



Sweden's Jesper Svensson Wins PBA International-WBT Thailand Open Title

Swedish two-hander defeats Sean Rash to end two-year title drought



Sean Rash, Jesper Svensson and Ryam Ciminelli

handed player, picked up his eighth career PBA Tour title along with a \$32,258 first prize.

The 24-year-old Swedish star rolled games of 289, 300, 290, 218, 279 and 195 for a 1,571 pinfall total in the final six-game qualifying round to win the top spot in the stepladder finals by a stunning 217 pins over Rash.

Svensson also won the Thailand Open title in 2016. He won last title in the 2017 PBA Cheetah Championship during the PBA World Series of Bowling IX in Reno, Nevada.

The PBA Tour's final two tournaments on the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour and World Bowling Tour schedule are the U.S. Open – the season's final major – Oct. 23-30 at Victory Lanes Family Entertainment Center in Mooresville, North Carolina, and the PBA-WBT Kuwait Open at Kuwait Bowling Center in Kuwait City, Oct. 31-Nov. 6.



Anthony Lavery-Spahr Wins Sixth PBA Regional Title in Odessa Southwest Open

Odessa, Texas, (September 23, 2019) – Anthony Lavery-Spahr of Pasadena, Texas, steadily moved up after each round of the PBA Odessa Southwest Super Regional Open to claim his third straight victory in the annual Odessa event at Diamond Lanes, overtaking Shawn Maldonado of Houston in the final game to claim the \$5,000 first prize.

Lavery-Spahr started his climb from fourth place after the eight-game qualifying round. He then moved up to third after the five-game casher's round, and then won five of his first seven matches in the eight-game modified round-robin finals to close to within 27 pins of Maldonado going into the final position round match. Needing a win over Maldonado to claim the 30 match play bonus pins for the title, Lavery-Spahr struck on four of his first six shots while Maldonado started the game

with an open frame.

Lavery-Spahr continued to strike through the 10th frame to clinch his sixth career PBA Regional title.

Lavery-Spahr finished with a 21-game total of 4,575 pins, including match play bonus pins. Maldonado had 4,512 total

The 2019-2020 United States Bowling Congress Collegiate season kicked off last weekend, and the Tennessee Wesleyan men and Campbellsville women earned their first wins of the new season at the Green River Classic.

Held at Danville Bowlarama in Danville, Kentucky, the Green River Classic had 11 men's and seven women's varsity programs, and teams bowled five traditional games and 12 Baker games with total pinfall determining the winner in each division.

The Tennessee Wesleyan men made their move at the end of the traditional block, rolling to a 1,068 team effort in the final game to build a lead of more than 160 pins over the



field. The Bulldogs maintained the advantage through Baker competition to win with a 7,104 total.

Lindsey Wilson took second in the men's division with 6,921, and Campbellsville finished third with 6,821.

Lindsey Wilson's Tanner Goodman earned the top individual honor at the Green River Classic on the strength of games of 266 and 240 to post a five-game score of 1,054, a 210.8 average. Other student-athletes in the top five of the men's division included Tennessee Wesleyan's Zachary Price (1,027), Thomas More's Jake

Bill O'Neill Helps Norm Duke Lock Up Final Berth in PBA Clash

Jason Belmonte to lead elite eight-man field into end-of-season special event

 CHICAGO (Sept. 25, 2019) – The end-of-season PBA Clash field of the eight leading PBA players based on Go Bowling! PBA Tour earnings for 2019 is set in the aftermath of Saturday's FloBowling PBA ATX Invite where Bill O'Neill of Langhorne, Pennsylvania, locked up Norm Duke's berth in the Clash.

When O'Neill, the ATX Invite winner, defeated Kyle Sherman of O'Fallon, Missouri, in the first elimination round of the Invite, 280-212, Sherman's hope to make the elite PBA Clash field also was over. Sherman needed to win the \$25,000 first prize to overtake the PBA Hall of Famer from Clermont, Florida, for eighth place on the earnings list.

Duke, who didn't qualify to participate in the ATX Invite, qualified for the Clash with \$97,415 while Sherman, who earned \$3,750 as a first-round loser in the final event of the FloBowling PBA Summer Tour, finished the Clash qualifying period with \$85,965.

The second PBA Clash will be contested on Monday, Oct. 21, at Kegel Training Center in Lake Wales, Florida, for airing on FOX on Sunday, Nov. 3. Marshall Kent, who won the inaugural PBA Clash, didn't qualify for this year's event. The following players (with their 2019 earnings totals) will compete for the \$50,000 first prize in the Clash:

Let's face it, the bar was raised this season. The Fox Sports produced PBA telecasts have a look all their own. The CBS Sports Network produced PBA telecasts now look a little dated, lacking the constant ball tracking graphics Fox uses, courtesy of Specto software from our friends at Kegel.

So is the ball, figuratively, now in the court of CBS Sports Network? Knowing television folk as I do, I would wager there is a change or two in store for 2020, but not neces-

sarily for the ball tracking graphics. CBSSN has now had a few years of PBA and five years (yes, you read that right, five) of PWBA telecasts. Producers and mid-level network executives may have an idea or two to create a look all its own. It's not that it's wrong or bad, but as we saw over the years with the "Pro Bowlers Tour" on ABC, 1960's telecasts certainly did not look anything like 1970's, 1980's, or 1990's as technology, especially as graphics presentation advanced. The look of a

telecast was changed every so often, much like a department store, or even now, a website will freshen its look in hope of making it more inviting to watch.

