USBC Hall of Fame Welcomes Seven New Members

LAS VEGAS – The United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame officially added seven members Wednesday night when it held its induction ceremony of the 2019 class at The Orleans.

Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, Finland native

Mika Koivuniemi, and Kelly Kulick of Union, New Jersey, were inducted for Superior Performance, the late Jim St. John was added in the Veterans category, Larry Lichstein of Fort Myers, Florida, was inducted in the Pioneer division and, for Meritorious Service, the late John Davis and veteran bowling writer Bob Johnson of Las Vegas joined the USBC Hall of Fame.

Barnes, 49, owns 19 Profes-

sional Bowlers Association (PBA) Tour titles, including three majors – the 2005 U.S. Open, 2006 PBA Tournament of Champions and 2011 PBA World Championship. He earned PBA Rookie of the Year honors in 1998 and was the 2007-2008 PBA Player of the Year, making him one of five bowlers to have won both awards. He was elected to the PBA Hall of Fame in 2018.

He captured 22 gold medals as a 16-time member of Team USA, the most appearances on the team by any male bowler. He announced his retirement from Team USA earlier this year and was honored by USBC, along with longtime teammate Tommy Jones, during the USBC Convention on Wednesday afternoon.

“As I look around, I’m simply in awe of the accomplishments and the legendary pioneers in this room that inspired me and so many other people to achieve things greater than they ever thought they could,” Barnes said. “While

O'Keefe Claims Title at 2019 Twin Cities Open

EAGAN, Minn. – Reigning Professional Women's Bowling Association Player of the Year Shannon O'Keefe of Shiloh, Illinois, collected her first title of 2019 and ninth career victory Saturday at the PWBA Twin Cities Open.

O'Keefe relied on her spare game throughout the week at Cedarvale Lanes to earn the top seed for Saturday's stepladder finals, and she converted a 4 pin and delivered a strike in her final frame to secure a 189-

182 win over England's Verity Crawley.

The 40-year-old right-hander claimed the \$10,000 top prize live on BowlTV.com.

“It’s incredible,” said O'Keefe, a 15-time Team USA member. “When the tour started again, my dream was to win one title. Now, here I am sitting at nine and one step closer to reaching my next goal – 10 titles. It just feels so good with all of the hard work I’ve put in.”

MOORESVILLE, N.C. (May 1, 2019) – Walter Ray Williams Jr., the Professional Bowlers Association's all-time PBA Tour career titles leader, won the PBA50 Mooresville Open presented by the Mooresville Convention & Visitors Bureau and Storm Wednesday to start the 2019 season with three consecutive wins and record his 14th career title, tying him for the all-time career titles record in PBA's tour for players 50 and over.


Williams, the Go Bowling! PBA Tour's all-time career titles leader with 47 wins, tied John

Just Paying Attention

As you have read elsewhere in this edition of TBN, Melrose Bowl Red took the regular team lead late Thursday night at the 2019 USBC Open Championships. As regular readers know, I spent the 1980's in central Minnesota. A frequent league opponent was Melrose Bowl owner Craig Schiffler in the mid to late part of the decade. Averaging in the 220's then, and was very tough in the clutch.

Many look at the Twin Cities as the first place to look for top bowling talent (USBC Hall of Famer Sam Lantto and Matt McNiel, when he's age-eligible, first come to mind), but as I've told a few times of the years, there has been and is some pretty decent talent around central Minnesota as well.

A companion team can work wonders, exponentially improving each other's performance. Aided by the 2010 OC double winners, Melrose Bowl Black posted a 3,135 total, good for eleventh place. It's a wild night when you've got one team going for the lead, but two on the same pair? That was the birth of the phrase I've used in this

column to describe the experience, unadulterated adrenaline.

As Bowlers Universe 1 and Bowlers Universe 4 rolled on that Friday night in May 2007 at the National Bowling Stadium, we had no idea we were going to forge a memory that is still smile worthy to this day.

Anchored by now-PBA50 Tour and XtraFrame color analyst Tom Carter, Bowlers Universe 1 set the standard the year before in Corpus Christi, getting to the tenth frame with a chance to take the team lead eventually finishing second, 24 pins behind eventual winner Browning Pontiac.

