

## Troup Upsets Belmonte to Win PBA-WBT Storm Lucky Larsen Masters Title

Bowling Tour Storm Lucky Larsen Masters at Baltiska Bowlinghallen Sunday.

Troup, a 27-year-old 10th-year PBA member, earned his third PBA Tour title along with a \$16,500 first prize, completing a sweep of the top three positions by two-handed players. Belmonte, who led qualifying as well as the "Step Three" round leading into the stepladder finals, saw his hopes for a title repeat when he failed to convert the 2-10 split in the fourth frame and left the 2-8 in the ninth frame after rallying behind a string of four strikes.

The colorful Troup, dressed in matching jersey and slacks in Sweden's blue-and-yellow national colors, also bowled without his trademark "afro" hairdo in denying Belmonte his third title of the 2018 season.

"This is my first trip to Swe-

ARLINGTON, TX - Before Richmond Raceway's first-ever NASCAR Playoff Race Weekend, presented by Who's Your Driver, gets underway on Sept. 21-22, the top 16 players in the Professional Women's Bowling Association (PWBA) will battle in the pinnacle event of their season. The PWBA Tour Championship, the final major championship of the 2018 PWBA Tour season, returns to the historic Old Dominion Building for the second consecutive season on Sept. 17-19 as part of Richmond's Fall Playoff Race Weekend.

## Andy Patterson Wins PBA Grand Casino Resort & Hotel Southwest Invitational

Shawnee, Oklahoma, (Sept. 10, 2018) – Andy Patterson from Tyler, Texas defeated Chris Hibbitts from Keller, Texas, to win the fifth annual PBA Grand Casino Resort & Hotel Southwest Invitational at FireLake Bowling Center Sunday.

Patterson, who earned his sixth PBA Regional title by a healthy 62-pin margin, was able to string strikes while Hibbitts had trouble adjusting to the final pair's conditions, topping him, 220-158, to claim the \$4,000 winner's check.

After 12 games of qualifying, both players had long roads to the final match. Neither earned any byes in the

elimination finals as Patterson qualified 13th and Hibbitts 14th. Patterson started his road to victory by downing Houston PBA50 player David Scardaville, 2-0, in the best-of-three-game Round of 16. He then survived a close match with

# Just Paying Attention

The List. It's been an idea stuck in my head since the late 1980's. How many items? Not sure if 20 is enough, so let's try 25. The first version of my Top 25 TV Bowling Moments covered the third and fourth JPA's twenty years ago. There have been three updates since, the most recent being the one you saw in the 100th anniversary edition of Bowlers Journal International nearly six years ago.

Compared to the PBA 60th anniversary list released earlier this year, qualifications are a little different. First, an event had to be seen on national television. There have been events on regional networks and local stations that would make just about any other list, but the idea is for as many people to see moment. More people, more memories, and more stories about what they witnessed.

It doesn't just have to be only a tour stop finals, either. Dick Weber appeared on David Letterman's talk show several times and bowled outside. There was a bomb scare before a major finals going beyond its time slot, kicking the final match off a network. There have been TV finals with two distinctly noteworthy occurrences, making them even more unique. In the early days of network television, bowling proved to be an easy sport to cover with its limited playing area and match time length. That is the basis for a return of another item.

That leads into the next qualification and that is public impression. Hard core viewers may remember an event, but what about casual viewers recalling the man-bites-dog moment? One of those moments was #1 on the very first list.

Another part of public impression is mainstream sports media reaction about an event. A replay on that night's local newscast of a trophy breaking, an ill-timed gutter ball, or a one-of-a-kind audible phrase uttered at an optimum moment are examples of that factor.

Another factor is if that moment begins a streak of higher profile performances by a given bowler not seen before. Bob Benoit's 300 game, Michael Haugen's dramatic 2008 PBA Tournament of Champions win, and Kelly Kulick's 1998 college arena finals performance are others.

The final factor I take into consideration is uniqueness or rarity of an event. Has something like that ever happened before or since? So, if there is a one-of-a-kind event that hasn't happened before that the mainstream sports media can't quite get enough of for a variety of reasons, chances are that event is placed higher. Many of those you will see in the top ten. A six-bagger worth \$75,000? Yes, there's one of those, too.

I've even had the pleasure of telling two bowlers in person if their event placed on the list (one did, one didn't). Let me put it this way, if you remember where you were and what you were doing when you saw something happen, then kept it on your VCR or DVR for at least a year to watch it as a guilty pleasure, there's a good chance it may be in this Top 25.

With the passage of time, items disappear, while some rise. No committee vote here (sorry, I wasn't asked to take part in the PBA 60 for 60 list), just my objective-as-possible view as a professional bowler and media professional going back to the 1980's, and TV bowling nerd/viewer going back to the 1960's.

One final note, I also listen to reader input and have changed items on future lists. So, I'm sure I'll hear

from people whom you would recognize, but won't name here. So here we go and what can I tell you.

