

## Pajak Wins First Title at PWBA Greater Detroit Open

GREEN BAY, Wis. – When Daria Pajak considered leaving her home in Poland to pursue a college education and bowling career in the United States, she needed an extra push. Her father was the person to do it. Now, Pajak can call herself a Professional Women's Bowling Association champion after defeating Verity Crawley, her

friend and Webber International teammate, 224-203, to win the 2017 PWBA Greater Detroit Open.

After a spare in the first frame, Pajak rattled off three consecutive strikes before leaving a 3-4-6-7 split in the fifth. The 24-year-old right-

hander converted the split and rode the momentum to her first career PWBA title.

It was a title that may never have happened had it not been for her father, and Pajak dedicated the victory to her dad.

"My dad is a great man and has been my idol," Pajak said. "He's an athlete. He used to be a bodybuilder, and he has that athlete's mind, where he knows what it takes to win. He's always been pushing me outside of my comfort zone."

"Coming to the (United) States was something I always wanted, but if he didn't push me here, I don't think I would've ever made the decision. Father's Day back home was a few days ago (the show was taped June 25), and he said the TV show was his present. He doesn't need anything else."

Pajak advanced to the title match by defeating 2012 United States Bowling Queens champi-

## Team USA Takes Silver Medal in Women's Doubles at World Games

ARLINGTON, Texas – Team USA's Kelly Kulick of Union, New Jersey, and Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, New York, claimed the silver medal in women's doubles at the World Games in Wroclaw, Poland, on Sunday, after falling to Clara Guerrero and Rocio Restrepo of Colombia in the title match.

Guerrero had a 279 game while Restrepo added 210 to give Colombia a 49-pin lead after the opening game of the two-game, total pins title match. The Colombian team completed the match with a 433-424 victory in Game 2 to win, 922-874, as Guerrero had a 227 game and Restrepo had 206.

Kulick rolled games of 224

and 223, while McEwan posted games of 226 and 201.

"Anytime you walk away with a medal in a world competition, it's always excellent," said Kulick, who won silver in women's singles on Friday. "We grinded it out through qualifying, then bowled really well through the matches. We got to the finals, and then Clara and Rocio bowled phenomenal."

Mexico's Tannya Lopez and Sandra Gongora, who lost to Team USA in the semifinals, took the bronze medal with a 965-835 victory over Venezuela's Patricia de Faria and Karen Marcano.

# Just Paying Attention

You know the name Tom Brady well, especially when friend-of-the-column Sandi Charles likes to let us all know how her New England Patriots are doing, and especially when they play in February. But he is just the latest outstanding quarterback in the nearly sixty years of the franchise.

The first well-known QB of the then Boston Patriots, Babe Parilli, passed away last weekend at the age of 87. In my youth football player days in Western Pennsylvania, another hotbed of high school football, our coaches had him address our team. Although he had just taken a new coaching job in the new World Football League in 1974 after coaching Steeler quarterbacks the year before, he lived about five miles away, not far from us, and not far from where he became a name in local high school football.

How much of a name? There was another local quarterback who in his youth certainly looked up to Parilli. He recently told the Beaver County Times he would walk by an Army-Navy store in his native Beaver Falls and stare at a football helmet with Parilli's name. This quarterback knew of Parilli before adding another

hero, Johnny Unitas.

The day he first shook hands with Unitas before one particular game in January 1969, he was in the process of setting the pro football and pop culture world on its ear with his looks and attitude. He made a brash prediction, guaranteeing his team from his lesser league would defeat the better team from a better league. Then, 'Joey U.', that kid from Beaver Falls, Joe Namath and his New York Jets engineered the Super Bowl III upset of the heavily-favored Baltimore Colts 16-7, still regarded today as one of the biggest upsets in sports history.

Ironically, Parilli was there. The final two years of his seventeen-year pro career, 1968 and 1969, were spent backing up Namath at quarterback and was also known for being one of the best place-kick holders in football, having to deal with the swirling winds of old Shea Stadium. He was also one of twenty players who played in each of the ten seasons of the American Football League. His 31 touchdown passes in 1964 stood as a Pats record until Brady broke it in 2007.

