


Dasha Kovalova Rolls 300 Game to Win 2019 Pepsi PWBA Louisville Open

LOUISVILLE, Ky. – Dasha Kovalova of Ukraine became the fourth bowler in Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour history to roll a televised 300 game as she captured the win at the 2019 Pepsi PWBA Louisville Open on

Saturday.

Kovalova posted 12 consecutive strikes in the championship match at Executive Strike and Spare to defeat United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famer Liz Johnson of Palatine, Illinois, 300-163, to win her second career PWBA Tour title. The 24-year-old right-hander

claimed \$10,000 for the win and an additional \$10,000 for the perfect game on CBS Sports Network from Go Bowling!

"Honestly, I don't remember too much – I had tunnel vision," said Kovalova, who won the 2019 USBC Queens. "I was really nervous, but once I tripped that 4 pin (on the 10th shot) I knew I had to make a move. That's what brought me back. When I'm nervous, it's good for me to go back to basics. I made a one-and-one move, made two shots and it worked."

Kovalova rolled 19 strikes in her two wins Saturday, never missing the pocket, but her look prior to her semifinal match against Colombia's Maria José Rodriguez suggested she may be relying more on her spare shooting to advance.

A jump to the left quickly changed her path on the way to a 226-198 win against Rodri-

Bill O'Neill Wins PBA Harry O'Neale Chesapeake Open for 11th Career Title

CHESAPEAKE, Va. (Aug. 11, 2019) – Top qualifier Bill O'Neill of Langhorne, Pennsylvania, finished with four strikes to turn back a rally by AJ Chapman of Manchester,

Iowa, and win the Go Bowling! Professional Bowlers Association Tour's Harry O'Neale Chesapeake Open Sunday at AMF Western Branch.

O'Neill, who earned his 11th career PBA Tour title and second of the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour season, jumped into an early lead with five strikes to start the title match while Chapman left a 3-6-7-10 split and failed to convert in his third frame. Chapman, the No. 2 qualifier, rallied behind a string of four strikes to close his deficit to three pins, but O'Neill struck out to end Chapman's bid for his first PBA Tour title.

"Everything this week, with the urethane equipment I was

Race to 2020 PBA Playoffs Begins in January in Arlington, Texas

CHICAGO – The Professional Bowlers Association today announced its 2020 schedule of PBA Tour on FOX Sports events leading toward an expanded PBA Playoffs featuring more venues.

Five major championships, including the U.S. Open for the first time on FOX, highlight the series of 13 tournaments taking place in nine different cities from January-March in which players will earn points toward qualifying for the PBA Playoffs.

The 2020 PBA Playoffs will again feature the top 24 from the points list in an elimination bracket with all matches televised, expanding to multiple locations as the tournament progresses. As part of a PBA partnership with Bowlero bowling centers, the first round will begin April 6 in Norco, California; the Round of 16 in Westminster, Colorado, April 20-21, and the Round of 8 May 10-11, in Eules, Texas. The Playoffs will conclude with the

Just Paying Attention

It's much more common these days, but watching a big game is easier and much more comfortable from your favorite chair to super couch at home. Some wouldn't think twice about attending a major event in person. A few of our regular readers experienced that on two separate occasions in the last ten years. They attended a Super Bowl, number 45 at Jerry World in Arlington, and number 51 at NRG Stadium in Houston.

An item on many bucket lists, the Super Bowl, is truly an event with a football game attached. Even for the players, coaches, and staff on the field, it's the realization of a lifetime goal. But for fans in DFW and Houston, the game, sorry, the event as you plan out a day looks at first to be a bit daunting.

Finding and purchasing tickets, standing in line for at least an hour to go through a metal detector and possibly be patted down, concessions, and even the weather outside, like the ice storms in 2011, hours and days before the game gave fans food for thought. Is it worth it? For those leaning

toward no, watching the game, sorry, the event on television is not that much of a loss.

As recent as the early 1990's, the television screen was graphic-free most of the time, with the usual game clock display near the end of the half or fourth quarter. The score would pop up every few minutes. You'd see a fun fact every now and then, but for the most part things were quiet. Polite golf clapping was in the audio background. Announcers spoke in hushed tones. Visually, there may be five to seven minutes without a graphic, the exceptions may be the bowler's name and a plus/minus number. That was it.

As the computer age progressed and easier reproduction of digital graphics, the look of a telecast changed. Taking a cue from other sports television productions, bowling began to "look" busier. What I mean by this is not only more graphics, but also more informative graphics. Since it was easier to make them smaller and more eye-catching, putting up a frame-by-frame line score even in the early stages of a match was also easier.

