



Yannaphon Larpapharat Wins PBA International-WBT Thailand Title

BANGKOK, Thailand (Oct. 6, 2017) – Yannaphon Larpapharat became the first bowler from Thailand to win a PBA Tour title when he threw two strikes in the 10th frame to defeat Swedish two-handed star Jesper Svensson, 212-202, in the championship match of the PBA International-WBT Thailand at Blu-O Rhythm and Bowl Paragon on Friday in his home city.

Larpapharat, a 34-year-old right-hander and a third-year PBA member, was the top qualifier heading into the eight-player stepladder finals, and won the equivalent of

US\$32,255 over a world-class field of American and international PBA competitors. Larpapharat, who previously bowled in the 2008 PBA World Championship in Wichita, Kan., and the 2015 U.S. Open in Arlington, Texas, will return to the United States to bowl in the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling IX, presented by

Francois Lavoie Wins PBA Killeen Southwest Open

Killeen, Texas, (October 3, 2017) – Reigning U.S. Open champion Francois Lavoie from Quebec City, Canada, defeated Kurt Gengelbach of Carrollton, Texas, 243-221, to win his third PBA Regional title in the 21st annual PBA Killeen Southwest Open at Hallmark Lanes Sunday.

Lavoie opened the title match with a spare and then struck six out of the next seven frames to outdistance Gengelbach who started the final game with four strikes before suffering opens in the fifth and seventh frames, allowing Lavoie to claim the \$2,700 winner's check.

Lavoie started his road to victory by topping Brian Burkett of Ennis, Texas, 2-1 in their best-of-three-game Round of 12 match. He then eliminated Andy Patterson from

Tyler, Texas, in the Round of 8, 2-1. In his semifinal round match, PBA Southwest Region Hall of Famer Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, could not keep up with Lavoie, succumbing, 231-183.

Gengelbach, who won his first of two PBA regional titles in 1982, defeated Gabe Yanas

Six Team USA Women Selected for 2017 World Championships

ARLINGTON, Texas - When the Team USA women put their team title on the line at the 2017 World Bowling World Championships, they'll do so on their home soil and with five of the six gold medalists returning.

The event is scheduled for Nov. 24-Dec. 4 at the South Point Bowling Plaza in Las Vegas.

The United States will be represented by defending world champions Stefanie Johnson, of McKinney, Texas, Kelly Kulick

of Union, New Jersey, Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, New York, Shannon O'Keefe of O'Fallon, Illinois, and Shannon Pluhowsky of Dayton, Ohio, and the quintet will be joined by World Championships first-timer Josie Barnes of Nashville, Tennessee.

Team USA won the world title at the 2015 World Bowling Women's Championships held in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates.

Now, all six team members

Just Paying Attention

The latest edition to the PBA Video library is a unique series about some of the most recent major tournament wins. The series, titled 'PBA Players Perspective' provides a ball-by-ball description from the major tournament winner, focusing on the victorious title match of the tournament in real time. The most recent release features 2016 Barbasol PBA Players Championship winner Graham Fach, the first Canadian winner on the PBA Tour.

As the telecast of the game runs in most of the screen, the featured winner appears in a corner of the screen, talking about his thoughts and strategy. The concept is in a vein similar to the latest retrospective pieces done by NFL Films (America's Game, Missing Rings, A Football Life), on winning teams, some of the who could have won in the Super Bowl era, and stories you may not know about the big names in the business.

As the players talk, we can watch them in a corner of the screen react as they relive one of the most memorable matches of their careers. Some of the insight is what you might think, but some observations are astounding and really worth a watch.

The first 'Perspective' was

released June 1, featuring reigning PBA Player of the Year E.J. Tackett on his 2016 PBA World Championship win. Others in the series include Ryan Ciminelli and his 2015 U.S. Open win, Kyle Troup and Jesper Svensson on the 2017 Roth/Holman Doubles, Francois Lavoie's on the 2016 U.S. Open, Gary Faulkner, Jr on his 2015 PBA World Championship win, Dom Barrett on the 2013 PBA World Championship, and Anthony Simonsen on the 2016 USBC Masters triumph.

