


Butturff Defeats Stuart Williams to Win PBA Lubbock Sports Shootout

in the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Summer Tour series, Butturff automatically became the early leader in the USBC Cup points race that is part of the summer series.

Butturff, who won his first PBA Tour title in Lubbock in 2016 and had a second-place finish in 2018, said the secret to his success was his comfort in bowling at South Plains Lanes.

"I think it's the fact that when you win your first PBA title here, it makes you more comfortable," the 25-year-old left-hander said.

Williams, who made a key ball change after a sluggish start in the title match, threw three strikes to take a four-pin lead into the 10th frame, but left the 2-4-6-10 split when a strike could have closed the door on Butturff. Butturff failed to throw consecutive strikes, but filled every frame and needed only a mark in his final frame. He left the 6 pin on a high hit, converted the spare

ARLINGTON, Texas – Four juniors, including the 2019 United States Bowling Congress Annual Zeb Scholarship recipient, are among the 10 USBC Youth bowlers named to the 2018-2019 Dexter High School All-American Team.

Selected by Dexter Bowling in consultation with the International Bowling Campus Youth Development staff, the Dexter High School All-American Team is comprised of five girls and five boys who participated on a recognized interscholastic high school bowling team during the last school year.

To be considered for selection, candidates were required to have at least a 3.0 grade-point average (on a 4.0



scale) and submit a resume of their bowling and academic achievements, along with an essay. Applicants also had to provide two recommendation letters – one from their coach or athletic director and at least one additional letter.


PBA World Series of Bowling XI Returns to Las Vegas in 2020



lates these student-athletes for their great performances on the lanes and in the classroom during the past school year," said Tyler Jensen, Dexter Bowling Vice President. "High school bowling continues to grow and we had a very strong field of candidates for this year's team. We appreciate the opportunity to recognize these outstanding young bowlers."

The Dexter High School All-American Team will be recognized during the Junior Gold Championships Opening Ceremony in Detroit in July and each team member will receive a \$1,000 scholarship.

At the presentation, one of the bowlers will be announced as team captain and will receive the Bud Clapsaddle Award, named for the former Dexter Bowling vice president who oversaw selection of the first 12 teams. The Bud Clapsaddle Award recipient

will receive an additional \$500 scholarship.

She also was on the Mathletes team that was a state qualifier each of her four years and did community work through Leo Club, part of the New Lenox Lions Club.

Katie Fraser (Elkhart, Indiana) – Her 4.45 weighted GPA ranks the junior second

in her Elkhart Central High School class. A member of the National Honor Society, she was vice president of her class and student council. She was captain of the bowling team that finished seventh at state while individually she was 10th at state to earn second team all-state honors.

Linda Himes (Texarkana, Arkansas) – The senior led Arkansas Senior High School to the Class 5A state title this season, setting a state mark with a 756 series, is a four-year member of the school band and a three-time Jazz Band all-region selection. She has volunteered for Special Olympics in football and track. She earned a bowling scholarship to Kansas Wesleyan.

Alyssa Johnson (Lancaster, New York) – Ranked third in her senior class at Clarence High School, she was a two-time All-Western New York Scholar Athlete and received the Regents Award for Math and Science. She did volunteer work at Ronald McDonald House, Meals on Wheels and Salvation Army. She was captain of the bowling team for three years and two-year captain of the field hockey team.

Cassie White (Quincy, Michigan) – She helped start the girls bowling program at Quincy High School her junior year, earning all-conference honors her junior and senior years. She also is a member of the 4-H and National Honor Society. She has done volunteer work at the Branch Area Food



Mike Logan Named BPAA Proprietor of the Year for 2019

ARLINGTON, Texas — Mike Logan, the owner of Grand Station Entertainment in College Station, Texas, has been named the 2019 recipient of the Proprietor of the Year award by the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America.

Logan will receive his award during International Bowl Expo week, June 23-27, at the Paris Las Vegas Resort in Las Vegas.

A special committee selects the award winner from submitted nomination forms. Logan's nomination was accompanied by letters of support from fellow proprietors, as well as local and state USBC association officials.

Logan, a third-generation proprietor, transformed a failing bowling center into a thriving family entertainment center. Rather than removing lanes in order to free up space for new attractions, he closed an adjoining roller skating rink and used that space to add a large arcade, laser tag and other attractions.

Logan is a bowler at heart, with numerous honor score

awards to his credit, but as a businessperson he says he could see the writing on the wall as bowling's league participant base has slowly but continually diminished. While he still strongly supports local and state bowling tournaments, he says new revenue streams were needed to keep bowling available and viable.