But that wasn't why Parilli was going to address us. His

story highlighted work, work, and more work at your position was what we heard. Coaches would use his example of how he played under a younger, lesser-known Coach Bear Bryant at Kentucky, becoming the fourth overall draft pick in the 1952 NFL Draft by the Green Bay Packers several years before a man named Lombardi arrived.

Back in that era, it was Parilli who coaches constantly reminded us as the example. Football was not the juggernaut it is has become today and why you may not have heard of him. But those of us from 'The Valley', Beaver Valley, know well of Parilli and the work he put into whatever he did and the fruit it bore.

From the July 14 edition of Brownwoodnews.com in Brownwood, Texas, about 170 miles southwest of the Metroplex, comes a story about a recent bowling center renovation. OK, so what's the big deal? This renovation of the former Academy Lanes took place courtesy of a new television show. According to the story, confidentiality agreements about the name of the show and even the network it is to be shown cannot be revealed at this time.

Pictures accompanying the story can be found here about the new Rex's Texas Lanes (<http://www.brownwoodnews.com/bowling-alley-gets-new-look-new-name-tv-show/>), shows 1980's Brunswick ball return hoods and original automatic scoring. The side walls have new décor and eye-catching masking units. Everything in the settee and concourse is brand new, including tables in between facing couches on each of the six pairs of lanes. A new mural painted by a local artist adorns an outside wall.

Previous pictures showing the 'before' on Google Maps show a white tile settee and free standing tables with four chairs at each. The settee floor was slightly below approach level. The new floor has been raised to be flush with the approach.

What's even more amazing is how fast the remodel took place. According to Rex's Texas Lanes co-owner Lee Baird, it was a whirlwind 48 hours.

"We started pulling things out at 8:00pm on Tuesday July 12, then had it all put back together and were open at 8:00pm Thursday," Baird told me in an interview last week.

If you look at the before and after pictures, the work they did is stunning. Baird said everything was extremely well coordinated from the design team to the contractors who put it all together. It reminded me of the remodels done on Ty Pennington's old ABC-TV home-makeover show, 'Extreme Makeover: Home Edition.' After bulldozing the previous structure, those remodels took nearly a week done by a crew of dozens of local construction

personnel working around the clock, while the host family took a vacation, often to Disney World, or some other warm locale.

The new show focuses on small family-owned longtime businesses who may be looking to sell, or close its doors. Producers saw an online listing of the Brownwood center and contacted Baird in early June about being featured in what will become the pilot episode of this show. He added there are two consultants working with the show, a broker to help sell the business, and a specialist in keeping small businesses running.

Included in the remodel is an ice cream bar, featuring the legendary Brenham, Texas-based Bluebell ice cream. Baird said ice cream sales, along with open play thus far are doing very well, much better

than anyone expected.

Once the show name, network, and air times are disclosed, we'll pass that along here in JPA. One teaser he did mention was a surprise ending to this inaugural episode, but I will also follow the confidentiality agreement and not disclose what he told me (You really have to watch and find out).

With many smaller centers potentially facing similar circumstances, this is quite the way to spark new interest. Thanks to Lee Baird for his time and his TBN subscription, because it sounded pretty busy in the background with pins falling and spoons being dropped into glass bowls in front of happy customers.



# Korea's Cho Captures Men's Singles Title at World Games

ARLINGTON, Texas – Youngseon Cho of Korea topped Team USA's Tommy Jones of Simpsonville, South Carolina, in the quarterfinals then went on to capture the men's singles title Saturday at the 2017 World Games in Wroclaw, Poland.

Cho, the fifth seed in the match-play bracket after the morning qualifying session, beat Venezuela's Ildemaro Ruiz, 2-0 (226-182, 257-253) in the title match at Sky Bowling.

Germany earned its second medal of the event as Tobias Bording defeated Italy's Salvatore Polizzotto in the bronze-medal match, 201-177 and 191-187. Laura Beuthner won the women's singles title on Friday.

Cho opened match play with a victory over Venezuela's Massimiliano Fridegotto, 2-0 (255-192, 195-158) to advance against Jones in the quarterfinals. Jones, who qualified

13th for the match-play bracket, beat Singapore's Qi En Kuek, winning 267-226 and 279-268, in the Round of 16.

