Go Bowling! PBA Tour Returns to Tulsa Area for Multi-Event FloBowling PBA Fall Swing Oct. 15-20

OWASSO, Okla. (Oct. 8, 2018) – The Go Bowling! PBA Tour will return to the Tulsa area for the first time in 13 years when The Lanes at Coffee Creek in Owasso, Okla., hosts the 2018 revival of the FloBowling PBA Fall Swing Oct. 15-20.

The multi-event tournament package, which will be conducted on two different PBA lane conditions, will be covered live exclusively on PBA's online streaming service Xtra Frame on FloBowling.

The Fall Swing will feature three PBA Tour events – Wolf Open, Bear Open and Tulsa



Open – each awarding a PBA Tour title. The Fall Swing will precede the U.S. Open – the final major championship of the season – which takes place Oct. 24-31 at Northrock Lanes in Wichita, Kan.

Team USA Men Selected for 2018 World Championships

ARLINGTON, Texas - The Team USA men recently converged on the International Training and Research Center for a week of analysis, camaraderie, strategizing, team building and training.

While the teammates were honing their skills and getting to know each other on and off the lanes, the Team USA coaching staff was evaluating the players and discussing potential selections for two upcoming international events.

Six players will wear the red, white and blue at the 2018 World Bowling Men's Championships, where the United States is the defending



champion in the coveted team event. The tournament will take place in Hong Kong from Nov. 24-Dec. 5.

Headed to the South China Athletic Association Bowling Centre in Hong Kong are Andrew Anderson of Holly, Michigan; Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas; Jakob Butturff of Tempe, Arizona; Tommy Jones of Simpsonville, South Carolina; EJ Tackett of

Just Paying Attention

Jakob Butturff won another two regional events enroute to the August 2018 IBMA Keggl Bowl of the Month. And this will be nothing like last week's column with numbers explaining how long it has taken to win a PBA regional title.

His latest win in the PBA West/Northwest Regional in Rohnert Park, California is his sixth of the year. Last year, there were four wins. Two years ago, there were nine wins. That makes nineteen regional wins in three years. Now, add two national tour victories in 2016, two more so far this year, and don't forget the 2017 QubicaAMF World Cup last fall, and the 2017 Team USA Team Trials. So that's twenty-five pictures with sponsors and trophies. And, oh by the way, there was the runner up finish at last fall's U.S. Open. That's a really good career for pretty much anyone,

but Butturff has that unique roll using the unique release and is literally striking while the iron is hot.

A second point I want to bring up is his breadth of travel. He's won in three regions, (West, Northwest, Midwest), then add in 2017 USA Team Trials in Las Vegas and the World Bowling Championships the 2017 QubicaAMF World Cup win last fall in Mexico, and the 2017 U.S Open in upstate New York (the BTM tourney house, Flamingo Bowl in Liverpool, New York for those who bowled USBC's in Syracuse this summer). Yeah, there's a few frequent flyer miles there.

Now, let's look at how Butturff is impacting the the all-time regional winners list, dating back to the start of the PBA Regional program in 1969. With 19 wins, Butturff is tied with three others at 43rd place

all time. If he, for example, had six more wins in 2019 taking him to 25 regional titles, he jumps 17 spots to a 26th place, five more gets him to 30 wins and up to 15th place all time. On that list are also bowlers whom have PBA50 regional wins as well.

Both Pete Weber (48 standard, 4 senior) and Dale Traber (40 standard, 12 senior) lead the list with 52 total regional wins. Couple of familiar names to regular TBN readers Chris Warren (44 standard, 1 senior) and Mike Scroggins (40 standard, 3 senior) are next with 45 and 43 wins, respectively. Not to worry, Butturff isn't eligible for those PBA50 tourneys for another 25 years. Whew.

The other three with 19 regional titles are pretty familiar names. Here's how long they took to get to 19 titles. Ernie Schlegel 1989 to 2008, the late Dave D'Entremont 1987 to 2010, and the late Sean Swanson 1997 to 2011.

Even looking at the all-time top ten, all whom have at least 40 titles, none had 19 titles in a three year period, although there is only one bowler who is close. Dale Traber (52) won ten in 1993-95, Mike Scroggins (44) nine from 2001-03, Pete Weber (52) eight from 2007-09, Chris Warren (51) eleven in 2011-13, Steve Jaros (42) ten from 2001-03, Ross Packard (42) six from 1979-81, Guppy Troup (42) seven from 2003-05, Sam Zurich (40) 14 from 1994-96 and also 1995-97. Zurich won 19 titles in four years, five each in 1994, 1995, and 1996, and four in 1997.

