

O'Keefe Caps Banner Year with Win at 2019 PWBA Tour Championship

RICHMOND, Va. – Shannon O'Keefe of Shiloh, Illinois, put the finishing touches on a dream season by winning her second career Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour Championship on Wednesday.

O'Keefe rolled eight consecutive strikes on her way to a 268-179 win over Ukraine's Dasha Kovalova in the title match to claim the \$20,000 top prize and her third major championship.

The 2019 PWBA Tour Championship was held inside the Old Dominion Building at Richmond Raceway, and Wednesday's knockout-style championship round was broadcast live on CBS Sports Network.

The 40-year-old right-hander won her fifth title of 2019, after securing her second consecutive PWBA Player of the Year award earlier in September. She made seven championship-round appearances in 13 events and finished the season with an 11-2 record in those appearances.

"This is beyond any of my wildest dreams," said O'Keefe, who won the 2017 Tour Championship. "To have a season like this – to win five titles, come back to Richmond Raceway, where I won my first major, and be able to win

again, to be player of the year – it's mind boggling to me, and I'm so humbled and grateful."

After delivering in a must-strike situation to defeat Stefanie Johnson of McKinney, Texas, in her semifinal match, 234-223, O'Keefe elected to make a ball change heading into the title tilt against Kovalova.

O'Keefe's first shot against Kovalova crept high on the head pin, leaving a 4-7 combination, which resulted in a spare. Her adjustment from the first frame helped her quickly distance herself from Kovalova, who opened twice in her first seven frames.

"Going off the first match, Dasha's ball motion was really good and her ball was hitting like a ton of bricks," said O'Keefe, who now owns 13

Held in conjunction with the Junior Gold Championships presented by the Brands of

Ebonite International, the Youth Open Championships took place July 11-12, 19-21 and 27-28. The tournament was open to all United States Bowling Congress Youth members and featured four age-based divisions (U20, U15, U12, U10) with scratch and optional handicap divisions in each age group.

Another week and there were two more fun television finals for us to watch. The PWBA ended its 2019 season Wednesday night as with the Tour Championship, which is starting to acquire a must-see television history all of its own. In a way, it's kind of resembling the PBA Firestone Tournament of Champions of the 1960's and 70's in the unexpected and unpredictable drama we would see in the four matches marching up the stepladder finals.

Dramatic semifinal matches have highlighted the five year history of this tournament, as this year added another chapter. Dasha Kovalova came within a

solid 7 pin of an unprecedented second TV 300 this season, ending with an eleven strike 279 to 230 win over Danielle McEwan, who started with the front six strikes of her own.

"The Shafanie Show" founders battled to the tenth frame in their semifinal, before Shannon O'Keefe threw a clinching double in the 234 to 227 win over longtime friend Stefanie Johnson.

The finale will be a testament to O'Keefe as authoring one of the best seasons anyone has ever seen, either before or after the PWBA rebirth in 2015. Watching her methodically piece together a seven

bagger while looking like she was making a stop in what sports psychologists like to call "the zone," where mental and physical peak performance work in absolute complimentary tandem, O'Keefe did not simply put a period at the end of her 2019 season. She put an exclamation point on it, as well as stamping her ticket to the USBC and PWBA Halls of Fame.

O'Keefe won five titles out of the fourteen tournament schedule, the most since friend of the column Carolyn Dorin-Ballard won seven titles in 2001. As the CBS Sports Network graphic showed, she also joins an elite group with 13 titles in a five year span O'Keefe tied Donna Adamek and Leanne Hulsenberg at 13 wins. Tish Johnson is next at 14, CDB with 16, and Lisa Wagner with 18 titles. The tour pre 2003 had more tournaments, thus that 13 title in five years mark is even more remarkable.

In a video piece before her semifinal match with Johnson, O'Keefe explained how although the last two seasons garnered her Player of the Year awards, the seasons could not have been more different.

"I just wanted to compete like that 13 year old little girl on the softball field who just loved the sport and I lost that last year. Winning Player of the Year, although an incredible accomplishment in my career, I wasn't really proud of it. I did some major soul searching over the winter break and I decided to form my goals in a different way, really focusing on my goals being something that I could control day in and day out and let the rest take care of itself.

"There's definitely moments throughout the season where I struggled. The number one thing for me that I kept telling myself was embrace the struggle, you're going to learn

so much when you embrace the struggle versus being so upset about it. You miss things in your career and I just don't want to miss things in my career," O'Keefe told CBS Sports Network.

If you get a chance, watch O'Keefe's Tour Championship title match through the eighth frame. Focus in on the pre shot routine, then the reaction after the shot through the set up of the next ball, whether it be a strike of spare. The physical movement in between deliveries was nearly identical, even when shouting, "Yes!" on the strike balls.