"I'm not a trendsetter by any stretch of the imagination," Logan said in the June issue of Bowling Center Management magazine, official publication of the BPAA. "But I know how to follow the trends."

Logan noted that "without the arcade and the other additions we made, we would not have been able to buy 40 new pinsetting machines, two new lane machines and so on."

Thanks to those capital improvements, and a strong focus on cleanliness, Grand Station Entertainment maintains a strong league base.

Logan also has found time to volunteer with both the Texas Bowling Centers Association and at the national level with

BPAA.

While a TBCA officer, he helped bring many centers into membership and urged that educational programs be presented to the members in multiple locations since Texas is such a large state. He chairs BPAA's FEC Committee, and has lobbied for FEC-focused educational seminars at Bowl Expo.

"I did not see it coming," Logan said of the call he received from BPAA President Randy Thompson informing him of the Proprietor of the Year award. "I asked Randy, 'Didn't anybody else get nominated?'"

A big man with a big personality, Logan retains a humble demeanor and gratitude for his family, which includes wife Deanna and son Scott, both of whom play important roles in the operation of Grand Station Entertainment.

"I'm blessed to have them in my life, and that things turned out the way they did for us," he says. "Sometimes God looks out for you when you need it."



100th Women's Championships Concludes in Wichita

WICHITA, Kan. – The 100th edition of the United States Bowling Congress Women's Championships came to a close Sunday, helping wrap up a tournament-long celebration at Northrock Lanes.

The 2019 event kicked off April 20 and lasted for 72 days in The Air Capital of the World. A total of 4,108 four-player teams, more than 16,000 bowlers, participated at the 48-lane venue, competing in four average-based divisions for team competition and six divisions for doubles, singles and all-events.

All standings are unofficial and pending final verification.

The top score in each discipline came from the Diamond Division, which features bowlers with entering averages of 190 and above.

Beverly Gonzalez of Sierra Vista, Arizona, took the lead in Diamond Singles on May 7, firing games of 279, 243 and 276 for a 798 series. The series was the second-highest total recorded in singles competition in USBC Women's Championships history (Michelle Feldman rolled 816 to win Classic Singles in 2009).

Lauren Pate of Inver Grove Heights, Minnesota, and Jordan Newham of Aurora, Illinois, posted the top doubles score May 14, combining for a 1,417 total. Pate and Newham both were making their tournament debuts after finishing their collegiate careers at McKendree and Vanderbilt, respectively.

Pate led the way with games of 221, 264 and 289 for a 774 series, and Newham added 179, 246 and 218 for a 643 set.

USBC Hall of Famer Kelly Kulick of Union, New Jersey, also made her move to the top of the leaderboard May 14, taking the lead in Diamond All-Events with 2,211.

Kulick rolled sets of 775 in doubles, 737 in singles and 699 in team to become the sixth player in tournament history to surpass the 2,200 mark for her nine-game total. Despite already being a USBC Hall of Famer, this would mark her first title at the Women's Championships.

The top score in Diamond Team was rolled May 30 by Powerhouse of Lakewood, Colorado, which averaged more than 230 as a team on the way to a 2,767 total.

Led by Sharon Powers' 785 series, Powerhouse posted games of 881, 943 and 943 to finish with the second-highest team score since the Women's Championships transitioned to four-player teams in 2014 (Bowlieve In A Cure finished with 2,819 in 2014 to win Diamond Team).

Powers was joined by two-time titlist Christine Gill (736 series), Michelle Maly (654) and Debbie McMullen (592).

A pair of bowlers also are poised to take home multiple titles at the 2019 event.

Chris Lafko of Simi Valley, California, took the lead in Topaz Singles and Topaz All-Events on May 30, using the strength of a 530 series in singles to propel her to the top spot in all-events with 1,425.

Lafko rolled games of 163, 214 and 153 in singles and added sets of 468 in team and 427 in doubles. Topaz Singles and Topaz All-Events include



bowlers with entering averages of 129 and below.

On June 8, Elizabeth McGarey of Warren, Michigan, followed a similar path, as her strong finish helped her into the lead in Amethyst Singles and Amethyst All-Events.

McGarey used games of 197, 146 and 222 to get to the singles lead with a 565 series, and she added 485 in team and 476 in doubles to finish with a 1,526 all-events score. Amethyst Singles and Amethyst All-Events feature bowlers with entering averages of 130-144.

A total of five bowlers rolled 300 games at the 2019 Women's Championships, matching the 2014 event in Reno, Nevada, for the most perfect games during a tournament. In all, 32 perfect games have been achieved at the tournament.

