




## Dasha Kovalova Wins 2019 Queens

WICHITA, Kan. – Ukraine's Dasha Kovalova won her first career Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour title and major championship Tuesday by delivering a double in her final frame at the 2019 United States Bowling Congress Queens.

The 24-year-old right-hander defeated Malaysia's Sin Li Jane, 226-216, at Northrock Lanes to claim the tiara and \$20,000 top prize, which was broadcast live on CBS Sports Network.

Kovalova, who garnered the support of the crowd as a former collegiate standout at Wichita State University, grabbed the lead at the halfway point of the match after Sin left and was unable to convert a 6-7 split in the fifth frame.

Kovalova followed Sin's open frame with her first double of the title match to push the lead

to more than 20 pins, and she maintained the advantage by staying clean through the ninth frame.

Working on a strike and finishing the match first, Kovalova needed a strike and nine pins on her first two shots to shut out Sin and rolled a pair of strikes to secure the victory.

In that pressure-packed moment, Kovalova kept everything quick and simple.

"I kept noticing the shot clock," Kovalova said. "When I get really nervous, I tend to slow everything down, but the clock helped me. When it got to 10 seconds, I knew I had to go.

I just focused on that and went to throw the best shot I could."

Heading into the title match, Kovalova also admitted to being nervous, but her plan to play the lanes farther left than her opponent allowed her to settle in after seeing a similar look during qualifying and match play throughout the week at Northrock Lanes.

"I was freaking out," said Kovalova, who's previous best finish in her PWBA career was eighth at the 2018 PWBA Louisville Open. "I wondered what would happen if I wasn't able to make good shots. But once I stepped up on the approach, I saw a really clear picture and was able to stay focused.

"We talked about keeping everything farther left than everybody else, but to be honest, I felt like I was playing this line during some of qualifying and match play, so I was familiar with it. We also drilled a new bowling ball, so that helped, too."

Kovalova was a four-time National Collegiate Bowling Coaches Association All-American while competing for Wichita State, and she now

## Prather, Simonsen Win to Advance to PBA Playoffs Semifinal Round

PORTLAND, Maine (May 20, 2019) – No. 4 seed Anthony Simonsen and No. 9 seed Kris Prather have clinched semifinal round berths in the inaugural PBA Playoffs and will continue their bids to win the \$100,000 top prize after winning their Round of 8 matches at Bayside Bowl. The first of two Round of 8 matches aired last Monday on FS1.

Prather and Simonsen will be joined in the semifinals by the winners of the No. 7 Bill O'Neill vs. No. 15 Wes Malott and No. 6 Sean Rash vs. No. 14 Dom Barrett Round of 8 matches which will air May 27 on FS1 at 9 p.m. ET. The four remaining players will battle in the Race to 2 Points format semifinals Saturday, June 1 live at noon ET on FOX with the winners returning for the live finals on June 2 that will determine the inaugural PBA Playoffs champion who will celebrate the largest payday of the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour

Prather, who won the PBA Scorpion Championship at World Series of Bowling X earlier this year for his first PBA Tour title, beat No. 1 seed Jason Belmonte in both games of the Race to 2 Points format match – 197-165 and 224-214 – to advance to the semifinals.

In the second game, Prather finished with four strikes in a

PBA REGIONAL UPDATE: KUBA TOPS PATE FOR FIRST REGIONAL TITLE

Matt Kuba of Chicago Ridge, Ill. defeated Nick Pate of Inner Grove Heights, Minn., 242-236, to win \$2,500 and his first PBA Regional title in the PBA Glo Bowl Midwest Open presented by 900 Global at Glo Bowl Fun Center in Marengo, Ill., Saturday.

Kuba defeated Jakob Butturff

of Tempa, Ariz., 232-223, to advance to the championship match after Kuba downed Nick Kruml of Downers Grove, Ill., 237-214, in the first stepladder match.

• Stoney Baker of Canton, Ga., defeated PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Oxford, Fla., 247-224, to take the first prize in the PBA50 Canton South Open presented by Roto Grip at Cherokee Lanes in Canton, Ga., Sunday, improving his all-time PBA titles total to 31.

Baker qualified in second place for the stepladder finals with an 5-3 match play record and a 16-game total of 3,800 pins, including match play bonus pins, and then won two consecutive matches to earn the \$1,700 first prize. Williams, who led from the start to the title match, posted an 4-4 match play record and had 3,975 pins to qualify first, 175

pins ahead of Baker, but had to settle for the \$900 second prize. After Williams took the lead with an early double, Baker rolled six consecutive strikes to take the commanding lead.

In the first stepladder match Joe Beck of Montgomery, Ala. defeated Dave Han of Birmingham, Ala., 188-181. Baker then disposed of Beck, 214-161, in the semifinal match.