My point is this, Bowlers get more perturbed by bad shots, some more than others, as well all do. You could not tell by watching O'Keefe what was happening. Each pre shot routine was nearly identical, focusing on the procedure, letting the results take care of themselves, as her earlier quote testifies. It was an ideal

example of a world class athlete reaching a physical and mental peak they don't reach at the same time that often or that viewers get to see that often.

Evidence was in the stat CBSSN shows from behind the in game in line score, you know the one, the one they haven't explained very well, the win probability stat. After the sixth frame on a five bagger, the stat graphic showed O'Keefe had a 95.10 % percent chance of winning the match. If anyone has seen or heard what algorithms are used to determine that number, let me know, I'm just a little curious. Plus, it's another opportunity to hook another telecast sponsor.

Bowling is one of the few sports where athletes at this level peak after the age of 40, as we've seen with legends like Earl Anthony, Walter Ray Williams, Jr., and CDB. That is what makes bowling so much more different and special than

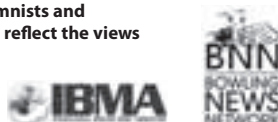

Shawn Maldonado Wins PBA Liberal Kansas Southwest Open

 Liberal, Kan., (Sept. 17, 2019) –Shawn Maldonado from Houston, Texas, won three of his first five matches in the modified eight-game round robin match play finals to build a 248-pin lead and then held off Canada's Francois Lavoie to claim his 11th PBA Regional title in the third annual PBA Liberal Kansas Southwest Open Sunday at Ayr Lanes.

Maldonado started the match play finals in the lead before losing matches six and seven with games of 192 and 169 while Lavoie closed in with wins with 257 and 229 game, setting up the deciding position round match. Maldonado still held a 64-pin lead, meaning Lavoie had to win the match by 35 pins and collect the 30 bonus pins to win the title. While Maldonado was filling frame through the middle of the match, Lavoie countered with two doubles to briefly take the lead. When Lavoie failed to convert two splits late in the game, Maldonado escaped with a 192-174 loss, but still maintained the overall pinfall lead,

4,610-4,594.

The win was worth \$4,000 to Maldonado while Lavoie collected \$2,400 for second place.

The Southwest Region's next event is the PBA Odessa Southwest Super Regional, offering a projected first place prize of \$5,000. Two one-day PBA50 tournaments follow over the Sept. 27-29 weekend at Junction City Bowl in Junction City, Kan. The second annual PBA50 Waxahachie Southwest Open will then be held at Hilltop Lanes, Oct. 18-20.

The Mann team won a close final match 223-219 for the title!

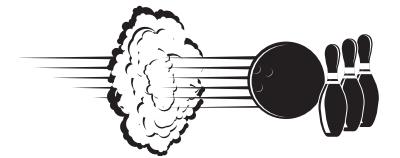
It was Rick's 3rd SASBA title and the first for both Cindy and Brent!

career PWBA Tour titles. "We felt like I could shoot 220 with the ball I used in the semifinals, but it was starting to get lazy downlane. We thought the other ball, with a little surface, would still retain through the front part of the lane and still come off it. The first shot was really good, so I made a one-and-one move on both lanes, and it was such a good choice."

Wednesday's victory also was amplified for O'Keefe as she celebrated the win with her husband, Bryan, on their 15th wedding anniversary.

"He's been in the fire with me, and it's so awesome to be able to share moments like this with him," O'Keefe said. "I wouldn't be the player I am today without him, and to win this on our anniversary is very special."

Kovalova was dominant in

her semifinal win against Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, New York, delivering 11 strikes to record a 279-230 victory.

Kovalova started the game with four consecutive strikes, but she found herself trailing as McEwan began with six consecutive strikes. Kovalova took the lead after back-to-back spares from McEwan in the seventh and eighth frames and found herself in the driver's seat after McEwan was unable to convert the 1-2-4-6-10 in the ninth frame.

Kovalova had a breakout year on the PWBA Tour in 2019, winning her first career title at the United States Bowling Congress Queens to earn her first trip to the Tour Championship. She followed the major victory with a perfect game in the championship match of the Pepsi PWBA Louisville Open to claim her second title of the season.

"No, I didn't expect this," Kovalova said. "I wanted to

make one show this season. I made four and won two of them.

"In the title match, I knew I needed to make a ball change, but I was just stubborn. It's OK. I'm going to take a little break and heal some of the aches and pains and come back stronger next year."

O'Keefe and McEwan were automatically seeded into the semifinals based on their ranking on the season-long points list, which determined seeding for this week's bracket.

Kovalova and Johnson each had to make their way through best-of-five matches to advance to Wednesday's championship round. The Tour Championship is a single-elimination event.

