

Liz Kuhlkin Earns her First Major Title at U.S. Women's Open

ORLANDO, Fla. – The road to the U.S. Women's Open finals is long and tedious, especially if you start back in the pack.

Liz Kuhlkin of Schenectady, New York, in 64th place after the opening round of the U.S. Women's Open, completed an epic climb Saturday with a 218-196 victory over top-seed Stefanie Johnson of McKinney, Texas, to capture her first major title.

Kuhlkin used two big games in the final round of qualifying to make the first cut, and a 299 game in the final round of match play to make the finals,

televised live on CBS Sports Network.

As the fifth seed, Kuhlkin had to win three matches for the chance to bowl Johnson for the title. She then would enter the final frame with the chance to close out Johnson, and finished the climb with a strike and a 9-count.

The emotion of knowing what she had accomplished was evident.

"This is the U.S. Women's Open, the top event of every sport," Kuhlkin said. "It's the biggest major of the year. A lot of prestigious players have

Castillo, Lavoie Team Up to Win PBA FireLake Grand Casino Hotel & Resort Southwest Doubles

Shawnee, Okla., (June 26, 2018) – Dino Castillo of Highland Village, Texas, and Canadian Francois Lavoie, now living in Wichita, Kan., teamed up to win the PBA FireLake Grand Casino Hotel & Resort Southwest Doubles at FireLake Bowling Center Sunday, defeating the Houston area team of D.J. Archer and Shawn Maldonado, 436-390, in the title match.

For Castillo, the win was his seventh in PBA Regional competition while Lavoie's number of PBA Regional titles is up to six following his second victory at FireLake. Each collected \$2,000 for the win.

The winning team had a long road to the finals after qualifying in seventh position

while Archer and Maldonado earned byes to the Round of Four by leading the eight-game qualifying round. Castillo and Lavoie defeated another Canadian, Mitch Hupe', and his amateur partner, Marc Heninger from Tangonoxie, Kan., 2-0, in the best-of-three-game Round of 8. In the Round of 6, Castillo and Lavoie out-battled the Oklahoma team of James Cantere from Norman and Jeff Hatt of Midwest City in three games to win, 2-1. Castillo and Lavoie then overwhelmed the No. 2 qualifiers from Amarillo, Texas, Mason Edmondson, and Tyler Albracht, 2-0, in the semi-final round while Archer and Maldonado eliminated a pair of two-handed players, Malaysia's

Hats off to Mr. Hafner who put on a display in qualifying on Saturday when he wasn't feeling his ummm... best...yes that's it...he wasn't looking good, but his fastball was locked in.

As I was sitting there watching the finals on Sunday, I thought I would take an informal poll to see what the average age of the guests were that made the finals. The average age was 36, with a high of 54 and a low of 20.

That was higher than I was expecting to see because of the young talent that exists today, but as I've said before, there isn't much young talent in Texas. The talent continues to get older and the cupboard is pretty empty when it comes to the next generation of great bowlers.

A place where there is new talent making a break-through is on the PWBA tour, as evidence by Liz Kuhlkin's vic-

tory over Stefanie Johnson to win the U.S. Women's Open on Saturday. Kuhlkin is 24 years old and if you look at most of the other young talent, they are for the most part under the age of 28.

At the Open this week, 11 of the 24 finalists are foreign born players, and almost all are under 28 years old.

The future for the women's game is strong, both here in the US and internationally.

 One thing I don't quite understand about the PWBA tour however, is the new ELITE field for the final three standard tournaments of the year.

The ladies earned points based on finish position in the first eight tournaments of the year. The top 24 point getters automatically cash in those last three tournaments. The rest of

the 32 person field is made up of ladies who qualify through the pre-tournament qualifier. So, regardless of how many ladies show up for the PTQ, only eight will make it into the tournament proper. The only positive is that the entry for the PTQ is \$100, instead of the normal \$300 (\$400 for non-members).

This feels like a huge turn-off to increasing entries and building upon the momentum that the PWBA tour has.