Even at age 25, it might be fair to say Butturff isn't even close to reaching the peak of his career. That used to occur in one's early 30's. However, that was in the pre-resin era of the early 1990's before today's power era.

Butturff's first regional victory occurred on January 31, 2016; can't wait to see how the rest of his climb up that list goes from here.

Now, here's the tribute item I wanted to get in last week. I know it's not a big deal when local football players get to play or get their names mentioned on a national broadcast here, because there have been so many reach the NFL. Their home arena is named for a coach who helped push the program from D3 to D1 in the late 1980's, Herb Brooks. Yes, that Herb Brooks.

Anyway, back to a late Sunday afternoon in November 1980, early in my freshman year. The locals were wondering as they usually do which

Vikings team would show up, the ones that took my defending champion Steelers to the final minute four weeks earlier, or the team that barely showed up at Lambeau Field the week before, dropping a 16-3 loss to the always-hated Green Bay Packers.

In the middle of the second quarter, the moment occurred. Keith Nord, usually in the defensive backfield as a safety, also took kickoffs and punts with Eddie Payton (Walter's brother). After Washington Redskin quarterback Joe Theismann was tackled in the end zone for a safety, Nord took the free kick and returned it for a touchdown, the only one of his career. Cheering was deafening across campus, as you might expect with the score now 23-0, Vikes.

Then, one of the guys told everyone to quiet down for a moment. I wasn't sure why until the television volume was suddenly turned up full blast. CBS play-by-play announcer Pat Summerall unknowingly added the exclamation point. After he said what school Nord attended, the sound of the cheering all of a sudden

ARLINGTON, Texas - The Bowling Green men and women completed the sweep last weekend in Adrian, Michigan, after claiming the top spots in their respective divisions at the Siena Heights University Halo Classic.

The Halo Classic was contested at Lenawee Recreation Center and featured nine men's teams and six women's programs. The tournament included six traditional games to go with eight Baker games, and total pinfall determined the winner in each division.

On the men's side, the Falcons took a lead of more than 300 pins during the traditional set of games and never looked back, earning the win with a 7,237 pinfall total. Olivet took second place with 6,953, and Madonna finished third with 6,940.

Madonna's Antar Howard started and finished his six-game block with games over 250 on his way to the top individual performance, finishing with a 1,361 total, a 226.83

average. Bowling Green's Steven Kocher was second with 1,255, while Olivet's Brandon Kreiner (1,234) and Spring Arbor's Austin Kraemer (1,203) were the only other players to average more than 200 for six games. Bowling Green's Kyle Waynick rounded out the top five with 1,188.

The Bowling Green women collected their second consecutive win after finding their way into the winner's circle at last week's Warrior Fall Classic in Troy, Michigan. At the Halo Classic, Bowling Green finished with 6,788 to win by more than 450 pins. Siena Heights was second with 6,328, and Spring Arbor was third with 6,287.

Bowling Green's Britni Hosterman also captured her second individual win of the season after leading the Falcons last week. She fired a 1,196 total for six games to earn the top spot, 36 pins ahead of

teammate Sabrina Romano (1,160). Spring Arbor's Kaylee Collier (1,123), Siena Heights' Tryna Gladstone (1,109) and Madonna's Rebecca West (1,074) also finished in the top five.

In other USBC Collegiate action over the weekend:

- At the Cardinal Classic in Muncie, Indiana, Wright State swept the men's and women's titles.

- At the Boilermaker Classic in Lafayette, Indiana, the St. Ambrose women defended their title, while the Robert Morris-Illinois men claimed the top spot.

- At the Great Lakes Bowling Conference I in Brooklyn Park, Minnesota, the Wisconsin-Whitewater men and Highland CC women were victorious.

Huntington, Indiana; and Kyle Troup of Taylorsville, North Carolina.

Matt Farber of Plainview, New York, and Matt Russo of Millstone Township, New Jersey, were selected to represent Team USA at the upcoming Pan American Bowling Confederation Champion of Champions event in Rio De Janeiro from Oct. 22-25. The event will be held at Rio's Bowling Social Club.