Included were more stat-oriented graphics, like bowler's cash tournament percentage, match play record, career titles, tour 300 games, and hometown. Another advantage starting in the late 1980's was if a tournament was held in a center with the Brunswick BowlerVision automatic scoring system.

The software was the first to show ball position on the lane at four different distances down the lane, at 15, 30, 45 and 60 feet from the foul line. Comparison of early strikes in a match versus those later in a match allowed the announcers to illustrate points they were making.

Graphic displays as we know them today began on the now-defunct Financial News Network (FNN) /Score occasionally using the scroll at the bottom of the screen from time to time by showing game-in-progress scores during the channel's nighttime sports programming, at times using a second scroll showing stock prices and daily totals.

As sports video games began to have a look all to themselves featuring unique camera angles, Fox Television began to constantly show game scores and current situation in one corner of the screen. The habit of asking someone who had been watching for a while for those essentials began to disappear. That became less and less frequent as smart phones and their various apps became commonplace, showing even more stats than what is shown on telecasts.

What the NFL has done with the Super Bowl is the absolute envy of sports marketing.

Here's just a brief list. High definition multiple angle replays, cameras in pylons on the goal line, and the halftime show in the last ten years keep this event in the top 20 of most watched television shows ever, always with a minimum of 100 million viewers watching at least part of the telecast.

The weakest part of those telecasts was the halftime show. In the mid 1990's, dozens of other networks aired stronger programming once halftime began. The bland stadium show wasn't cutting it. The NFL knew it and so did everyone else. Puppy Bowl on the Animal Channel, Beavis and Butthead on MTV were among the most successful.

So the NFL hired MTV to produce a one of a kind, fifteen minute show from a portable stage on the field. That's what they did, even with a little mischief thrown in, ending with the infamous Justin Timberlake-Janet Jackson incident at SB38 in 2004. Now the NFL hires the band to play what's turned into a greatest hits medley.

What makes it worth a trip

to the stadium? Witnessing something you've never seen before.

The latest example was just last Saturday as Dasha Kovalova rolled the fourth PWBA TV 300 game, joining Michelle Feldman, Cara Honeychurch, and Liz Johnson, who ironically threw the last one in 2001. Seeing a TV finals in person is a thrill, but seeing something really special widens the smile even more as it is remembered and shared with others.

In my own experience, I saw the 1987 Minnesota Twins clinch a tie for their first division title in seventeen years

and saw the Cubs' Carlos Zambrano toss his 2008 no-hitter under one of the most unique set of circumstances in MLB history. Having witnessed play on the field, then later watching the game recording made these events even that much more memorable. Keep in mind, these are only two examples out of dozens of professional sports attended over the years.

Mark Williams Wins PBA60 Dick Weber Championship for First PBA60 Title

PBA Hall of Famer outlasts Rick Minier with 177-175 title match win

FORT WAYNE, Ind. (Aug. 9, 2019) – Seven-time Go Bowling! PBA Tour and three-time PBA50 Tour titlist Mark Williams defeated Rick Minier 177-175 in the title match to win the PBA60 Dick Weber Championship presented by DeHayes Insurance Group and 900 Global Friday at Pro Bowl West for his first PBA60 title.

In the final tournament of the 2019 PBA50/60 season and third event for players 60 and over, both Williams and Minier struggled in the title match with three open frames each. Minier's most costly open came in the ninth when he left a 7-10 split.

Williams, who was the top seed for the stepladder finals, was working on a double heading into the 10th frame but got a scare when he left the 2-10 split after a light hit on his first shot of the frame. The resulting eight-count turned out to be enough to win the match.

"I knew I needed eight to be safe but it turned out I was lucky to get it," the 61-year-old PBA Hall of Famer said. "I got the ball a little wide and it didn't hook back like I thought it would. Sometimes you need breaks to win and I guess that was the one I needed."

The low-scoring title match came as a surprise to Williams after a relatively high-scoring

semifinal match in which Minier, the No. 2 seed for the finals, beat No. 5 seed Hall of Famer Brian Voss 279-228.

"I think the conditions really changed and caught both of us by surprise," Williams said of the title match. "The way those guys were bowling I thought it would take 220 or 230 at least to win. I would have never thought that the (title) match would have been below 200."

