## Duke Comes Through to Win PBA50 Race City Open for Fourth Career PBA50 Tour Title

Duke strikes on first ball in 10th frame of championship match on way to 221-213 win over Kenny Parks

MOORESVILLE, N.C. (May 3, 2017) – After a heartbreaking loss in the 10th frame of the championship match of the season-opening PBA50 Pasco County Florida Open, PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke of Clermont, Fla., got some redemption by sealing the deal in the 10th frame of the PBA50 Race City Open presented by Columbia 300 Wednesday to notch his fourth career PBA50 Tour title.

Thanks to a clutch strike on the first ball of the 10th, Duke defeated top qualifier Kenny Parks of Hammond, Ind., 221-213, in the title match at George Pappas' Victory Lanes.

"I tell you, nothing's a given," Duke said. "You just can't take anything for granted. It seems like the lanes are changing every frame and it's all you can do to get to the pocket. It's a lot of guesswork

## 2018 Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour Schedule Announced

ARLINGTON, Texas - Competitors, fans and spectators will have six new venues to visit in 2018 during the 14-event schedule on the Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour.

The 2018 PWBA Tour will begin April 26-28 in Las Vegas, and will conclude with the 16-player, invitation-only PWBA Tour Championship from Aug. 29-Sept. 2.

Along with nine standard events, four major championships will be contested in 2018 including the United States Bowling Congress Queens,



PWBA Players Championship, U.S. Women's Open and the PWBA Tour Championship.

"The 2018 PWBA Tour season branches out to new cities and states, which is a fantastic way to meet and greet new fans," said PWBA spokesperson Kelly Kulick. "It also opens the doors for more competitors

# Just Paying Attention

Professional bowling is fortunate to have two major league quality play-by-play announcers, Dave LaMont on ESPN and Dave Ryan on CBS Sports Net. With the summer Main Event Tour finals announcement (as seen elsewhere in this edition of TBN), we will get to hear more of the work of Ryan, who first was paired with Randy Pedersen in the early 2000's on ESPN.

In the tradition of Chris Schenkel, Denny Schreiner, and Phil Ferguson, both Ryan and LaMont have sharpened their play-by-play skills in other sports over the years before trying and mastering bowling. To the untrained eye and ear, announcing bowling may look easy. But if you've seen how mystically strange social media comments can be, everyone does everything wrong.

Two skill-sets come into play here. First, is becoming familiar with the ebb and flow of the competition one is describing. For example, you don't hear announcers get really excited in the first quarter of a football or basketball game. That may happen at the end, if the score is close or tied and/or time is running out. There also has to be time to

get in the commercial breaks, with some commercials and sponsor mentions read live in the booth. That's learned in Announcing 101 and 102.

The other part is much more difficult. With more and more time broadcasting a team or activity, an announcer learns more and more about nuances and specialized information about that activity, as well as the performance traits of the athletes. The reason I say 'activity' is you can include other things, like dog shows, too. Noted television and voice-over actor John O'Hurley has a respected following as the lead announcer for the National Dog Show on NBC Thanksgiving Day for the last fifteen years.

Now, here's a point that gets applied in Announcing 401 and 451. Even though the lead announcer knows the information, the smart lead announcers know something needs to be explained and when it needs to be explained. That's when the lead announcer will set up the color analyst, whether it be Randy, Kelly Kulick, CDB, or Chris Barnes, to explain in detail, what just happened.

So if you dare, the next time you listen to play-by-play with two voices in the booth, see

how many times this happens. It happens more than you realize. That's part of the reason why I enjoy the work of Dave Ryan and Dave LaMont.

I've been asked a few times over the years review balls for the company I represented at the time, but with a lack of time to throw the balls to get an idea of their range of motion for my game, decided against it. My game has bordered on the fringes of 'tweener hell', even dating back to the urethane era, nothing near the preferred style of the day. Lately, the requests have increased, and since Motiv is getting more and more of a following, here we go.

Since I signed with Motiv Bowling three years ago, one thing that stood out immediately was the wide range of ball motion in the line. Traditional, skid/snap, and stronger arc in various amounts of hook is what impressed me and helped me shoot the last live streamed 299 game from USBCs on bowl.tv in 2014.

The last two releases and the one in a couple of weeks are great examples of the range of ball motion. A favorite since day one has been the Revolt line with the Vanquish core. Still love the original black Revolt and the solid purple Revolt Havoc, so when I saw a new pearl cover on the United Revolt, I was a little unsure on where it would fit in the arsenal.