Barnes, Butturff and Jones are returning members of the gold-medal-winning team at the

World Championships, while Anderson, Tackett and Troup all will make their international debuts as members of the Team USA adult team.

"To be selected to represent the USA in the World Championships is an honor and dream come true," said Troup, who also will represent Team USA at the 2018 QubicaAMF Bowling World Cup. "I've always wanted to represent the red, white and blue in international competition. I'm fortunate to be selected with the amount of talent we have on our team this year to choose from. I'm excited to experience the atmosphere and the thrill of competition with some of my

best friends against the best bowlers in the world."

The 2017 World Championships was a combined event - men and women - something that happens every four years. The last World Men's Championships took place in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates in 2014. Team USA left that event without a gold medal.

Barnes enters the 2018 World Men's Championships with more than 20 years of experience at the event, having bowled for the first time in 1995, while Jones made his debut at the World Youth Championships a year later. Both have been a consistent

part of the team's success since professionals were invited to compete just over a decade ago.

Last year, Barnes and Jones had the opportunity to bowl doubles together for the first time in their Team USA careers, and they went on to claim the gold medal at the South Point Bowling Plaza in Las Vegas.

The three first-timers may be new to the World Championships, but they've all proven themselves on the biggest stages and calmly handled a variety of pressure situations.

Tackett is an 11-time Professional Bowlers Association Tour champion and past PBA Player of the Year (2016), Troup is fresh off a win at the Lucky Larsen Masters in Sweden and Anderson is a two-time winner on the PBA Tour this year, including the United States Bowling Congress Masters.

"I'm extremely proud of the things I've done on the PBA Tour, but I don't think you can

feel like you've had a complete career until you've won a gold medal with Team USA," said Tackett, who won two gold medals and two silver medals at the 2011 PABCON Youth Championships. "My experience traveling with Junior Team USA was awesome, and I'm looking forward to going to Hong Kong with this group of guys, too. It means a lot to have this opportunity, and win or lose, I'm going to give it 100 percent until the last ball."

Butturff, the lone left-hander headed to Hong Kong, has collected four PBA Tour titles, 19 PBA regional titles and won the 2017 QubicaAMF World Cup during his short time in the spotlight.

The difference in winning as an individual and winning with a team, especially while representing their country, definitely isn't lost on the players.

Anderson twice had the opportunity to compete at the Lee Evans Tournament of the Americas (2013 and 2014)

as a member of Junior Team USA, and he's excited for this next opportunity in his young

career.

The 23-year-old right-hander had a chance to see Team USA in action during the 2017 World Championships in Las Vegas, and that not only fueled his desire to make the team, but also to make the World Championships roster.

"I've been online to watch every Team USA event over the last eight or nine years, and I've always wanted to feel that feeling," Anderson said. "You always wonder if all the hard work is worth it, and getting the phone call and invite to the World Championships was indescribable. Every time the phone rang, my heart dropped, and when it ended up being Rod (Ross) on the other end, I didn't even know what to say."

The Team USA women will set the tone for the year this week at the PABCON Women's Championships in the Dominican Republic, before the action shifts to Brazil.

Farber and Russo will have some company on their trip to Rio De Janeiro, where they will be joined by longtime Team USA members Kelly Kulick of Union, New Jersey, and Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, New York.

"It's an exciting time for Team USA, and we're really excited to get back on the lanes to test ourselves against the best in the world," Team USA head coach Rod Ross said. "I know I say this every year, but the players seem to get more and more talented, and the depth of the team continues to grow. Making these selections gets tougher, too, as any combination of the bowlers would be amazing."

and over plus invitees hall of famers Johnny Petraglia and Brian Voss.

Down by eight pins in the fourth frame of the title match, Williams, the PBA Tour's career titles leader with 47 wins and an 11-time PBA50 Tour winner, took advantage of a missed 9-pin by Duke in the fifth frame and then struck on the next seven of eight shots to take the title.

"When I got done with practice I wasn't real excited about how I was going to play the lanes," said Williams, who turns 59 on Oct. 6. Going into the semifinal match I planned on playing the lanes straighter but I had to make an adjustment a little further inside and hook it a little more. When I go to the title match against Norm I started to feel pretty comfortable and didn't miss the pocket.

"Both of us threw good shots in the title match," Williams added. "I was fortunate that I only left two 10 pins."

Both Williams and Duke, who is third on the all-time

PBA Tour titles list with 38 wins and also owns five PBA50 Tour titles, have been bowling against each other in tour competition for more than three decades.

