

## Anthony Simonsen becomes First Professional to Win the Bowlero Elite Series, Earning \$100,000

Finalist and New Jersey native Amy Brehm wins second place prize of \$65,000



Anthony Simonsen Wins \$100,000 Grand Prize

NEW YORK – Professional bowler Anthony Simonsen of Little Elm, Texas, became the new Bowlero Elite Series Champion during the second installment of the pro-am series. The tournament gathered 16 of the world's top professional and amateur bowlers at Bowlero North Brunswick for an exhilarating display of bowling's best that crowned a new winner on Wednesday, Sept. 11.

Simonsen, the 22-year-old professional bowler, competed against amateur bowler and Harrison, NJ, middle school teacher Amy Brehm in the title championship match (259-220) to win the second Bowlero Elite Series title and a \$100,000

top prize—one of the largest winnings in the sport. Amy won a second-place prize of \$65,000, with the tournament's cash prizes totaling more than \$250,000.

Prior to the final match, Simonsen went head-to-head with professional bowlers in three single-elimination matches where he competed against the national champion from Mexico, Sandra Gongora (225-218), 11-time PBA Titleholder and Team USA Member

Bill O'Neill (246-245), and Five-Time World Champion Stefanie Johnson (258-227).

"It was really exciting getting to compete in the Bowlero Elite Series," said Anthony Simonsen. "I love seeing two different sides of the sport come together as one. This event was made even more special when I found out about Bowlero Corp purchasing the PBA. Really looking forward to the future and competing again in December."

Brehm's matches during the tournament also had the crowd cheering as she competed at her home bowling center. Brehm went head-to-head with Bowlero league bowlers in three single-elimination matches where she played against Milwaukee father Torry Henderson (224-167), Puerto Rico native Rafael Pizarro (231-202), and fellow local league bowler and Bowlero North Brunswick pro shop manager Lucas Leandro (174-141).

"Participating in the Bowlero Elite Series was an unbelievable

## Chris Barnes Wins PBA Grand Casino Resort & Hotel Southwest Invitational

SHAWNEE, OK – Chris Barnes from Double Oak, TX defeated Dylan Burns, of Garden City, Kan., to win the sixth annual PBA Grand Casino Resort & Hotel Southwest Invitational at FireLake Bowling Center Sunday.

Barnes, who earned his 28th PBA Regional title by a healthy 48-pin margin, fell behind early in the final match as Burns started with four strikes. Barnes responded with his own hambone, striking from the seventh frame through the tenth, as Burns ran into all sorts of issues, giving Barnes a 226-178 victory and the \$4,000 winner's check.

After 12 games of qualifying, both players received byes to the Round of 8, as Barnes was the top seed, and Burns was right behind him in second place. In the best two of three Round of 8, Barnes defeated Keith Lesko, from Prosper, Texas, 2-0, while Burns advanced with a 2-0 win over

Austin Boulds, of Creal Springs, Ill. In the one game semifinal round, Barnes squeaked by Anthony Lavery-Spahr, from Pasadena, Texas, 245-231, while Burns eliminated Houston's Shawn Maldonado 219-203.

Burns earned \$2,500 for second place. Lavery-Spahr and Maldonado each received \$1,500.

The Southwest Region's next events will be the PBA Odessa Southwest Super Regional, with a projected \$5,000 winner's

## O'Keefe Captures 2nd Consecutive PWBA Player of the Year Award

ARLINGTON, Texas – Shannon O'Keefe has earned the Professional Women's Bowling Association Player of the Year award for the second consecutive season, wrapping up the honor with her runner-up finish at the QubicaAMF PWBA Players Championship this past weekend in Raleigh, North Carolina.

O'Keefe, of Shiloh, Illinois, leads the 2019 PWBA Tour season in points, which determines the PWBA Player of the Year. As the points leader, she automatically is seeded into the semifinals of next week's season-ending PWBA Tour Championship and, since she can finish no lower than third,

no one can catch the 40-year-old right-hander.

"Winning my second PWBA Player of the Year award is mind boggling and humbling all at the same time," O'Keefe said. "This one most certainly means more because I was able to do it, competing from beginning to end, by sticking to my mental process and season goals."

O'Keefe has won four titles this season – PWBA Twin Cities Open, PWBA Tucson Open, PWBA East Hartford Open, BowlerX.com PWBA Orlando Open – and now owns 12 PWBA Tour titles. She not only leads the tour in points, but also in earnings, average, cashes and championship-

round appearances.

She put together an impressive run in six championship-round appearances this season, averaging more than 225 and posting a 9-2 record.