With two teams striking early and often, we were feeding off each other's energy, we constantly compared notes amongst the ten of us through the entire series, creating just enough noise, causing the stands behind Lanes 27-28 (just to the left of the runway) to fill. I was so into gauging others ball reactions and doing team game math, I just wanted to roll a quick frame, then get back to watching and listening to the other nine have their own versions of our collective

unadulterated adrenaline. Luckily, many of my frames were consisted of just one ball (but that's another story). The adrenaline returned the next night for one of my favorite nights at the OC, but that's yet another story for another time.

The two teams placed at the time we bowled in fourth and ninth, ultimately finishing tied for 11th and 13th.

Congrats to Schiff and the guys on a job well done and hope they hang on until July for at least a top ten finish. Whatever happens, the group will sure have a sweet memory from that night for years to come.

With last week's USBC Hall of Fame induction ceremonies, I'm sure many spoke fondly of famed bowling coach, author, and 2009 USBC Hall of Famer Tom Kouros, as news of his passing was posted by Kouros' son Craig on Facebook last Sunday. Kouros was perhaps best known as explaining the physics end of the game in groundbreaking two books, "Par Bowling" in 1976, and the 1993 sequel "Par Bowling: The Challenge".

Although the phrase was introduced years earlier, he was the first I remember to describe the down-lane ball motion phase "skid-roll-hook" (which is now skid, hook, roll in the resin ball era).

Forty years ago this summer, Kouros made an appearance at one of the original PBC Bowling Camps in Sheboygan,

O'Neill and Malott Survive Roll-offs in Round of 16 Matches to Advance in PBA Playoffs

 PORTLAND, Maine (May 6, 2019) – No. 7 seed Bill O'Neill of Langhorne, Pennsylvania and No. 15 seed Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, survived PBA Playoffs Round of 16 Race to 2 Points matches that both required a ninth and 10th frame roll-off, to advance to the Round of 8 after FS1's telecast Monday from Bayside Bowl.

O'Neill and Malott join No. 4 seed Anthony Simonsen, No. 21 Andres Gomez, No. 1 Jason Belmonte and No. 9 Kris Prather who have already advanced to the Round of 8 after winning Round of 16 matches.

In the first match, No. 2 seed Jakob Butturff of Mesa, Arizona, defeated Malott in the first game, 268-210, but the USBC Masters champion couldn't keep the momentum going in the second game, losing to Malott, 226-193, to send their match into a roll-off.

With both players starting with a strike and spare, Malott, a 10-time tour winner, struck on his final ball and advanced when Butturff left a solid 7 pin on his fill ball, handing Malott a 40-39 win. It was the second time that Malott won a Playoffs match sitting on the bench. He also won his Round of 24 match-up against Josh Blanchard when Blanchard left the 1-2-4 on his final ball of the 10th frame.

"I felt like I was running out of lives when I was watching Jakob," said Malott, the 2009 PBA Player of the Year. "I didn't think either one of us had a really good look to start the second game. Jakob was struggling and I was still trying to get comfortable. It looked like it was going to be one of those matches where filling frames any way you can was going to get the job done."

"In the middle of the second game I was finally getting comfortable enough where I was getting the ball reaction I wanted so I could repeat good shots."

No. 23 seed Sweden's Jesper Svensson, a seven-time tour winner, jumped out to an early lead with a 222-211 win in the first game of the second match, but O'Neill capitalized on the struggling Svensson in the second game coming back to win, 247-164, to send the match into the roll-off. O'Neill, who



CHICAGO -- The Professional Bowlers Association is now accepting applications for the 2018 PBA Billy Welu Scholarship Award which recognizes exemplary qualities in male or female college students who excel in academics as well as in the sport of bowling.

The winner will receive a \$1,000 scholarship. To be eligible candidates must be amateur bowlers who are currently in college (preceding the application date) and maintaining at least a 2.5/4.0 GPA or equivalent. Applications must be postmarked by June 21.

The scholarship was established in 1982 in memory of the PBA Hall of Famer who served as television analyst alongside legendary ABC broadcaster and PBA Hall of Famer Chris Schenkel on the "Pro Bowlers Tour" series prior to his death in 1974. Over the years, 33 outstanding student athletes have been selected as Welu Scholarship recipients, including 2018 winner Wesley Low Jr. of Wichita State.

Joe Findling Wins PBA Planet Bowl Oklahoma City Southwest Open Title

Oklahoma City, Okla. (April 30, 2019) – Joe Findling from Mesquite, Texas, survived a tense final match to win his eighth Professional Bowlers Association Regional title in the PBA Oklahoma City Planet Bowl Southwest Open, presented by Roto Grip, Sunday.