• Cole Schroyer, a non-PBA member from Stanton, Texas, pulled ahead of the field late in the 13-game qualifying round and then won seven of his eight matches in the modified round-robin finals to thoroughly dominate the competition in the second annual PBA Waxahachie Southwest Challenge Sunday at Hilltop Lanes in Waxahachie, Texas.

Schroyer had built a lead of more than 100 pins early in the match play portion of the finals

# Just Paying Attention

In the first of a two-part interview last week, Upper Iowa University Bowling Coach Dr. Nichole DePaul-Miller spoke of creating a new collegiate program from square one.

This week, she talks about the ups and downs of recruiting, questions from parents, and how the student-athletes are getting to know each other in this foundation-building season.

**JPA:** How helpful have the fellow UIU coaches been as you get acclimated?

**Coach DePaul-Miller:** The coaches at UIU have welcomed me with open arms on campus and in Fayette. Some have helped me with information with finding a home in Fayette

to the best dentist in Fayette County. We are family-oriented athletic department with many of us having open-door policies to everyone on campus.

**JPA:** Without revealing names of course, what have been some of the surprises and disappointments in the recruiting process for the first year?

**DePaul-Miller:** Surprises have been the talent for the teams. Starting a new program has its challenges for any university. With Fayette having a population of 1,000 people, I thought it would be a challenge to get the talent for the teams to Fayette, Iowa. However, the men and women fell in love with the campus and small-

town feel. Bringing members of the teams from across the United States (Wyoming, Texas, Connecticut, Maine, Georgia, Wisconsin, Illinois, Kansas, and Iowa) was an exciting task for me as their head coach. Also, the team chemistry for each team is fantastic!! They are getting to know each other before they arrive on campus through the GroupMe app. Each team selected a squad at Junior Gold in Detroit to bowl together and get to know each other, as well. Several ladies knew each other through youth tournaments, as well.

During the recruiting process, I have had some disappointments. My biggest disappointment was the lack of communication from recruits and finding out through social media they signed with another school. I lost one or two recruits due to low grades, as well. Some wanted more athletic scholarships than I could give them. One did not like the bowling ball brand selected for the teams to use during collegiate competition.

**JPA:** What unique questions have the parents of recruits asked so far, other than will my kid bowl all the time, and the like?

**DePaul-Miller:** Some have asked what we will eat for breakfast, lunch, and dinner on the road during tournament weekends. One parent asked if each team member would drive to every tournament on their own. There haven't been any unique questions from the parents. It has been the standard questions, like how much will the university pay for the team (equipment, travel, uniforms, etc), and how many tournaments will the teams bowl. All the basic and standard questions.

**JPA:** How helpful has recruits and parents knowing your background with Kegel and USBC?

**DePaul-Miller:** Some parents and recruits have been surprised by my background in the industry. Many are more interested in my life on the road for the PWBA tour, and my staff with DV8. Some knew my connections with various industry leaders in bowling. The connections help me get several recruits to become commitments and sign National Letter of Intent with Upper Iowa for the men's and women's team.

**JPA:** Since there is no center in Fayette, where will the team practice?

**DePaul-Miller:** We have two centers within twenty minutes from the campus for us to use as practice facilities. Lilac Lanes, in West Union, Iowa, and Viper Lanes, in Oelwein, Iowa. We have set up

the practice schedule to run Monday through Wednesday from 2pm to 5pm (to stay in line with NCAA rules for hours of practice).

**JPA:** It's been a full year since your hire date. Has it been all you've expected so far?

**DePaul-Miller:** Absolutely is the best career decision I have ever made besides purchasing a pro shop (Perfect Motion Pro Shop, inside Plainfield Lanes, Plainfield, Illinois) with my husband, Jason Miller. At first, I thought it would be difficult to recruit for the men's and women's team. I am excited to start our season and get the teams to tournaments. Chatter has begun about both teams going post-season, winning conference (for the women's team, Great Lakes Valley Conference) and sectionals (for the men's team) in the first year of the program. Both teams have state champions, Pepsi scratch

row to eliminate Belmonte, who left a 3 pin as result of a high hit on his second shot of the 10th frame to end his bid for the win.

As the No. 9 seed, Prather advanced to the Round of 8 by winning a single-game Round of 24 match against No. 24 seed Darren Tang and a Round of 16 Race to 2 Points match against No. 8 seed Tom Daugherty.

In the second match, Gomez, a three-time tour winner, beat Simonsen, 234-207, but Simonsen rallied in the second game to defeat Gomez, 243-215, to force a ninth and 10th frame roll-off.

Despite a slow start by Simonsen in the second game with two spares after leaving seven counts, the two-hander came back with five consecutive strikes and took advantage of a missed 10 pin by Gomez in the fifth frame.

The 22-year-old Simonsen, who won the PBA Players Championship in February for his second career major, struck on his first three shots of the roll-off to win, 56-39.