O'Keefe will make her seventh championship-round appearance at the PWBA Tour Championship in Richmond,

Virginia. She won the event in 2017.

CBS Sports Network will have live coverage of the PWBA Tour Championship finals on Wednesday, Sept. 18, at 8 p.m. Eastern.

Throughout her 2019 campaign, O'Keefe has professed

# Just Paying Attention

This was one of those weeks with enough material for me to cover with two big television shows. Then came last Tuesday's announcement some knew was coming for some time. As you saw on the front page of this edition of TBN, Bowlero announced the completion of its purchase of the PBA.

So now what? We do know Bowlero doesn't mind flexing its finances around to grow its brand. We thought the purchase of Brunswick Recreation Centers (Brunswick Zone centers) was huge, and there's no mistake, it was. But to purchase an existing professional sports association on the rise after being on life support two decades ago is a step we really haven't seen before.

I asked a couple of very familiar names in this publication their initial reactions to the sale of The Association. First up is Anthony Lavery-Spahr.

"I think it's going to be good for the PBA moving forward. You see all the effort they (Bowlero) have put in to the Bowlero Elite Series tournaments, I can only imagine they will put as much into the PBA. I truly believe big things will

be coming from this," Anthony told me.

Anthony's brother, Sean, is also optimistic.

"I actually think it's going to be a good thing. Hopefully they take it in the right direction and make the prize fund better but also make it better for the fans. I think there's a lot of marketable things they can do to market the players better and make it a win-win all around," Sean said.

There is some pessimism if you've seen some comments on social media. In some locales and centers, Bowlero has had issues with league bowlers, a customer segment looked upon as unwanted and unneeded only ten years ago.

I will say this. Bowlero added a corporate league bowling officer and a customer care officer to its corporate structure, even after first dismissing the economic impact of league bowlers. That Chief Customer Care officer, Colie Edison, will also be the new CEO of The Association.

Even with the most recent public relations and economic boost the PBA received from the Fox Sports television deal,

momentum needs to be maintained and may have received another timely boost.

Hope you caught the two network television shows this past week, showing some impressive individual performance from names known and unknown.

Reigning PWBA Player of the Year Shannon O'Keefe nearly ran the stepladder to highlight an already Hall of Fame caliber year, attempting to win for a fifth time in 2019. Granted, she'll have another shot in the PWBA Tour Championship this week, but O'Keefe is the first to have a four win season since Carolyn Dorin-Ballard won seven titles in 2001.

And speaking of PWBA PoY, this and the Rookie of the Year award really need to be named for a couple of PWBA legends. Discuss.

There is a new look to an underutilized used camera angle, the one from directly on the floor. This time, the image showed the bowler's footwork to the foul line as well as a closer look at the ball rotation downlane. Color analyst Kelly Kulick pointed out various footwork and ball motion details the handful of times the shot was used, allowing her to explain more of the details we have come to expect to hear from one of the all time greats. Hope we see that angle this weekend.

The other show, the second of the three scheduled Bowlero Elite Series shows in 2019, had its unique shining moments as well.

In the amateur final between Amy Brehm and Lucas Leandro, after Brehm missed the pocket to the right for the second time on the left lane,

telecast analyst Jason Belmonte flat out nailed one major difference between amateurs and touring pros. He used a nice amount of detail to say it is seeing the transition, knowing what adjustment to make, then executing the adjustment.

Many weekly league bowlers would credit physical execution, rather than realizing they didn't throw it that bad. Nothing against Brehm mind you, but undoubtedly, her own game and the bowlers under her coaching wing will benefit from this one of a kind experience.

Sure, both bowlers were in their home house, but add in being in the network television environment for the first time and that one game match looks to be all of a dream you knew happened, but can't fully recall the next morning.

Belmo turned in another stellar performance behind the mic along with the NFL Hall

Of Famer and hardcore bowler Jerome "The Bus" Bettis. They spoke of momentum shifts and what either player had to do to win. Jason's prior PBA XtraFrame on FloBowling experience came into play, helping lead announcer Todd Harris, filling in more scoring details frame to frame.

Why the big announcement wasn't on this BES show? You have to remember this show was recorded the night before. The December show will probably look and sound a little different.

While in northern New Jersey prepping for the Bowlero Elite Series, former Marine and PBA Tournament Director Corey Kistner, who we profiled in the July 4 JPA, took steps in what many consider to be sacred ground. Sarge, as many of us call him, hadn't been to Ground Zero in lower

## PBA Spare Shots

**FLOBOWLING DEBUTS ANTHONY SIMONSEN DOCUMENTARY: "LEAVE IT BEHIND"**

At age 22, Anthony Simonsen of Little Elm, Texas, has already established himself as one of the PBA's premier stars. But his youthful journey to the top levels of competitive bowling hasn't been easy. A documentary that made its debut on FloBowling.com Wednesday, "Simonsen: Leave It Behind," tells his story.