Against Cho, Jones won the opening game, 247-244, followed by a 215-215 tie in Game 2 that required a one-ball rolloff. Each struck on their first ball, then Jones had a 9-count on the second ball while Cho struck to win the game. Cho then took Game 3, 259-156, to advance.

Cho then would knock out Polizzotto, dropping the first game, 206-192, before winning the next two games, 253-175 and 279-165, to reach the title match.

Denmark's Thomas Larsen and Mexico's Ricardo Lecuona led the morning qualifying session, each posting a 1,420 pinfall total. Larsen would fall to Polizzotto in the quarterfinals while Lecuona lost in the Round of 16. Team USA's

Marshall Kent of Yakima, Washington, had a slow start in qualifying and did not make the match-play bracket.

The bowling competition continues Sunday, when Team USA's Kelly Kulick of Union, New Jersey, who won the silver medal in women's singles on Friday, teams with Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, New York, for women's doubles. Jones and Kent will return to the lanes on Monday for men's doubles, the final event for bowling.

The World Games, which have been held every four years since 1981, is an international multi-sport event for sports, disciplines or events within a sport that are not contested in the Olympic Games.

Organized and governed by the International World Games Association (IWGA), under the patronage of the International Olympic Committee (IOC), the World Games will showcase 31 sports and approximately 3,500 athletes and officials from more than 100 countries during the 11 days of competition that started July 21.


**Jonnie Wall**

title was her first in a world competition.

"I have multiple bronze and silver, but I always fell short (of a gold medal)," Restrepo said. "This is an amazing feeling to be able to do it with Clara; she showed me the way."

Guerrero said the World Games was the one title missing from her international resume and she was happy to win it with her friend.

"Rocio bowled amazing all day long, all week long," Guerrero said. "We worked as a team perfectly today, and that's what you need to win with such an amazing level (of competition)."

In doubles, the 16 teams were placed in four-team groups for round-robin competition. The top two teams in each group advanced to the quarterfinals.

Team USA opened group play with a 940-831 victory over Japan, but then lost to Finland 903-820. Needing a victory in its final group match, Team USA lost its first game to Denmark, 439-423, but responded with a 513-431 game, as Kulick had a 268 and McEwan added 245, to take the match, 936-870, to reach the quarterfinals.

Facing a tough team from Germany, which had women's singles gold medalist Laura Beuthner, Kulick and McEwan posted back-to-back 500 games on their way to a 1,057-853 victory. Each had a 278 in Game 1 to take a 556-416 lead, then took Game 2, 501-437, to reach the semifinals.

Team USA would shoot another 500 game, as McEwan had a 290 and Kulick added 214, and the American team rolled past Mexico, 903-812, to reach the title match.

"They bowled phenomenal today," Team USA head coach Rod Ross said of the Team USA duo. "They had a couple of sets that were just phenomenal to watch. Clara was throwing it great; that's what a gold-medal match should be."

Team USA's Tommy Jones of Simpsonville, South Carolina, and Marshall Kent of Yakima, Washington, will compete in men's doubles on Monday, the final event of the bowling competition.

# Canada Wins Men's Doubles Title as Bowling Competition Ends at World Games

ARLINGTON, Texas – Canada's Francois Lavoie and Dan MacLelland captured the men's doubles title on Monday as the bowling competition at the World Games in Wroclaw, Poland came to a close.

The Canadian duo took down Venezuela's Mas-similiano Fridegotto and Ildemaro Ruiz, 972-935, in the title match. Lavoie rolled games of 209 and 279, while MacLelland went 268 and 216 in the final. Ruiz led Venezuela with games of 259 and 298, while Fridegotto added 190 and 188.

Hong Kong's Siu Hong Wu and Michael Mak, who eliminated Team USA's Tommy Jones of Simpsonville, South Carolina, and Marshall Kent of Yakima, Washington, in the quarterfinals, claimed the bronze medal with a 1,003-948 victory over Mexico's Ricardo Lecuona and Arturo Quintero.

Lavoie, the 2016 U.S. Open champion, also teamed with MacLelland to capture the men's doubles title at the 2015 Pan American Games, and said a World Games title ranks among his top accomplishments.