Using the same pin down layout from the other two, the United Revolt produces a similar slightly-sharper backend I'm used to seeing. When the mid-lane is a little tight, as it can be on PBA patterns and at the USBC Open Championships, the lower RG core helps get the ball to not only recover, but maintain the extra movement at the backend.

I've used the original Revolt on everything from 35-foot to 47-foot patterns with the same amount of backend movement. The lower RG Vanquish core inside the United Revolt allows it to read longer patterns as though I'm using another ball with much more surface, say 1000 grit, for example.

It's about a 4 and 2 more (four left on the approach, two left at the arrows) than the original and a great transition piece from the Trident or Ghost Jackal to the ball in the next paragraph.

Next is the redesigned Octane Carbon. With the rebuilt dual-density core Injector and the new Agitator MXR pearl cover, the Carbon is a medium to drier lane stronger arc to skid/snap, depending on cover preparation.

Another point worth mentioning is the noticeable difference in shape and response between pin up to pin down layouts. My pin down layout gives a great read when the track gets dry by game three (a.k.a. 'blows up'), allowing almost calmer, controllable reaction with a minimum of

over/under reaction.

I can use the pin up layout before this part of the pattern transition with a slightly

scuffed cover. About five seconds with a 2000 Abralon pad or a quick pass with a 1000

# Zavjalova Breaks Through at PWBA Storm Sacramento Open

CITRUS HEIGHTS, Calif. - Since the return of television to the Professional Women's Bowling Association in 2016, Latvian native Diana Zavjalova had come up just shy of reaching the bright lights, but that sentiment changed on Saturday as Zavjalova broke down the door to earn her first PWBA televised finals appearance at Steve Cook's Fireside Lanes.

The TV finals of the PWBA Storm Sacramento Open will be taped Tuesday, May 23 during the United States Bowling Congress Queens and is scheduled to air June 13 on CBS Sports Network.

History could've repeated itself this week, but a determined Zavjalova defeated Amanda Greene of Romney, West Virginia, 279-236, in the Group B Stepladder Final in an emotional victory. Joining Zavjalova on television is top seed Liz Johnson Cheektowaga, N.Y., Colombia native Rocio Restrepo is the second seed and Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, N.Y., is seeded fourth. Zavjalova, who now resides

in Austin, Texas, has run into bad luck on more than one occasion late in PWBA competition, most recently last week at the QubicaAMF PWBA Sonoma County Open. After holding the lead for much of the event, Zavjalova eventually lost in the Group Stepladder Finals to finish fifth.

This week, she again held a lead only to lose it late in match play, but it was a different bowler in the final match thanks to some friendly advice.

"Today, I was just in a different mindset," Zavjalova said. "I had been putting so much pressure on myself in the past because I kept coming so close. It was very frustrating, and to start off this season the same way was heartbreaking. Before my match (against Amanda), I was talking to Daria Pajak, and she told me a couple of things that really boosted my confidence. I'm not sure if everyone could see it, but I was smiling and just wanted to bowl happy. Once I started smiling, I felt like that monkey was coming off my back, and that's what happened."

Johnson, the reigning back-to-back PWBA Player of the Year, led the way in Group B with a 5,308 pinfall total, just five pins ahead of Restrepo for the top overall seed. Johnson found success on an unreleased lane condition which forced her to display her versatility.

Although she arguably is the most accomplished player on tour, she still embraces all challenges after many years of competing, and this week would certainly qualify.

"This week required a little more of the C and D game, and that's why I constantly work on my game," Johnson said. "My ball reps had me keeping my shoulders back and square so I wouldn't come around it, and the little things like that helped all week. I did my best to stay out of trouble, and everything kind of came into place. After all of the years out here, I'm not afraid of anything. I may not be as good on some shots as others, but I know I can do it."

Restrepo, last season's runner-up for PWBA Player of the Year, earned an auto-

matic TV berth for the second consecutive week after earning the top overall seed at the Sonoma County Open, putting her in position as the early front-runner for PWBA Player of the Year honors in 2017.

The players in the second, third and fourth positions in each group at the conclusion of match play advanced to their respective group stepladders Saturday and battled for the final two spots on the TV show.

The final TV spot went to McEwan, who defeated Shannon Pluhowsky of Dayton, Ohio, 195-170, in the Group A final. McEwan advanced to the final match after dispatching of Shannon O'Keefe of O'Fallon, Illinois, 224-190.