Findling led after eight and 13 games of qualifying, and maintained his lead through the modified eight-game round robin match play finals heading into the final position round match. Holding a 64-pin lead over Sean Lavery-Spahr of Pasadena, Texas, Lavery-Spahr needed to win the match by 35 pins and pick up the 30 match play bonus pins to deny Findling the title. After both players opened in the first frame, Lavery-Spahr strung seven strikes before leaving a 10 pin in the ninth frame, eventually finishing with a 244 game. It wasn't enough. Findling threw two strikes in his 10th frame to finish with 227 and a 4,965 pinfall total, topping Lavery-

Spahr's 4,948 to claim the \$2,500 winner's check.

Lavery-Spahr held on to second place, earning \$1,600, while his twin brother, Anthony Lavery-Spahr, also from Pasadena, finished third and collected \$1,100.

Handegard for most career PBA50 Tour titles.

In a dramatic comeback effort in the title match, the 59-year-old Williams, who was the top qualifier for the finals, threw the last five strikes of the match to beat fellow hall of famer Danny Wiseman 229-227. Wiseman, a 12-time PBA Tour winner bowling in his second PBA50 Tour tournament, had an opportunity to win the match with a strike on the first ball in the 10th frame but left a 10 pin.

"I came out of practice all lined up on both lanes, but things got a little tricky in the middle of the game," said Williams, who left the 3-6-10 in the fifth frame and 3-6 in the seventh frame. "The right lane was a little tighter for me, so I thought I needed to hit the ball a little more at release but the reaction I got was totally unexpected.

"In the ninth frame I moved one board left and that was the right move," Williams added, after being down as much as 28 pins in the match. "You've got to bowl well and get the breaks to win. I was able to finish strong and caught a break when Danny left the 10 pin in

the 10th frame."

The win also marked the second time this season that Williams advanced all the way from the cashers round to reach the finals. He won the season-opening PBA50 Johnny Petraglia BVL Open by advancing from the cashers round.

"Even though I'm bowling pretty well, I've been a little frustrated in qualifying," Williams admitted. "In general, it seems like I'm not getting good pin carry until I get to match play for whatever reason."

Williams, who won the 2010 Senior Miller High Life Classic at Victory Lanes for his first PBA50 Tour title, was especially fortunate to advance to match play earlier Wednesday bowling a 256 in the final game of the cashers round to earn a spot in the first match play round.

"All I can say is it's crazy," Williams said about his journey to the Mooresville Open title. "I didn't expect to win the first three titles of the season, but it feels awesome."

Williams' second win of the season came in last week's PBA50 National Championship for his third career major title.

The stepladder final, streamed live on FloBowling, began with No. 5 qualifier hall of famer Parker Bohn III of Jackson, New Jersey beating No. 4 qualifier Todd Kjell of Roscoe, Illinois, 196-181.

Bohn, trying for his fifth PBA50 Tour title, then beat No. 3 qualifier Scott Greiner of Sunrise Beach, Missouri, 258-229, to advance to the semifinal match against Wiseman.

Wiseman, who finished 10th in last week's PBA50 National

Championship, then beat Bohn 258-223 to advance to the title match against Williams. Greiner and Kjell were both trying for their first PBA50 Tour titles.



Although O'Keefe's spare shooting was strong throughout competition, it nearly derailed her in the title match. She missed a pair of 3-6-10 combinations on the left lane through the first seven frames, but still maintained a slight advantage in the match.

She had built the lead after Crawley left back-to-back 2-8-10 splits on the left lane earlier in title tilt.

"I just missed them right off my hand," said O'Keefe, who also defeated Crawley in the title match of the 2018 PWBA Sonoma County Open. "I knew it the second it left my hand. As the games progressed through each block, I was quickly moving left and balling down, so I knew I was going to stay committed to what got me here. Every shot I executed well in the title match was really, really good, but each of those 3-6-10s were poorly executed. I just made some bad shots."

O'Keefe stayed clean in the eighth and ninth frames, which gave Crawley, who rolled a strike in the ninth frame, the opportunity to deliver a pair of strikes in the 10th frame for the chance to claim her first career PWBA Tour title.