Since it has been nearly six years since the last T25TM list, there are a number of new items, even older ones not included before, Kulick's 1998 collegiate arena finals finish for Morehead State an example of a new listing. Tourney wins by Liz Johnson and Jason Belmonte at last year's PBA World Series of Bowling made the list, while a TV 300 dropped off (no, I'm not going to tell you which one and there have been 30 from all three tours, men's, women's and seniors).

I'm including at least two from the new PWBA, O'Keefe's dramatic win in last year's Tour Championship as well as Stefanie Johnson's Players Championship crown just a couple of weeks ago.

The Dallas Strikers PBA League Baker System 300 game makes the list, and an item that was seemingly left out makes it first appearance, Mike Aulby's 1995 PBA Tournament of Champions heart-stopping win over Bob Spaulding on another arena finals telecast,

common in the era.

It's not that I'm excluding any live streamed events, that medium didn't exist twenty years ago. That would no doubt be an interesting list to compile. Since pretty much every piece of live streamed material is accessible on the internet from almost everywhere, the list following the near-mythical achievement of "Horrific Bowling Accident" as my pick for the top slot would be entertaining, but also take an incredible amount of time. Perhaps one day, but not now.

It may take a couple of columns to explain each event and why it's ranked where it is. Keep in mind after watching bowling on network, regional, and local television for over fifty years, the level of drama and clutch performance become a little more obvious after a while. Seeing how national, regional, and local media cover, react, and respond to those events has been quite the excursion as well.

Like the late Casey Kasem on his American Top 40 radio shows, we'll count them down until we get to number one...it all starts next week. Get Ready.

# A Historical Look at PWBA Rookie of the Year Jordan Richard's 2018 Season

ARLINGTON, Texas - When Jordan Richard threw her first ball as a professional bowler at the 2018 United States Bowling Congress Queens, she didn't know she was embarking on what would become one of the best rookie seasons in Professional Women's Bowling Association history.

Richard, who is from Tecumseh, Michigan, missed the first three events of the PWBA Tour season because of commitments that included completing her collegiate career at Arkansas State. But the two-time National Tenpin Coaching Association Division I Player of the Year quickly showed she was ready to compete at the professional level.

She captured her first title in her fourth tournament and locked up the 2018 PWBA Rookie of the Year award at the final regular-season event of the year, the QubicaAMF PWBA Players Championship.

Richard is the second consecutive bowler to make the jump from college to professional and earn PWBA Rookie of the Year honors, joining Daria Pajak (2017), since the PWBA Tour resumed in 2015. Stefanie Johnson had more than a decade of experience on Team USA before earning rookie honors in 2015 while Singapore's New Hui Fen, also a veteran in international competition, won the award in 2016.

So, how does Richard's season compare to a few of the best seasons from past PWBA Rookie of the Year winners? Let's look at some of Richard's statistical season.

Titles (1): Greater Harrisburg Open

In just her fourth event as a professional, Richard captured her first career title at the Greater Harrisburg Open and became the ninth player in history to win a title in the same season as winning rookie of the year. The list includes Daria Pajak, New Hui Fen, Stefanie Johnson, Cara Honeychurch (2), Lisa Bishop, Liz Johnson, Wendy Macpherson and Anne Marie Duggan.

Honeychurch captured the PWBA Greater Orlando Classic

and the Brunswick Women's World Open in 2000. Duggan holds the distinction of being the first player to win a title in her first tournament as a professional, when she won her debut in 1983. Bishop joined Duggan in that category after winning the 1997 Clabber Girl Greater Terre Haute Open in her first event as a professional.

# PBA to Donate Go Bowling! PBA Tour and PBA50 Tour Player Fines to BVL

CHICAGO (Aug. 28, 2018) - The Professional Bowlers Association has announced that the PBA will donate all proceeds from player fine money collected from Go Bowling! PBA Tour and PBA50 Tour competition to the Bowlers to Veterans Link (BVL).

Founded in 1942, BVL grants provide arts and crafts programs, music and sports activities, reading materials, board games and much more to help boost spirits and improve morale for veterans while also speeding recuperation for those in VA Medical Centers, Vet Centers and State Veterans Homes.

BVL also assists recuperating veterans, veterans suffering from PTSD (Post Traumatic Stress Disorder) and aging veterans by giving them an outlet for the joy, freedom, and friendship that recreation and sport can bring. Since its inception BVL has raised almost \$50 million dollars for America's active duty service members and veterans.



"The genesis of this new annual charitable donation came from conversations with the PBA Player Committee," said PBA Commissioner Tom Clark. "Fines happen. No player wants to be fined, but from now on everyone will know that money goes directly to support the BVL."

"We're very happy that the PBA and PBA Players Committee thought of us for this kind gesture," said John LaSpina, BVL Board of Directors Chair. The BVL is very appreciative of PBA's generosity to our efforts because nothing can be greater than supporting the men and women who serve our country."

PBA incorporates a policy of levying fines for various

rules violations. Players can be fined for a number of rules infractions which range from an improperly filled out recap sheet to unsportsmanlike conduct. PBA will donate funds beginning with those collected during the 2018 season.

