.

“It’s something you dream about your whole life,” said the 56-year-old Boresch. “To win a major especially against a great player like Norm – it’s something special for sure. This is going to take a while to sink in.”

Both players struggled to find a shot in the title match but Boresch had an opportunity to win when Duke, the top qualifier for the finals who was trying for his fifth PBA50 Tour title, failed to strike on his first ball of the 10th frame. Boresch made a one board move to the right and increased his speed slightly for the first shot in the

10th frame on the right lane and it turned out to be the right adjustment.

“I was visualizing what I wanted to do but I can tell you I was a nervous wreck,” said Boresch. “Fortunately I was able to get the ball to the area of the lane I wanted and came through with two of the biggest shots of my life.”

“Throughout my career I’ve been in a lot of pressure situations where I needed a strike or a double to win but this was at a whole different level,” he added.

Boresch, who qualified third for the finals, defeated PBA Hall of Famer and four-time PBA50 Tour titlist Parker Bohn III of Jackson, N.J., in the second stepladder match 248-221 to advance to the semi-final match.

In the semi-final match, Boresch beat 2018 PBA Hall of Fame inductee and two-time PBA50 Player of the Year Ron Mohr of Las Vegas, 242-232, to advance to the title match against Duke. Mohr was trying for his 10th PBA50 Tour title.

In the opening stepladder match, Bohn beat No. 5 qualifier PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Oxford, Fla., 257-221. Williams, who finished second in the season-opening PBA50 Lucas/Maga-

zine Classic, was trying for his 12th PBA50 Tour title.

The next stop for the PBA50 Tour will be the PBA50 Mooresville Open presented by Columbia 300 April 29-May 2 at George Pappas’ Victory Lanes in Mooresville, N.C.

purse of more than \$64,000, also a tournament record.

# Helmer Cup Winners Decided at 2018 Intercollegiate Team Championships

LINCOLN, Neb. – The McKendree men's team won a national title for the second time in three years and the Lindenwood women's team captured the second title in its program history at the 2018 Intercollegiate Team Championships at Sun Valley Lanes on Saturday.

McKendree, making its third consecutive appearance in the men's title match, took a 3-1 victory over Robert Morris-Illinois in the best-of-five Baker final. The Lindenwood women beat defending ITC champion McKendree, 3-1.

The championship matches were taped for broadcast on CBS Sports Network. The women's final will be televised on May 10 at 8 p.m. Eastern and the men's final will air

May 15 at 8 p.m. Eastern.

Robert Morris-Illinois took the opening game of the men's title match, 226-193, but the McKendree men came back with a 187-173 win in Game 2. Needing a strike and eight pins to even the series, sophomore anchor Charlie Reid buried all three shots.

"That was clutch," said McKendree coach Dennis Knepper. "That was the turning point. But, seriously, these guys knew he was going to do it. You could feel it from the team. He just looked like he had all the confidence in the world. It was awesome."

While the Bearcats produced three strikes in the first five frames of Game 3, the Eagles produced just one strike in the first seven frames. Both

teams used the final frame to try possible adjustments as McKendree took the game, 181-159, but Robert Morris-Illinois' struggles continued into Game 4.

Senior Billy Goodman then capped McKendree's four-strike run in the eighth frame as the Bearcats won Game 4, 195-160, to win the Helmer Cup.

"The feeling we had last year after we lost, that was something we didn't want to experience again," Reid said. "Coming into today, we just wanted to fill frames and execute shots the best we can. If the pins fall in our favor, they fall in our favor. It's bowling ... you just never know what's going to happen."

The Lindenwood women's team, which won its first title

12 years ago, started slow against defending ITC champion McKendree managing just two strikes in the opening game in a 191-177 loss.

But the Lions would rebound to win the next three games, including an unlikely victory in Game 2.

The Lions built an early lead in Game 2 as the Bearcats had three consecutive open frames. But the Bearcats stormed back with four consecutive strikes and had the chance to close out the game. However, a 2-10 split in the final frame opened the door for the Lions, who took advantage for a 183-178 victory to tie the best-of-five series at a game apiece.