I asked **Jason Thomas** of the PWBA tour what were the driving forces in this decision, here is his response:

"Entries for the final three standard events for the first

three seasons were down from the rest of the events. So, we wanted to find a way to reduce the entry fee costs for some of the players (Elite events save a player not in the top 24 \$900 in entry fees for those three events), guarantee a larger group of players a weekly check and stimulate more guest entries with a low-entry fee option. Another consideration was creating a format that would allow a Saturday TV finals without moving up the start of the tournament by a day, which the Elite Tour format does."

I don't know the details on how many fewer entries there

Coté Captures Go Bowling PWBA Challenge Title

ORLANDO, Fla. – Bryanna Coté nudged her way into the four-player field for the Go Bowling Professional Women's Bowling Association Challenge, taking the final spot with a fourth-place finish at last week's PWBA event.

She then proceeded to take full advantage of the opportunity in the special event.

Coté defeated Josie Barnes, 248-233, in the title match of the Go Bowling PWBA Challenge to pocket the \$5,000 top prize. Go Bowling, the consum-

er-facing brand of the bowling industry, sponsored the special competition for PWBA Tour competitors. The finalists were determined based on PWBA points earned in the first six PWBA standard events.

Coté, of Red Rock, Arizona, edged Colombia's Maria Jose Rodriguez by 50 points to make the Go Bowling PWBA Challenge semifinals. Coté knew heading into last week's PWBA Greater Harrisburg Open that she needed several pieces to fall into place if she was going to make the field.

"I knew it was close, that I needed to make the show or the top five and other things had to happen (at the PWBA Greater Harrisburg Open)," Coté said. "It was close – I thought I was in, but I wasn't celebrating until I saw it was official. I was excited. We all want to be a part of the special events."

The Go Bowling PWBA Challenge title match also went down to the wire. Coté needed to strike on her fill ball to close out Barnes, of Nashville, Tennessee, and did exactly that.

"Since my TV shows have not gone the way I've wanted them to go, and though this was more of a fun event, there's still that pressure of performing," Coté said. "I told myself I want to bowl the best two, hopefully, games that I

can. I did and was fortunate to come out on top.

"That final against Josie was high scoring; you can never count her out. You just have to keep doing what she's doing and try to do a little better."

As the fourth-seed for the event, Coté first had to get past top-seed Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, New York, in the semifinals. Coté took the match, 222-187, while the third-seeded Barnes took a 228-171 victory over No. 2 seed Shannon O'Keefe of O'Fallon, Illinois.

The semifinals and finals of the Go Bowling PWBA Challenge were live streamed on Xtra Frame, the online bowling channel of the Professional



Unique Format in Place as FloBowling Makes Its Debut with PBA Xtra Frame Parkside Lanes Open Last Weekend

“Bonus pins” in qualifying, different lane conditions each round to enhance Parkside’s challenge

AURORA, Ill. – When Ryan Ciminelli of Clarence, N.Y., returned to Parkside Lanes Saturday to defend the Professional Bowlers Association’s Xtra Frame Parkside Lanes Open title he won in 2016, he and the rest of the all-star field found a few changes are in place, including the debut of PBA Xtra Frame on FloBowling.com, and a new format that will bring a new dimension to the qualifying portion of the event.

Organized by PBA Tour champion Sean Rash, an Aurora area resident, the Parkside Lanes Open will present unique challenges to a world-class field of proven PBA champions as well as a talented field of challengers who are seeking their first PBA title, and it’ll be an event that is part festival as well as part tournament.

With FloBowling’s PBA Xtra Frame cameras and announcers following the action from start to finish, the event will feature a new dimension to the qualifying rounds Saturday and Sunday, as well as Monday’s semifinal round. For starters each of those rounds will be contested on a different lane condition. Ciminelli conquered the lane condition challenge on two different patterns when he won in 2016, but this year players will have to demon-

strate their skills on three widely different oil patterns: PBA Chameleon 39 on Saturday, Don Carter 39 on Sunday and PBA Bear 39 on Monday (designations refer to 39-foot applications of oil).