Amanda Flood of Brandon, Florida, was the first to roll 12 consecutive strikes at the 2019 event, doing so during her singles set on May 13. She finished with a 789 series, which placed her second in Diamond Singles.

USBC and PWBA Hall of Famer Jeanne Naccarato of Tacoma, Washington, also connected for 300 on May 13, rolling her second career 300 game at the Women's Championships during her team event.

Naccarato became the first bowler to own multiple 300s at the tournament, after first achieving the feat at the 2014 event.

Kaidee Sutphin of Maitland, Florida, posted 300 during her singles set May 14, and USBC and PWBA Hall of Famer Leanne Hulsberg of Pleasant View, Utah, added her name to the list during her doubles competition May 15.

Hulsberg joined USBC Hall of Famer Dede Davidson as the only players in tournament history with both a 300 game and 800 series on the championship lanes. Hulsberg's 800 series came at the 2007 event in Charlotte, North Carolina, where she rolled 804 during her team event.

Brenda Clifford of Kahoka, Missouri, was the fifth player to achieve perfection at Northrock Lanes, rolling her first career 300 during her opening game of doubles June 14. Clifford also is leading Ruby All-Events with a 1,837 total. Ruby All-Events features bowlers with entering averages of 175-189.

Six bowlers were recognized this year for their dedication and longevity at the Women's Championships, joining the event's exclusive 50-Year Club.

This year's group included Marcie Baker of Fredericktown,

Missouri; Karen Bostian of Hilton Head, South Carolina; Muriel Casey of Fairfax, Virginia; Marilyn Miller of Two Rivers, Wisconsin; Marie Neugebauer of Glen Mills, Pennsylvania; and Fran Smith of Marshalltown, Iowa.

In addition to the 100th edition of the Women's Championships, Northrock Lanes also hosted the USBC Queens from May 15-21. The Queens, a major championship on the Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour, welcomed nearly 200 of the top female bowlers from around the world to compete for the coveted tiara awarded to the winner.

Ukraine's Dasha Kovalova, who was a standout at nearby Wichita State, won the event for her first career PWBA Tour title, defeating Malaysia's Sin Li Jane in the title match, 226-216. The stepladder finals were broadcast live on CBS Sports Network.

The Women's Championships will head to Las Vegas' South Point Bowling Plaza for the 2020 event. The 60-lane facility also hosted the tournament in 2016.



FLORIDA'S BILL ROGERS WINS PBA BOWLING CHALLENGE "PBA PLAY-OFFS" SPECIAL EVENT

For his win, Rogers receives a PBA bowling pin autographed by Prather plus 6,000 PBA Bowling Challenge gold pins from Concrete Software.

PBA REGIONAL UPDATE: VENTURA WINS NINTH REGIONAL TITLE IN NEW HYDE PARK

Sammy Ventura of Norwich, N.Y., a two-time East Region PBA50 Player of the Year, compiled a 5-3 match play record and a 15-game total of 3,598 pins to win the PBA50 Ned Micelli Memorial at Herrill Lanes in New Hyde Park, N.Y., Saturday by a mere six pins over reigning PBA50 East Region Player of the Year Rick Graham of Lancaster, Pa.

Ventura qualified second, 11 pins behind Graham, but quickly assumed the lead, which he held throughout

the first seven games of the round robin match play finals. Ventura held a 69-pin lead over Graham going into the final match, but Graham started with four strikes and found himself in position to win before he suffered an open frame in the seventh frame. After Graham failed to strike in the ninth, Ventura had the title clinched despite an open in the final frame.

Ventura won \$1,500 along with his ninth overall PBA Regional title while Graham earned \$800.

The new PBA East Region event was organized by PBA member Glenn Smith to honor the late Ned Micelli, a long-time fellow competitor. Micelli, who died in July 2017, competed well into his 80s throughout the Long Island area.







Just Paying Attention

Presented for your review on this Fourth of July week are three stories of perseverance, each unique in their own way.

Sarge. That's what some call Corey Kistner, after PBA Tour players learned he served as a Marine Corps sergeant from 1997 to 2002. He rose to the rank of Tournament Director for both PBA and PBA50 Tours from 2003 through 2011.

With Sarge, as PBA players can tell you, there was also a simmering level of determination, no matter the task at hand. One of his latest tasks has all that determination and them some. Kistner has submitted a video to be considered for one of the eight bowlers in Bowlero's upcoming Elite Series (BES) tournament in September.