"It's a different atmosphere, it's a different feeling," Lavoie said. "There's no money in this, and we keep coming back year after year because representing our country is something extremely special, something we both cherish."

For the doubles competition, the 16 teams were placed in four-team groups for round-robin play. Each match in group play was two games, with total pinfall determining the match winner. The top two teams in each group advanced to the quarterfinals.

In Group D, Jones and Kent topped the Chinese Taipei team of Chin-Liang Hsieh and Kun-Yi Hunk, 941-888, and then overcame a 33-pin deficit after their opening game to edge Germany's Tobias Bording and Andreas Gripp, 922-910.

In the final match of group play, Kent had a 299 game as Team USA jumped to a 139-pin lead over Colombia's Andres Gomez and Oscar Rodriguez en route to a 974-824 victory to win the group.

In the quarterfinals, Wu and Mak rolled opening games of 244 and 245, respectively, to take a 489-467 lead over Jones (243) and Kent (224). Team

USA would respond by taking Game 2, 491-482, as Kent had a 278 and Jones had 213, but it was not enough to overtake Wu (258) and Mak (225), who held on for a 972-958 victory to knock out Team USA.

"We bowled well and, sometimes, even when you bowl well, it's not enough," Kent said. "In that match, we had a couple of 7-10s (splits) in bad spots. With a format as short as this, you kind of need some things to go your way to win. Today just wasn't our day."

The World Games is an in-

ternational multi-sport competition for sports, disciplines or events within a sport that are not contested in the Olympic Games. It has been held every four years since 1981.

At this year's World Games, Team USA captured two medals. Team USA's Kelly Kulick of Union, New Jersey, took silver in women's singles and then teamed with Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, New York, to claim the silver medal in women's doubles. Kulick now has won four medals in World

# PBA50 Tour Begins Stretch Run in Indiana With the PBA50 South Shore Open July 24-27

HAMMOND, Ind. (July 19, 2017) -- After a four-week break, the 2017 PBA50 Tour season makes its stretch run with three tournaments in Indiana to close the season beginning with its traditional stop in Hammond, Ind., for the PBA50 South Shore Open presented by DV8 at Olympia Lanes July 24-27.

Heading into the South Shore Open, Brian LeClair of Delmar, N.Y., who is the season's only multiple winner with two titles, holds a healthy lead in the PBA50 Player of the Year points race over 2017 Senior U.S. Open winner Michael Haugen Jr. -- who also leads the Rookie of the Year race -- in second, and USBC Senior Masters winner Walter Ray Williams Jr. in third place.

PBA fans will be able to follow all the action streamed live on PBA's online bowling channel Xtra Frame. In addition to following the action on pba.com, Apple users will be able to use the new PBA app, available through the Apple App store, to access live scoring.

In 2016, two-time defending PBA50 Player of the Year Pete Weber defeated tournament top qualifier Lennie Boesch Jr., 241-203, in the title match to win the South Shore Open to finish the season with a record six PBA50 Tour victories that included a record string of four in a row. It was also his 99th title overall in PBA competition.

Weber, who is winless this season, is hoping to win his elusive 100th career title in Hammond. He has won 37 PBA Tour, 10 PBA50 Tour, 48 PBA regional and four PBA50 regional titles which ranks

second all-time to fellow Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. who owns 101 titles in PBA competition.

Also among the field of 90 players will be fellow Hall of Famers Tom Baker, 2017 PBA50 Players Championship winner Bryan Goebel, Amleto Monacelli and Parker Bohn III.

The South Shore Open could also play an important role in determining the top eight players from the season's points list who will have the opportunity to advance to the PBA Challenge held in conjunction with the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling IX presented by Eldorado Reno Properties this November in Reno, Nev.

South Shore Open competition begins with the first eight-game qualifying round on Tuesday, July 25 to be followed by the second eight-game round on Wednesday, July 26. Match play begins Thursday, July 27 which will determine the top five for the stepladder finals scheduled for 7 p.m. Central Time. The official practice session is scheduled for 9 a.m. -- noon on Monday, July 24 followed by pro-am squads conducted at 1, 3 and 6 p.m.