The stepladder finals started with Voss, trying for his second consecutive PBA60 title after winning the David Small's JAX 60 National Championship Monday, beating No. 4 seed Jerry Sikora, coming off a third-place finish in the JAX

60 National Championship, 246-226. Voss then went on to beat Emilio Mora 246-169 in the second stepladder match to advance to the semifinal.

Mora, trying for his first "senior" title, made a remarkable run to earn the No. 3 seed for the finals posting an 11-1 record in match play.

Defending champion and Fort Wayne native Ron Mohr, who was trying for his third PBA60 title, finished sixth ending his streak of six consecutive PBA50/60 tournament top-five finishes. The four-time and reigning PBA60 Player of the Year missed the stepladder final after losing his position

2019 PABCON Youth Championships Set to Begin in Dominican Republic

ARLINGTON, Texas - When Caitlyn Johnson and her Junior Team USA teammates head to the Dominican Republic this week, she'll be a veteran and a rookie at the same time. The 20-year-old right-hander is a two-time member of Junior Team USA, a world champion and a collegiate standout, but her trip to the 2019 Pan American Bowling Confederation Youth Championships will mark her first time outside of the United States.

Johnson plans to use her experience and knowledge to serve a leadership role at Santo Domingo's Sebelen Bowling Center, while she'll rely on advice from her friends and teammates to get comfortable in the foreign bowling center and unfamiliar culture.

Competition at the 22-lane bowling center, which previously hosted the 2018 PABCON Women's Championships, will begin Monday after a formal opening ceremony Sunday night.

Bowlers from nearly a dozen countries will compete for medals in singles, doubles, trios, team, all-events and Masters competition. There will be two divisions - 21-and-under

and 16-and-under. Team USA only will compete in the U21 category.

Johnson will be joined at the 2019 PABCON Youth Championships by fellow world champions Mabel Cummins and Kamerin Peters, along with two-time Junior Team USA member Kaitlyn Eder.

"This will be my final event with Junior Team USA, and I'm really excited to go because it will be my first time out of the country," said Johnson, who is entering her senior year at Webber International University. "I'm definitely looking forward to traveling with this group of girls. I think we have a strong group with great chemistry, and we bonded so well at camp, so I know we're going to do well on the lanes."

Four Junior Team USA boys also will be making the trip to Santo Domingo, and the roster will include world champion Cortez Schenck, Team USA

member Sean Wilcox, two-time Junior Gold Championships winner Anthony Neuer and first-time Junior Team USA member Tom Hankey Jr.

Wilcox, a 20-year-old right-hander who debuted this year on both Junior Team USA and the adult version of the team, recently made his own first appearance on the international stage, collecting three medals, including doubles and team gold, at the 2019 PABCON Men's Championships in Peru.

Though he was the young newcomer looking up to his experienced teammates at that event and the mini training camp that preceded it, he'll now switch roles and use that experience to lead his Junior Team USA teammates.

It's an interesting and exciting dynamic he noticed during the recent Junior Team USA training camp at the International Training and Research

Center in Arlington.

"It's a little bit surreal, considering that a few months ago, I was the young guy at camp asking questions and hoping to learn as much as I could from some of the best bowlers in the world," Wilcox said. "At our Junior Team USA camp, the

roles kind of were reversed, and some of the guys were asking me for help or some thoughts on how I see things out on the lanes. It was pretty cool, and a little funny, at the same time."

Over the last two years, the Junior Team USA girls have enjoyed continued success and look to continue that at the upcoming PABCON Youth Championships.

In 2018, Johnson and

Cummins helped the United States to the team gold medal at the World Bowling Youth Championships in Detroit, and Cummins and Peters kicked off 2019 with a doubles gold medal at the inaugural World Bowling Junior Championships in Paris.

Schenck also claimed a gold medal at the 2018 World Youth Championships, winning the tournament-ending Masters event for the lone medal on the boys side.

"Last year, what we did at the World Championships was amazing, especially since none of us had been to that event before," said Johnson, the 2017-2018 National Collegiate Bowling Coaches Association Most Valuable Player. "To be able to have similar success this time would be the perfect way to end my time with Junior Team USA."

Along with her collegiate experience at Webber International, Johnson also has tested her skills in some Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour events.

Eder, who has represented the United States at the Lee Evans Tournament of the Americas, also has collegiate experience as a member of the Louisiana Tech bowling team, while Cummins and Peters still are in high school.

"I think I bring a lot of experience, not just with Junior Team USA, but from bowling other tournaments, like collegiate and PWBA events, and, with that, comes some knowledge," Johnson said. "I think I'll be able to help the team talk through things, help with moves and even help with the nerves. It's a big international tournament, and I know even I'll be nervous, but I'm looking forward to playing a role as a leader and veteran."