"We've been bowling against each other for a long time and he's a great player," Williams said. "When you bowl someone like Norm, you always feel fortunate to come out on the winning end."

Williams finished the season fourth in points with three runner-up finishes and two other top-five finishes including fifth in the PBA50 National Championship. Duke, who finished the season fifth in points, had one title in 2018 and runner-up finishes in the PBA50 National Championship and USBC Senior Masters.

Williams, who qualified second for the finals after two seven-game match play rounds, defeated No. 3 qualifier five-time PBA Tour winner Ryan Shafer of Horseheads, N.Y., 256-212, in the semifinal to advance to the title match against Duke.

Shafer, who finished ninth in points, had six PBA50 Tour top-10 finishes including a career best of second.

In the second match, Shafer beat USBC Hall of Famer and 2018 PBA50 National Championship winner Lennie Boresch Jr. of Kenosha, Wis., who qualified fifth for the finals, 257-222, to advance to the semifinal match against Williams.

In the opening match Boresch, who finished the season seventh in points, beat 2018 PBA50 Player of the Year and season points leader Michael Haugen Jr., of Phoenix, 225-207, to advance to the second stepladder match against Shafer.



O'Keefe, Richard Highlight 2018 PWBA Tour Season

ARLINGTON, Texas – The 2018 Professional Women's Bowling Association season officially is complete, highlighted by Shannon O'Keefe completing a bucket-list item in earning PWBA Player of the Year honors and Jordan Richard reaching the stepladder finals at five events on her way to the PWBA Rookie of the Year award.

O'Keefe, of Shiloh, Illinois, claimed her first PWBA Player of the Year award after winning two titles in the first four events of the 2018 season, including her second career major at the United States Bowling Congress Queens.

She led the tour in championship-round appearances (seven), which included a runner-up finish at the PWBA Greater Harrisburg Open, third place at the PWBA Tour Championship, fourth-place finishes at the PWBA East Hartford Open and BowlerX.com PWBA Twin Cities Open, and a fifth-place finish at the U.S. Women's Open.

The 39-year-old right-hander completed her career year by leading the Tour in points

(130,050), tying for the lead in cashes (13), finishing fourth in average (216.27) and making the Round of 12 nine times.

"It means the absolute world to me," said O'Keefe, after clinching the award at the QubicaAMF PWBA Players Championship. "All the hard work, dedication, the tears, the frustrations – it's all worth it. I feel I've been knocking on the door, and I've had some really good seasons. Last year, I finished third, the year before that was fifth.

"I've been climbing that ladder and knocking on the door. I just feel player of the year is something people always will remember in your career. I have bucket-list items that I'm trying to check off and that was just one of them. So, to be able to mark that off, I can move on to the next thing."

Richard, 22, stood out in what was arguably the best rookie class since the relaunch of the PWBA Tour in 2015. Despite missing the Tour's first three events, Richard settled in nicely, and, in only her fourth event, claimed her first career title at the PWBA Greater Harrisburg Open.

The two-time National Tenpin Coaches Association Division I Player of the Year finished the season second in average (217.43), third in championship-round appearances (five) and seventh in points (89,150).

The Tecumseh, Michigan, native was a mainstay on CBS Sports Network in August, making the TV finals in all four events during the month, and was the only player on tour to make four consecutive finals appearances.

She garnered a third-place finish at the BowlerX.com PWBA Twin Cities Open, fourth-place finishes at the Pepsi PWBA St. Petersburg-Clearwater Open and QubicaAMF PWBA Players Championship, and fifth-place at the Nationwide PWBA Columbus Open.

"I really don't think it will set in for a while," said Richard, after learning she had earned enough competition points to claim the honor. "It's something that I've always wanted since I'd heard about the relaunch of the PWBA in 2015. I knew when I came out here it's what I wanted. I was rookie of the year in college and then I was rookie of the year in one of the organizations that I bowled in, so it's something that I've wanted."

In addition to O'Keefe, seven

players returned to victory lane during the 2018 PWBA season including PWBA Player of the Year runner-up Danielle McEwan, who claimed the PWBA Fountain Valley Open for her fourth career title. McEwan provided O'Keefe a late scare down the stretch in the race for PWBA Player of the Year, but she fell just short of the honor.