"We were huddling, getting ready because we've been down 2-0 before," Lindenwood coach Phil Vida said. "When that door was opened a little bit, it was like a wave of confidence came over and we took advantage."

The Lions would take Game 3, 200-181, and then take the Helmer Cup with a 226-190 victory in Game 4.

"Everything I've ever dreamed of for my collegiate career, and how I wanted it to end, it just ended in a perfect way," said Lions senior Amanda Garavet, who was selected Most Valuable Player of the women's tournament. "I think we were really confident coming in on the bus this morning. We told each other we could do it and we trust each other."

Garavet was joined on the women's all-tournament team by Sacred Heart's Tori Boughton, McKendree's Breanna Clemmer, Kayla Crawford of St. Ambrose, and Stephanie

Schwartz of Stephen F. Austin.

Kenny Ryan of Robert Morris-Illinois earned MVP honors in the men's division. Joining him on the men's all-tournament team were Lindenwood's Michael Coffey, Josh Pate of Wisconsin-Whitewater, William Paterson's Jake Rollins and McKendree's Greg Young.

Ryan and freshman Katelyn Jones of Savannah College of Art and Design-Savannah were the recipients of the Chris Stoehr Sportsmanship Award.

The 16 men's and 16 women's teams earned their way into the ITC field by finishing in the top four at one of four sectional events held in March. At the national tournament, all teams bowled 24 Baker qualifying games Thursday to determine seeding for the double-elimination bracket, which featured best-of-seven Baker matches leading up to the finals.

the list of the PBA's 50 Greatest Players in 2008. He made his television debut in his hometown, capturing the first of his 12 tour titles at the 1990 Fair Lanes Open. He won the 2004 USBC Masters and was runner-up at the 2009 Masters, and in 2013 became the first bowler selected to the Maryland State Athletic Hall of Fame.

"I am honored, humbled and so grateful," Wiseman said.

"Growing up, I never dreamed I would be in a room accepting an honor like this. I didn't start bowling believing I'd be in any halls of fame. I just wanted to knock over pins."

Milligan, 41, of Mansfield, Texas, won the U.S. Women's Open and Hammer Players Championship in 2000, and earned the nickname "Major Milligan" after winning her third major, the 2005 USBC Queens. She won 27 medals, including 13 gold, as a six-time Team USA member, and has four USBC Women's Champion-

ships titles.

"Tonight, I am humbled and privileged," Milligan said. "Someone once told me that you don't have to tell everybody that you're good, they'll tell you. To those who voted me into this exclusive club, I guess you told me."

Mack, 46, of Indianapolis, won more than 70 titles on five continents and in more than 30 countries to help pave the way for bowling to become a more global sport. Before there was a World Bowling Tour, he won the Bahrain Open, Indonesian International Open and Qatar Open, events now recognized as PBA Tour titles. He bowled for Team USA at the 2003 World Bowling Men's Championships in Malaysia, winning a gold and four silver medals.

"What an honor and privilege to be among this wonderful class of inductees," Mack said. "Not only are they amazing people in bowling, but they are my friends. I'm beyond humbled and honored to be in this class."

Gaines, 44, of Orlando, Florida, owns four Women's Championships titles and in 2000 recorded the first 800 series (812) in the event's history. She won two Professional Women's Bowling Association (PWBA) Tour titles and had second-place (2003) and third-place (1998) finishes at the USBC Queens. She was a five-time member of Team USA.

"This is such a tremendous honor for me, to be inducted into this elite club," Gaines said. "My first thoughts when receiving the phone call was, 'I'm in THE USBC Hall of Fame with Dick Weber, Earl Anthony, Lisa Wagner, Betty Morris - oh my goodness!' These are people I looked up to as a little girl."