Wilcox will enter this week's event with a level of confidence he didn't yet have before taking the lanes in Peru.

It's not that he wasn't confident in his abilities, it was more about being unfamiliar with the environment and level of competition.

"Going into the PABCON Men's Championships, I knew I could do well, but there still was some self-doubt, since it was my first international event and first chance to represent Team USA," Wilcox said. "This time, I'm definitely going in more confident. I had a great experience in Peru, we did well and I learned so much - mentally, physically and just about how to react in certain situations."

Neuer also is fresh off a trip to the 2019 World Junior

Championships, where he earned a doubles silver medal with Solomon Salama, and Hankey's previous 12 months includes wins at the 2019 Intercollegiate Singles Championships and Intercollegiate Team Championships with Webber International.

"No matter what event it is, I think there's still going to be nerves," Wilcox said. "It's the same game we play at home with our friends and family. The only difference is that we get to wear a really special jersey. Picturing it that way helps me stay more relaxed."

PABCON includes competitors from North, Central and South America, along with the Caribbean.



guez, and she didn't lose any momentum against Johnson, who was looking for her 25th career PWBA Tour title.

"In practice, I really didn't have great ball reaction," Kovalova said. "And I was nervous because I saw everybody else's ball reaction. After talking with Chuck (Gardner), I decided to make a really big jump and just go softer with my hand."

Kovalova's breakout season now has her joining reigning PWBA Player of the Year Shannon O'Keefe of Shiloh, Illinois, as the only players with multiple wins in 2019.

"It's cool," Kovalova said. "Last season was good, but not that good. I didn't really expect it to be this good. I'm just happy things are going the way they are, and I'm excited for more."

Johnson, who led the event by nearly 100 pins to earn the top seed Saturday, used the same ball throughout the first two days at Executive Strike and Spare but felt she needed to make a change on the championship pair.

Although the final game didn't go as she hoped, she was happy with her overall performance for the week.

"I was feeling like the farther I had to move in, I couldn't get the angle I wanted," said Johnson, who rolled a 300 game in the championship round of the 2001 Paula Carter

Classic in Davie, Florida. "I thought the ball I started the finals with was going to give me the angle I wanted on the back part of the lane. It wasn't my best choice, but I wasn't making great shots either, so the combination of the two obviously hurt me. But, I'm incredibly proud of myself for the way I bowled this week."

Rodriguez, who was making her second consecutive championship-round appearance after a fourth-place finish at the PWBA East Hartford Open, advanced to the semi-finals by defeating Germany's Birgit Pöppler, 190-181. Pöppler also had made the show in East Hartford, Connecticut, last week, finishing as the runner-up to O'Keefe.

Rodriguez kicked off Saturday's stepladder by edging Missy Parkin of Laguna Hills, California, in a high-scoring match, 248-237. Rodriguez struck on her first delivery in the 10th frame and knocked over nine pins on her second to lock up the victory.

A total of 32 players earned spots in this week's main field. The top 24 players on the 2019 PWBA points list (through the PWBA East Hartford Open) secured automatic spots in the field, while a pre-tournament qualifier (PTQ) held Thursday at Executive Strike and Spare determined the bowlers filling the rest of the field.

Singapore's Cherie Tan was the lone player in the top 24 not to compete this week, which allowed nine bowlers to advance from the PTQ.



using, was about staying slow," O'Neill said. "Just to win an event when you're not playing your 'A' game means a lot.

"I've worked on my game a lot this year, mainly on ball speed," he continued. "I throw it too hard when I'm doing bad, but I'm bowling a lot smarter and I think the end of the game showed that."

In the midst of arguably his best season in his 14-year career, the 37-year-old O'Neill has had third, fourth and fifth place finishes in addition to winning the PBA Hall of Fame Classic to start the year and later finishing second in the inaugural PBA Playoffs.

Greg Young Jr. of Viera, Florida, a 23-year-old rookie who had not finished higher than 30th in any previous PBA Tour appearance, eliminated 10-time PBA Tour champion Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, 216-192, in the first match of the four-player stepladder finals. But Young ran into immediate trouble in the semifinal match against Chapman, leaving splits that resulted in three unconverted spares in the first five frames as Chapman coasted to a 233-160 victory.