The 16-player field at the Tour Championship included all of this year's eligible PWBA Tour champions, and the final spots in the bracket were filled in using the 2019 PWBA points list.

Four lanes once again were specially installed inside the Old Dominion Building by QuibicaAMF, the official supplier of

bowling equipment for the 2019 PWBA Tour Championship.

All rounds leading up to the championship round were broadcast live on BowlTV.com.

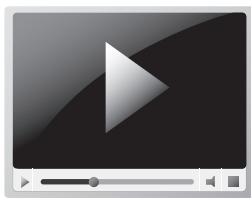

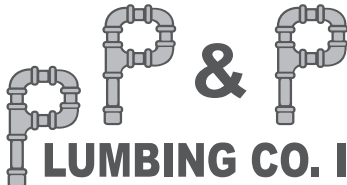

PBA REGIONAL UP-DATE: MALDONADO HOLDS OFF LAVOIE TO WIN 11TH REGIONAL TITLE

Shawn Maldonado from Houston, Texas, built a 248-pin lead and then held off Canada's Francois Lavoie in the final frames to claim his 11th PBA Regional title in the third annual PBA Liberal Kansas Southwest Open Sunday at Ayr Lanes in Liberal, Kan.

Maldonado started the eight-game match play finals in the lead before losing matches six and seven while Lavoie closed in with wins behind 257 and 229 games to set up the deciding position round match. Maldonado still held a 64-pin lead, meaning Lavoie had to win the match by 35 pins and collect the 30 bonus pins to win the title. While Maldonado was filling frame through the middle of the match, Lavoie countered with two doubles to briefly take the lead. When Lavoie failed to convert two splits late in the game, Maldonado escaped with a 192-174 loss, but still maintained the overall pinfall lead, 4,610-4,594.

In addition to his title, the win was worth \$4,000 to Maldonado.

• Kyle Troup of Taylorsville, N.C. defeated Trevor Roberts of Crystal River, Fla., 257-234, to win the \$2,500 first prize and his 12th PBA Regional title in the 16th annual PBA Fayetteville South Open at Lafayette Lanes in Fayetteville, N.C., Sunday.

Roberts qualified in the

third position for the four-man stepladder finals, one pin ahead of defending champion Brandon Curtis of Manson, N.C., and then eliminated Curtis in the opening match, 208-192. Roberts then defeated Ryan Ciminelli of Lancaster, S.C., 257-234, to advance to the championship match.

In the title match, Troup threw eight strikes in his first eight frames to grab a healthy lead. Roberts didn't strike until the seventh frame and by then it was too late.

• Darren Tang of Las Vegas posted an 8-4 match play record and a 20-game total of 4,366 pins to win the Fourth Annual PBA West/Northwest Capital City Open at Bowlero North Sacramento Sunday while Tony Rodriguez Jr. of Rancho Cucamonga, Calif., won the PBA50 portion of the double-header weekend.

Tang won his sixth PBA Regional title and the \$2,000 first prize by 56 pins over non-member Sam Cantrell of Citrus Heights, Calif., who had an 9-3 record and 4,310 pins, including match play bonus pins.

Rodriguez went 8-4 in the 12-game PBA50 match play finals and knocked down 4,250 total pins for his 20 games to top Noel Vazquez of Sacramento by 78 pins.

• Rick Graham of Lancaster, Pa., the reigning East Region PBA50 Player of the Year, compiled a 3-5 match play record and a 15-game total of 3,524 pins to win the PBA50 King Pin Lanes Open at King Pin Lanes in Rome, N.Y., Saturday.

While Graham only managed to win three of his eight matches, his 228 average helped propel him to a 101-pin victory over Ryan Shafer of Horseheads, N.Y. For Graham, the trip to King Pin Lanes brought back fond memories because King Pin Lanes was the site of his first PBA regional win, in 2010. Saturday's win was Graham's fifth in PBA Regional competition and earned him \$1,500.

• Justin Knowles of Okemos, Mich. defeated Chris Loschetter

of Avon, Ohio by 30 pins to win the PBA Sturgis/Storm Central/Midwest Open at Sturgis Bowl Sunday. Knowles finished with a 5-3 match play record and a total of 4,738 pins for 21 games, including match play bonus pins, to win his first PBA title and the \$2,600 first prize.

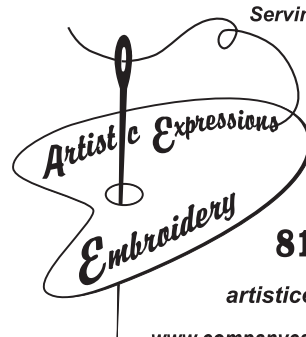
