

USA Bowling National Championships Set to Start in Dallas

ARLINGTON, Texas – The top youth teams in the country will seek national titles when the USA Bowling Championships presented by Sixlets starts Wednesday in the Dallas area.

The national championships event, in its third year, brings together 30 winners of regional tournaments. The 16 teams in the 15-and-under division and 14 teams in the 12-and-under division will try to advance through a double-elimination bracket for a spot in the finals, which will be televised on CBS Sports Network.

Competition starts Wednesday at 6 p.m. Eastern at AMF Garland Lanes with the qualifying round, which will consist of 15 matches, using a modified Baker format, to determine the seeding for the double-elimination match-play bracket.

Match play will start Thursday at 1:30 p.m. Eastern at USA Bowl and will consist of best-of-three Baker matches. BowlTV will provide livestream coverage of qualifying and match play.

The finals of both the U15 and U12 divisions will be held at the International Training and Research Center in Arling-

ton on July 21. The single-elimination best-of-five Baker matches will be taped for broadcast on CBS Sports Network.

In the U15 division, the 2017 champion, 3 Rights Make a Left, will return three of its four players. Spencer Robarge, the 2015 Junior Gold U12 boys champion, Brandon Bonta and Silas Limes will be joined by Piper Reams to represent the Midwest Region. Last year, the team dropped the opening game of the title match before winning the next three to take the title.

Amanda Naujokas, the 2015 Junior Gold U12 girls champion who was a member of the U15 team that lost to 3 Rights Make a Left last year, will be part of the South Region team #Lucky7 this time around. The team includes Alex Horton, the runner-up in the U12 boys division at the 2014 Junior Gold



event, and 2017 Junior Gold U12 boys champion Brandon Bohn.

The Indiana All Stars U15 team, the Ohio Valley Region champs, has two members who won the first USA Bowling National Championships U12 title in 2016. Reece Dunbar and Kyle Toyias were on the Indiana All Stars U12 team that won the title in Indianapolis.

Karina Capron, the 2017

PBA50 Tour Resumes with PBA50 River City Extreme Open July 17-20 in Minnesota

MONTICELLO, Minn. (July 12, 2018) – The 2018 PBA50 Tour started the season in the East, then ventured to the West, and now heads down the homestretch in the Midwest beginning with the PBA50 River City Extreme Open presented by Ebonite at River City Extreme July 17-20 in Monticello, Minn.

With five PBA50 events remaining on the 2018 schedule, 2017 PBA Rookie of the Year and Suncoast Senior U.S. Open winner Michael Haugen Jr. of Phoenix leads the PBA50 Player of the Year points race with a commanding 2,400 point lead over PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Oxford, Fla., in second. Hall of Famer Ron Mohr of Las Vegas, who has virtually wrapped up his third consecutive PBA60 Player of the Year honor, is in third place nearly 2,800 points behind.

Haugen, a five-time PBA Tour winner, won the PBA50 Johnny Petraglia BVL Open in May for his second career PBA50 Tour title. He also has four other top-10 finishes including two third-place finishes, one of which came in



the USBC Senior Masters, in addition to a sixth and ninth-place finish.

Williams has three runner-up finishes this season, and Mohr won the PBA50 Northern California Classic for his 10th career title while also recording third, fifth and sixth-place finishes so far in 2018.

Following the River City Extreme Open, the PBA50 Tour heads to Indiana for the first of three tournaments in the Hoosier State beginning with the PBA50 South Shore Open presented by Hammer July 23-26 at Olympia Lanes in Hammond followed by the PBA50 Security Federal Savings Bank Championship presented by Track July 28-31 at Dave Small's Heritage Lanes in

2018 Junior Gold Championships Kicks Off this Week in Dallas

ARLINGTON, Texas – Four champions will return to defend their titles while another will step up a division when the 2018 Junior Gold Championships presented by the Brands of Ebonite International kicks off in Dallas on Saturday, July 14, with registration and the trade show at Fair Park.

The Junior Gold Championships features the top youth bowlers in the country seeking national titles in 20-and-under, 15-and-under and 12-and-under divisions for both boys and girls, a total of six divisions. Spots on Junior Team USA and part of a tournament record \$350,000 scholarship fund also will be up for grabs.