The Harry O'Neale Chesapeake Open, named in honor of the long-time PBA South Region manager who was inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in 2016, was the third of 10 events that are part of the FloBowling PBA Summer Tour. The FloBowling PBA Summer Tour resumes Tuesday at Ten Pin Alley Family Fun Center in Wilmington, North Carolina, with an eight-game qualifying round in the PBA Wilmington Open.

The 2020 schedule and PBA Playoffs points race begins Jan. 14-19 in Arlington, Texas, at the International Bowling Campus for the PBA Hall of Fame Classic, followed by stops in Shawnee, Oklahoma, and Jonesboro, Arkansas, before a string of majors in February (PBA Tournament of Champions at historic AMF Riviera Lanes in Fairlawn, Ohio, Feb. 4-9; the PBA Players Championship at Wayne Webb's Columbus Bowl in Columbus, Ohio, Feb. 11-15; and the U.S. Open at Sun Valley Lanes in Lincoln, Nebraska, Feb. 18-23). Big February concludes with two events in Indianapolis at iconic Woodland Bowl, including the Mark Roth/Marshall Holman PBA Doubles Championship.

The Tour will then shift to the west for two of the most anticipated events of the year, beginning with the PBA World Series of Bowling XI at South Point Bowling Plaza in Las Vegas, March 6-19. WSOB XI will feature four title events including the PBA World Championship, where Australia's Jason Belmonte will defend after winning his record 11th major championship in that event in 2019. The WSOB will again feature five consecutive days of TV on FS1, including live telecasts of all four title events.

Following WSOB XI will be the fifth major of the year, the USBC Masters in Reno, Nevada, March 23-29. The Masters, airing live on FOX, will be the

final event for players to earn points toward the 24 berths in the 2020 PBA Playoffs.

Also part of the to-be-announced 2020 PBA schedule on FOX Sports' family of networks will be three special events with no PBA Playoffs implications in three different locations, including Chris Paul's annual CP3 PBA Celebrity Invitational.

The PBA League team event series will return to Bayside Bowl in Portland, Maine, July 20-23, live on FS1. PBAL details will be released soon.

All early rounds of all events on the national schedule, and international coverage of the finals, will again be livestreamed on FloBowling.com.

Full television schedule and times are also to be announced.



Sweden's Martin Larsen Struck by Car, Injured in Virginia Beach

CHESAPEAKE, Va. – PBA Tour veteran Martin Larsen of Sweden was seriously injured when he was struck by a car last Thursday in Virginia Beach, Virginia, prior to the start of the PBA Harry O'Neale Chesapeake Open. The news was first reported by FloBowling senior editor Lucas Wiseman.

Larsen, 40, was walking with fellow bowler Fran Louw of South Africa when he was struck in the middle of an intersection while attempting to cross the street. Larsen said he was thrown 40 feet down the road as a result of the accident.

Larsen told FloBowling he was hospitalized for two nights with a broken left wrist, 59 stitches in his upper left arm, a broken rib and other various injuries. Fortunately, none of the injuries were life-threatening, but his 2019 season is over.

"I feel really fortunate looking back on it," Larsen told Wiseman. "I just can't under-

stand how my legs are not broken, and how I don't have a real bad headache. It's really fortunate that I'm alive, and I'm not more hurt than I am."

Larsen said he and Louw drove to the tourist district along the beach to see the sights and enjoy dinner. When they returned to their rental car, they found it had been towed because it was illegally parked. The impound lot was just over a mile away, Larsen said, so they decided to walk to retrieve their vehicle. Along the way, Larsen said they reached an intersection where they waited "a long time" for a crossing signal.

"When the cars stopped, we thought it was our turn," Larsen said. "Stupid enough, we didn't pay attention to the lights. There was a car coming from the third lane. We didn't see it and they didn't see us."

Larsen said he was slowed down because he was carrying a case of bottled water on his shoulder, while Louw was in

front of him, which is why Louw wasn't hit.

"It's a lifetime lesson learned," Larsen said. "You have to do what you say to the kids and wait until it's your turn to cross. Next time I'm going to be a little more careful."

Larsen, who flew home to Sweden, said he was thankful most of the injuries were to his left arm and not his bowling arm.

"My right arm is totally fine except for some bruises," Larsen said. "The left wrist is going to be in a cast for five weeks. I don't know how long it takes for the rest of the body to heal up."

Larsen, long considered one of Europe's premier players, has bowled in PBA Tour competition since 2009 with a second-place finish in the 2014 PBA Scorpion Championship his best among six top-five finishes. He was the recipient of the 2012 Steve Nagy Sportsmanship Award, selected by his fellow competitors.
