

## It's All or Nothing as Tommy Jones Wins PBA BowlerStore.Com Classic

Nineteen-time PBA Tour title winner survives two gutter balls in defeating Sean Rash

COLDWATER, Ohio (Aug. 23, 2019) – For Tommy Jones of Simpsonville, South Carolina, the title match in the PBA BowlerStore.com Classic

presented by Moxy's Xtra Pair at Pla-Mor Lanes Friday was an all or nothing affair.

Jones defeated top qualifier Sean Rash of Montgomery, Illinois, 215-179, bowling a game that featured eight strikes on his first 10 shots – and gutter balls on the other two attempts. Playing a severe angle that called for throwing the ball to the edge of the gutter in order to strike, Jones twice threw the ball a bit too far.

"I believe I'm the first one to win a title with two gutter balls because I don't think anyone else was dumb enough to do it a second time," Jones said. "There's nothing you can do about it; you just move on to your next shot."

After his first error, Jones converted his spare. On the second, he got nine pins, but the two errant shots cost him

enough pins that Rash still had an outside chance to win – despite leaving a 7-10 split on a light pocket hit on his side of the match.

"Tommy bowled a good game. I bowled a good game, but I left a 7-10," Rash said, adding, "Thanks Coldwater" in a good-natured jab at the host center's reputation for being a demanding scoring environment.

"Any time you have a chance to win, it's special," Rash said, "but at the end of the day there's only one winner. I put myself in a position to win. That's all you can ask for. Hats off to Tommy."

In appraising his overall performance in winning his 19th career PBA Tour title, Jones said, "I like to throw it hard and I got to throw it hard this

Bond defeated former collegiate teammate Gazmine Mason of Cranston, Rhode Island, 441-420, in the two-game total-pinfall contest to claim the \$6,000 top prize in the made-for-TV event showcasing the top performers on the PWBA regional tour. Mason received \$4,000 for the runner-up finish.

# Just Paying Attention

Watching a TV 300 game is still a special treat for viewers. Even though they happen more often now, we get to see a player handle pressure in a different way than just winning a match. On the PWBA Tour, we've actually seen this happen five times. More on that later.

Four women are now on the list. It's a little hard to imagine, but after all the PWBA and LPBT television finals shows over the years, their first TV 300 game didn't occur until 1997. Michelle Feldman, one of the first power players on tour, rolled a title match 300 game against Carolyn Dorin-Ballard at the PWBA Southern Virginia Open. Her tenth frame was replayed on many local sports segments of your local news that night.

Cara Honeychurch rolled the second in tour history in the semifinal of the 1999 AMF Gold Cup. Although not in a title match, it was on a prior Top 25 TV Bowling Moments of mine for two reasons. It was in one of Honeychurch's first PWBA tournaments as a member, plus a finger insert popped out of the ball after the tenth strike. Anytime an insert comes out is

one thing, in the tenth frame of a competition game is another, but in the tenth frame on national television is a whole other matter. Cara calmly glued the insert back in place, wiped off excess glue, and then flushed the last two strikes for a Mastercard bonus of \$50,000.

Liz Johnson rolled the third with very unique circumstances. The PWBA Paula Carter Classic television finals were to be held the night of September 11, 2001. Needless to say, they weren't after what we saw earlier that horrific day. Since airline travel was banned for the following week, highways and interstates were much fuller of traffic, the television truck and production crew could not make it to Florida for the finals. The decision was made to proceed with the Carter Classic and the TV finals without the network production truck in the usual format. The tournament was the only actual professional sporting event to be held that week.

In a segment airing on the following tournament's telecast, Liz Johnson rolled the third PWBA TV 300 game, defeating Carolyn Dorin-Ballard (who

had five titles thus far on her way to seven in 2001) for the title and a \$50,000 bonus from Travelodge Hotels.

At the 1987 Metroplex Open at what I believe now is AMF DeSoto, the PWBA had a chance for a true rarity, two TV 300's in the same show. Both Paula Drake and Barbara Leicht both had the front eleven strikes in their matches. Broken Arrow, Oklahoma resident Drake opened the show with 299 (6-pin), Leicht closed the show with 297 (think she left the 3-6-7 on the fill ball). Drake's game was the tour TV high for nine years. Sadly, I couldn't find a show tape anywhere online. That would be a fun one to watch. I did include this in the original 1998 Top 25 list and the 2013 Bowlers Journal list.

The "other" PWBA TV 300 game I mentioned earlier? It was rolled in the 1993 LPBT National Doubles by Laurie Soto and Aleta Sill en route to their win. Oddly, it's another telecast without an online listing or much else about it to be found.