Prior to facing Zavjalova in the Group B final, Greene defeated Jennifer Higgins of Westerville, Ohio, 216-201, to advance.

Competition at the 2017 PWBA Storm Sacramento Open began Friday with two six-game qualifying blocks to determine to the 32 players for Saturday's Cashers' Round. An additional six-game block Saturday morning narrowed the field from the 32 cashers to the top 12 players for round-robin match play.

The 2017 PWBA Tour season continues next week with the PWBA Fountain Valley Open at Fountain Bowl in Fountain Valley, California.

Abralon on your own helps the ball pick up a smidge earlier in the mid lane.

The Octane Carbon is the ball E.J. Tackett used to win the PBA Tournament of Champions in February.

The final ball of these three is the Tank Burgundy, due out May 31. If urethane were still a primary cover choice, this

would be the next step in its evolution. Jokingly nicknamed "Ron" by a few staffers, it is stronger than the last two Motiv versions, the Arctic Sniper and Rebel Tank. It is designed to smooth out over/under reactions on varying degrees of medium to dry conditions, plus have a little more hit than the Rebel Tank. I should have mine by the time this edition hits your bowling center, so I'll let you know in the next round of reviews.

# Wilkinson Elected to Third Term as USBC President

ARLINGTON, Texas – The United States Bowling Congress Board of Directors have re-elected Frank Wilkinson of Staten Island, New York, as USBC president and Cathy DeSocio of Wichita, Kansas, as vice president for the 2017-2018 season.

The election of officers for the USBC Board took place following the USBC Convention, held in April in Las Vegas. Because of terms limits, the 2017-2018 season will mark both Wilkinson's and DeSocio's final terms as president and vice president, respectively.

Wilkinson, the owner of

Rab's Country Lanes, joined the USBC board as a youth committee representative in 2010 and served two three-year terms before his election to the board by delegates in 2016. He served two years as vice president, from 2013-2015, and has been president since the 2015-2016 season.

"It is a tremendous honor for me to have the support of the board to continue as president and to have Cathy continue as vice president," Wilkinson said. "We have taken many positive steps in the last few years and that is only through the combined efforts of the board, the

USBC staff and the thousands who support us at the state and local levels as we continue to build a future for the sport."

The 2017-2018 season will be the final terms for Wilkinson as president and DeSocio as vice president because of term limits, as each position is limited to three one-year terms. Wilkinson also is in his final term as a board member, which runs through July 31, 2019.

In addition to serving on the USBC board, Wilkinson has served as a USBC representative on the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America board since 2014. He is a director on the Staten Island USBC board and has been on the National Council of Youth Sports since 2012. He has received many honors, including the Staten Island Chapter of the American Cancer Society Distinguished Community Service Award, the NYS USBC Youth Leaders Bridging the Gap Award and

the Staten Island Small Business of the Year presented by the City of New York.

DeSocio is president of JOMA Company, which operates eight centers in Kansas, Missouri and Oklahoma, and serves as a trustee on the International Bowling Museum and Hall of Fame board. The first woman to serve as president of BPAA, from 2012-2014,

she was honored with the BPAA President's Medal in 2015. Other awards include the Great Plains USBC Hall of Fame Pioneer Award for Exceptional Leadership, Continued Support and Distinguished Service to the Sport of Bowling in 2014, the Wichita Business Journal Women in Business Award in 2013 and the Bowlers Journal Proprietor of the Year in 2012.

and fortunately I guessed right this time."

Taking the lead into the 10th frame of the Pasco County Open two weeks ago, Duke left the 2-4-8-10 split which handed the win over to Brian LeClair of Delmar, N.Y., for his second PBA50 Tour title.

"There's one philosophy that says, put those situations behind you and move on, but for me, I stew over it," said Duke, who ranks third on the all-time PBA Tour titles list with 38 wins. "That was a

learning experience and I want to learn from it. I don't want to get into a second-place cycle."

Duke was able to overcome two splits in the Race City Open title match that he failed to convert but was able to come back with strikes at the end of the match when he needed them.

"I'll be honest, this victory was probably more ball than it was me," said Duke, who qualified third for the stepladder finals. "I needed every advantage I could get."

Parks, the 2008 USBC Senior Masters winner, was trying for his second career PBA50 Tour title.