“One good thing about this format is that if you’re struggling you have some time to figure it out,” said Simonsen, who advanced to the Round of 8 by beating Rhino Page in the Round of 16 after earning a first-round bye. “The turning point probably came when he missed the 10 pin, but I could see he was struggling with ball reaction. I was finally getting the ball reaction I needed and felt I could probably put some pressure on him. Everything seemed to be going my way at that point.

“It’s very rewarding to make it this far but there’s a lot of

work left to do,” Simonsen said of his return trip to Portland. “One thing I know is, it’s going to be fun to watch. I’m going to do the bowling and let the crowd do the rest.”



resides just minutes away from Northrock Lanes.

She helped lead the Shockers to the finals of the Intercollegiate Team Championships at the 48-lane venue in 2016, but the team was unable to win the Helmer Cup, falling to Webber International.

Tuesday's win serves as some redemption for Kovalova.

"We weren't able to deliver the title to Wichita State in 2016," said Kovalova, the 2014-2015 NCBCA Player of the Year. "So, I hope this counts. I wanted to give something back to my coaches, teammates and friends. It feels great. It's kind of surreal."

Sin, who was looking for her second career PWBA Tour title, was happy to see her persistence pay off after almost missing the cut into the match play earlier in the week.

The 27-year-old right-hander was out of the number heading into the final round of qualifying but quickly turned things around in match play, posting the highest match-play average in USBC Queens history on the way to the No. 2 seed, averaging 248.72 over six matches.

"Honestly, I'm very happy with my performance," Sin said. "The scores were low for me during the first two days, so I had to fight really hard to qualify for the top 64. I bowled really well in match play, and it's anybody's game in a one-game match. So, no regrets."

Sin started with eight consecutive strikes on her way to the title match, defeating Colombia's Clara Guerrero, 267-224. A 4 pin in the ninth frame ended Sin's run at 300.

Guerrero advanced to the semifinal after recording a thrilling 242-232 win over Indonesia's Tannya Roumimper.

Guerrero, finishing the match first, had the chance to shut out Roumimper with three strikes in her final frame but left a 10 pin on her final delivery to allow Roumimper the chance to tie with three strikes of her own. Roumimper struck on her first shot but left a 3-6 combination on her second to finish in fourth place.

In Tuesday's opening match, Roumimper struck on six of her first seven shots in a 231-195 victory over Singapore's Daphne Tan.

A total of 192 bowlers from 17 countries competed in three five-game blocks of qualifying over three days this week to determine the 63 players who joined defending champion Shannon O'Keefe of Shiloh, Illinois, in the bracket.

O'Keefe, the 2018 PWBA

# Walter Ray Williams Jr. Takes Commanding Points Lead as PBA50 Tour Resumes Competition

BRENTWOOD, Calif. (May 21, 2019) -- With three consecutive wins and an eighth-place finish to start the season, PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. takes a huge 10,000-point lead in the PBA50 Tour points race over reigning Player of the Year Michael Haugen Jr., as the tour for players 50 years and over begins its western swing with the PBA50 Northern California Classic presented by MOTIV at Harvest Park Bowl in Brentwood May 25-28.

The 59-year-old Williams, who owns the PBA Tour all-time career titles mark of 47, will try again for a record 15th career PBA50 Tour title, and if successful, will hold the all-time titles lead for both of PBA's national tours. Williams is currently tied with fellow Hall of Famer John Handegard for most PBA50 Tour titles at 14.

Williams started the 2019 season with wins in the season-opening PBA50 Johnny

Petraglia BVL Open and PBA50 National Championship for his third career PBA50 major title, before his streak ended with a win in the PBA50 Mooresville Open. He fell short of a record-tying fourth consecutive PBA50 Tour title with an eighth-place finish in the PBA50 Hamilton Lanes & Entertainment Center Open.

"It's a matter of everything coming together, especially because the PBA50 Tour continues to get better and better," said Williams, who won the Northern California Classic in 2012 and 2013. "When I started the season, I certainly couldn't have predicted getting the crazy start that I did.

"Last season I was in a good position to win but finished second three times," the seven-time PBA Tour and two-time PBA50 Tour Player of the Year continued.

Williams currently leads the PBA50 Tour points list with 18,930 points, 10,270 ahead of Haugen in second with 8,660. PBA Hall of Famer and

two-time PBA50 Player of the Year Ron Mohr will defend his Northern California Classic title at Harvest Park Bowl. The 63-year-old Mohr, who also won in 2011, handed Williams one of his three runner-up finishes in 2018 with a come-from-behind 237-218 title match victory for his 10th career PBA50 Tour title.

The fifth stop of the 2019 season starts with eight-game qualifying Sunday, May 26 with squads at 8 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. to be followed by a second round of qualifying on May 27. Cashers and match play rounds begin at 8 a.m. on May 28 which will determine the top five players for the stepladder finals at 6:30 p.m.