Janawicz, 45, of Winter Haven, Florida, has won three USBC Open Championships titles, and two were done in record fashion. He won the 2004 singles title with a then-record 858 series and led Lodge Lanes Too when it posted a then-record score of 3,538 in winning the 2013 team title. He is an eight-time member of Team USA.

"I never dreamed of making the USBC Hall of Fame when I was younger, but I kept working on my craft and as the accolades started to build up, I kind of knew it was possible," Janawicz said. "I knew I just had to stay the course, and tonight I cross the finish line."

Edwards, 55, of Medina, Ohio, served as Team USA head coach from 2004-2009, guiding the team to more than 90 medals, including 47 gold medals. She led the program's transition when pro players were allowed to compete in international events starting in 2008. She also served stints as Junior Team USA head coach and Team USA assistant coach.

"Once you're a part of Team USA, you always are a part of Team USA," Edwards said as she thanked the collective

Team USA family. "The things that happen with the squad, and the competitions that you share, there's just nothing like team competition and really laying it out on the line with everybody."

With Wednesday's six

inductees, there will be 425 members of the USBC Hall of Fame - 220 for Superior Performance, 118 for Meritorious Service, 50 Veterans, 21 Pioneers and 16 for Outstanding USBC Performance.

# USBC Sets New Specifications for Bowling Balls

ARLINGTON, Texas – Following three years of research on how technology has affected the sport of bowling, the United States Bowling Congress Equipment and Specifications Committee has established new specifications designed to sustain the playing field both currently and in the future.

The new specifications, which will be implemented over the course of the next two seasons, were announced at the USBC Convention in Reno, Nevada.

“Technology impacts every sport, but it is our role as the National Governing Body to ensure the skill of the competitors on the lanes remains the deciding factor,” said Andrew Cain, chair of the USBC Equipment and Specifications Committee. “The research presented revealed the impact technology has made on the sport’s playing environment and the committee determined there was a need to enact these specifications.”

A new specification has been established for the oil

absorption rate of bowling ball coverstocks, the first time such a specification has been set, and a specification to eliminate balance holes while increasing static weight allowances also has been approved.

In addition, new rules will be put into place to allow only a dry towel to be used to clean bowling balls during competition and to keep bowlers from changing the static weight (i.e. drilling grip holes deeper) of bowling balls during competition.

“The diligent work of the USBC Equipment Specifications and Certifications team spurred discussions in several areas and the committee made decisions that are needed to protect our sport’s future,” USBC President Frank Wilkinson said. “Technology will continue to push the boundaries and we will continue to analyze every aspect to make certain we are doing what’s in the best interests of bowling and our members.”

The new oil absorption specification for bowling ball

coverstocks will require that for a new ball to be approved, submitted ball samples cannot have a rate of oil absorption under 2 minutes and 15 seconds (2:15), and must adhere to the 0.6% non-conformance rate.

The initial step on the oil absorption specification will begin Aug. 1, 2018, when bowling ball manufacturers are required to submit oil absorption data as part of the USBC bowling ball approval process. Manufacturers have been provided a standard operating procedure (SOP) to determine oil absorption rates.

The specification requiring a bowling ball’s oil absorption rate to be more than 2:15 for the ball to be approved will take effect Aug. 1, 2020. Also, any ball models tested where the average oil absorption rate is under nine minutes and 30 seconds (9:30) will require additional balls to be tested.

The specification eliminating the use of balance holes will go into effect Aug. 1, 2020. Balance holes, also known as weight holes, are meant to correct static imbalance in bowling balls, but more recently have been used to change the design intent of balls. By allowing bowling balls (for balls weighing more than 10 pounds) to have up to three ounces of static side, thumb and finger weight – which is up from one ounce

– and up to three ounces of top weight, there no longer will be the need for a balance hole to correct static imbalance in the typical ball layout.

The specification increases in static weights take effect Jan. 1, 2020, which will allow bowlers the opportunity to plug balance holes prior to the elimination of balance holes starting Aug. 1, 2020.

