

Jason Belmonte Wins 2018 PBA Tour Finals for 18th Career PBA Tour Title

ALLEN PARK, Mich. (June 19, 2018) - In a hotly-contested rematch between the last two Professional Bowlers Association Players of the Year, Australian two-hander Jason Belmonte defeated defending champion EJ Tackett of Huntington, Ind., in a two-frame roll-off to win the 2018 PBA Tour Finals, earning his 18th career Go Bowling! PBA Tour title. The finale was telecast Tuesday on the CBS Sports Network from suburban Detroit's famous Thunderbowl Lanes.

Bowling on the 45-foot Dick Weber lane condition chosen by Belmonte, the 2017 PBA Tour Finals runner-up held the upper hand in the best-of-two-game match after defeating Tackett in the first game, 239-205. But Tackett, the 2017 PBA Tour Finals winner, rebounded to win game two, 219-170, to force the 9th and 10th frame roll-off for the title.

"I didn't know what to do," said Belmonte after appearing to be lost following his 170 game. "I tried playing outside and then I went back to playing inside. I think I probably was overplaying my adjustments and making too radical of changes, so I went back to my original ball and started playing in the middle of what I

was trying to do earlier in the game."

In the roll-off, Belmonte started with a strike and finished with a spare/strike in his 10th frame while Tackett, who was trying for his 10th career title, spared in his ninth but left the 2-8-10 split on his first ball of his 10th frame, resulting in a 40-26 loss and giving the title to Belmonte.

Belmonte stressed the importance of his strike on his fill ball in the 10th frame of the second game leading into the roll-off.

"That (final ball) in the 10th was huge because that was the only indicator I had that I

could find some kind of shot going into the playoff."

The PBA Tour Finals was draining for Belmonte because it followed an especially grueling travel schedule for him just prior to the event.

After competing in the Oceanview at Falmouth PBA League in Portland and then traveling to Florida to visit with Hannah Carbocci, a member of Stoneman Douglas' high school bowling team, he returned home to Australia for a short four-day break before flying all the way back to Detroit for the PBA Tour Finals.

"I'm exhausted, but I

PBA's YouTube Channel Reaches 100,000 Subscriber Milestone

CHICAGO - The Professional Bowlers Association's YouTube channel is the first bowling channel to achieve YouTube's elite Silver Level status, surpassing the 100,000 subscriber milestone last week.

By reaching Silver Level status on the YouTube.com ranking system, the PBA bowling channel will receive a Silver Creator Award which will include a silver play button and other perks that will help the channel grow even more. Silver Level status also means the number of fans following PBA on YouTube has continued to grow, achieving the fourth milestone on the video streaming website's popularity scale.

One reason the PBA has achieved the Silver Level



milestone is its archive of more than 1,300 videos residing on its YouTube channel, including complete tournament telecasts, Xtra Frame highlights, full coverage of big events such as past World Series of Bowling and PBA League competition,

Women's Championships Weekly Glance

Two bowlers celebrate 50 years at 2018 USBC Women's Championships

Indianapolis' Helen Kidwell and Bonnie Anderson of King-land, Texas, each celebrated a participation milestone this week, joining the 50-Year Club at the 2018 United States Bowling Congress Women's Championships.

Kidwell made her milestone appearance at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nevada, on June 16, and Anderson made her 50th appearance June 19. Each received a plaque, chevron and necklace to commemorate their longevity at the event.

Kidwell, 89, started her journey at the 1967 event in Rochester, New York, and a highlight of her career was



helping her hometown win the bid to host the 1975 USBC Women's Championships, which was announced during the 1974 event in Houston.

"I was a director for the women's organization for more than 10 years and traveled with the tournament," said Kidwell, a member of the Indianapolis USBC Hall of Fame and the 2017 Irene Wiese Award of Appreciation winner. "I was overjoyed when it was announced that the tournament was coming to my hometown. The Woman Bowler magazine

Just Paying Attention

As I eluded to last week, watching television is changing before our very eyes again. Live streamed programming is changing how we watch in two different ways. With not only one, but two very large recent completely transactions, it may change a part of the process for the next ten to twenty years. More on that in a moment.