The city of Dallas and the Dallas Sports Commission are hosts for this year's Junior Gold Championships, which will have a record field of approximately 3,900 bowlers for its 21st edition.

The Opening Ceremony will be at American Airlines Center on Sunday, July 15, with Light Balance, the light-up dance team that was a 2017 finalist on the television show America's Got Talent, headlining the event. The festivities will start at 3 p.m. (Central) with Ebonite International Game Day at Victory Plaza, located outside the American Airlines Center, with doors opening at 5:30 p.m. for the

Opening Ceremony. The event is not open to the public.

The first of four days of qualifying gets underway Monday, July 16, at eight bowling centers in the Dallas area.

Allie Leiendecker of Wooster, Ohio, will be one of four champions from 2017

seeking to defend their title in the same division. Leiendecker won the U20 girls title last year in Cleveland, her first time in the division.

Solomon Salama, a two-hander from Beverly Hills, California, who rolled a 299

Last summer, I wrote about the former Academy Lanes, a small center up for sale. The 12-laner in Brownwood, Texas, 130 miles southwest of Fort Worth on U.S. 377, was about to go under a little renovation. It was actually a secret renovation, inside and outside, taking part over three days, included as the pilot episode of an unnamed yet-to-air reality television show.

Twelve months later, the center, renamed Rex's Texas Lanes is having a boom in business in the Texas bible-belt, according to co-owner Lee Baird. However, even with the increased exposure, renovation, and increased lineage, the center remains on the market.

Baird has a hand in several other local businesses, including a ranch and said he and his brother Ray, who co-own the center, are "not getting any younger."

The experts, hired by the television show producers, suggested selling ice cream, which proved to be extremely popular (Baird chose Bluebell, what else). However, they also cut the seating from 76 to 30, without taking league play into consideration. Baird increased back to a higher number.

'Save It or Sell It', seen on both A & E and the History Channel, explores challenges of holding on to a long-time family business. As the name implies, a group of experts will see if a family business can be sold or saved. For now, the Bairds still own it, but it can be yours, if the price is right.

If you want to look for yourself, or know a realtor personally who can crunch the numbers (like Publisher Genie), it's listed here (www.homeslandcountrypropertyforsale.com/commercial-properties/properties/bowling-center-in-central-texas-for-sale).

They had the lead in the 2014 USBC Open Championships team event for ten weeks, since April 3. Members of the Motion Plus Lanes team of Greenfield, Wisconsin thought they had finally scaled the mountain. Until this point, it proved to be slippery, jagged, and uneven at best, but now with a record score of 3,561, did the journey for that elusive USBC eagle seem over?

TBN and JPA regular readers are well aware of what happened next. On the fateful Monday night of June 22, five Texas and Oklahoma-based

bowlers, Anthony, Jimmy, Xeno, Ted and Pete, bowling as Artistic Expressions 1, literally slowed down Facebook.

To take the lead, as my 2010 team and our 2006 companion team came close to doing those years, I figure four of the five bowlers need career days. It had been done before, as Motion Plus Lanes did, individual series were 762, 756, 717, 698, and 628. This group shot 3,499 in 2013 good for a fifth.

Few teams in recent memory had all five bowlers firing on all cylinders, but this motley crew sponsored by Debbie and Leisha Murr, did just that. They not only took the lead, but blew the doors and part of the roof off the National Bowling Stadium with a 3,720 score.

Talk to anyone following the live scoring that night. I remember following three simultaneous Facebook threads. What was unfolding on our laptops and smartphones was one of those nights where you remember where you were and what you were doing.

It wasn't just about taking the lead, it was by how much. You see an occasional 3,700



2018 Bowlers Journal Championships in Syracuse Ends in Dramatic Fashion



SYRACUSE, N.Y. - The benefit of bowling on the last day of a tournament that spans many months is not having to endure the wait to see if your score will hold up.

Mitch Hupé of Towanda, Kansas, only had hours to wait to see if he was going to be the Open Singles champion at the 2018 Bowlers Journal Championships presented by the United States Bowling Congress. He bowled early on the final day of competition and rolled games of 257, 257 and 279 for a 793 series.