With the elimination of balance holes, bowlers may have up to five holes for gripping purposes and all gripping holes must be used on every delivery.

The change allowing only a dry towel to clean bowling balls during competition becomes effective Aug. 1, 2019. It eliminates the use of liquid cleaners of any kind during competition, which aligns with other changes to ensure equipment is not manipulated during competition. The change prohibiting a bowler from adjusting static weight during a competition by drilling grip holes deeper goes into effect Aug. 1, 2020.

It is important for bowlers to understand the specification for oil absorption will not eliminate any bowling balls from competition, as all current balls will be grandfathered in. Bowlers also should be aware that because the increase in static weights starts Jan. 1, 2020, they will have seven months to have any balance hole plugged so they will be in compliance when the specification eliminating balance holes starts Aug. 1, 2020.

The Equipment and Specifications Committee has delegated authority from the USBC Board to make changes to equipment specifications.

The USBC Board fully supports the direction and action taken by the Equipment Specifications Committee.

USBC will conduct a media-only teleconference on Tuesday, April, 24 at 8 p.m. (Eastern) with Equipment Specifications Committee members and USBC staff. 



But, Zavjalova left the 4-6-7 split in the ninth frame and Ng produced spares in the ninth and 10th to claim her first title.

“It means a lot to me,” said Ng, who led the tournament after the first two rounds of qualifying. “I’ve been on tour for a couple of years now and I’ve made a couple of shows, but I’ve never won anything yet. So, this means a lot to

me to win a title of my own and having my own little flag (champion’s banner). It really means a lot to me.”

Ng had a pair of third-place finishes – the 2016 U.S. Women’s Open and, prior to the Tour’s return in 2015, the 2013 United States Bowling Congress Queens – but now has her first victory in the United States.

“With the first two TV shows I made, it was inevitable that one gets nervous,” Ng said. “But, I kept knocking on the door and my chances are

coming more and more. When we get used to the nerves, we are able to execute better. But, at the end of the day, it’s not about bowling against your opponent, it’s about bowling against yourself. So, I was just telling myself to stay in the moment. It doesn’t matter what she bowls, as long as I do my best and I execute well. That’s the most important aspect of the game today.”

The Singapore national team has been a constant presence on the PWBA Tour since 2015, with four players each winning one title. Jazreel Tan won the 2015 PWBA Lubbock Sports Open as a non-member, Cherie Tan captured the 2016 PWBA Storm Sacramento Open and 2016 PWBA Rookie of the Year New Hui Fen claimed the 2016 PWBA Tour Championship.

Ng is happy to join her teammates as PWBA champions.

“It definitely ranks near the top,” Ng said. “I’ve won a couple of international titles in Asia and in the World Championships, but I’ve never won on the PWBA. So, this definitely means a lot to me. I’ve seen their names on the flag and I’ve always wanted one myself, so this couldn’t have been better.”

Ng advanced to the title match after defeating USBC Hall of Famer and 26-time PWBA titlist Leanne Hulsenberg of Pleasant View, Utah, 193-167. Hulsenberg was searching for her first title since the relaunch of the PWBA Tour.

Hulsenberg opened the stepladder finals with a 213-202 victory over fellow USBC Hall of Famer and reigning three-time PWBA Player of the Year Liz Johnson of Palatine, Illinois.

Competition this week at the PWBA Las Vegas Open at South Point Bowling Plaza included two eight-game qualifying blocks on Friday to determine the 32 players for Saturday’s Round of 32. An additional eight-game block Saturday morning narrowed the field to 12 players, who bowled six additional games to determine the stepladder finalists.

The 2018 PWBA Tour season continues next week with the PWBA Sonoma County Open at Double Decker Lanes in Rohnert Park, California.

Qualifying and match-play rounds of PWBA Tour events are broadcast on Xtra Frame, which also will be the live-stream home for the stepladder finals of seven standard events.