Crawley got to the pocket on her first shot but was unable to get the 10 pin to fall, putting O'Keefe in the position to mark for victory.

"I was so, so worried that those two spares I missed earlier in the match were going to cost me," O'Keefe said. "When I was looking at the 4 pin in the 10th, I just told myself to make it. I was very happy when I saw my spare shot was on line and there was no doubt I was making it. It definitely was a relief."

Crawley finished as the runner-up for the fourth time in her career, but she's walking away knowing the extra work she's put into preparing for this season is starting to pay off.

"Honestly, I threw both 2-8-10s really well and was happy with them in the moment," Crawley said. "Obviously, the lane said otherwise. If anything, they were a pinch fast, which isn't my tendency, but lately I've been trying to stay a bit more aggressive. I made the decision to move left and actually get around it a little bit more after the second 2-8-10, which looked better but wasn't able to get out the 10 in the 10th frame."

"I'm very positive coming away from this right now, though. I've worked very hard, and right now, I feel like my

game is in a very good place. I think this just gives me an extra boost of confidence going into the next couple of weeks."

Crawley advanced to the title match after rolling a double in the final frame to shut out Bryanna Coté of Red Rock, Arizona, 210-196.

In the opening round of Saturday's stepladder, Crawley delivered 11 strikes on the way to victory against Colombia's Maria José Rodriguez, 266-201.

The 2019 PWBA Tour season will continue May 9 at the PWBA Lincoln Open. The event will be held at Sun Valley Lanes in Lincoln, Nebraska, with wire-to-wire coverage on BowlTV.

won his 10th PBA Tour title in the season-opening PBA Hall of Fame Classic, struck in the ninth and the first two shots in the 10th to eliminate Svensson, 57-39.

"To start the first game, I really didn't feel like I knew what I was doing," said O'Neill. "In

practice everything felt good but I think I started to rush because the adrenaline was pumping. I felt lucky to get 211.

"Fortunately, I was able to settle down and I made really good shots down the stretch," O'Neill continued. "With Jesper struggling I felt like the ball was in my court and was pretty confident going into the roll-off. I made a ball change and threw three really good shots when I

needed them."

The Round of 16 concludes on May 13 at 9 p.m. ET on FS1 with two matches to determine the last two positions for the Round of 8 matches which will air on May 20 and May 27. 

doubles partners and singles rivals (depending upon the event), Brad Miller of Lee's Summit and Kyle Sherman of O'Fallon have created a popular YouTube channel (Brad & Kyle) that has generated more than 30,000 subscribers and in excess of 3.5 million views since its debut in 2018.

the PBA Tour allowed me to provide for my family and made me bowling famous, it is the bowling I did within the USBC that shaped my life.

"Following in the footsteps before me, of many of you, it has long been a goal of mine to make the USBC Hall of Fame through USBC accomplishments. And I like to think I'm not done yet."

Koivuniemi, 52, currently lives in the United Arab Emirates and has coached the UAE national team since 2015. He joined the PBA Tour at age 32, earning the first two of his 14 career PBA titles in major events – the 2000 USBC Masters and the 2001 U.S. Open – to earn the nickname Major Mika.

He captured a third major at the 2011 PBA Tournament of Champions and was a two-time PBA Player of the Year (2003-2004, 2010-2011). He was inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame earlier this year.

"What a year 2019 has been for me, making two big hall of fames in the same year," Koivuniemi said. "There are so many people throughout the world who have helped me. I still remember my first (USBC) Open Championships in Reno in 1995 at the new stadium. It was something to see how it ran so smoothly with so many bowlers. I remember my first Masters and U.S. Open in 1996 – great memories and experiences – and then being lucky enough to win both of them as my first two titles."

Kulick, 42, made history in 2010 when she captured the PBA Tournament of Champions title, becoming the first woman to win a PBA Tour event. She captured Professional Women's Bowling Association (PWBA) Rookie of the Year honors in 2000 and won the first of her six major titles at the 2003 U.S. Women's Open.

She is a 15-time Team USA member and her international resume includes a then-record performance in winning gold in singles at the 1999 World Bowling World Championships, the first of her 22 career gold medals.

"To witness the people walking through that door earlier, the hall of famers and everyone here ... I just thankful for this moment," Kulick said. "I learned a lot from my elders, but since commenting on the youth and collegiate events, it's the youth who inspire me to pave the way for future generations."