Liz Kuhlkin captured her second career title and first major championship at the U.S. Women's Open. Kuhlkin, who won the PWBA Topeka Open in 2015, was without a title since but made major strides in 2018 to return to the winner's circle.

Stefanie Johnson captured her first career major championship at the QubicaAMF PWBA Players Championship in front of a hometown crowd at Plano Super Bowl in Plano, Texas. Johnson made the TV finals in three of the four majors this season, finishing fourth at the USBC Queens and second at the U.S. Women's Open before claiming the emotional victory.

Other players returning to victory lane in 2018 were: Josie Barnes (PWBA East Hartford Open); Liz Johnson (PBA/PWBA Striking Against Breast

Cancer Mixed Doubles, Nationwide PWBA Columbus Open); Diana Zavjalova (Pepsi PWBA St. Petersburg-Clearwater Open); and Rocio Restrepo (BowlerX.com PWBA Twin Cities Open).

Joining Richard as first-time champions in 2018 were Shayna Ng (PWBA Las Vegas Open); PWBA season average leader (217.46) Erin McCarthy (PWBA Louisville Open) and Maria Jose Rodriguez, who captured last week's PWBA Tour Championship at Richmond Raceway in Richmond, Virginia.

The 2019 PWBA Tour schedule is set and the season will kick off in Cleveland with the PWBA Greater Cleveland Open on April 25-27. The 2019 schedule includes three new venues - Golden Pin Lanes in Tucson, Arizona, Executive Strike and Spare in Louisville, Kentucky, and Buffalo Lanes North in Raleigh, North Carolina.

conducted on PBA's Wolf 33-foot pattern, the Bear Open on the Bear 39-foot pattern. The 18 players who advance to the Tulsa Open match play rounds will have the added challenge of competing on a mixed condition that uses the Bear condition on the left lane and Wolf condition on the right lane. The mixed Bear/Wolf oiling system also will be used for the Tulsa Open stepladder finals on Saturday, Oct. 20.

As the 2018 season heads down the homestretch, the Fall Swing will play a pivotal role in determining the PBA Player and Rookie of the Year award

winners. Leading contenders for Player of the Year heading into the Fall Swing are four two-time PBA Tour winners this season including four-time and reigning Player of the Year Jason Belmonte of Australia; 2016 Player of the Year EJ Tackett of Bluffton, Ind.; 2018 USBC Masters champion Andrew Anderson of Holly, Mich., and Jakob Butturff of Chandler, Ariz.

The defending champions from the last Fall Swing held in 2016 at Thunderbowl Lanes in suburban Detroit are Tackett (Bear Open), Tom Daugherty of Riverview, Fla. (Wolf Open) and Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill. (Detroit Open).

The last time the PBA Tour visited the Tulsa area was in

October 2005 when 18-time PBA Tour winner Tommy Jones of Simpsonville, S.C., won the Tulsa Championship at The Lanes at Coffee Creek, defeating Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, 289-248, in the title match. Both players are also entered in the Fall Swing which will feature a field of approximately 120 players representing 10 countries.

Of local interest will be Oklahoma players including 18-year-old two-hander Trey Ford III of Bartlesville and former touring player Mike Edwards of Tulsa. Ford made PBA history earlier this year by becoming the youngest player to win a PBA regional tournament at the age of 17. He has competed in several other PBA national events with a best finish of 11th in the PBA Grand Hotel & Resort Open in July of 2017. Edwards owns one PBA Tour title which came in the IOF Foresters Bowling For Miracles Open in 1994.

Following an official practice day on Oct. 14, the FloBowling PBA Fall Swing will get underway with two Wolf Open six-game qualifying rounds on Monday and Tuesday, Oct. 15-16. After 12 games, the top five will advance to the Wolf Open stepladder finals Tuesday at 7:30 p.m. CT.

Wednesday and Thursday, Oct. 17-18, all players will bowl two more six-game qualifying rounds in the Bear Open with the top five bowling for the Bear Open title Thursday at 7:30 p.m.

Based on the combined

24-game qualifying totals from the Wolf and Bear events, the top 18 players will advance to Tulsa Open match play, which will consist of two six-game round robin match play rounds on Friday, Oct. 19 and the final six-game round on Saturday, Oct. 20. Based on combined total pinfall for 42 games, including match play bonus pins, the top five scorers will compete for the Tulsa Open title Saturday at 12:30 p.m.