The longtime member of Team Canada and a 2015 Intercollegiate Team Championships titlist with Wichita State topped the longstanding mark of 791, set by Jason Bowles of Strongsville, Ohio, on March 24, the second day of the 107-day event.

Hupé will receive \$8,000 for the victory, and he headlines a talented group of champions this year at AMF Strike 'N Spare Lanes, just a short distance from the Oncenter Convention Center, which

hosted the USBC Open Championships from March 24-July 8.

The 23-year-old right-hander, who also is a Regular Team champion at the Open Championships (2016), claimed an additional \$1,000 for topping the Dual Entry standings, too. The special no-cost feature at the Bowlers Journal

Championships includes all competitors who choose to use their three-game totals for singles and doubles at the same time.

"I wanted to put up a good score but wasn't necessarily chasing the lead," said Hupé, whose set helped him to a third-place finish in Open Doubles with Kevin Bienko (653) with a 1,446 total. "I started the last game with a spare, so I had a long way to go. Luckily, I got the first strike in the 10th. Our main focus coming out here is performing well at the



is competing in an international event and will not attend Junior Gold this year.

The eight centers that will host qualifying rounds are AMF DeSoto, AMF Garland, AMF Richardson, AMF Spare-time in Arlington, Brunswick Westcreek and Cityview Lanes in Fort Worth, Forum Bowling Lanes in Grand Prairie, and USA Bowl in Dallas.

Starting Monday, competitors in all divisions will bowl 16 qualifying games over four days (four games each day) before the field is cut. Bowlers in the U20 and U15 divisions then will bowl an additional five games before a second cut is made, and those remaining will bowl an additional five games to determine the 16 bowlers for match play. In the U12 division, after the initial cut, competitors will bowl an additional four games before the field is cut to the top eight for match play.

Match play for each division will be a double-elimination

bracket to determine the finalists for the televised finals.

New in 2018, the Junior Gold Championships will have a stepladder finals for each division. The two finalists in the match-play bracket will bowl to determine the No. 1 and No. 2 seeds for the three-person stepladder final, and the winner of the Elimination Bracket will be the No. 3 seed for the televised finals.

The stepladder finals will be one-game matches, with the No. 2 and No. 3 seeds facing off in the opening match and the winner of the match advancing to face the No. 1 seed for the title.

All finals will be held at the International Training and Research Center (ITRC) in Arlington on Saturday, July 21, and will be taped for broadcast on CBS Sports Network. The U12 finals will air July 24, the U15 finals will be televised July 31 and the U20 finals will air Aug. 7, with all shows starting at 8 p.m. Eastern.

BowlTV will provide livestream coverage of the Junior Gold Championships, starting with a live show on Saturday from the trade show at Fair Park and live coverage from the Opening Ceremony at American Airlines Center. BowlTV will livestream the advancement round in each division, until the finalists for television are determined.

In addition to the Junior Gold Championships, two additional major youth events will take place in the Dallas area.

The USA Bowling National Championships presented by

five-person team series in league, or perhaps as I did at the 2017 Texas USBC State Tournament, a 3,813, but at the Open Championships? Not a chance. Yet, there it was, the 159-pin margin unfolding faster than a pesky armadillo scurrying home before a Texas sunrise. And yet, this group from Wisconsin was foiled, yet again.

The late Oakland Raiders owner Al Davis once said in an NFL Films piece, lamenting about his Raiders coming up short year after year in the playoffs in the 1970's, that the winner gets to write the story of the triumph because that's

how things are in our culture.

As you saw in last week's July 12 TBN, they won team all-events eagle. But now, the group, now known as Red Carpet Lanes, gets to write the story. Having bowled against three of the five members, Dave Beres, Ken Duffield, and Chad Mass in PBA Midwest Regional events over the years, yes indeed, it will be a great story to read.

Then there is someone else with whom I've bowled league who is enjoying the OC conclusion. Tracy Anderson of the Chicagoland suburb of Prospect Heights, Illinois, joined The Bowlers ER Tres in the Standard Division (team average 901-1,045) team win. Their 2,843 total was bowled May 29.

But here's something that's happened only once before. Anderson became the second female eagle winner, behind USBC Hall of Famer Wendy Macpherson. She won the Regular Singles crown in the 2006 Corpus Christi OC's final days.