New this year also is a “bonus pin” scoring system during qualifying that will put added emphasis on performing well every game. The new system will work like this: with four players on each pair of lanes, the player who bowls the highest score each game will earn an additional 30 bonus pins. The second highest player will earn 20 bonus pins, and the third-high player will get an extra 10 pins. The lowest scoring player on the pair won’t get any bonus pins. In case of ties, bonus pins will be divided.

Qualifying in PBA competition normally involves actual pin count only, but the new wrinkle is something Rash introduced based on his years of experience in PBA competition.

“It’s a combination of events we’ve played in the past,” Rash said, “but it’s the first time is PBA history this has been used in PBA Tour competition. It’s something I wanted to try so we’ll see how it goes.

“The whole objective to is make every shot matter,” he added. “Too often in qualifying, players get a little compla-

cent so now the guys are going to have to pay attention, myself included. The bonus pins can make a huge difference.”

Therefore, Ciminelli will try to overcome the lane condition challenges as well as take advantage of the new bonus pin system as he tries to repeat against a world-class field of bowling talent that features several 2018 PBA titlists including DHC PBA Japan Invitational winner Dom Barrett of England; PBA Tournament of Champions winner Matt O’Grady of Rahway, N.J.; PBA Xtra Frame Greater Jonesboro Open and USBC Masters champ Andrew Anderson of Holly, Mich.; Mark Roth-Marshall Holman PBA Doubles co-winner Bill O’Neill of Langhorne, Pa., and PBA Xtra Frame Wilmington Open winner Cristian Azcona of Puerto Rico.

Other PBA Tour title holders entered include Ciminelli, Canada’s Graham Fach, Yorkville’s Steve Jaros, Tommy Jones, Marshall Kent, Rhino Page, Anthony Pepe, Rash, Ronnie Russell, Matt Sanders, Ryan Shafer, Anthony Simonsen, Tom Smallwood, Jason Sterner, EJ Tackett, England’s Richie Teece, Kyle Troup and Cameron Weier.







USBC Coaching to hold 14 Bronze Certification Conferences on Aug. 11-12

ARLINGTON, Texas – To provide hundreds of aspiring coaches the opportunity to reach the next level of certification, the United States Bowling Congress Coaching Certification and Development team will hold 14 USBC Bronze coaching conferences on one weekend in August.

The National Bronze Coaching Certification Weekend is set for Aug. 11-12, when USBC will provide coaching certification classes in 14 cities across the United States. Classes for each of the two-day conferences are expected to run from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m. each day.

The USBC Bronze certification class provides intermediate-level training designed to increase coaching skills and professionalism. coaches who have completed the online USBC Coaching Level I Certification and is recommended for high school coaches.

“We want Level I coaches to have the opportunity to continue their coaching progression,” USBC Director of Coaching Development Stephen Padilla said. “By having these conferences throughout the country on a weekend, we hope to reach the many coaches who might not have the time or resources to travel to a USBC Bronze conference.”

Coaches are required to attend the entire conference and pass an online test to receive USBC Bronze certification. In addition to having completed Level I certification, participants must be at least 16 years old; anyone 18 or older must go through the Registered Volunteer Program's background check before they can receive access to the certification test.

USBC Coaching is offering a

discount to those who register early for the National Bronze Coaching Certification Weekend. The fee for those who sign up by July 2 is \$245, a savings of \$50 off the regular cost. The entry deadline is July 30 and those who register after that date will have to pay \$325 to enter.

Each conference will have a maximum class of 25, so early registration is strongly encouraged.







USBC Masters heads to Las Vegas in 2019

ARLINGTON, Texas – The Gold Coast Bowling Center in Las Vegas will be the site of the 2019 United States Bowling Congress Masters, a major event on the Go Bowling Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) Tour and a World Bowling event.

The 2019 USBC Masters will start March 26, and the event's stepladder finals will be shown in primetime on FOX Sports, the PBA's television partner starting in 2019. FS1 will televise the stepladder live on Monday, April 1, at 9 p.m. Eastern.

