## Jordan Richard Victorious at 2019 PWBA Lincoln Open

The difference remained close as neither player was able to record a double as they approached the final frame. Richard, finishing the match first, was working on a strike entering the 10th frame and needed to fill 19 pins to shut out Gongora.

The 23-year-old right-hander rolled a strike to record her second double of the finals, and she secured the win and a spot at the season-ending PWBA Tour Championship in Richmond, Virginia, after toppling seven pins on her next shot.

The 2019 PWBA Tour Championship will be held at Richmond Raceway on Sept. 15-18 and invites the top 16 players for the season to compete for the final major championship of the season. Players can earn a spot by winning an event throughout the season or through the season-long points list.

"I'm pretty speechless right now," said Richard, who won the 2018 PWBA Greater

LINCOLN, Neb. – Jordan Richard of Tecumseh, Michigan, claimed her second Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour title with a wire-to-wire victory at the 2019 PWBA Lincoln Open.

The 2018 PWBA Rookie of the Year led every round leading up to the stepladder finals

Saturday at Sun Valley Lanes and defeated Mexico's Sandra Gongora in the title match, 215-195, to collect the \$10,000 top prize.

Richard gained the early advantage in the finals, striking on three of her first four deliveries to build a 10-pin lead on Gongora, who was looking for her first career PWBA Tour title.

## Joel Carlson Beats Ron Mohr in Roll-Off to Win PBA50 Hamilton Lanes Open

TRENTON, N.J. (May 5, 2019) – After a 279-279 title match tie, PBA50 Tour veteran Joel Carlson of Omaha, Nebraska, defeated PBA Hall of Famer Ron Mohr of Las Vegas, in a one-ball roll-off 10-8 to win the PBA50 Hamilton Lanes & Entertainment Center Open presented by Columbia 300 Sunday for his first title on PBA's tour for players 50 and over.

Carlson and Mohr went strike for strike through the first seven frames of the title match until Carlson left a 7 pin in the eighth. After making the spare, he finished the match

## USBC Convention to Take Place in Chicago Area in 2021

ARLINGTON, Texas – The United States Bowling Congress Convention and Annual Meeting heads to the Chicago area in 2021 as the Westin Lombard Yorktown Center in Lombard, Illinois, will be the host hotel for the event.

The 2021 USBC Convention is set for April 26-29, continuing its Monday-Thursday format of the last several years.

Convention delegates, comprised mostly of volunteers from local and state associations throughout the country, have responded through surveys that the weekday schedule is preferred. The schedule assists with rates and accommodations for delegates and their guests.

The USBC Board of Directors recently approved the site selection, as it continues the orga-

nization's commitment to host its annual meeting near a USBC Championships event. The 2021 USBC Women's Championships will take place at Stardust Bowl in Addison, Illinois, just six miles away.

At the USBC Convention and Annual Meeting, delegates attend educational seminars, hear updates from USBC and industry leaders, and national awards and scholarships, including the National Recognition Awards and Stars of Tomorrow Awards, are presented.

During the Annual Meeting, delegates vote on legislative proposals to bylaws and league and tournament rules, and vote on open positions on the USBC Board of Directors.

The USBC Hall of Fame induction ceremony also is held in conjunction with the

## SMART Corporation Makes \$1.75 Million Distribution for Second Consecutive Year

ARLINGTON, Texas – For the second consecutive year, the Scholarship Management and Account Reporting for Tenpins (SMART) will make a distribution of \$1.75 million to providers' funds from investment earnings.

Based on income earned from investments, the SMART Board determines any possible income earnings distribution and releases the funds to providers by the end of May each year. The \$1.75 million distribution is from investment earnings in 2018.

"The SMART Board is excited to make such a signifi-



cant distribution for the second consecutive year," SMART Corporation Board Chairman Steve Moehrle said about the distribution announced by SMART during its presentation at the USBC Convention. "We will continue to protect SMART funds through conservative investment strategies and look to continue our yearly earnings distributions so providers can provide more youth bowlers with scholarships."

# Just Paying Attention

I know, I know, the last few weeks have been a little more what are known in the media biz as 'think pieces' about how top bowlers and bowling telecasts are shown on national television, but that train of thought has been one of the pillars of this column for over parts of the last three decades.

I have seen some posts on social media about how the telecasts look odd with all the displays of emotion from athletes, spectators, announcers, and of course the graphics...it's laughable really. And that's on a good day.