As you can see here on his YouTube video (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=BmSVadfrtID>), Kistner draws inspiration from his Marine past, including his time as a helicopter technician in the 15th Marine Expeditionary Unit deployed to Afghanistan as part of "Operation Enduring Freedom" after the September 11th attacks.

Kistner was a driving force in getting a 9/11 Memorial built in his current home of Decatur, Illinois. The inspiration as the video explains was from the nine fellow Marines in his company that did not come home from that deployment.

Another source of pride and inspiration is wife Sheila and stepdaughter Alyssa. Sheila, her brother Randy, dad Mark, and late mom Terry bowled on the same mixed league team for many years. Sheila won the Illinois High School Association (IHSA) 1992 girls singles title.


This Roto Grip and Turbo staff member doesn't throw the ball like he used to, like the Sarge I remember who joined us for the USBC Open Championships a few years back. He too, has adopted the two-handed style, something he was "messing around with" at that time, as he first showed a few of us awhile back. Even in the very early stages of developing the technique, it was easy to see there was a lot of balance in his two-handed style. Kistner has refined it further to what we see in the video.

Entries for the September BES tourney closed June 19. For this past April's inaugural BES tournament, (where Luis Gonzales defeated Kyle Troup, winning a record \$270,000) selections were made several weeks after entries closed.

One thing that hit me immediately was the high production quality of Kistner's video. Pacing of the video segments, editing, underlying music bed, camera shots and angles resemble something you'd see on a national network broadcast. Kistner explained his video producer owns his own production company after working at WAND-TV, Decatur's NBC affiliate.

The September BES will be at Bowlero North Brunswick, formerly Brunswick Carolier, former longtime host of the U.S. Open. The television finals will air on NBC Sports Network (NBCSN) Wednesday September 11 at 6:00 pm Central.

If you know any one that has served in The Corps, as a niece and nephew of mine have, they will tell you there really isn't a former Marine, you are a Marine for life. That grit and determination remains and lives on, helping others around them. Best of luck



to Sarge on this latest quest. Semper Fi!

As a regional player, I spent years searching for that right feel, balance and timing, in the approach. Once it's there, it almost made an audible sound. When it did, the game got fun again.



Challenge events are open to PBA members without a PBA title or non-members who have never won a PBA event. Hines earned \$1,500 for the win, but since he is not a PBA member, he does not receive credit for a PBA regional title.

Up Your Average

The Delete Button

I shouldn't say 'never' rerack a spare, but I'm not one to let the shoulds run my life, so... when you are practicing, NEVER RERACK A SPARE. After all, it's not a delete button. Giving yourself permission, however tacit, to blow off the spare will carry over to competition. You'll throw at a real one indifferently and waste that precious double you just worked so hard to get. Spares deserve as much attention, if not more, than all those strike efforts.

It could be that you throw to get lined up rather

than to make the spare. That's okay. Even if you don't hit the standing pins, the subliminal message of not sweeping it off gives it credence.

Because of this habit of sweeping spares, our spare shooting inventory is often not as vast as the strike inventory. Spares are what keep you in the money. In fact, sometimes your spare ball should be the only one you take in the building.

It is certainly true that when you shoot the 6/10 with a full rack, the consequences of your failure are not great. After all, if you miss, you get another chance. However, when that

6/10 is standing there by itself, sometimes the pins look like toothpicks! The only way to get comfortable with the angle and your timing is to repeat shots until you feel competent. Then they'll look like barrels instead of toothpicks.

After shooting the 6/10 with a full rack, you'll probably have some pins on the left side of the lane - a perfect chance to pick off a left side spare. When you shoot the 4/7 with a full rack, a right side spare will most likely remain. Choose what you shoot to challenge yourself. Practice sessions like this will help alleviate that sinking feeling in the pit of your stomach when you leave a difficult spare or even those single pin "clusters" that bother you.

You know how many times you've missed the cut by a spare or lost a game because of count on a split. You'll never

and knocked down seven pins on his fill ball to lock up the title.

"The hope was to not throw a split," Butturff said with a grin, "and fortunately I didn't."

The win was Butturff's third in 2019. He previously won the PBA Oklahoma Open and his first major in the USBC Masters. He also has three second-place finishes.

In Sunday's first four-player stepladder finals match, Tackett started with seven strikes in denying Anthony Lavery-Spahr of Pasadena, Texas, his chance for a first PBA Tour title, 279-204. In the semifinal match, Butturff turned the tables on Tackett, starting with six strikes while Tackett lost his strike carry. Despite leaving a 4-7-10 split in the seventh frame and failing to convert, Butturff cruised to a 235-185 win, ending Tackett's hopes for his first title of 2019.