Five years ago this week in JPA, I wrote about how life had changed with two completely unrelated events occurring on consecutive days, but both marking a loss of innocence. A couple of staples of 1970's life, music on AM radio and one of the most recognizable baseball players of our time had a status change this week 30 years ago.

The last great nationally-known AM rock radio station changed formats after 29 years. A notable baseball player-turned-manager was banned for life from MLB baseball. These two events happened on back-to-back days. Rarely is music on AM radio anymore, and Pete Rose is still banned from MLB clubhouses and being on the ballot for the National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum.

Music hasn't returned to AM radio en masse. Pete Rose pretty much knows he's not appearing on the ballot anytime soon. And the PBA is seeing growth it hasn't seen since WLS-AM in Chicago switched to a talk format thirty years ago this week.

Finally this week, just about anyone who reads this column knows I am not going to let the following mention slip by, absolutely zero chance. The town of Beaver, Pennsylvania now has two native sons who are PBA champions. As you have read elsewhere in this week's TBN, besides a certain charming and delightful bowling writer, the second is a man who has been working toward that goal, probably as long as I have.

My hearty congratulations go out to fellow yinzer (Google it), former MLB pitcher John Burkett, who won the PBA

Houston Emerald Bowl Southwest Challenge (non-champions only) tourney the weekend before last. Knowing his skill and passion for the game was at least equal to his skills "in the show" for parts of fifteen MLB seasons, I am not as all surprised he won a PBA title. However, I did think he would bag one on the PBA50 Tour first, based on his performances over the last few years.

With as much work and effort I know he has put into this, especially since becoming PBA50 eligible, this will not be a one off. There will be more.

# Team USA Women Headed to Las Vegas for 2019 World Bowling Women's Championships

 LAS VEGAS - After just missing a spot in the singles semifinals at the 2019 World Bowling Women's Championships, Colombia's Maria José Rodriguez earned some redemption Sunday as she teamed with Rocio Restrepo to earn the top seed for the doubles medal round.

players fighting for the last semifinal spot, and she simply fell short. Though it was disappointing, it was motivating as well.

She also attributes her success in doubles to getting more comfortable, tweaking her strategy, throwing the ball better and having a talented teammate there with her.

"It's just a different feeling when you bowl doubles, and it helps to have that extra person behind you," said Rodriguez, a two-time winner on the Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour. "I felt a little weird yesterday, maybe even some nerves that come each time you're out there representing your country, but it didn't affect my performance. I know I just need to make better shots when it matters."

Heading into the semifinals, Rodriguez hopes to capitalize on the opportunity to claim her first gold medal at the World Championships. She previously helped Colombia to bronze medals in the five-player team event in 2011 and 2017.

"I've been close in doubles and singles a couple times and made the medal round in team

before, but to win would mean everything," Rodriguez said. "Winning the gold medal is why you bowl for your country. Obviously, it's special to win titles and have individual success, but this is a totally different atmosphere and a whole different meaning. You're not just bowling for yourself. You're bowling for your teammates and family and country and Olympic committee."

Though the members of Team USA didn't make the doubles medal round, finishing seventh (Shannon O'Keefe and Stefanie Johnson), 16th (Danielle McEwan and Missy Parkin) and 32nd (Liz Kuhlkin and Jordan Richard), they did see some overall improvement as a group and picked up valuable information about the venue and 39-foot World Bowling Seoul oil pattern.

O'Keefe posted a 1,363 block in doubles Sunday, and Johnson

The doubles semifinals and final will take place on Aug. 29 as part of an all-day TV extravaganza that also will include the medal rounds for singles and trios.

Rodriguez and Restrepo will face Hermansson and Wegner, and Son and Lee will meet Franco and Guerrero. The semifinal winners then will bowl for the gold medal, and the losers each will receive bronze medals.

The excitement will be broadcast live to a global television audience.

"Yesterday, I had an idea of what to do and bowled well, but late in the block, I knew I needed to make a change," Rodriguez said. "It was the same thing as two years ago, and I thought about it getting away again, but I was able to step it up and bowl a 240 game. Unfortunately, I just didn't get enough. Today, we were able to grind out the first two games, and then the lanes just opened up for us. We started striking, stayed loose and had a lot of fun. We tried to keep it simple and not overanalyze, and that really seemed to be the key."

Rodriguez admitted to some nerves during singles that always come when representing her country on the lanes, but it's something she expects and usually overcomes as the tournaments go on.