Spectator admission is \$10 each day including the stepladder finals on Oct. 20. Grassroots bowlers can bowl with the pros during a special practice session on Oct. 14 at 6 p.m. which will provide the opportunity to get instruction from some of the best bowlers in the world. For additional admission and Practice with the Pros entry information contact The Lanes at Coffee Creek by calling (918) 274-0400.



Florida's Chris Keane Earns Second PBA50 Dick Weber Sportsmanship Award

CHICAGO - Veteran PBA50 Tour player Chris Keane of Cape Coral, Fla., has been selected as the 2018 PBA50 Dick Weber Sportsmanship Award winner in voting by his fellow competitors, becoming the second two-time winner of the award.

The 60-year-old Keane, who won his first sportsmanship award in 2014, has been competing on the PBA50 Tour for eight seasons. He took the opportunity to bowl full-time on the PBA50 Tour after selling his car wash and auto repair business.

"It was very special to win it the first time and especially so the second time," Keane said. "You become such a family out here (on tour) that you want to see everyone succeed. I try to reach out and help guys whenever I can and many of them do the same for me."

"It's interesting to see the evolution of meeting someone on tour for the first time and then you become good friends. It has become such a part of our lives that we're not just bowling people; many of us also are motorhome people."

Keane has a career-high

PBA50 Tour finish of fourth in the 2015 PBA/PBA50 Tour South Shore Doubles with partner Tommy Jones. He had a 2018 season-best finish of ninth in the South Shore Open and a fifth-place finish in the season-ending PBA60 Dick Weber Championship.

"I'm happy to say that I'm getting better each year," Keane added. "Sooner or later you accept the fact that you need to do something different to get better and thankfully I've learned that lesson."

The only other player to previously earn the Dick Weber Sportsmanship Award twice was Robert Harvey in 2010 and 2013.

Other 2018 PBA50 Tour award winners were Michael Haugen Jr., who earned PBA50 Tour Player of the Year; Rolando Sebelen, Rookie of the Year, and Ron Mohr who earned his third consecutive PBA60 Player of the Year. Player and Rookie of the Year awards were based on competition points. Recipients will receive their awards during a presentation at the 2019 Suncoast PBA Senior U.S. Open in Las Vegas.

BILL O'NEILL NOW ON "BUBBLE" AS PBA-WBT THAILAND SHUFFLES PBA CLASH TOP 8 LIST

The PBA International-WBT Thailand, which concluded last Friday in Bangkok, at least temporarily shuffled the top eight qualifying positions on the 2018 Go Bowling! PBA Tour earnings list heading into the end-of-season PBA Clash, and Bill O'Neill is now "bubble boy" in the eighth spot.

Following the Thailand tournament, the top four on the 2018 PBA Tour earnings list remain the same: Jason Belmonte, Anthony Simonsen, Dom Barrett and Andrew Anderson. After a fourth-place finish in Thailand, Kyle Troup has moved up two spots to fifth; EJ Tackett drops one spot to sixth, Marshall Kent is seventh (down from sixth) and O'Neill is now on the bubble in eighth place, moving up two spots after finishing 15th in Thailand. Jesper Svensson has advanced to ninth (\$1,470 behind O'Neill) followed by Jakob Butturff and Tom Smallwood.

Attention now turns to the FloBowling PBA Fall Swing (including the Wolf Open, Bear Open and Tulsa Open) at The Lanes at Coffee Creek in suburban Tulsa, Okla., Oct. 15-

20, followed by the U.S. Open at Northrock Lanes in Wichita, Kan., Oct. 24-31, which will decide the earnings race.

PBA Xtra Frame on FloBowling will cover the PBA Fall Swing live from start to finish. Subscriptions are available at FloBowling.com. The preliminary rounds of the U.S. Open also will be live-streamed by Xtra Frame on FloBowling, Oct. 26-30, before the finals air live on CBS Sports Network on Oct. 31.

The WBT Thailand was also a WBT points event. The top three men and top three women in WBT points for the 2018 season will compete in the World Bowling Tour Men's and Women's Finals presented by the PBA which will be contested at the International Training and Research Center in Arlington, Texas, for airing on FS1 on Sunday, March 10, at 10 p.m. EST.

The current top five in men's WBT points are: Anthony Simonsen, Stuart Williams, Kyle Troup, Andrew Anderson and Sean Rash. The women's top five are WBT Thailand winner Danielle McEwan, Liz Johnson, Daria Pajak, Siti Safiyah Amirah and Shannon O'Keefe.