PBA Hall of Famer Johnny Petraglia, a 14-time PBA Tour and eight-time PBA50 Tour champion, is a spokesperson for BVL and often visits VA hospitals throughout the country. After having already started his professional bowling career, Petraglia was called to duty and served in the Army during the Vietnam War from 1967-68.


No one rolled a 300 game that week. It was good to see George Vaughn bowling with us again. Also, Tracy Patterson was back and bowled for the title the final match.



# IBC Youth Development Awards 21 Bowler's Ed Kits

ARLINGTON, Texas – Bowler's Ed kits, containing curriculum and equipment designed to introduce students to the lifetime sport of bowling, have been awarded to 15 schools and organizations based on submitted applications to International Bowling Campus Youth Development.

The Bowler's Ed kits provide educators with the tools needed to engage children in a true bowling experience by providing a bowling-center atmosphere inside a classroom or gymnasium. The easy-to-follow curriculum, which adheres to common core educational standards and includes cross-curriculum activities for grades K-8, features activities to enhance cardiovascular health, coordination and endurance.

"Bowler's Ed is a fun way for teachers and youth program leaders to engage kids in a sport that doesn't have limitations based on size or strength," IBC Youth Committee chair Melissa McDaniel. "Providing an introduction to bowling hopefully will ignite these kids' desire to further explore the exciting possibilities available in our sport."

A total of 21 kits have been awarded to the 15 schools and organizations. Harmony Evergreen Public Schools in Vancouver, Washington, will receive four of the kits while Big Hollow School District 38 in Ingleside, Illinois and the Middle Georgia United States Bowling Congress Association each will receive two kits. den," Troup said. "I couldn't ask for a better result."

In the first stepladder match, Ireland's Christopher Sloan opened in the seventh frame of a close match, but recovered by throwing six strikes to close out the contest and eliminate nine-time PBA Tour champion Bill O'Neill of Langhorne, Pa., 236-234.

Troup advanced to the title match with a 235-187 win over Sloan, a 24-year-old third-year PBA member from Dublin, who was unable to sustain his first-game momentum. Sloan threw one strike and had an open in his first six frames while Troup started with four strikes. A pocket 7-10 in the sixth frame slowed Troup, but he came right back with another three strikes to roll to an easy win.

The Malmo tournament – named in honor of Swedish

PBA star Martin Larsen – was a World Bowling Tour points event. The tournament format involved multiple six-game qualifying squads to arrive at 60 finalists. Qualifiers 34-60 bowled the four-game Step One, with the top 11 advancing to Step Two along with qualifiers 9-33. The 36 players in Step Two bowled another four-game block, with the top 16 joining qualifiers 1-8 in Step Three for an eight-game round to determine the four stepladder finalists. In each "Step" round, pinfall from all previous rounds was dropped. Under tournament rules, women bowling in the event were entitled to eight handicap pins per game.

The final PBA International-WBT event on the 2018 schedule is the WBT Thailand which will take place in Bangkok Sept. 22-28. Thailand's Jojoe Yannaphon is defending champion. Fans can follow the event on the Asian Bowling

Federation website (<http://www.abf-online.org/results/ttbawbt18.htm>).







Macpherson won the U.S. Women's Open in April of 1986 as an amateur prior to joining the PWBA Tour in August.

Average (217.21): In 2018, Richard was second to Erin McCarthy (217.86) in average after bowling 277 games across nine events. While Richard's average is the all-time highest among award winners, Honeychurch posted a 215.18 average for 774 games in 2000 to lead the tour, and Liz Johnson's 212.23 over 831 games in 1996 was ninth in average.

Cashes/events (9/9): The PWBA Tour is the highest level of competition with the best bowlers in the world competing on a weekly basis. This makes the fact Richard, as a rookie, cashed in each of her nine events an impressive feat. Singapore's Joey Yeo, who competed in just two events, was the only other rookie to cash in every event they competed in 2018. Richard also advanced to the Round of 12 seven times.

Historically, there have been a few previous rookie-of-the-year winners with

noteworthy cashing records: New Hui Fen 6/6 (2016), Stefanie Johnson 10/10 (2015), Kelly Kulick 19/23 (2001), Cara Honeychurch 21/22 (2000), Liz Johnson 19/20 (1996), Tammy Turner 18/19 (1994) and Kim Kearney 8/8 (1989).

Championship-round appearances (5): While Richard

has at least one title, she's had the opportunity to capture multiple championships in 2018. Richard was on a roll the final month of the season, qualifying for the TV finals of all four August events (four consecutive).



Pepsi PWBA St. Petersburg-Clearwater Open, third at the BowlerX.com PWBA Twin Cities Open, fifth at the Nationwide PWBA Columbus Open and fourth at the QubicaAMF PWBA Players Championship. She'll still have a chance add to this streak if she can make the finals at the season-ending PWBA Tour Championship, being held in Richmond, Virginia, from Sept. 16-19.

While five is good, it still checks in below the nine championship-round appearances Kulick and Honeychurch each made during their respective rookie-of-the-year campaigns in 2001 and 2000, and the six by Liz Johnson in 1996.