We are looking now at generation number two who doesn't know bowling was a staple of Saturday afternoon television for a thirty-year stretch. Unfortunately, it's not a big deal to them that it was. What is important is keeping it on the air somewhere at the same time each week.

The naysayers would prefer a telecast look as it did in the late 60's or early 70's, give me just bowling, and nothing else, with maybe some almost enthusiastic golf clapping thrown in by spectators. That would work

in 1969, but life has changed a little bit since then.

Sorry if you've read this here before, but television is still the big dog on the block, but it isn't as big as it was then. Cable and satellite TV came in, but this little thing called the internet with its live streaming on-demand stockpiles of shows and movies started to blow the doors off the hinges.

What is the same is this generation of young media consumers don't get their information the same as the generation before, and the generation before that. I couldn't imagine going to high school with a cell phone or having a presence on social media, but yet, in 2019, its reality.

They also know a world of video games at home, much like my parents had the huge color console TV and having a just-as-big stereo console with the AM/FM radio tuner LP albums dating back to the early 60's.

Sports television was straight forward, just point a couple of cameras and have an announcer describe the action. Graphics were assembled one

performed letter at a time against a black background, like on a wall mounted menu board, and then superimposed over the image on the screen. Spectators were polite, commercials even more so.

It's not that life got out of control, it's the next generation didn't want to be like their parents. They had their own way of doing things. Smart marketers and programmers know this and changed how shows are presented. Advertisers still covet the 18-49 age group, especially the younger half who are and will make many more consuming choices than older viewers, who have gradually gotten set in their ways and are less influenced by advertiser messages.

Let's go back to Saturday afternoon bowling for a moment. Remember why it disappeared after 35 years from ABC-TV? As Disney began its takeover of the network, it let the current contract run out because viewership was too old. In other words, there weren't enough 18-34 aged viewers to watch in the winter months. So what did they air instead? NCAA Men's

College Basketball, which has a large 18-34 viewership.

The irony pointed out here several times and in the Bowlers Journal piece I did two years ago on the 20th anniversary of the final Saturday afternoon ABC-TV telecast, was that many other major sports in the last decade, faced the same viewership issue the PBA faced then, an older viewership base, that has become the latest stumbling block to higher ratings.

Advertisers want younger viewers. Those viewers have grown up differently than the generations before. They are used to bat flips, longer end zone celebrations, and dunks and goals with more gyrations than the dance scenes on the old "American Bandstand" show. They are also used to seeing more graphics and other things to look at on screen as a game progresses.

Remember why we were all aflutter this time last year waiting for the PBA contract with Fox to start? Twenty-five years ago, they reinvented the way we see television sports right now. Their energetic presenta-



tion is bringing PBA telecasts into the modern media world.

That just scratches the surface. I barely touched on e-gaming sports, multiple social media platforms, and how everything interconnects now. Welcome to the column and TBN, with fifty new editions a year, my friend. The next part of this rant will be the topic of the annual Troy Walker Media columns in August. Now back to our regular programming.



# 2019 USBC Convention Concludes in Las Vegas; Three Elected to Board

 LAS VEGAS – Delegates elected three board members and voted on eight legislative proposals as the 2019 United States Bowling Congress Convention and Annual Meeting came to a close Thursday at The Orleans.

The ballot for the USBC Board election had four candidates slated by the USBC Nominating Committee – Anthony Colangelo of Meridian, Idaho; Rich Foran of Billings, Montana; Bo Goergen of Sanford, Michigan; and Lowell Lovgren of Kelso, Washington – with candidate Richard Ramsey of Byers, Texas, running from the floor.

On the first ballot, Colangelo (637 votes), Goergen (629) and Lovgren (582) were elected, with Foran receiving 396 votes and Ramsey receiving 263. A candidate had to receive a majority of votes from the 972 eligible voters to be elected. The newly elected board members begin their three-year terms on Aug. 1, 2019.

Also joining the USBC Board

starting with the 2019-2020 season will be new USBC Hall of Fame member Chris Barnes, who was elected by Team USA athletes earlier this year. He replaces Bill O'Neill, who did not seek another term.

Chris Floyd and Aaron Yuratovich are joining the International Bowling Campus Youth Committee, which also returns current members Melissa McDaniel and Chrissie Kent.

In addition to the board elections, delegates voted on eight proposed amendments, with three related to league rules, one for tournament rules and four proposals for bylaws.

Delegates approved a league rules amendment that will require a league secretary to furnish a list of individual averages to the local association manager within 15 days of a league's completion, and then rejected two additional league rules proposals and a tournaments rule proposal. Two amendments to bylaws were approved, including allowing state delegates to determine if hall of fame members should

have voting rights at the state annual meeting.