The Masters also will be the final event for PBA Tour players to earn points into the new PBA Playoffs system, which will be introduced in 2019.

The Gold Coast Bowling Center, a 70-lane facility, served as host of the 2018 USBC Senior Queens in March.

With the 2019 USBC Open Championships starting March

9 at the South Point Bowling Plaza, competitors will be able to bowl in two events in one trip to Las Vegas in 2019.

Many bowlers took the opportunity to compete in the Open Championships this year while in Syracuse for the USBC Masters, including stepladder finalists Alex Hoskins and Steve Kloempken. Marshall Kent found a team using the sub board at the Open Championships and bowled doubles with Matt Gasn, who also competed at the Masters.

At the 2019 Masters, competitors will bowl 15 games of qualifying over three days (five games each day) and total pinfall will determine the 63 players who will join defending champion Andrew Anderson in the match-play bracket.

Match play, consisting of three-game total-pinfall matches, will take place until the five players for the championship stepladder are determined.

2019 PWBA Tour to Kick off in Cleveland, Features Stops in Arizona and North Carolina

ARLINGTON, Texas – The Professional Women's Bowling Association (PWBA) will kick off its 2019 tour schedule with four stops in the Midwest that will include the season's first major.

Once again, the stepladder finals of all four PWBA Tour majors plus three elite-field events will be televised from the host centers on CBS Sports Network in 2019. The PWBA will provide live coverage of all preliminary rounds and the stepladder finals of six standard events via livestream.

"We're excited to have the schedule in place for next season and appreciate the support we have received from proprietors throughout the country," PWBA Director of Operations Tennelle Milligan said. "It seems like we just started this journey, so it's hard to believe 2019 will be the PWBA Tour's fifth season. We look forward to taking the PWBA Tour to fans in areas we have yet to visit and can't wait to return to the places where fans have shown their support during the first four seasons."

The 2019 season will start April 25 when the PWBA Tour makes its first trip to Cleveland for the Greater Cleveland Open at Yorktown Lanes. The tour then will hit familiar stops for the PWBA Twin Cities Open (May 2-4) at Cedarvale Lanes in Eagan, Minnesota, and the PWBA Lincoln Open (May 9-11) at Sun Valley Lanes in Lincoln, Nebraska.

The United States Bowling

Congress Queens, set for May 15-21 at Northrock Lanes in Wichita, Kansas, will be the first major of the 2019 PWBA Tour season. The 2019 USBC Queens will take place in the same venue that will serve as host of the 2019 USBC Women's Championships, which celebrates its 100th edition in 2019.

The West swing of the 2019 PWBA Tour schedule starts in California with the PWBA Sonoma County Open (May 30-June 1) in Rohnert Park, California, before the PWBA Tour makes its first trip to Arizona for the PWBA Tucson Open (June 6-8) at Tucson's Golden Pin Lanes. For the third consecutive season, the PWBA Fountain Valley Open (June 13-15) will be held in Fountain Valley, California.

The U.S. Women's Open is set for June 16-23 in 2019. Texas Station in Las Vegas will be the host center of the season's second major.

The final leg of the 2019 PWBA Tour will feature three elite-field events before the season concludes with two majors. Elite-field events, which are being introduced this season, feature 32-player fields – the top 24 players on the PWBA points list after eight events plus eight players who earn their way into the field through an on-site eight-game qualifier each week.

The PWBA returns for a second time to Silver Lanes in East Hartford, Connecticut, on Aug. 1-3 for the PWBA East

Buffaloe Lanes North, in Raleigh, North Carolina, will serve as host center for the PWBA Players Championship, set for Aug. 21-25.

The site of the 2019 PWBA Tour Championship, which brings together the top 16 players from the season, will be announced later.

just like I did here. I think it’s beneficial.”

In the semifinal match, Kuhlkin and Erin McCarthy of Omaha, Nebraska, each had open frames in two of their first three frames. Kuhlkin, however, strung together strikes in frames 4-8 to take a 213-186 victory.

Kuhlkin produced her biggest game of the day against No. 3 seed Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, New York. Kuhlkin struck on her first five shots and nine times overall in a 246-172 victory.