The final three events to earn WBT points in 2018 will be the PBA Tulsa Open, the U.S. Open and the all-events division of the World Bowling Men's World Championships Nov. 24-Dec. 5 in Hong Kong.

PBA REGIONAL UPDATE: BUTTURFF WINS 19TH REGIONAL TITLE IN ROHNERT PARK

Top qualifier Jakob Butturff of Tempe, Ariz., defeated Josh Blanchard of Mesa, Ariz., 259-206, to win the PBA Double Decker Lanes West/Northwest Open presented by Roto Grip at Double Decker Lanes Sunday, continuing his unprecedented domination of PBA Regional competition in the west.

The win, which was covered live by PBA Xtra Frame on FloBowling, was Butturff's 19th regional title in his three-year PBA career, and earned the \$2,000 top prize.

Blanchard defeated Wayne Garber of Modesto, Calif., 232-222, in the semifinal match after Garber defeated Tim Cagle II of Hercules, Calif., in the opening match, 223-174.

-Keith Lesko of Prosper, Texas, defeated Mac Sanders of Taylors, S.C., 223-216, to win the PBA50 J&L Sports Spartan-

burg South Open at Paradise Lanes in Spartanburg, S.C., Sunday.

Lesko won \$1,900 along with his fifth career regional title. After rolling a strike in the ninth frame, he needed another on his first shot in the 10th frame to take the title and he delivered the shot he needed.

In the semifinal round, Lesko eliminated Craig Auerbach of Sunrise, Fla., 244-178, while Sanders disposed of Tim Regan of East Northport, N.Y., 280-183.

-The PBA Regional schedule for the Oct. 12-14 weekend includes the PBA50-PBA60 Central Doubles Open presented by Columbia 300 at Park Centre Lanes in North Canton, Ohio and the PBA50 and PBA60 Dick's Pro Shop Northwest/West doubleheader presented by Boulder Falls at Linn Lanes in Portland, Ore.

-The Oct. 19-21 PBA Regional calendar includes the PBA50 Waxahachie South-west Open at Hilltop Lanes in Waxahachie, Texas, and the Jackson Central/Midwest Open at Dave Small's Jax 60 in Jackson, Mich.

QUICK NOTES:

-PBA's list of all-time regional title winners suggests no PBA member has come close to Jakob Butturff's record in regional competition in his first three years as a member. Unofficially - because the PBA has never created record categories for its regional program - the closest to Butturff's performance would be newly-elected PBA Hall of Famer Patrick Allen who won 10 of his 30 career PBA Regional titles between 2000 and 2002, his first three years of membership.

A quick check suggests no other PBA member has reached double figures in regional wins in a similar three-year span to start a career. Among the all-time regional title leaders, Chris Warren is no. 1 with 47 titles, but won only five times in his first three years. Pete Weber (second with 46 regional titles) won three times; Steve Jaros (43) won five times and Walter Ray Williams Jr. (33) won two regional titles in his first three years.

The PBA has previously noted that the 24-year-old left-hander won a record nine regional titles in his rookie year (2016), four in 2017 and six times as of Sunday in 2018.

literally had feel. In the era well before bigger cable and satellite TV, the internet, and social media, our school name was mentioned where it wasn't mentioned much before, on national television. Someone later joked that it compared to be named on the 'Playboy' magazine list as a party school some ten years earlier; this was another great day in school history.

Also part of the joy was the story of how Nord got to the NFL. Undrafted, he made the

Vikings as a walk on, following his senior year at St. Cloud State. The 5' 9" Nord played seven seasons, 1979 to 1985. As the top special teams tackler his first four years, he became special teams captain in 1983, the first native Minnesotan to do so.

He still holds the school record for kickoff return average with 26.7 yards per return. SCSU Football has given the annual Keith Nord Award for a number of years as described by the SCSU athletics website to "...the most dedicated and determined football player," as voted on by the players themselves. Nord was the

guy who wasn't supposed to achieve what he did. But he made it anyway, even becoming a sought-after motivational speaker after retiring. That's when he wasn't in a deer stand or out with his Irish setters quail and grouse hunting.

Diagnosed only this spring, Nord passed away September 19 from stomach cancer at the age of 61. In one of his presentations later posted to YouTube, he said after his dad passed at age 57, Nord vowed to live life to the fullest with the best of his abilities. Yes, he sure did.