Entering the final frame of singles, she was one of three

# Six Down, Three to Go in FloBowling PBA Summer Tour Points Race

Non-titlist AJ Johnson moves past Kyler Sherman as PBA Tour heads to Aurora, Illinois

CHICAGO - With six tournaments in the books, the final three tournaments of the FloBowling PBA Summer Tour are set to begin Monday at Parkside Lanes in Aurora, Illinois, just a few miles from new Summer Tour points leader AJ Johnson's hometown of Oswego. It is shaping up as a dramatic finale to a competition points race loaded with incentives.

Johnson, a 26-year-old fourth-year touring player, has yet to win his first Go Bowling! PBA Tour title, but he has had an outstanding summer season, cashing in all six FloBowling PBA Summer Tour events with three top 10 finishes in overtaking previous points leader Kyle Sherman of O'Fallon, Missouri as the world's best bowlers head into the FloBowling PBA Summer Swing presented by the Brands of Ebonite International.

With 2,500 points at stake for the winners of the PBA Wolf and PBA Bear Opens in Aurora, and 5,000 points for the Illinois Open titlist to conclude the Summer Swing - plus points of descending value at stake for all other players - the top eight

positions are wide open.

To illustrate how important strong performances in each event will be coming down the home stretch, note that Tommy Jones, winner of the PBA BowlerStore.com Classic in Coldwater, Ohio, Friday, advanced from 27th place to sixth place on the Summer Tour points list.

Finishing in the top eight in points means significant rewards:

- The top five will share in a \$40,000 bonus prize fund, with \$20,000 to the points leader;

- The top eight will be invited to compete for bonus prize money in the inaugural FloBowling ATX Invite at Dart Bowl in Austin, Texas, on Sept. 21, where the winner will receive \$25,000. The FloBowling ATX Invite is the 10th and final event on the Summer Tour schedule;

- The top eight also will be invited to travel, expenses-paid, to Shanghai for the PBA's first-ever visit to China for the PBA China Tiger Cup. A \$20,000 first prize will be paid to the winner of the singles event, all players also will compete in a special team challenge against a team of Chinese players.

In addition to the summer points competition, the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour earnings race also is ongoing. The top eight money-winners for the full year will earn berths in the second PBA Clash that will take place at the Kegel Training Center in Lake Wales, Florida, in



"I think this is a very positive end to my rookie season," said Bond, who's in the running for PWBA Rookie of the Year for the 2019 season. "I felt like I had a lot of good moments this year, but there were disappointments, too. I feel like this regional win sets a nice, positive tone for the future of my career."

Bond, who teamed with Mason to help the University of Nebraska capture the 2015 National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Women's Bowling Championship, grabbed the early lead in the two-game match by taking Game 1, 247-233.

Despite the flurry of strikes in the opening game, both players made a ball change heading into the final game.

"I wasn't in love with my ball reaction," said Bond, a three-time Team USA member. "I know sometimes you can get into trouble trying to chase the perfect ball reaction, but I felt that ball was going a little too long and I had less and less room. Looking at Gazmine's ball reaction, I felt like if I could get closer to that I would like to. I made the ball change in the 10th frame and finally saw the pocket open up a little bit for me."

Bond would open two of

the first four frames in Game 2, including a missed 5 pin in the fourth frame, allowing Mason to take the overall lead. The 23-year-old right-hander responded to the slow start with three consecutive strikes starting in the fifth frame, while Mason left splits in the sixth and seventh frames she was unable to convert.

Bond sealed the victory with a strike to start her 10th frame.

"After the missed 5 pin, I was very frustrated for a couple of seconds," Bond said. "But, we were only halfway through the game. I still had five frames to go, and I knew I had to keep pushing and mentally buckle down."

Including the Go Bowling! PWBA Regional Showdown, Bond captured the top spot in each of the three PWBA regional events she was part of in the 2019 season. She was victorious at the PWBA Lincoln Regional and PWBA Sonoma County Regional to earn her place in the Regional Showdown.

Mason, who won the PWBA East Hartford Regional, advanced to the finals by defeating Elise Bolton of Merritt Island, Florida, in the knockout-style championship round, 217-214.

Mason bounced back from a pair of open frames to deliver the final six strikes to shut out Bolton. Bolton had earned her spot at the Regional Showdown

by winning the PWBA Greater Cleveland Regional in April.

Bond, the top overall seed for the event, managed to hang onto a 214-204 win against Kayla Bandy of Salisbury, Maryland, to advance to the championship round. Bond could have shut out Bandy with a strike on her fill ball, but an eight count gave Bandy a window.

Bandy, needing three strikes in the 10th to win by a pin, delivered the first strike before leaving a 10 pin on her second offering. Bandy earned the final spot in the Regional Showdown based on her accumulated prize winnings in PWBA regional competition in 2019.