In the opening match, Kuhlkin faced Shannon O’Keefe of O’Fallon, Illinois, who was seeking her third consecutive major title. O’Keefe opened with a trio of spares while Kuhlkin struck on five of her first six shots. A missed 10-pin in the seventh frame by O’Keefe allowed Kuhlkin to take a 21-pin lead, and she went on to a 235-214 victory.

Competition at the 2018 U.S. Women’s Open consisted of three days of eight-game qualifying rounds before the field was cut to the top 36 players for an eight-game cashers’ round. The 32-game pinfall totals determined the 24 bowlers for round-robin match play. The 56-game totals, including 30 bonus pins for each win in match play, will decide the five players for the stepladder finals.

Those Pesky Single Pin "Clusters" Part II

This month we'll continue talking about single pin spares, what causes them, and how to not leave them so often.

6 Pin

A 6 pin is the result of a high hit. The ball hits too much of the 3, sending it straight back rather than side-ways into the 6. An adjustment that causes the ball to hit less of the 3 pin is appropriate – more speed, less hand, change equipment, move inside. You have lots of choices!

7 Pin

There are often two ways to leave some single pin spares. A "stone" 7 (one of those "the breeze should have knocked it over" shots), is caused by a high hit. The headpin goes straight back and its impact with the 2 causes that pin to rebound off the sidewall to take the 4 but not the 7.

A "slow" 7, like the slow 4 we talked about last month, is a light hit. The headpin is hit too thinly, sending it in front of the 2. The 2 falls backward, nicking the right edge of the 4, which is sent weakly into the channel rather than into the 7.

8 Pin

Leaving an 8 is commonly the result of the 5 either flying over the 8 or being driven straight back. In other words, the ball hits the pocket but

doesn't deflect properly. The shot is too strong for those poor weak pins! You can change the angle of entry into the pocket by changing your rotation, going to a less aggressive coverstock, speeding up, or moving inside. Again, lots of choices.

(There is also a slow 8. It's usually accompanied by a very late falling 10 pin (almost an 8/10). This ball has hit weakly, deflecting too much. Make your get-the-ball-into-the-pocket-higher moves and you'll be fine).

The 9 Pin

Since the ball is supposed to take the 9 pin and it didn't, where did the ball go? Unless you're throwing a very light ball, it missed left. This can be a frequent occurrence with the strong equipment used in today's game. The ball drives too strongly through the pocket, leaving the deck so far left of the 9, it misses the pin entirely. You could move left, change hand positions, reduce your speed, or change to a less aggressive orb.

The 10 Pin

You must know which kind of 10 pin you are leaving in order to make the proper adjustment. A weak 10 occurs because you hit too much of the 3 pin and too little of the headpin, causing the 6 to go in front of the 10. The 6 lands

in the channel without enough oomph to rebound into the 10. The 6 can also hit the kickback and go behind the 10, leaving it standing. Either way is a weak 10. Adjustments are myriad - a slight move to the right, moving back a few inches, or changing equipment are just a few.

A ringing 10 is still weak since, if we define weak as getting too much of the 3 pin, that's exactly what happened here. It just LOOKS like the 6 goes around the 10 faster rather than lazily into the channel. You could move back on the approach. If you need to change your angle, do the usual things: move inside,

change equipment, etc.


Ringing 10s are part of the game. Paying attention to the scoring pace is very important here. You don't want to move off a 10 pin and give up the pocket. Walter Ray has more money and more titles than anyone on the planet because of all the 10 pins he leaves. He NEVER gives up the pocket. Neither should you.

Well, there you have the whys of those single pin clusters. Standing pins are your friend. They clearly tell you

what move to make to be sure they're not standing up there next time!



Open Championships Weekly Glance

(For June 20 - June 26, 2018)

Pennsylvania bowler celebrates two milestones at USBC Open Championships

The 2018 United States Bowling Congress Open Championships has been filled with memorable performances and special milestones, and Joseph Pursel Jr. of Hellertown, Pennsylvania, experienced both June 24 at the Oncenter Convention Center in Syracuse, New York.