After a break in the schedule for three days of PBA League Elias Cup competition at Bay-side Bowl in Portland, Maine, July 16-18, and the Barbasol PBA Tour Finals presented by Red Rock Casino Resort & Spa July 20-21 in Las Vegas, the PBA Summer Tour and USBC Cup points competition resumes July 25-28 in Houston, Texas when Copperfield Bowl will host the Storm PBA/PWBA Striking Against Breast Cancer Mixed Doubles. Tackett and Liz Johnson of Palatine, Illinois, are defending champions.

The PBA League will be covered in its entirety over three nights on FOX Sports' FS1 network. The Barbasol PBA Tour Finals will air live on CBS Sports Network in five separate

North Carolina bowler joins elite club at 2019 USBC Open Championships

Lee Vanderhoef of Fuquay-Varina, North Carolina, may not compete as much as he used to, but he showed he still can throw clutch shots when the situation requires it.

The 40-year-old right-hander rolled 12 consecutive strikes during his team event June 20 at the South Point Bowling Plaza in Las Vegas to become the third bowler in United States Bowling Congress Open Championships history to record three perfect games on the tournament lanes.

He achieved the feat for the first time in 2009, also in Las Vegas, and added his name to the short list of bowlers with multiple 300s during the 2013 tournament in Reno, Nevada.

His perfect game this year was the 12th of the 2019 event and earns him a place in the record book alongside Craig Szplett of Beecher, Illinois (1996, 2005, 2013), and David Cirigliano of Phoenix (1998, 2007, 2016).

"I was probably more nervous in the last frame today than I have been in a long time, if not ever, until I threw the Brooklyn," Vanderhoef said.

"The pressure was off after that, but it was important to me to follow it with a good shot. After getting a break like that, it meant a lot to throw the last one well."

Vanderhoef's team set included games of 180 and 201 for a 681 series, and he returned to the lanes June 21 for sets of 652 in singles and 575 in doubles for a 1,908 all-events total. This year marked his 16th USBC Open Championships appearance.

Entering his 2019 Open Championships campaign, Vanderhoef was one of 32 bowlers in 116 years of tournament history with multiple 300s.

Three other bowlers also made runs at perfection this week at the Open Championships but fell short in the final frame.

Steve Lopez, a 48-year-old right-hander and six-time tournament participant from Sahuarita, Arizona, tossed 11 consecutive strikes during singles late June 22, before his final shot crept high, leaving the 3 and 6 pins for the fifth 298 of the year.

He finished with a 689 singles set and 1,802 all-events total.

David Sparr of Watkinsville, Georgia, re-emerged at the Open Championships and had a memorable return to the biggest stage in bowling, which included a run at the 13th perfect game of the year June 24.

Sparr competed at the tournament in 1998 and 1999, before life took him and his family in a different direction.

He finished his week in Las Vegas with games of 202, 214 and 299 for a 715 singles series. The near-perfect effort was the seventh 299 of the year at the Open Championships.

He added 571 in team and 562 in doubles for a 1,848 all-events total.

Tim Tripp of Castle Rock, Colorado, continued his personal dominance of the singles event at the Open Championships, starting with 11 consecutive strikes June 25, before a 6-8 split ended his run at 300.

The left-hander finished with games of 298, 170 and 233 for a 701 singles set and 1,781 all-events total.

In Tripp's nine Open Championships appearances, his four highest sets (724, 701, 700, 682) all have come during singles.

Two bowlers roll perfect games at 2019 Bowlers Journal Championships

Andrew Suscreba of Clifton, New Jersey, and Daniel Deno of Owensboro, Kentucky, became the eighth and ninth bowlers, respectively, to shoot 300 at the 2019 Bowlers Journal Championships presented by USBC.

Suscreba just celebrated his 27th birthday and made the week memorable with games of 267, 300 and 143 for a 710 series at the South Point Bowling Center on June 21.

The right-hander, who finished sixth at the 2018 USBC Masters in Syracuse, New York, was entered in singles and also bowled doubles with two partners. He shot 1,343 with Mark Curtis of Torrance, California, and 1,290 with Erick Buckley of Fresno, California.

Deno, a 26-year-old right-hander, rolled games of 230, 300 and 234 for a 764 series June 22, and his effort ties him for eighth place in the Open Singles standings. AJ Rice of Columbus, Georgia, leads with



BVL Exhibit Runs Through Labor Day at Hall/Museum






