



Monacelli Wins 2019 USBC Senior Masters

LAS VEGAS - For the second time in his career, Venezuela's Amletto Monacelli hoisted the trophy at the United States Bowling Congress Senior Masters, this time averaging more than 246 while climbing the stepladder at the Sam's Town Bowling Center.

The 57-year-old right-hander entered Sunday's championship round as the No. 5 seed and won five games to secure the coveted major title and \$20,000 top prize. His run included a pair of wins over top seed Stoney Baker of Canton, Georgia, and made him the eighth bowler in history to win the USBC Senior Masters twice.

Monacelli, a USBC and Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer, struck at least eight times in each match and closed the finale against Baker with five strikes for a 237-200 victory.

Because Baker had made it through the event's 64-player double-elimination match-play bracket without being beaten, he needed to be defeated twice to be denied the title. Monacelli topped Baker 255-243 to force the second game.

Baker, a 56-year-old right-hander and 31-time PBA regional champion, started the opening game with seven consecutive strikes, before a 10 pin ended his run at perfection. An unconverted 1-2-10 washout in the ninth frame gave Monacelli a chance to lock up the game, and the 2015 Senior Masters champion took advantage of the opportunity.

Monacelli, who defeated fellow hall of famer Pete Weber of St. Ann, Missouri, two times to win the 2015 event, kept pace with Baker, slowed only briefly by a 7-10 split in the third frame. He followed the open frame with seven consecutive strikes and a single-pin spare to shut out Baker.

Even as a part-timer on the PBA50 Tour, Baker has found success, including a previous-best finish of fourth. He's also the reigning PBA South Region Senior Player of the Year.

Since joining the PBA in 1986, the bowling center proprietor has enjoyed competing with and against the Tour's top stars, two of whom joined him in the finals Sunday - Monacelli and Norm Duke of Clermont, Florida.

To earn his meeting with Baker, Monacelli remained unrattled after an eighth-frame gutter ball against Duke and closed with four strikes to escape with a 239-222 victory. Sunday marked Duke's third consecutive appearances in the Senior Masters stepladder, where he has collected finishes of fourth, second and third, respectively.

O'Keefe Captures her Second Title of Season at PWBA Tucson Open

TUCSON, Ariz. - It's not a secret Shannon O'Keefe sets goals for herself each season. This week, she checked off an item she called a pie-in-the-sky, bucket-list goal.

O'Keefe captured her second title of the season with a 259-195 victory over Colombia's Maria José Rodriguez in the title match of the PWBA Tucson Lanes at Golden Pin Lanes. It marked O'Keefe's 10th career title, a goal she never thought was likely to happen in her bowling career.

While the 10 career wins checked off an item on her bucket list, her main goal for the 2019 PWBA Tour season was just getting back to basics. She said the end of the 2018 season had become a grind, as she made a push for PWBA Player of the Year, and realized she needed to focus on the things she can control as a competitor.

In Saturday's title match, O'Keefe struck on five of her first six shots against Rodri-

gue. The strike in the sixth included the 2 pin and 9 pin tripping late, and following a made spare in the seventh, O'Keefe struck out to capture the title.

Rodriguez made the title match with a 247-216 victory over Liz Kuhlkin of Schemnectady, New York. Rodriguez earned the No. 2 seed with a blistering performance on Saturday that included averaging 245 during the Round of 12 to jump from 14th into third.

Kuhlkin also had made

KRIS PRATHER CLIMBS TO THIRD IN FLOBOWLING'S "POWER RANKINGS"

With his surprising victory in the inaugural PBA Playoffs, previously-under estimated Kris Prather got some respect from the unofficial pollsters who compile the FloBowling "power ranking" list, moving up from seventh to third on the most current list.

Prather, who defeated Bill O'Neill in the "race to two points" championship match, won \$100,000 by outlasting a field of 23 of the world's premier players in 2019. Heading into the start of the summer season June 29 in Lubbock, Texas, FloBowling's top 10 are

PBA ADDS \$10,500 TO SUNCOAST PBA SENIOR U.S. OPEN PRIZE FUND

With the addition of \$10,500 to the prize fund for the Suncoast PBA Senior U.S. Open prize fund, first place in the 2019 season's final major championship for players ages 50 and older has been increased to \$15,000 and prize money for the other top five finishers also

has been increased.