# THE SOUTHWEST REPORT



**No Feet, No Game**

You should check your shoes and the approaches every time you prepare to bowl - whether it's practice or competition. If someone has "burned rubber" or left any residue (especially those nasty powders people use illegally) on the approach, you need to know that. You can never assume the approaches are okay.

You want to check both your shoes and the approach surface. Some people start at the end of the approach and then run toward the foul line to see if they can slide. Well, duh! What if they can't? They'll figure that out as soon as they regain consciousness out by the arrows. Even worse are the people who run up toward the

foul line with the ball in their hand. Have 911 on your speed dial!

**How to Quickly and Effectively Check Approaches**  
-Stand in the middle of the approach three to four feet behind the foul line. WITH YOUR RIGHT FOOT STAYING IN CONTACT WITH THE FLOOR, bend your right knee as you slide your left foot toward the foul line.

To test approaches, don't just stand upright and delicately slide your foot back and forth a few inches like you're sticking your toe in the water. That's not how you slide and it can't be how you test approaches. Bend your knees and slide your whole body forward on the ball of your foot and then apply pressure to the heel for braking just like you do when you slide.

-Next, slide at a slight angle between the 25th and 35th board. This is approximately where you'll be sliding for right side spares. If the approaches are synthetic, there's might be a seam. Be sure you test the feel of sliding across it, whether you think you'll be doing that or not. Better to be prepared for anything.

-Slide at a slight angle toward the left corner of the deck between about the 12th and 17th boards. This is close to where you'll be sliding for

left side spare conversions or if you get to play the ditch.

-As part of an effective pre-shot routine, slide into your starting position as a way to check the sole of your shoe before every shot.

**Care and Feeding of the Bowling Shoe**

Taking care of your shoes is as important as taking care of your other weapons. Shoes can last a long time and most importantly, will help prevent injury.

-Use a steel brush to clean the bottom of the sliding shoe. If you brush heel to toe, you'll have more slide. If you brush side to side, you'll have less.

-You won't believe this one but it works. If you're not sliding as much as you'd like and you're sure it's not the approaches or your shoes, tighten the entire lace on your sliding shoe. If you're sliding too much, loosen it.

-Shoe covers protect your soles. Make sure you have a pair and use them anytime you leave the bowler's area.

-Powdered products are illegal for use on the shoe (USBC Rule 12 - Defacing the Approach). If someone can't slide, that person needs to fix their shoe, not mess up the approach for those who are not having problems.

-Rubbing your shoe on carpeting actually creates static electricity and will cause sticking, not cure it. It's a great thing to do if the approaches are slippery and you are sliding too much but absolutely the wrong thing to do if you are

having trouble sliding.  
-If you use the sock-like products for the sliding shoe, be very cautious on wood approaches. A broken board or splinter can catch on the sock material and send you flying. Don't become dependent on it. If it becomes unusable for any reason, you'll have no options.

entertainment complex open in Austin, but not with the outdoor sports fields. Outdoor fields are scheduled to open the first weekend of May.

“That’s 102 teams and 2,000 people. After that, outdoor diamonds are booked every weekend through the fall “according to marketing director Kira Brabeck in the Friday April 27 Quad City Times.

Finally this week, segments like these never get easier when we say goodbye to another bowling name you may or may not have known. Before Glenn Allison became Mr. 900, Ray Orf of St. Louis

was Mr. 890. A PBA champion in the Association's early years, he won two titles, the 1962 All-American Classic at Dallas' Cotton Bowl Lanes and the 1975 National Resident Pro Championship. He was also the alternate for the first Firestone-sponsored ToC in 1965, finishing fourth, narrowly missing the three-man television finals. Orf opened a pro shop and trophy supply in 1976, which son Rich and grandson Andrew operate today. However, he's also known for another bowling accomplishment.