Providers (studios, networks, independent producers, etc.) are also using the internet to transmit programming to us watchers in a more elaborate search engine. Just ten years ago, receiving existing television shows, movies, original programming, sports, and so on wasn't available on the scale it is now. Some of the more popular providers at the moment are Sling, Hulu, Netflix, and Amazon Prime.

Many of these providers are also carrying traditional network television, bypassing existing cable and satellite providers. For local television, many stations are already offering streamed programming through websites and apps. Some are even going old school, using aerials to pick up over-the-air signals.

Because of this streaming technology, a very unique

point is not far off on the horizon. According to Zenith Media, a worldwide media agency, money spent on mobile device advertising over the next four years will exceed money spent on television advertising. Although at the moment, television advertising is more effective for consumer recall. The item didn't offer an explanation why, although I'd be willing to bet it might have to do with traditional television being around for sixty to seventy years.

Think of it when bowling centers reached a 60/40 ratio of open to league play revenue was something, rather than 60/40 league to open play or greater, as it had been for years.

The recent AT&T (DirecTV, DirecTV Live)/ Time Warner (TBS, TNT, CW, DC Comics) merger creates a new avenue to deliver programming, while Disney (who has one new streaming service with another on the way) won out over Comcast to buy Fox Television (movies and programming).

So where does that leave bowling? This is where the recent PBA deals with Fox Sports and FloBowling come into play. Besides the over-the-air

telecasts, the Fox deal will also have PBA links on Fox Sports online platforms. FloBowling will be the actual live stream provider, airing coverage online as XtraFrame has done to this point, beginning next week.

An example of this change in viewing habits was Saturday two weeks ago. While waiting for the PWBA finals to start on XtraFrame, I stumbled on another Facebook thread about the question I've seen way too often in the last ten years. We've all see one every month or so, the one that asks, "Why isn't there more bowling on TV" or "this should be on TV." All this occurred while I watched Phil Michelson putt a moving golf ball in the third Round of the U.S. Open on Fox's over-the-air television coverage (as Publisher Tony mentioned so well last week).

One study in 2017 showed the average age of numerous sports television viewers.

The lowest average age was NBA viewers at 42, the oldest were PGA viewers at 64. MLB and NFL were in the upper 40's. A key point was many viewers below age 32 watched sports on their phones, which has a different method of measuring viewership, not taken like Nielsen over-the-air, cable, and satellite television ratings.

PBA Spare Shots

BELMONTE, PAGE, SMALLWOOD, SVENSSON EARN ESPY "BEST BOWLER" NOMINATIONS

Reigning PBA Player of the Year Jason Belmonte, 2017 U.S. Open champion Rhino Page, 2018 Barbasol PBA Players Championship titlist Tom Smallwood and Sweden's two-handed powerhouse, Jesper Svensson, are ESPN's candidates for the 2018 "Best Bowler ESPY." ESPN announced Wednesday.

Fan voting is now open (http://www.espn.com/espys/story/_/page/voting52/vote-best-sports) for "best bowler" and a variety of other categories. The annual ESPYs telecast, hosted for the first time by a woman – auto racing star Danica Patrick – will air live on ABC on Wednesday, July 18, from the Microsoft Theater in Los Angeles. Fans also can vote at ESPN's social media platforms (@ESPN on Facebook, Instagram and Twitter) and @ESPYS (Twitter).

The ESPYS and related events benefit the V Foundation for Cancer Research in memory of the late Jim Valvano.

Belmonte, who has won the "Best Bowler" ESPY in fan voting the past three years, could become the first bowler to win the honor four consecutive years. He also is a four-time winner, tying Norm Duke and Pete Weber for second place behind the all-time ESPY leader, Walter Ray Williams Jr., who has won the award seven times since its inception in 1995. Belmonte and Duke are the only recipients to win three years in a row.

Belmonte is coming off a 2017 season in which he became the first player ever to win three PBA majors in a single season, and thus far in 2018 he has won the Mark Roth-Marshall Holman PBA Doubles Championship (with partner Bill O'Neill) and the PBA Tour Finals as well as

posting top-five finishes in the PBA Tournament of Champions and the Barbasol PBA Players Championship.