The Senior U.S. Open, presented by Storm, is open to non-members as well as PBA50 members. The PBA50 Tour's most challenging tournament begins Monday, June 10, and concludes on Friday, June 14, at Suncoast Bowling Center in Las Vegas with FloBowling's livestreaming coverage of the stepladder finals at 7:15 p.m. EDT (4:15 Pacific). PBA Hall of Famer Mika Koivuniemi is defending champion.

Just Paying Attention

The good news is if you watched the PBA Playoffs last weekend, you were definitely not alone. Saturday's semifinals averaged 576,000 viewers, while Sunday's final averaged 662,000 viewers on Fox. Yeah, they weren't February numbers, but for a nice weather weekend in June, those are outstanding. Even the coveted 18-49 age group numbers were good at 167,000 and 190,000 for Saturday and Sunday.

Saturday's O'Neill-Rash semifinal could not have been better timed, helping draw viewers to Sunday's show. As I pointed out last week, it was an all-timer. You don't see many television matches with one spare and seventeen strikes in the first nine frames, maybe once a decade.

According to PBA Commissioner Tom Clark, Fox Television sales, now has a year of PBA telecasts under its belt to sell for the 2020 season. From what he's seen, the Association is getting back into the mix of television sports in a very good way. I'll have more comments from the Commissioner on this and more next week in the June 20 JPA right here in TBN.

It really was quite a show. Lots of strikes, close matches, plenty of crowd noise, and a great on-air presentation with a few new graphical features. But is it enough?

The USBC Queens telecast on CBS Sports Network two weeks ago was well worth watching live, or in DVR real time—no skipping over slower portions. We've already seen a number of several high-drama PBA shows this season, but this was the first PWBA show with a little extra kick. But is it enough?

Traditional television marketing says to put out an exciting, face paced show, grabbing the attention of even the most casual viewer. The sports television landscape is crowded enough these days, even with esports and corn hole (bags) matches, now filling the former PBA telecast slots on ESPN. Again, is it enough?

We've seen great skill and timely performances over the years, but does that correspond into higher television ratings, higher profile sponsors, and even higher ratings?

One key to success has

been a magnetic personality able to come through the glass camera lens, then through our television or personal electronic device. No matter how hard marketing departments and athletes try, a charismatic personality cannot be faked or forced. It occurs naturally. If it's forced, the viewer knows it, comes off as fake and is usually dismissed.

With the recent World Series of Bowling, then last weekend's PBA Playoffs on the regular Fox network, a larger audience gets to see the sweat on a PBA player's brow, puzzled looks on their faces, and the emotion of a job well done or not well enough. The PWBA players go through the same on CBS Sports Network. But is it enough?

The PWBA may have a few in the making. Liz Johnson was on almost every week for a while, then Shannon O'Keefe began to take over that role. But is the PWBA on national television often enough to attract the casual viewer? Serious bowling fans and regular readers know who they are and will watch, but does the casual viewer know?

Jason Belmonte may be the closest there is on the PBA Tour. People are not indifferent toward his results. There's the all-the-two-handers-can-pound-sand crowd, saying they have destroyed the game. Then there's the crowd in amazement of what he's done in a historically very, very short time.

People used to ask why a city had four or five top 40 or rock and roll radio stations. It's simple really. People listened and those stations made money. Nowadays, a city may have three or four sports talk radio stations, or at worst, portions of their schedule usually at

night, known in the biz as dayparting. Same reasoning applies here, they make money, even nowadays, stations airing nighttime sports talk radio more than likely subscribe to a nationally syndicated show, like Scott Ferrall's "Ferrall On The Bench," offered on CBS Sports Radio.

Topics discussed, of course, are timely, especially if a sports' playoffs are playing out, like the NBA Finals and Stanley Cup Finals are now. During the season and leading up to the playoffs, players, coaches, executives will get discussed and dissected daily. Then multiply that by five or six other shows on the same station or network. Then multiply that by five or six other shows on handful of other networks.

Some shows seem to dwell on the same topics, who won, who dogged it, who played out of their mind, which coach mismanaged the game, and so

on. Some will come up with a creative idea that is worth a listen.