The 2019 USBC Convention also celebrated a special milestone, as it was the first convention in which every association was fully merged, and USBC announced a new award to recognize and celebrate an outstanding local association. Skagit Valley USBC of Burlington, Washington, was selected for the inaugural USBC Association Excellence Award, which was presented to association president Lonny Olson.

The presentation of national awards, including the Alberta E. Crowe Star of Tomorrow Award to Mabel Cummins of Elburn, Illinois, and the Chuck Hall Star of Tomorrow Award to Trace Nuss of Tampa, Florida, also took place Thursday.

USBC President Karl Kielich and USBC Executive Director Chad Murphy presented their annual reports, and delegates heard reports from the USBC Strategic Planning Committee and from International Bowling Campus Youth Development.

With this year's earnings distribution of \$1.75 million, SMART has returned more than \$4.3 million to Providers accounts in the last year. It includes \$2.2 million in expired Recipients Funds and \$430,000 in Expired Provider accounts.

The SMART Board provided an income earnings distribution of \$1 million in 2017 and \$450,000 in 2016.

SMART also has continued to make improvements to the program. Within the last year,

providers were given the ability to make online payments and SMART scholarship recipients now have an easier way to request funds online.

The SMART Bowling Scholarship Funding Corporation was created in 2010 as an independent entity dedicated to the management, protection and promotion of the SMART scholarship funds with the United States Bowling Congress staff overseeing the day-to-day operation of the program. USBC started the SMART program in 1994 to offer a centralized location to manage bowling scholarship funds, as well as

provide USBC members with a resource for inquiries about bowling scholarships.

The seven-member SMART Board places the largest portion of earned scholarships in conservative securities with remaining assets invested in a diversified portfolio expected to yield larger returns. The majority of investment income is distributed to participating organizations and providers, with a small portion used to cover administrative costs and investment fees.



bowling score. Twelve strikes, of course is, and a 278 game isn't too bad either. Those two numbers also represent the number of seasons and total amount of "The Big Bang Theory" episodes aired by CBS since 2007. And best yet, the most watched television situation comedy of its day dared to show bowling scenes every now and then.

Lead character Dr. Sheldon

Cooper was slightly more tolerable as he and Leonard, Penny, Howard, Raj, and nemesis Wil Wheaton would take to the lanes. He couldn't do much of anything that required physical movement, but he could bowl, something millions of others have done as long as bowling alleys have been in centers and church basements.

When the show's creator and head writer Steve Molaro unexpectedly walked into Mike Austin's Bowling Dynamix pro shop inside Emerald Bowl that late Thursday afternoon

in December 2017 with a Warner Brother public relations staffer, and center owner Don Ellis, little did I know I would soon hear the words that flat out stunned me then, "Hi, I'm Chuck Lorre."

Lorre was in Houston scouting shooting locations for the spin off, "Young Sheldon," looking for 1980's-looking centers

for either backdrop or actual scripted locations, requiring actors, lights, and cameras.

That scenario did not play out, but Lorre was kind enough to thank those he encountered. Not only did he send a personalized director's chair to myself and center GM Steve Hofer, the two of us were thanked on Lorre's signature Vanity Cards (card #562 in case you're really bored), seen at the end of each Lorre-produced episode usually with help of a VCR or DVR,

dating back to his first series as creator, "Grace Under Fire," in 1993.

Harrisburg Open. "This is a dream come true, and I'm really excited to head back to Richmond. It was a lot of fun last year, and I'm really glad I get to go back."

Richard held the top spot in the standings after each round at Sun Valley Lanes this week, and she had no intentions of giving it up after some close calls in the early portion of the 2019 season.

She was in the top four heading into the final game at the season-opening Nationwide PWBA Greater Cleveland Open before finishing in fifth place, and dropped out of the cut during the final game of the Round of 32 at the PWBA Twin Cities Open, finishing in 13th.

"I wanted to build myself a lead," said Richard, who led qualifying by 65 pins over Gongora. "And then, I wanted

to stay up there and avoid getting in the same situation I've found myself the past two weeks, just missing cuts by a couple of pins. I talked to my mom and told her I wasn't going to give those pins away this week. I stayed with it, and once I got there, I just kept moving forward."

Gongora, a 33-year-old righthander, was happy to post the best finish of her career after struggling during the first two weeks of the 2019 season. She had finished in 52nd and 60th during the first two events of the season.