Two-time PBA Tour winner Jeff Bellinger earned a check the hard way when he showed up late for his second round qualifying squad on Tuesday. Commuting from his home in Columbia, S.C., the 63-year-old Bellinger got caught in a traffic jam caused by road construction in the Charlotte area.

Giving the field what amounted to an eight-frame head start, he began competition in the ninth frame and bowled a 40 in his first game. He followed it up with games of 225, 248, 246, 257, 197, 211 and 225 which was good enough to finish 44th in qualifying advancing to Wednesday's cashers round. Unfortunately he couldn't get anything going in the cashers round finishing the tournament in 51st and winning \$1,000.

## Eight PBA Stars to Compete in Unique Multi-Telecast Special Event

CHICAGO – The Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) returns to CBS Sports Network for the new Main Event PBA Tour Finals in Orlando, Fla. The Network will televise five consecutive, two-hour shows on Tuesday nights involving eight PBA Tour stars beginning on Tuesday, May 30 at 9:30 P.M., ET.

Players who will compete in the invitational special event include Australia's Jason Belmonte; EJ Tackett of Huntington, Ind.; Dom Barrett of England; Sweden's Jesper Svensson; Anthony Simonsen of Austin, Texas; Ryan Ciminelli of Cheektowaga, N.Y.; Tommy Jones of Simpsonville, S.C., and Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill. They are the PBA's top eight in composite earnings over the past three seasons.

Individual career highlights include:

- Belmonte, a 14-time PBA Tour titlist, is a three-time PBA Player of the Year (and former Rookie of the Year) and winner of the 2017 Barbasol PBA Players Championship and USBC Masters.

- Tackett, a seven-time PBA Tour champion, is the reigning PBA Player of the Year and winner of the 2016 PBA World Championship and 2017 FireLake PBA Tournament of Champions.

- Barrett, a five-time PBA Tour winner, was 2013 PBA World Champion.

- Svensson, the first player to win five PBA Tour titles by age 21, is the 2016 FireLake PBA Tournament of Champions winner.

- Simonsen, a two-time Tour titlist, won the 2016 USBC Masters to become the youngest player ever to win a major title at age 19.

- Ciminelli, a seven-time PA Tour winner, won the 2015 U.S. Open.

- Jones, an 18-time title winner, has won two majors and is one of four players to earn both PBA Rookie of the Year and Player of the Year honors.

- Rash, an 11-time titlist, has won two majors and was 2012 PBA Player of the Year.

The Main Event PBA Tour finals will utilize a similar

format to the tennis ATP Tour, dividing the field into two four-player groups for round-robin match play and award 50 bonus pins for each match win. Group A will include Belmonte, Svensson, Simonsen and Rash. Group B will include Tackett, Barrett, Ciminelli and Jones.

The first round will involve head-to-head matches within each group leading to Group A and Group B stepladder finals. The final two-hour telecast will include a match between the runners-up in each group for third place, and a three-game, total pinfall championship match between the Group A and B stepladder winners.





The 59-year-old left-hander has one 300 game and one 800 series to her credit. She recently bowled in the 2017 USBC Open Championships as part of a six-team group from Switzerland, Germany and Austria.

This year at the South Point Bowling Plaza, Beckel rolled sets of 624 in singles, 605 in doubles and 563 in team for a 1,792 all-events total.

USBC - What are some of your bowling-related achievements and career highlights?

MB - In 1991, I placed first in the World Bowling Women's Championships (singles). In 1992, I won the (QubicaAMF) World Cup. In 2005, I won again at the World Championships (doubles). In 2015, I had a second-place finish in doubles at the World Senior Championships.

USBC - What balls are in your bowling bag?

MB - I was mainly throwing my Ebonite Gamebreaker 2. I went between the solid and



PBA XTRA FRAME BILLY HARDWICK MEMORIAL TO GO "OLD SCHOOL"

The upcoming PBA Xtra Frame Billy Hardwick Memorial, scheduled for June 23-25 at the Memphis, Tenn., bowling center formerly owned by the late PBA Hall of Famer, will honor Hardwick in more than name only. It will be contested using the kind of limited-technology bowling balls the 18-time PBA Tour champion used when he became the PBA's first "triple crown" winner back in the late 1960s.

The Hardwick Memorial, which will be live-streamed exclusively on PBA's Xtra Frame online bowling channel, will be open to a field of 80 bowlers. All players must use approved polyester bowling balls manufactured by a PBA Product Registered company. A list of approved bowling balls can be found on [pba.com](http://pba.com) (<https://www.pba.com/Tournaments/Details/2331>) and includes the PBA Skill Ball 2.0 which is used in Teen Masters competition.