This is what you hear during each of the four major team sports seasons. As an example right now, it's a little bit of Stanley Cup Finals, little bit of MLB, and the bulk is NBA Finals.

A recent episode of Colin Cowherd's daily simulcast show on Fox Sports Radio and FS1 brought up another point of personalities. This one was about how sports leagues themselves have their own personalities, hopefully adding to the magnetic attraction of television can deliver.

He attached a personality trait to a handful of sports leagues and associations. Major League Baseball conforms to tradition, PGA Golf is "Quiet, Please," a command to the gallery while a player

2019 Suncoast PBA Senior U.S. Open Storylines

 LAS VEGAS (June 6, 2019) – As the most demanding stretch of the PBA50 Tour season continues with the USBC Senior Masters this week in Las Vegas, players will once again have to dig deep when the second half of the major doubleheader continues with the Suncoast PBA Senior U.S. Open presented by Storm wraps up the western swing June 10-14.

The Senior U.S. Open marks the halfway point of the season which, thus far, has been dominated by PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. in what could already be considered a “Player of the Year” worthy season.

The Senior U.S. Open will be streamed live in its entirety via FloBowling beginning with first-round qualifying June 10. Visit www.flobowling.com for subscription and schedule information.

Here’s a look at a few of the storylines for the third and final major of the 2019 season:

Walter Ray Williams Jr. continues his PBA50 Player of the Year march: In the first five tournaments of the season, PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. started with three

consecutive wins that included the PBA50 National Championship, followed by eighth and seventh-place finishes heading into the Senior Masters, an event he has won twice.

The seven-time PBA Tour and two-time PBA50 Tour Player of the Year holds a huge 10,000-point lead in the PBA50 Tour points race over reigning PBA50 Player of the Year and 2017 Senior U.S. Open winner Michael Haugen Jr. Williams, the career leader on the Go Bowling! PBA Tour titles list with 47 wins, continues his pursuit of a 15th PBA50 Tour title which would give him the career titles lead for both of PBA’s national tours. He is currently tied for first on the PBA50 all-time titles list with fellow Hall of Famer John Handegard with 14 wins.

Mika Koivuniemi returns to defend Senior U.S. Open title: The PBA Hall of Famer earned the moniker of “Major Mika” after winning two majors for his first two titles early in his PBA Tour career before winning his first PBA Tour standard title. The 14-time tour winner, who is the head coach for the United Arab Emirates national bowling team, hopes

that history will repeat itself on the PBA50 Tour after winning the 2018 Senior U.S. Open with a 259-237 title-match victory over Brian Kretzer for his first PBA50 Tour win. With his win, Koivuniemi – who won the 2001 U.S. Open on the PBA Tour – joined Amleto Monacelli as the only international Senior U.S. Open champions.

Will the Senior U.S. Open see its first three-time winner? Hall of Famer Pete Weber, Amleto Monacelli and Tom Baker will be trying to become the first three-time winner of the Senior U.S. Open since it began in 2003. All three players have won it in consecutive seasons – Weber (2015, ’16), Monacelli (2012, ’13) and Baker (2005, ’06). The other two-time winner is retired hall of famer Wayne Webb who also won in back-to-back years in 2008 and ’09.

Can Pete Weber bounce back? Weber, who is tied for sixth on the career PBA50 Tour titles list with 11 wins, took some time off from the PBA50 Tour earlier this season, but after winning a PBA regional in early May, hopes that tune-up will provide some momentum for the rest of the PBA50 Tour



some big moves during the day to reach the stepladder and was nearly perfect in the opening match against Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, New York. The duo matched strikes for the first four frames before McEwan had a 9-count in the fifth.

But Kuhlkin kept striking and threw 11 consecutive strikes before leaving the 9 pin on her final shot in a 299-226 victory.

There were two perfect games rolled during Saturday's competition. Sydney Brummett of Wichita, Kansas, had a 300 in Game 4 of the Round of 32 and Kelly Kulick of Union, New Jersey, had 12 consecutive strikes in the opening game of the Round of 12.

The 2019 PWBA Tour now heads to Fountain Valley, California, for the PWBA Fountain Valley Open at Fountain Bowl. Competition starts June 14, and BowlTV.com will have live coverage of all rounds, including the stepladder finals.