FloBowling's first documentary interviews Simonsen and the people close to him as it delves into how he overcame some difficult personal obstacles in his formative years to become one of bowling's biggest stars.

"With this first FloSports bowling presentation, I hope you enjoy a glimpse into one of our young star bowler's life," said PBA Commissioner Tom Clark. "Anthony's origin story, like every person in the PBA family, deserves to be told because when you get to know our players, when you really care about them and they feel like part of your family, the drama PBA bowling provides is unmatched."

Simonsen has already won enough PBA Tour titles to qualify for election to the PBA Hall of Fame, but also must complete 20 years of PBA membership before he'll be eligible for election. With seven



standard PBA Tour titles and two majors, he is the youngest player ever to complete the title-eligibility requirement.

In unrelated news, Simonsen has withdrawn from the PBA China Tiger Cup because of a previous business commitment and will be replaced in the exclusive eight-man field of PBA stars by fellow two-hander Kyle Troup, the next qualifier in line to make the trip. Simonsen was the No. 3 qualifier in competition points earned during the nine-event FloBowling PBA Summer Tour; Troup finished ninth in points.

The PBA's inaugural trip to China is set for Nov. 19-22 for a singles competition including a field of Chinese bowlers along with a U.S. vs. China team event. The American contingent will include points leader Sean Rash, Tackett, Jason Sterner, AJ

Johnson, O'Neill, Kyle Sherman, Tommy Jones and Troup.

### NEW KUWAIT BOWLING CENTER TO HOST FINAL PBA-WORLD BOWLING TOUR EVENT

The newly renovated Kuwait Bowling Centre will host the final PBA International-World Bowling Tour event on the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour schedule Oct. 31-Nov. 6. The tournament also is the final qualifying event for the World Bowling Tour Men's and Women's Finals that will follow the Kuwait Open in the same facility.

The Kuwait Open will feature a prize fund of \$218,000 with a \$50,000 first prize. Other events remaining on the PBA-WBT schedule for 2019 are the Thailand Open, Sept. 27-Oct. 4 at Blu-O Paragon in Bangkok, and the U.S. Open,

The Bowlero Elite Series will continue with its third and final event of the year that will air on NBC on Saturday, Dec. 28, at 3 p.m. at Bowlero Jupiter, Fla. Since the inaugural tournament in April, more than \$1 million in prize money will have been awarded across all three Bowlero Elite Series events this year.





the need for a different outlook in comparison to her 2018 season, despite winning the coveted award for the first time in her career.

Taking home the award consumed her during the second half of 2018, O'Keefe said, and it affected her performance as Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, New York, made a late charge. But, for the second consecutive year, O'Keefe was able to clinch the award at the PWBA Players Championship.

"Last year, I was so obsessed with the player of the year race and points, I completely missed the last three tournaments," O'Keefe said. "I felt like I was just waiting for time to run out and the season to hurry up and end. I worried about what other people were doing, and

I got lost in what I was doing and how I ultimately wanted to compete.

"The mental discipline I brought into this season was necessary for me to continue in my path of growth to be the best I can be. This season is so much more vivid. I was able to embrace my struggles and celebrate my successes. I lived in every moment, good and bad. I didn't listen to or let the outside noise distract me from reaching my daily, weekly, season and career goals. I'm proud of how I stayed true to the plan, and I'm not sure if this season would have been as successful without it. I will continue to carry this mindset throughout the rest of my career."

McEwan again was the top contender to take over O'Keefe's spot in 2019 after winning the U.S. Women's Open in June. McEwan officially was

eliminated from PWBA Player of the Year contention with her seventh-place finish at the PWBA Players Championship.

O'Keefe's 12 wins are the most by any competitor since the relaunch of the tour in 2015, and her four wins in 2019 marked the most in a season by a single player since 2001.

Her run this year also included winning a gold medal for Team USA at the Pan American Games in Lima, Peru (in doubles with Stefanie Johnson), along with one silver medal (singles) and two bronze medals (team, all-events) at the World Bowling Women's Championships in Las Vegas.

O'Keefe (2018 and 2019) and United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famer Liz Johnson of Palatine, Illinois (2015-2017), are the only players to win the PWBA Player of the Year award since the tour's relaunch.