The tournament will offer a \$10,000 first prize and a PBA Tour title, if the winner is a PBA member. The event will not be part of the PBA Xtra Frame Storm Cup series because of its equipment limitations. Competition will include eight qualifying games for all players on Saturday, June 24, with the top one-third advancing to a four-game cashers' round on Sunday. After 12 games, the top 16 will enter into three-game single elimination match play leading up to one-game semifinal and championship matches.

Ozio, 63, resides in Beaumont, Texas. His resume includes 1991 PBA Player of the Year honors along with a PBA Tournament of Champions title. He was ranked 34th on the PBA's list of the 50 greatest players in PBA history during the organization's 50th anniversary celebration in 2009.

"When you think back to the dedication and the things it took to get here, was it worth it?" Ozio asked during his induction speech. "By all means, I would've done it again 10 times over."

Shady, 51, is a former collegiate star at Nebraska and Wisconsin-LaCrosse who now lives in Girard, Pa. The 1992 Earl Anthony PBA Open winner also is a two-time USBC Open Championships title holder who currently leads the tournament's lifetime average list with a 222.28 average for 21 years of participation.

Mike Moore of Orlando, Fla., defeated Jason Sterner of Rockledge, Fla., 290-225, to take the first prize in the inaugural PBA Valdosta South Open at Jac's Lanes in Valdosta, Ga., Sunday.

PBA League Elias Cup will be decided next Sunday at 1 p.m. EDT on ESPN in a showdown involving singles, doubles, trios and Baker team matches.

Employing a strategy that proved successful in the opening round, Dallas player-manager Norm Duke disregarded his personal views, electing to put his team on the more consistent right lane for the first game in order to finish the match on the tricky left lane. The strategy worked when team members Bill O'Neill, Duke, Rhino Page, BJ Moore III and anchor bowler Tommy Jones strung five strikes in the second half of game one for a 239-196 win. The Strikers then

clinched their berth in the Elias Cup finals with a 201-165 win in game two – the first match settled without a roll-off – taking advantage of a pair of doubles while Philadelphia ran into split trouble as the scoring conditions on the right lane began to change.

“We were the higher seed so we got to choose the order of lanes,” Duke said. “We decided to do what we did (in the first round) because my guys seemed to like them when they’re hooking more. I don’t know about that, but they have a point. When the other guys go to the right lane, it’s harder to move right than left.”

“It was against my instincts, but I have some really good minds and they know what they like,” the PBA Hall of Famer added. “I can pretty

much deal with all of it, so I try to put them in the right position. Now we’re back in the title match, and that’s what counts.”

The Lumberjacks had a more challenging trip to their finals berth, facing a comeback after the Atom Splitters – the only team to win the Elias Cup twice – escaped with a 221-217 win in the first game. As the lane conditions continued to transition in the second game, strikes became less frequent and spares became more valuable.

Heading into the 10th frame, Portland was on the brink of elimination after throwing only three strikes in the entire game. The Atom Splitters, needing only a mark in the 10th frame to lock up

# Women's Championships Weekly Glance

Scoring pace picks up at 2017 USBC Women's Championships

The leaderboards at the 2017 United States Bowling Congress Women's Championships have a new look as the tournament begins to settle in at the Raising Cane's River Center.

In Diamond Doubles, a pair of bowlers from the Pelican State moved to the top of the standings as Kateri Celestin of New Orleans and Keosha Moore of Walker, Louisiana, posted a 1,243 total May 3. Moore led the duo with 666, and Celestin added 577.

A day earlier, two past USBC Women's Championships titlists again found their stride on the championship lanes as Joeia Moore of North East, Maryland, and Jean Hall of Elkton, Maryland, took the Amethyst Doubles lead with a 919 total. Moore and Hall helped Alley Gators II win the 1998 Division III Team title, and the pair put together a consistent effort as Hall led the way with 465 and Moore added 454.

Diamond Doubles consists of bowlers with combined entering averages of 380 and above, while Amethyst Doubles features bowlers with entering averages of 260-289.

Jillian Schneider of Dayton, Ohio, saved her best for last as she moved into the Amethyst

Singles lead May 5 with a 519 series. Schneider began her set with games of 167 and 162 before posting 190 in her finale.