After the South Shore Open, the PBA50 Tour heads to Anderson, Ind., for the Dave Small's Championship Lanes Classic presented by Roto Grip July 29 -- Aug. 1 to be followed by the DeHayes Insurance Group Championship presented by Pro Bowl West and Ebonite in Fort Wayne, Aug. 5-8.

The season wraps up with the PBA60 Dick Weber Championship presented by Hammer, for players 60 and older, Aug. 10-12 also at Pro Bowl West in Fort Wayne.

# 2017 Bowlers Journal Championships Concludes in Las Vegas

LAS VEGAS – Craig Nidiffer of New Boston, Michigan, highlighted an exciting edition of the Bowlers Journal Championships presented by the United States Bowling Congress by rolling an 846 series on his way to the top spot in three categories.

The 71st Bowlers Journal Championships, held at the South Point Bowling Center, kicked off Feb. 17 and concluded its run alongside the USBC Open Championships on July 15.

All standings are unofficial and pending a final verification.

Nidiffer connected for 31 strikes during his winning performance June 2, which included a stretch of 23 consecutive strikes, on his way to games of 247, 300 and 299. The effort helped him into the top spot in Open Singles with the highest set at the event since the format changed back to three games in 2013.

The 32-year-old right-hander also used the record set to move into the lead in Open Doubles with Justin Neiman of Macomb, Michigan, who added games of 290, 258 and 207 for a 755 series and 1,601 doubles total.

By competing in doubles and singles at the same time, Nidiffer also earned the top spot in the Dual Entry standings, reserved for bowlers who choose to use the same three-game set for both events at once.

The top prizes in Open Singles, Open Doubles and Dual Entry for 2017 are \$10,000, \$7,500 and \$1,000, respectively.

"It was definitely a sweat in the final weeks, since it seemed like the numbers started to shoot up at the end," Nidiffer said. "I put up a big number, but no number is safe, especially with every great player in the country coming in and taking a shot. This is one of my biggest accomplishments, especially after missing in 2016 due to a wrist injury. It really shows me I can still compete at this level, and to be able to win with a buddy of mine is really a big thing. It was one of the best days of my career and definitely one I won't forget."

In Senior Singles, Pete McCordic of Katy, Texas, used a return visit to Las Vegas to shoot to the top of the standings, rolling games of 279, 290 and 243 for an 812 series July 11.

The 63-year-old right-hander already had found success at the tournament in March, rolling a perfect game at the

ing Nidiffer, McCordic and King, rolled perfect games at the Bowlers Journal in 2017.

Other top finishers in singles included Open Championships titlist Les Shirwindt of Las Vegas, who claimed the top spot in Super Senior Singles with a 695 series, and Melissa Cassidy of Jacksonville, Florida, who found her way to the top of the 209 & Under Handicap Singles standings with a 707 total.

The top prize in both Super Senior Singles and 209 & Under Handicap Singles is \$2,000.

Robert Brown of Cody, Wyoming, and Billy Langford of Lone Grove, Oklahoma, held off several close calls to finish in the lead in Senior Doubles with a 1,416 total. Langford led the effort with a 714 series, and Brown added 702 to the total.

Henry Murphy and Marlyn Bisnar of nearby Henderson, Nevada, took the top spot in Handicap Doubles with 1,343.

Senior Doubles will pay \$2,000 to the winning pair in 2017, and Handicap Doubles features a top prize of \$1,000.

Competitors at the 2017 event also had the opportunity to take home some extra prize money by entering three different jackpots – Clean Frame Jackpot, High Game Jackpot and Strike-It-Rich Jackpot. Each features a prize-fund style payout.

A total of 44 players were able to navigate three games across three different pairs without an open frame to claim a portion of the top prize in the Clean Frame Jackpot, while 13 of the 15 bowlers

Casey Shephard of Portage, Michigan, and Kyle King of Glendale, Arizona, joined Nidiffer and McCordic as the others players to record 800 series at the South Point Bowling Center in 2017, notching 827 and 805, respectively.

King finished second in Open Singles, while Shephard's only was entered in doubles for his set. Shephard held on for an eighth-place finish in Open Doubles with Andrew Klingler of Grand Rapids, Michigan (1,483).