She also referenced a former Team USA teammate about what reaching the hall of fame

means to her future on the lanes.

"Liz Johnson sat up here a few years ago and said just because she's in the hall of fame doesn't mean she's done," Kulick said. "Me, too. I am not done."

St. John, who served in the Navy for nine years before turning to bowling full time, won six titles on the PBA Tour from 1963-1969 and captured a USBC Open Championships Classic Team title in 1964. He died on Jan. 11, 1987.

His most dominating performance came at the 1963 World Invitational, one of the most prestigious tournaments in bowling, that took place in Chicago. St. John set 12 tournament records, tied two others, and posted the only 300 game over the course of the 11-day tournament. He successfully defended his title at the 1964 event.

Members of St. John's family were unable to attend the induction ceremony, but his daughter, Karen Hayward, relayed a message from the family, including her mom, Delores, and her brother, Ron.

"My family and I would like to thank the USBC Hall of Fame committee for recognizing my father in the Veterans category," Hayward said in her letter. "When my brother and I were very small, we would travel around the U.S. with our parents to all of the bowling tournaments. ... I also enjoyed watching my dad and the other bowlers on the Falstaff bowling team. They did a lot of trick bowling. I haven't seen anything like it since. My family and I have a lot of wonderful memories of our bowling family. Thank you again to the USBC and everyone involved."

Lichstein, 69, who was

elected to the PBA Hall of Fame in 1996 in the Meritorious Service Category, made his mark as the long-time director of player services for the PBA. He started his PBA career as a bowler in 1969, becoming the youngest PBA Rookie of the Year at the time of his selection, and won his lone PBA title at the San Jose Open in 1970.

In May 1974, Lichstein changed career paths, and for more than 22 years, would serve as the PBA Director of Player Services, where he equipped, fit, maintained and served up to 300 PBA Tour bowlers each week. He also owns two Open Championships titles, winning Classic All-Events in 1969 and Classic Team in 1970.

"When I got the call, Nov. 2 (from USBC President Karl Kielich), that was my son's 50th birthday," Lichstein said. "It was a tough day, I cried a lot, because I love the sport and I couldn't believe it was happening. I really thought it wasn't true, but he finally convinced me it was. This is really such a special day for me."

Davis, who passed away on Jan. 25, 2013, at age 64, started Kegel in 1981 on the heels of developing The Key™ Lane Cleaning Tool, which provided bowling centers a better and more economical way to clean lanes. With a goal of making "two lanes play the same," he became a leading innovator and expert in the field of lane maintenance throughout a career that had a major impact in the sport.

In addition to the lane machines, conditioners, cleaners and other items he developed, he opened the Kegel Training Center in 1997, moving it to its current location in Lake

Wales, Florida, in 2003, to give bowlers and coaches the latest technological advances to take their knowledge to the next level. His last invention was the Kegel LaneMapper, which measures lane topography.

"My father was a very humble man," said Davis' son, Chris. "He didn't care about the rewards, the awards, he just wanted to fix bowling. He accomplished so much over the years. He was truly a family man and loved the sport of bowling. ... What a life, what a life. What a great honor this is."

His brother, Mark Davis added, "John had a passion for servicing the bowling industry. He spent much of his time on the phone with people all over the world, discussing the game and all aspects of it. He would call people out of the blue and talk to them for hours about nothing but bowling. I don't doubt that some of those people are in the room now."

Johnson, 61, of Las Vegas, has been at the forefront of telling bowling's stories for nearly five decades. He has been honored with 75 national writing awards for his work covering the sport and industry, and has served on the USBC Hall of Fame committee since its formation.

In 2009, Johnson was selected as the Bowling Writers Association of America (now International Bowling Media Association) Luby Hall of Fame Award winner, and was inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame earlier this year.

"Looking back, I'm grateful for those tough days because they forced me to be a better

researcher, a better interviewer and a better writer," Johnson said about his start as a journalist. "I had to become a better writer to get more assignments and, over time, that is what happened."

The USBC Hall of Fame was created in 2005 by merging the former American Bowling Congress and Women's International Bowling Congress Halls of Fame.

With the induction of the seven-member class of 2019, there are 432 members of the USBC Hall of Fame – 223 in Superior Performance, 120 in Meritorious Service, 51 in Veterans, 22 in Pioneers and 16 in Outstanding USBC Performance.