The feeling being at the top of this leaderboard was a little different than the others.

"I was shocked, honestly. There was some hesitation in my own mind because I know what it takes to be at the top of the leaderboard for the women's division, then my mind went there. When it actually sank in what had really just happened, the level of happiness and pride was overwhelming. And I'm still stunned to this day," Anderson

said.

Anderson is no stranger to leading and winning a USBC title. Her teams won the 2011 USBC Women's Championships Diamond Team and 2013 WC Scratch Team titles, so there's a little practice in watching the leaderboard after getting home from the tournament. In her case, she used the same strategy for the five weeks following this year's OC trip and didn't watch at all.

"We had several friends who reached out with countdowns, so I let my curiosity be fulfilled by their excitement," Anderson added.

Last Monday, Anderson and the other team members received phone calls from longtime OC Tournament Director Duane Hagen. Yes, THAT phone call.

"I saw a different phone number and wondered who it could have been. Then, it clicked and flew across the room to turn down a confer-

ence call that was on my work phone. I could barely get any words out," Anderson explained

What's more remarkable is that this title almost didn't happen. I'll have more on Anderson's remarkable story next week.

Junior Gold U12 girls champion, will lead Upper Midwest Region U15 representative, Dodger Bowl, out of Nebraska.

Diego Jara and Nihal Mareedu will seek a second consecutive title in the U12 division as members of the Pacific Southwest Region champion. The duo helped the Cloverleaf Strikers to a 3-1 victory in the best-of-five modified Baker finals last year.

Open Championships, and we could have done better there, but I'm very happy to win the Bowlers Journal."

The Open Doubles title at the 2018 Bowlers Journal Championships went to a pair of New Jersey bowlers, Jim Hosier of Wayne, New Jersey, and Matthew O'Grady, Rahway, New Jersey, who combined for a 1,452 total during the first

week of June.

O'Grady, who made headlines earlier in the year when he won the 2018 Professional Bowlers Association Tournament of Champions for his first PBA Tour title, led the doubles effort at AMF Strike 'N Spare Lanes with a 782 series, while Hosier added a 670 set.

The victory earned the pair \$8,000 to share and kept the momentum going for O'Grady, a 31-year-old right-hander and former Junior Team USA member. His 782 set also tied him for fourth place in Open Singles and third place in the Dual Entry standings.

"I've known Jim for a good 15 years, and I've always looked up to him as a tremendous bowler," O'Grady said. "He's always been an awesome competitor, so I know anytime I team with him, we have a pretty good chance at doing well because he's always bringing the fire. You have a little less pressure to perform when you know your doubles partner is really, really good. It's definitely been a good year so far, and I hope to keep it going."

Warren Eales, a 59-year-old right-hander from Chandler, Arizona, also rode some momentum into the Salt City, following his win at the season-opening 2018 PBA50 Lucas Magazine Classic in New Port Richey, Florida, and he managed to claim a pair of senior titles at the 2018 Bowlers Journal Championships.

Eales rolled games of 269, 259 and 253 for a 781 series, which earned him the top spot in Senior Singles, and he teamed with Sam Ventura, a 59-year-old right-hander from Norwich, New York, to take the Senior Doubles title, also with a 1,452 total. Ventura contributed a 671 series on games of 212, 235 and 224.

"It has been quite a spring," said Eales, who will take home \$3,000 for the singles win and will share \$1,600 with Ventura for the doubles victory. "With the quality of players who bowl the Bowlers Journal, to have the chance to win two titles is a great accomplishment, and I'm happy to have held on. I've been fortunate to have three enormous accomplishments now in a very short period of time, so it shows that perseverance really pays off."

Additional individual winners at the 2018 Bowlers Journal Championships included USBC Hall of Famer Gus Yannaras of Waukesha, Wisconsin, in Super Senior Singles with a 735 set and Isaac Wake of Versailles, Indiana, in the 209 & Under Handicap Singles event with a 683 performance.

Wake also topped the standings in Classified All-Events this year at the Open Championships with a 1,754 nine-game total.

The top prize in both Super Senior Singles and 209 & Under Handicap Singles is \$2,000.