In addition to his U.S. Open win, Page won the Xtra Frame Kenn-Feld Group Classic title and he finished fifth in the USBC Masters earlier this season. In addition to winning his second major in the PBA Players Championship, Smallwood helped the Sysco Philadelphia Hitmen to a second-place finish in the OceanView at Falmouth PBA League Elias Cup finals. Svensson, after runner-up finishes in the 2017 PBA World Championship and 2018 PBA Tournament of Champions, helped the GoBowling.com Silver Lake Atom Splitters win the 2018 Elias Cup.

Before the internet era, these average ages were believed to be at least ten years younger.

The concern over "why isn't bowling on TV more" is voiced more, not surprisingly, by older viewers, not wanting

to part with traditional viewing with the big TV set at home. The phrase "what the kids are into these days," now describes video game playing, cable-cutting, smart phone-watching consumers.

The younger end of this group has grown up with cell phones, complete with internet access and social media. The

larger TV screen at home are used for video game playing, occasionally for television watching. If they want to watch local television, many stations possess their own streaming services through station websites and phone apps. Once again, cable and satellite service is bypassed.

If my count is correct, this is the sixth different television viewing era of my lifetime. In order they are 1) only five channels to watch in the 1960's and early 1970's, 2) fourteen channels to watch, thirteen on cable, plus a box to descramble the HBO signal in the mid to late 70's, 3) one hundred cable channels by the mid to late 1980's, 4) big city phone book-sized cable box to receive hundreds of channels, 5) transition from analog to digital over the air signals for local television stations, 6) watching television from online sources. Sorry if I missed one (I am over 50 and senior/raisin moments are more common).

Now back to bowling. With the Fox and FloBowling deals in place, the PBA broadcast and live stream outlets are set for a while. The PWBA will use the USBC YouTube Channel, bowl.tv for coverage up until tournament finals are telecast on CBS SportNet.

So could we one day find the PBA exclusively on Sling, Hulu, Netflix, and Amazon Prime?

If televised bowling takes off again as it did in the ABC's 'Pro Bowlers Tour' era, and if the broadcast rights fees dollar amount is right, who knows? Another sign of the internet television era, one milestone was reached last week as






Sapphire All-Events includes bowlers with entering averages of 145-159, while Amethyst Singles and All-Events features competitors with entering averages of 130-144.



wouldn't miss this event in this historic venue and the great Detroit bowling fans," Belmonte said. "This is a great event that I believe really puts a spotlight on our top players so I really enjoy competing in it. Plus, I had some unfinished business after last year's runner-up finish (when he lost to Tackett)."

The PBA Tour Finals featured an elite field of the top eight players in combined PBA earnings from the 2016, 2017 and first four months of 2018. Competition consisted of four games of total pinfall positioning round competition on four different lane conditions, followed by a semifinal stepladder round for each four-man group. Belmonte won Group 1 over Anthony Simonsen, Dom Barrett and Sean Rash while Tackett topped Group 2, topping Jesper Svensson, Marshall Kent and Tommy Jones.

As the high average leader heading into the title match, Belmonte got to select the lane conditioning pattern out of the four patterns used in the event: Johnny Petraglia 36, Mark Roth 42, Don Carter 39 or Dick Weber 45 (the numerical distinction behind each pattern name refers to the distance in feet oil is applied to the lanes). Coincidentally, Tackett also favored the Weber pattern.

Preceding the title match, a match to decide third- and fourth-place featured the No. 2 qualifiers from each semifinal round. Sweden's Svensson, a left-handed two-hander, defeated Simonsen,

a right-handed two-hander from Austin, Texas, in another best-of-two-game match that also resulted in a 9th and 10th frame roll-off. Svensson won game one, 248-204. After Simonsen came back to win the second, 229-201, Svensson won the roll-off, 49-39, to finish third.

For Belmonte, the title was his second of the 2018 Go Bowling! PBA Tour season after a win with partner Bill O'Neill in the Mark Roth/Marshall Holman PBA Doubles Championship in February. Belmonte is trying to defend his 2017 PBA Player of the Year title and win PBA's most prized individual honor for the fifth time in six years. Tackett disrupted Belmonte's reign when he won the 2016 PBA Player of the Year award.