Bolton and Bandy each received \$2,500 for their semifinal appearance.

The four spots for the Go Bowling! PWBA Regional Showdown were determined through four regional events throughout the 2019 PWBA Tour season - PWBA Greater Cleveland Regional, PWBA Lincoln Regional, PWBA Sonoma County Regional, PWBA East Hartford Regional.

Spots were reserved for the winners of each event (players had to be PWBA Tour members at the time of victory to be eligible), and additional spots were determined through prize winnings, which also determined the seeding for the event.

added 1,278 for a 2,641 total. Parkin (1,312) and McEwan (1,251) had 2,563 and Kuhlkin (1,254) and Richard (1,182) finished with 2,436.

"It's still just learning and building, which includes gathering information as a team about what works for each of





## TIMELESS PBA HALL OF FAMER CARMEN SALVINO TO SET PARTICIPATION RECORD - AGAIN

When 85-year-old PBA Hall of Famer Carmen Salvino throws his first ball in the Flo-Bowling PBA Summer Swing, presented by the Brands of Ebonite International, Monday at Parkside Lanes in Aurora, Illinois, he'll set the PBA record as the oldest player ever to bowl in a PBA Tour event.

He'll break his own record, set in 2018 when he competed in the PBA Tournament of Champions earlier in the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour season. A founding member of the PBA in 1958, Salvino has bowled in 732 PBA Tour events since competing in the first PBA tournament ever held – the 1959 Empire State Open at Schade's Academy in Albany, N.Y.

The Chicago native won 17 PBA Tour titles and two PBA50 Tour titles during his lengthy career. He will celebrate his 86th birthday on November 23.



## MYKEL HOLLIMAN MAINTAINS GO BOWLING! PBA TOUR ROOKIES POINTS LEAD

Despite his 129th place finish in the PBA Gene Carter's Pro Shop Classic over the weekend in Middletown, Del., Mykel Holliman of Collierville, Tenn., maintained his comfortable lead in the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour's rookie competition points race.

Holliman, a 26-year-old left-hander, didn't move from his 31st position on the overall 2019 PBA Points list. Among players on the 2019 Bowl4Life PBA Rookie Watch list, Kenneth Ryan of Farmingdale, N.J., is second in 59th place followed by Wichita's Patrick Hanrahan (62nd); Mike Coffey of Melbourne, Fla. (74th); Jake Rollins of Glen Rock, N.J. (76th) and Greg Young of Viera, Fla. (78th) on the overall 2019 PBA Tour points list. While competition points have no direct bearing on who will be selected as 2019 PBA Rookie of the Year, they will be a significant consideration when voting takes place at the end of the season.

The 2019 Harry Golden PBA Rookie of the Year will receive a \$2,500 bonus from Chuck Gardner's Bowl4Life Foundation and the foundation will donate an additional \$2,500 to a youth

bowler scholarship in the ROY's name.

## WILL THE REAL ZAC/ ZACH TACKETT PLEASE STAND UP?

Professional bowling has had a few players over the years who are sometimes mistaken for one another because they share the same name: Walter Ray (and Walter) Williams; Gary Jr. (and Gary) Faulkner; Don (and Don) Johnson among others.

The latest additions to the list arose during the PBA Harry O'Neale Chesapeake Open when Zac and Zach Tackett competed in the same event for the first time. They are not related to each other, but are similar in stature if not in other ways:

- Zac Tackett without an "h" is formally Zachery Tackett, brother of 13-time PBA Tour champion and former Player of the Year EJ Tackett. This Zac turns 23 on Aug. 27. He's 5-foot-10, weighs 165 pounds and is a right-hander player who lives in Huntington, Ind. He is a fourth-year PBA member who won his only title in a PBA Central Region "Challenge" Tournament in Monroe, Mich., in 2019. Zac's bowling hero, he noted, is "probably (Norm) Duke."

- Zach Tackett is formally Zachary Tackett who will turn 22 in December. He's 5-foot-9, weighs 165 pounds and is a left-handed two-hander who lives in Virginia Beach, Va. This Zach is a PBA rookie who bowled in the PBA Harry O'Neale Chesapeake Open, his first tournament as a member. His bowling hero is Jason Belmonte.

## BUTTURFF, PATE WIN PAN AM DOUBLES GOLD MEDAL AFTER DISQUALIFICATION

The United States duo of Jakob Butturff and Nick Pate, both PBA members, were awarded Pan American Games gold medals for men's doubles in the wake of the disqualification of Puerto Rico's Jean Francisco Perez after he tested positive for chlorthalidone, a drug on the World Anti-Doping Agency's list of banned substances.