The 82-year-old right-hander was recognized and celebrated on the tournament lanes as he joined two of bowling's most elite clubs - the 60-Year Club and 100,000-Pin Club - at the USBC Open Championships.

Pursel, who started his tournament career at the 1959 event in St. Louis and has competed every year since, was presented with a plaque, chevron and engraved money clip for becoming the 24th bowler in history to compete in the tournament 60 times.

He and his father, Joseph Pursel Sr. (55 years) are one of three father-son duos in the 50-Year club, joining Frank "Chick" Carr (62) and Thomas Carr (57) and Earl Ebers Jr. (58) and Earl Ebers Sr. (50).

Two games into Pursel's milestone appearance this week, he again had the spotlight to himself as he added his name to the short list of bowlers who have topped

100,000 pins at the Open Championships. He entered the 2018 event needing just 294 pins to reach the plateau, and he got there with a ringing 10 pin to start the final frame of his second game.

He finished the special day with games of 129, 179 and 129 for a 437 series.

"This is the culmination of my career," said Pursel, who immediately was presented with the crystal bowling pin, given to each member of the 100,000-Pin Club. "I was kind of anxious and kind of nervous. This was the first time I had my wife, two sons, granddaughter and daughter-in-law all here. That means a lot."

Pursel is the 22nd bowler in history, and second this year, to eclipse the 100,000-pin mark. USBC Hall of Famer Gordy Baer of Tinley Park, Illinois, added his name to the list in April.



Pursel also is the second bowler in 2018 to make his 60th march to the lanes. Donald Granberry Jr. of St. Louis achieved the feat earlier this month, while Paul Gustke of Sarasota, Florida, is scheduled to join the club June 26 at 7 p.m. Eastern.

The participation record of 71 years on the championship lanes is shared by USBC Hall of Famers Bill Doehrman and Joe Norris, along with Sylvester Thiel, while USBC Hall of Famer Bill Lillard Sr. tops the all-time pinfall list with 124,087.

Pursel added sets of 448 in doubles and 409 in singles June 25 for a 1,294 all-events total. He left the 2018 tournament with a career pinfall of 101,000.

It's not just those annual events, its year-round thoughtfulness and giving. Carolyn and Del, Donna Conners, and Adam Barta are doing simply what they do very, very well. Pay it forward.

It was a much different era with different media images of ourselves. But it was perhaps the last sports film of its kind, perhaps leading the way for one of the most memorable sports-themed feature films, produced by a cinematic icon. This bowling film was cheesy by today's standards, as it turned out, maybe a little too cheesy for that era, too.

There were a few other films that followed the formula, putting sports in a background, possibly starting with 'Caddyshack', released the year after this film in 1980. A classic comedy with a cult following even today, the film put golf in the background while following the exploits of all sorts of golf course personalities.

Our little corner of the world had to suffer through one more movie with an all-star cast. 1994's 'Greedy' starring Kirk Douglas, Michael J. Fox, Nancy Travis, was a Lowell Ganz/Babaloo Mandel screenplay that never quite got off the ground, despite a memorable scene with Randy Pedersen.

Bowling is lucky enough to have two movies to be considered cult classics. Peter and Bobby Farrelly gave us 'Kingpin' in 1996. 'The Big Lebowski' from Joel and Ethan Coen followed in 1998, spawning the annual Lebowski festival, complete with screen-

ings of the film and a bowling party with attendees dressed as film characters.

Released in April 1979, the feature film 'Dreamer' didn't do that well at the box office, but it wasn't for a lack of trying. Tim Matheson was coming off a role in a surprise hit film he is still associated with to this day, 'Animal House'. Susan Blakely was three years removed from a highly-rated, critically-acclaimed television mini-series, 'Rich Man, Poor Man.'