There is the other factor, which is of course, who may pay for the refreshing. Whether the PWBA is in a position to do so remains to be seen. The network may suggest it, the PWBA may suggest it, or both may want a change. That remains to be seen.

And speaking of not staying pat, as seen on PBA Commissioner Tom Clark's Facebook page this past week, Da Commish and new PBA CEO Colie Edison met with Fox Sports execs this week about the upcoming season. His post concluded with the following, "Some more surprises coming in 2020, so stay tuned!" nuff said.

In his Facebook posts, you could tell it was bothering him, but Anthony Lavery-Spahr broke out of not only a slump, but a pattern of five second place and two thirds place finishes without winning a PBA regional, something he's done five previous times recent years. For the third year in a row, ALS won the PBA Southwest regional in Odessa, this year hosted by Diamond Lanes, the Southwest Super Regional, good for his 6th PBA regional title and first since last year in Odessa.

After what he called a disaster of a PBA Summer Swing, there was a third place finish in Shawnee, and the "worst event I ever bowled" in Liberal, Kansas, PBA50 stand-out Keith Lesko saw something in Anthony's approach in the Odessa tournament sweeper and said something.

Lavery-Spahr told me last week what that was, saying it wasn't the first time he's fallen into that particular habit.

"Keith told me that my shoulders were getting really far forward and that it looked like I was almost lunging to the foul line. I had a lesson with Mark Baker before the USBC Masters in April and told me he noticed when I bowl bad that he sees the same thing. So when Keith told me that it instantly was like you know what you're probably right. So I really focused all weekend on correcting that."

Lavery-Spahr added he'll be at the U.S. Open later this month and be on tour full time in January. Kudos to Lesko for mentioning the tip, who lead much of the weekend, eventually finishing in fourth place.

In an update on a June JPA item, Nick Pate defeat did Brady Stearns, 229-193, for the PBA Ten Pin Alley Midwest Regional Open in Fitchburg, Wisconsin, a neighboring town of Madison, on Saturday September 21.

Earlier this summer in a video that still made the tale unbelievable, both Pate and Stearns rolled gutter balls in their respective tenth frame fill balls, giving Stearns his first PBA regional title. Pate's was more costly as he finished the match, needing only count to claim his first PBA regional title.

Pate, who weeks later claimed a men's singles gold medal in the Pan American Games as a member of Team USA, bounced back in what could be an amazing life lesson.

Maybe this video will go viral, and maybe it won't, but you can't blame Jason Belmonte for trying. But rolling a 140 mile per hour strike is something you don't see every day, especially at one of NASCAR's regular venues.

On only their fifth attempt, perhaps making math, physics, and engineering geeks everywhere jealous with envy, Belmo launched a ball out the passenger side of a specially fitted NASCAR vehicle (they don't have front passenger seats), knocking down all ten pins set up at the start/finish line. 





Put Your Shoes On and Go
Bowling is, after all, an athletic endeavor.

In all sports activities, athletes warm up. No one puts on their cleats and throws from center field to home plate. You play catch, getting farther and farther apart until you can play burn out. Properly warming up is important to any good athletic performance and certainly to your ability to bowl longer, stronger.

I have many clients who were athletes in other sports or are currently participating in softball or volleyball or golf. They can tell me about the warmup regimen for each sport, yet look incredulously at me when I ask what they do to prepare to bowl. "Put on my shoes. What else is there?"

When you watch any event on FloBowling or bowl.tv like the World Championships or a collegiate event, you'll see teams doing dynamic warmups as a group.

They are not doing this to look cool, although it does.

They are doing it because it prepares their body for competition. Feeling prepared is a very close relative to feeling competent. Easier to have confidence if you're feeling competent....

Dynamically warming up before you bowl is a must. Stretching is not a warm up regimen. It is a cool down strategy. You shouldn't stretch cold muscles. A productive and efficient strategy is dynamic warm up movements and static stretches for cooling down. That's not what we were taught, but it is correct. Knowledge continues to grow....

Warming Up and Then Lining Up

You don't have time to warm up your body and get as loose as you think you need to be and then find out all the things you need to know about a lane. You've got to learn it all while warming up. Even though those first few shots are thrown with a "just start walking" philosophy at about 1/4 speed, they


have a purpose and you can glean a lot of information from them. This is not something to do after you've warmed up. This IS the warm-up. Warming up and lining up are the same thing.

When it's time to warm up, make sure you are first in line. Throw as many shots as you can by getting in the shortest line. Roll the ball in zones. If you strike, move! While that strike is nice, you have found A shot. It may not be THE shot.

Let's assume you threw the ball well enough to make a decision. For the purposes of this where's-the-oil test, well enough is if the ball stayed on the lane. Any shot that stays on the lane will give you information, so your first shot will be one you're sure you can keep out of the trough. Actually, the ones that don't stay on the lane tell you stuff, too! It may not be the way you intended to learn, but any information is good information. What not to do is just as important as what to do. Since you know it's true that whoever finds it first wins, why wouldn't you make every effort to be sure that's you?

Train to get great and stay great. It actually can be fun especially with the Training Games available at strikeability.com.