Renzie Kintzler of Cheyenne, Wyoming, moved into the top spot in Ruby All-Events with a 1,707 total on May 2-3. She had sets of 647 in team, 578 in singles and 482 in doubles to post her leading total.

Robin Miles of Alberta, Minnesota, raised the bar in Amethyst All-Events on April 28-29 as she fired a 1,481 total. Miles, who finished third in Division IV All-Events at the 2009 Women's Championships in Reno, Nevada, rolled sets of 512 in team, 492 in doubles and 477 in singles.

Bonnie Ryan of Price, Utah, took over the top spot in Topaz All-Events on May 3-4 with a 1,301 total. Ryan's sets included 463 in doubles, 428 in singles and 410 in team.

Ruby All-Events includes bowlers with entering averages of 175-189, and Amethyst All-Events features bowlers with entering averages of 130-144. Topaz All-Events is for bowlers with entering averages of 129 and below.

A look ahead

Three bowlers are scheduled to make their 50th USBC Women's Championships appearance this week.

Greta Kozar of Chamblee, Georgia, will be the first to reach the milestone as she makes her 50th consecutive appearance May 6 at 9 p.m. Eastern. Kozar began her tournament career at the 1968 event in San Antonio.

Hope Williams of Tucson, Arizona, also started her Women's Championships career in 1968 and will make her 50th consecutive trip to the world's largest participatory sporting event for women May 10 at 6 p.m. Eastern.

Elaine Rebatzke of Milwaukee will make her 50th appearance May 11 at 6 p.m. Eastern. Rebatzke made her Women's Championships debut at the 1963 event in Memphis, Tennessee.

Thomas Fredrick of Watertown, Wisconsin, struck nine times in his final game of doubles May 2 at the 2017 USBC Open Championships to give his partner, Mark Mallow, also from Watertown, a chance to fill his final frame for the lead in Standard Doubles.

Mallow, a 56-year-old left-hander, struck on his first shot and went high on his second offering, leaving the 6-10 combination. He converted the spare to secure the top spot in the standings by a single pin.

Fredrick, a 57-year-old right-hander, led the way with a 625

set, and Mallow contributed 567 for a 1,192 total. Raymond Haran and Ramon Pagan of Chicago previously held the lead with 1,191.

Five bowlers celebrate 50 years at 2017 USBC Open Championships

This week was a celebration of longevity at the USBC Open Championships as five bowlers were recognized for 50 years of tournament participation.

Each bowler received a plaque, chevron and diamond lapel pin on the lanes at the South Point Bowling Center to commemorate the achievement.

Wilbert Bellamy, 87, whose Open Championships career started at the 1968 event in Cincinnati, completed the first game of his team event

before stepping aside for a substitute, who rolled the final two games. Bellamy pushed his career pinfall total to 71,723, a lifetime average of 175.

Dave Hauber, a 70-year-old right-hander, also made his tournament debut in 1968, and he got his start alongside Dick Rice of Platteville, Wisconsin, a member of the tournament's 60-Year and 100,000 Pin-Clubs.

In his 50th appearance, Hauber rolled sets of 520 in singles, 465 in team and 397 in doubles for a 1,382 all-events total. He has knocked down 76,486 pins during his Open Championships career for a lifetime average of 174.6.

Paul Portsche, now 66, got his Open Championships start in 1968 as a 16-year-old, when

he was asked to fill a spot on his father's team.

This year in Las Vegas, the Lincoln Bowling Association Hall of Famer rolled sets of 512 in team, 501 in doubles and 493 in singles for a 1,506 all-events total, bringing his career pinfall at the Open Championships to 83,156, a 184.7 lifetime average.

J.R. Schmidt, a world-renowned bowling historian and longtime writer for Bowlers Journal International, finished his 2017 tournament campaign with 541 in singles, 444 in doubles and 426 in team for a 1,411 all-events total. In 50 tournaments, the 69-year-old has knocked down 76,331 pins

for a career average of 175.

Larry Evans was 42 years old when he made his first appearance at the Open Championships in 1968. He has been to every tournament since, with a highlight coming in 1971 when he bowled with his father, brother and son. His son, Larry Evans Jr., was on the lanes with him again this year for his special night.

Evans, now 91, has a career average of 168 through 50 events. This year at the South Point Bowling Plaza, he rolled sets of 485 in doubles, 407 in singles and 397 in team for a 1,289 all-events total. His career pinfall at the Open Championships is 74,480.