Her only other championship-round appearance came at the 2016 PWBA Las Vegas Open, where she finished in third place.

Gongora stayed clean for both of her matches, including a semifinal win over Liz Johnson of Palatine, Illinois, 203-174, but she was unable to record a double in the finals.

"Carry ended up being a

little tough for me, and then when I needed to make good shots, I didn't make it happen," Gongora said. "Of course, anything can happen in one game, and the right lane was a little funny for me. I needed to be almost perfect to get to the pocket, and that's why I wasn't able to strike in those frames."

"But, I'm happy with my performance. Coming from two weeks where I wasn't very consistent, I came out and developed a plan for this week. Lincoln always has been good to me, and I had to take advantage of this pattern because it played into my A game. I'm not going to rest or stop until I get a title, because that's my dream."

In Saturday's opening match, Johnson stayed clean in a 215-184 victory over Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, New York.

Carlson's previous high PBA50 Tour finishes were third in the 2016 Sun Bowl In The Villages and fourth in the 2018 PBA50 Lucas Magazine Classic.



# USOC Compliance Report Shows USBC Meets all Requirements

ARLINGTON, Texas – The United States Olympic Committee (USOC) published an audit report confirming the United States Bowling Congress is compliant with the USOC's 2018 Compliance Checklist.

The audit was conducted by the USOC National Governing

Body Compliance and Audit Department.

The USOC annually conducts a review and produces a compliance checklist report for all National Governing Bodies. The report verifies USBC is aligned with key elements of the Ted Stevens Olympic and Amateur Sports Act, the USOC

Bylaws and certain USOC policies, in order to demonstrate ongoing commitment to the values and requirements of membership in the USOC.

As part of the review, USBC policy was examined and deemed compliant on the checklist report which includes 27 questions related to the following areas:

- Governance/Managerial
- Financial capability

• Due process and athlete representation

- SafeSport
- Anti-Doping

USOC initially identified two deficiencies needing policy clarification. USBC immediately remedied these to become fully compliant.

## PETE WEBER JOINS PBA'S ELITE "100 TITLES" CLUB WITH 47TH REGIONAL WIN

PBA Hall of Famer Pete Weber has now won 37 PBA Tour, 47 standard PBA Regional, 11 PBA50 Tour and five PBA50 Regional titles, joining Walter Ray Williams Jr. as the only players to win a combined total of 100 PBA titles.

The 56-year-old St. Ann, Mo., resident joined the exclusive "100 PBA Titles" club after defeating Kyle Sherman of O'Fallon, Mo., by 75 pins to win the BowlersMart/Bowlero Midwest Open presented by Brunswick at Brunswick Zone Lakeside in Valley Park, Mo., Sunday.

Weber, who won his 99th title almost two years ago in the 2017 PBA50 DeHayes Insurance Group Championship in Fort Wayne, Ind., won nine of his 12 matches and posted a 20-game total of 4,643 pins Sunday, including match play bonus pins, to win his 100th combined PBA title.

Williams is the record-holder, with a total of 112 titles at all levels of PBA competition

(47 PBA Tour, 33 PBA Regional, 14 PBA50 Tour and 18 PBA50 Regional). Weber also joined Williams late in 2018 as the second player in PBA history to surpass \$4 million in career earnings. Williams is the all-time PBA earnings leader with just over \$4.8 million.

By winning his 47th standard Regional title and his 52nd including his five PBA50 Regional wins, Weber is one title behind Chris Warren of Grants Pass, Ore., in both of those categories.

Sherman finished the Valley Park tournament with a 7-5 match play record and 4,568 pins, 70 ahead of 2018 PBA Rookie of the Year Kamron Doyle of Brentwood, Tenn. Weber earned \$2,500, Sherman \$1,500 and Doyle \$1,250.

Thomas Jones, who rolled

a 299 game during his team event at the 2006 tournament in Corpus Christi, Texas, set the pace for Melrose Bowl Red this year with a 695 series. He was followed by John Hommes (658), Chris Castle (656), Craig Schiffler (655) and Michael Wirz (637).

S and B Pro Shop 1 of Warren, Michigan, the defending Regular Team champion, previously held the lead this year with a 3,254 total, rolled March 23.

Beasley's 800 was the fourth



of the 2019 tournament (all four have come in singles) and made him the 36th bowler in tournament history with an 800 series and 300 game on the championship lanes. He had one of the 10 perfect games rolled at the Bowling Plaza during the tournament's 2017 debut at the new facility.