Very recognizable supporting characters actors for the era appeared. Seen by millions in numerous films and television shows, Dreamer's manager and pro shop owner Harry White, played by Jack Warden, was nominated for two Academy Awards. Bowling center owner George Taylor, played by Richard B. Shull, was a regular on 'The Rockford Files' and 'Love American Style'. Head waitress Angie, played by Barbara

Sherman's performance helped One & Done into fifth place in Team All-Events with a 9,932 total. He was followed by Fujita (2,041), Greg Young (1,981), Hahlen (1,896) and Kamron Doyle (1,890). Red Carpet Lanes of Greenfield, Wisconsin, leads with 10,252.

Stuart was a regular on 'Gomer Pyle, USMC', 'The Dick Van Dyke Show', 'Batman', and a handful of television westerns in the early 1960's.

The soundtrack for 'Dreamer' was written by an Academy Award winning composer Bill Conti, who also wrote music for the 'Rocky' film series. He later won an Academy Award for Best Original Score in 'The Right Stuff'.

Oh, yeah, there were some other recognizable people in the film, too. In its climatic scene, Dreamer Nuttingham takes on the best bowler of his day, Johnny Watkin, played by none other than Dick Weber. Calling the action for the match on the telecast, as you might expect, were none other than Chris Schenkel and Nelson Burton, Jr.

The PBA was a television ratings hit, the roles had actors familiar to many viewers. Everything seemed to be in place. So what was the difference between these two films? What was needed was a little different angle of the story, a hurdle for sports-themed films for decades.

'Dreamer' was more about bowling on the PBA tour, and not enough about the relationships between the characters, especially Harold 'Dreamer' Nuttingham and his girlfriend,

Karen Lee.

Based out of the St. Louis suburb of Alton, Illinois, Dreamer bowls out of Bowl Haven Lanes, which still open today.

Robert Redford got a hold of a different angle on a screenplay, based on a book by Robert Malamud, 'The Natural.' It wasn't as much about baseball as it was about Roy Hobbs' journey overcoming adversity to become a vision of his childhood hero, Ted Williams, inspiring the line at the end of that film, quoting Williams' quest to walk down the street and have people say, "there goes the greatest hitter who ever lived."

If you've even watched a clip of the 1979 PBA Firestone Tournament of Champions and wondered why Tim Matheson was seated next to Dick Weber, this is your answer. 'Dreamer' was released the weekend after George Pappas' wire-to-wire win.

And so, easily the longest clip I've ever offered, this week's JPA Lost Classic, is the nearly straight-to-video feature film, the bowling movie that could have been, 'Dreamer', is found here

Jose was accurate with a bowling ball, often converting splits and making most of his spare attempts. He also enjoyed restoring vintage Army jeeps, coin collecting and working in the yard with his large, extended family.

AMERICANS BRING HOME THE WEBER CUP

A four-man team of American PBA stars (Chris Barnes, Tommy Jones, Anthony Simonsen and Kyle Troup) defeated a team of our European PBA stars (Dom Barrett, Stuart Williams, Martin Larsen and Jesper Svensson), 19-10, to win the Weber Cup for the first time in six years. Troup was named MVP for the multi-event, Ryder Cup-style competition. At the conclusion of the invitational event, organizers said the 2019 Weber Cup (named in honor of PBA legend Dick Weber) will be held in Las Vegas, the first time it has ever been held in the United States. Dates and location are pending.

AUSTRALIAN NETWORK TELEVISION PROFILES JASON BELMONTE

Bowling has never been a "headline" sport in Australia, but Jason Belmonte is slowly but steadily changing that. Most recently, according to Australia's Lynne Clay, the Australia Broadcast Company - Australia's "ABC-TV" - has recently aired a segment on its popular 7.30 Report profiling the world's top-ranked bowler.

The 34-year-old two-handed star from Orange in New South

Wales has achieved unprecedented success with dozens of titles in national and international tournaments, re-writing the sport's record books, becoming the first player ever to win the USBC Masters on four occasions, and sweeping the PBA's two most defining statistical categories for 2017 - official earnings and scoring average, which included a record 229.39 scoring pace for the full season.

Clay noted the 7.30 Report is billed as providing the best analysis of local, national and international events from an Australian perspective and is streamed live on iView. The program is watched by