Last week, two more 'Perspectives' became available on PBA Xtra Frame. Sean Rash describes his 2016 PBA Detroit Open win over Jason Belmonte. Francois Lavoie walks us through his historic U.S. Open win, including the first TV 300 game in a U.S. Open telecast last fall.

If you're ever at Town and Country Bowl in Burlington, Wisconsin, just across the Illinois state line, you will be greeted by a myriad of pictures around the center and behind the bowling counter. The largest of the signed pictures is of former Burlington High School and former Dallas Cowboy quarterback Tony Romo and former Green Bay Packer quarterback Brett Favre.

Although a few locals still wish he could have been drafted by the Pack, they could not be more surprised and pleased by his effort so far in the 2017 season. Their guy is creating a stir in a network television broadcast booth not seen since John Madden first seasons in the early 1980's.

In the span of a literally a handful of games, Romo has already made a name for himself as a color analyst. His approach is a much more difficult way, since he will take on the seer, sage, and soothsayer approach and tell us what we are about to see, as well as analyze what just happened.

Since he was an active player last season, he's acutely aware of what certain coaches will call for plays in a given situation and how certain players will react in a given play. The interesting thing is how often Romo is correct in what he predicts will happen. He'll then analyze what we just saw, then hand it off to lead announcer Jim Nantz for the play-by-play. That's the tremendous advantage a very recently-retired player has in the booth.

Some criticism has come from a technical standpoint. Romo will sometimes step on Nantz verbally, meaning they will both be speaking at the same time, common for two or three-person teams in the booth who haven't worked together before. But what Romo has shown so far for content easily outweighs any overlapping talking. Those verbal overlappings will go away with time.

What John Madden brought to the booth was a similar knowledge thread about plays and specific tasks of certain players on the field. It also helped his play-by-play partner, Pat Summerall, used very few words in calling a game, letting the pictures we saw tell the story. And yes, for those of your scoring at home, there is a difference in a television call versus a radio call of a game. Let the television pictures tell your story, but words carry the radio call. So there is some credence on how some prefer the radio call while watching a telecast, there's more coloring in the outline your eyes are watching being drawn. That brings me to my next point on other former players who've jumped into the broadcast booth.

The current crop of A-team network analysts, like Chris Collinsworth, and Phil Simms (before being bumped to the pregame show after Romo's hiring), are some of the most disliked analysts ever, if you believe everything you see on social media and sports talk radio shows.

They will go into what I call traditional analyst mode and

here's what I mean. Player X is having a big game, making a notable lengthy series of plays at or above his usual level. A compliment is paid to that player for many of those noteworthy plays. The problem comes when Player X doesn't make a play or is far away from the main play, Player X still gets mentioned. It's almost as if Player X becomes the story, rather than sticking with the nuts and bolts play-by-play. Now, let's add another player, call him Player Y. If Player Y's team is making a comeback, Player X still gets more mention, although Player Y is helping his team to tie or go ahead, Player X still gets a mention. Once that happens a few times, viewers of any game they work will start to tune out.

In the ESPN era (almost forty years now) and with

social media, and information literally at our fingertips, more fans and viewers know more facts, traits, and trends of their teams. Fresh information outside the locker room isn't that common anymore.

This is one of a handful of scenarios which can get fans to search online for the hometown radio feed of a game, rather than the television network audio. But when Jim Nantz and Tony Romo are working CBS' lead game that week, viewers are watching to hear what Romo is saying.

Finally this week, museum work is more than showing off and preserving historic items inside display cases. In the next few weeks, I'll have details about what's being done to preserve the visual media history of our sport.

“BIRTHDAY BOY” WALTER RAY WILLIAMS JR. BOOSTS CAREER PBA TITLES TOTAL TO 105

Aging like a fine wine, PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Oxford, Fla., celebrated his 58th birthday Friday, six days after defeating amateur Robert Crain of Gray Court, S.C., 257-174, for his 105th career PBA title Sunday in Spartanburg, S.C.