Orf rolled his 890 series in 1972 and is still talked about in St. Louis to this day, with games of 290, 300, and 300. Doing quick bowling math tells you that would have been a spare, then the back 35 strikes in a row. If you haven't heard of this series, there's a good reason. It was never sanctioned by the American Bowling Congress

According to a 2015 interview with Kevin Hong on his 'The Bowling History Book' blog (found here: <https://bowlingbook.wordpress.com/2015/03/20/feb-6-1972-ray-orf-bowls-890/>) and also on Kevin's Facebook page, Orf, even 43 years later, somewhat painfully recalled the ABC rejection of his 890 series.

First, let's go back to Sunday February 5, 1972. Orf and his son Rich, then a 7-year-old, rolled in an adult-youth league at Western Bowl, where Orf had worked for the last five years as a manager. Orf left a 10-pin, spared it and then

rolled then a 35-bagger.

Newspaper stories appeared in his hometown St. Louis Post-Dispatch and also the New York Times exclaimed the feat as the new world record.

Back then, lane inspections followed any honor score report and were much different than what's done today. According to Orf in the Hong interview, after three inspections in successive days, ABC representative Roger Tessman questioned the drier outside boards, even after a day's worth of league and open play. The key then was to have a gradual slope in the pattern, not a sudden increase. In today's bowling lingo, it's called 'cliffing', 'over/under', or 'wet/dry' describing a drastic amount of friction very close to each other.

After appealing the sanction rejection to the ABC High Score Committee, Orf then took the unprecedented step of suing the ABC. After lengthy litigation, Orf and the ABC settled out-of-court, part of which did not allow him to discuss details of the settlement. If the 890 series had been

passed, it would have stood for twenty-five years until Jeremy Sonnenfeld's 900 series in 1997 (the first to be inspected with use the UV-tinted lane oil and a tape take-up device).

Hong's blog shows a picture of the 890 ball, a Brunswick Black Beauty with a mill hole above the finger holes. Proof that the ball had been used on the PBA tour, common to balls of that era through the 1990's.

Orf, according to a post on the shop's Facebook page, who had not been in the best of health recently, passed Friday April 20 at the age of 76.

As a tribute, this week's JPA Lost Classic goes back to one of several syndicated bowling shows on television in the 1960's, Top Star Bowling with a 22-year-old Orf in a three-game total-pins match against returning champ Al Savas. This match is cut up into eleven 10-minute sections, due to YouTube restrictions at the time of the clip's uploading. matches on August 19, prior to the championship round matches scheduled for that Sunday afternoon

The top four at that point will bowl two-game total pin-fall matches, with fourth playing third, the winner playing second seed, before challenging the leader (who would have to lose twice) for the trophy and the first prize check.

Since the main event started in 2004, more than 400 different bowlers have shared total prize-money of more than \$535,000.

One of the other big draws is the difficult lane condition on which timing, ball selection, spare-shooting ability and concentration are paramount. “The tournament has a history of being a tough scoring pace and will continue that philosophy”, said Mackie.

## 2018 USBC Convention Comes to a Close

RENO, Nev. – The 2018 United States Bowling Congress Convention and Annual Meeting wrapped up last Thursday at Grand Sierra Resort with delegates voting on proposed legislation and for the three open positions on the USBC Board of Directors.

The USBC Nominating Committee slated three candidates for the three open board positions – incumbents Jay Daryman of York, Pennsylvania, and Karen Jost of Tumwater, Washington, along with Dennis Hacker of Longtown, Missouri. No candidates ran from the floor.

Following a motion, and a second, for acclimation of the three candidates, Daryman, Jost and Hacker were elected by delegates by voice vote. It will be the third three-year term for Jost, the second term for Daryman and the first for Hacker. All three will begin their terms on Aug. 1, 2018.

Also, during the Annual Meeting, delegates voted on eight proposed amendments – two for league rules, three related to tournament rules and three proposals to bylaws.

Both league rules were rejected while all three tournament rules, including the rule requiring tournament managers to be members of USBC, were accepted.

Two of the bylaws proposals passed, including the national bylaws proposal to allow the USBC President and Vice President to serve a two-year term with a limit of two terms and for a USBC President elected in his/her ninth year to remain on the board with a 10-year maximum.