The drug in question is a diuretic frequently used to treat high blood pressure, but one that also can serve as a masking agent, according to WADA. It has no performance-enhancing benefits. Puerto Rico's national bowling team has filed a protest, seeking to overturn the ruling. Perez and partner Cristian Azcona had posted a combined 12-game total of 5,816 pins to top Butturff and Pate's 5,545 total.

In the wake of the disqualification, in addition to awarding the gold medals to the Team USA players, Colombia's Manuel Otalora and Alfredo Quintana moved into second place and Mexico (Jose Llargo and Arturo Quintero) was awarded the bronze.

## PBA REGIONAL UPDATE: MARSALA WINS PBA50 EVENT IN BOWLING GREEN

John Marsala of St. Louis defeated Ron Profitt of Brookfield, Ohio, 256-191, to win the 22nd PBA50 Progressive/Gerdeman Insurance-Al Smith Chrysler/Dodge/Jeep Central/Midwest Classic at Al-Mar Lanes in Bowling Green, Ohio, Sunday.

The title was Marsala's first of the year in the PBA Central

Region and his second career PBA Regional title. He earned \$3,500 along with his title.

Profitt defeated Brian LeClair of Albany, N.Y., 213-202, to advance to the championship match after eliminating Brad Snell of Mount Prospect, Ill., 218-203, in the first stepladder match.

- College student Noah Gallegos of Golden, Colo., defeated fellow non-PBA member Brandon Knowles from Westminster, Colo., 239-235, to claim his first PBA win and the \$2,500 first prize in the seventh annual PBA Lakewood Storm Southwest Open, presented by New American Funding, at Holiday Lanes in Lakewood, Colo., Sunday.

Gallegos, who has completed two years of study toward a pharmacy degree at McKendree University, finished the qualifying rounds in fourth place, earning a bye until the Round of Eight in the single-elimination match play finals. The son of two-time PBA Regional champion Steve Gallegos, Noah started the best-of-three-game match play with a 2-0 win over PWBA player Jennifer Russo of Monmouth Junction, N.J., to advance to the semifinal round where he recorded a 241-235 victory over top seed Kris Koeltzow from Wheat Ridge, Colo., set up the final match. Knowles overcame former Lakewood winner Francois Lavoie of Canada, 221-215, in the other semifinal match.

# Winners Determined at Senior Championships

CINCINNATI – The 2019 United States Bowling Congress Senior Championships wrapped up last week at Western Bowl as 12 competitors in six age classifications took home titles.

More than 400 bowlers from the United States and Canada competed at the 2019 edition of the event. The tournament has two divisions, Mixed and Women, and each division has six age classifications – 50-54, 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, 70-74, 75 and above.

Competitors bowled a pair of three-game qualifying sets over two days to determine the top six players in each division for Friday's medal round. The six qualifiers in each division were determined by total pinfall, including handicap.

Pinfall was dropped for the medal round but bowlers did receive bonus pins based on their qualifying position (50 bonus pins for first, 40 pins for second, etc.).

In the Women's division, three of the top qualifiers were able to win their age group.

M. Lynn Johnson of Hueytown, Alabama, Susan Sweatman of Trout Creek, Montana, and Lucia McKnight of Columbiaville, Michigan, stayed at the top of the standings to claim titles in the 55-59, 65-69 and 70-74 age divisions, respectively.

Brenda Dokes of Pine Bluff, Arkansas, and Mary Ann Compton of Grantville, Georgia, each recorded a victory as the No. 3 qualifier, taking the top spots in 60-64 and 75 and

above, respectively.

Marion Kosiak of Goffstown, New Hampshire, posted the largest score in either division (757), including handicap and bonus pins, to win the Women's 50-54 division.

The Mixed division also saw three top qualifiers hold position in their respective age divisions.

Indianapolis' Richard Lynn (50-54), Ben Hoefs of Mobile, Alabama (70-74), and Anita Schwantes of Marshfield, Wisconsin (75 and above), maintained solid performances from qualifying into the medal round to claim victories.

Bex Talania of Winnipeg, Manitoba, was the lone champion from Canada, winning the Mixed 60-64 category.

Mike Taylor of Somerset, Kentucky, had the biggest jump of any competitor in the medal round at the 2019 USBC Senior Championships, going from fourth to first in the 55-59 division.

Michael Mai of Russell, Kansas, put together a consistent performance on his way to winning the 65-69 Mixed title.

Bowlers at the 2019 Senior Championships earned their spots in the national event

through their state or province senior tournaments.