Williams, PBA's all-time leading title winner, picked up his third PBA50 regional title in the month of September in the PBA50 J & L Sports Spartanburg South Open at Paradise Lanes. Over his 37-year PBA career, he has won 47 PBA Tour, 32 PBA Regional, 11 PBA50 Tour and now 15 PBA50 Regional titles.

Unofficially, Williams has competed in 823 PBA Tour, 192 PBA Regional, 83 PBA50 Tour and 35 PBA50 Regional events – a grand total of 1,133 tournaments.

After qualifying in a tie for 15th place to slip into the Spartanburg elimination bracket finals, he never looked back in winning five consecutive matches on his way to the \$1,900 first prize. Crain pocketed \$1,000 as the runner-up.

Williams started his climb by eliminating Joe Scarborough of Charlotte, N.C., 2-0 in the best-of-three-game Round of 16, followed by a 2-0 sweep of Ernie Segura of Taylor, Mich., in the Round of 12; another 2-0 sweep of Roy Davis of Lumberton, N.C., in the Round of 8, and 210-195 victory over Doug Becker of Clermont, Fla., in the semifinal round. Crain won his Rounds of 12 and 8 matches before rallying to eliminate PBA Hall of Famer Tom Baker of King, N.C., 199-178, in his semifinal match.





are coming off a successful 2017 campaign on the Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour, where four earned titles during the 14-event season.

"Being able to represent our country is something we always dream of and look forward to, and to be able to do it on our own turf and as defending champions makes it even

more special," said Pluhowsky, a 17-time Team USA member who will make her sixth appearance at the adult World Championships. "Things didn't exactly go as planned last time we were in this position (2013), so everyone is extra motivated. I know we're all planning to work very hard over the next two months to be as prepared as possible."

With Pluhowsky's help in Hong Kong in 2011, the Team USA women ended a 24-year title drought in the team event,

but they fell short in their title defense in 2013 when the tournament visited Sunset Station's Strike Zone Bowling Center in Henderson, Nevada. They earned the silver medal, falling to Korea in the final.

The 2017 World Championships will be a combined men's and women's event, which happens every four years.

The 2013 World Championships at Sunset Station also was a combined event. Along with Korea winning the team gold medal on the women's side, Finland downed Team USA for the men's title.

Again this year, there will be medals up for grabs in six disciplines - singles, doubles, trios, team, all-events and Masters.

Qualifying in singles, doubles, trios and team traditionally consists of six games. The top four then advance to the semifinals, with the winners moving on to gold medal match.

Though Barnes will make her first appearance at the World Championships, she is very familiar with international competition.

The 29-year-old right-hander is a five-time member of Team USA, which came after five appearances on Junior Team USA, and she has earned more than a dozen medals while representing the United States.

"I've been around the Team USA program for a long time, and this is something you always hope for but never expect, and I'm very grateful and excited," said Barnes, also a Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour titlist. "I've always had a lot of goals and things I wanted to achieve, and this definitely is one of them. I don't really get nervous about a lot of things, but this feels different. I'm a little nervous about the overall experience, but not necessarily about the bowling part."

Barnes is a frequent world traveler, but having the World Championships back in her home country adds an extra level of comfort for her debut at the event.

"For this being my first time, it might be a good thing that it's close to home and somewhere familiar and relatively comfortable," Barnes said. "Of course, I love to travel, but how cool would it be to win a gold medal in our own country?"

The selection of the Team USA representatives came after a recent training camp at the International Training and Research Center in Arlington. The camp allowed the Team USA women to shift gears from the individual environment they experienced on the PWBA Tour to the team cohesiveness necessary for success on the world stage.

They spent the week working on team building and communication, making sure they're sharp physically and bowling on the oil patterns

in the bank of World Bowling lane conditions that has been selected for the 2017 event. The actual pattern will be announced on-site in Las Vegas.

"It quickly became clear how deep the talent is and how sharp everyone is after a successful collegiate or PWBA season," said Team USA head coach Rod Ross. "This group of players made a huge statement with the win in 2015, and it will be special for them to defend their title. Josie is an experienced competitor and successful coach, and she'll be a great addition in 2017."

The 2017 representatives for the Team USA men will be announced following their training camp in October.




