

U.S. Open Missing Major for Belmonte

ARLINGTON, Texas - Jason Belmonte recently spent eight days enjoying a relaxing holiday on the quiet beaches of northern New South Wales, Australia, but don't think the sunshine and sandcastles distracted him from the wave of success he's been riding on the Professional Bowlers Association Tour in 2019.

The 36-year-old two-hander is having a career year that includes four titles and more than \$275,000 in earnings. He leads the PBA Tour in prize money, points, average and championship-round appearances - 11 in 18 events - and he's put himself in position to be the PBA Player of the Year for the fifth time.

More than a decade into his professional bowling career, Belmonte's success in 2019 isn't

new, but it's different.

Much like the Pottsville coastline he recently walked with his wife and three children, there have been high and low tides, but, ultimately, there's harmony and balance, which often requires as much work as mastering lane conditions and hand positions.

"I like to live my life in a balanced way, and that takes work, but it has become even more important as our family has grown," Belmonte said. "If I don't spend time with my family and get the R&R (rest and relaxation), my bowling suffers. If I bowl too much, the family

aspect suffers. The recent trip is something we started planning in January, and for our calendars to align and allow us to do that, was incredibly special."

Belmonte's wife, Kimberly, is a registered nurse, and their children - Aria, Hugo and Sylvie - keep busy with school, sports and other activities, so the stress-free getaway was rare and appreciated. It also gave them a chance to visit with friends and family.

Now recharged, Belmonte is ready to focus on the next major stop on his travel itinerary - the 2019 U.S. Open.

When his family goes to bed each night over the next 10 days, the 22-time PBA Tour champion will be on the lanes working on everything from playing different parts of the lane to using a variety of releases to help make sure he's prepared for the challenging oil patterns he'll face at one of bowling's most mentally and physically demanding events.

Practicing at night also aids in maintaining the life balance and allows him to give his full attention to each important aspect.

He will be among the 144

Dexter Bowling, IBC Youth Extend Partnership Agreement

ARLINGTON, Texas - Dexter Bowling will remain the title sponsor of the annual Dexter High School All-American Team through the 2022 season after renewing its partnership agreement with International Bowling Congress Youth Development.

Since the 2005-2006 season, Dexter has worked with IBC Youth each season to select five male and five female student-athletes for the prestigious award. Selections are determined from a nationwide pool of applicants and are based on the student-athlete's high school bowling accomplishments, academic achievement, recommendations, extracurricular

and community involvement, and submitted essays.

"Over the past 14 years, the Dexter High School All-American Team has become one of the most prestigious honors a youth bowler can receive," Dexter Bowling Vice President Tyler Jensen said. "We are excited to continue the partnership with IBC youth to showcase high school bowlers who excel on the lanes, in the classroom and in their communities."

Those selected to the Dexter High School All-American Team each receive a \$1,000 scholarship. In addition, one team member is selected as team captain and receives the \$500 Dexter Bud Clapsaddle Scholarship. The award is

named for the former Dexter Bowling vice president who oversaw selection of the first 12 Dexter High School All-American teams.

IBC Youth will continue to recognize the Dexter High School All-American Team each year at the Junior Gold Championships.

Dexter Bowling also will remain the exclusive sponsor of the Intercollegiate Team Championships Coach and Player Lunch as part of this extended agreement.

FloBowling followed Kyle Sherman around at the ATX Invite, even while he recorded and produced a B & K video, showing a glimpse of one of the most innovative bowling series ever, online or otherwise. The piece shows Kyle as he forms the plan of attack with a ball and equipment rep, including talking slide soles with local Austin legend Robert Lawrence, and chatting with an opponent or two.

As we've seen on his "Brad and Kyle" YouTube channel, Sherman isn't afraid to show different sides of his tour and personal life. This is another great video showing a younger tour player at age 25 making progress in his competitive career.

Kyle's latest Columbia 300 ball review video, produced by none other than "The Pulse" Mike Flanagan, features a trick shot rolling the ball down the lane outlined with 25 balls on either side of his strike line. Another trick shot is Sherman lofting the ball for a strike over a double layer of balls stacked five wide and three high (yep, that's 30). Set to a high energy music track and a handheld

camera with purposeful shaky movement, it's really a well done piece, inviting multiple viewings, while still keeping the point in mind, and that is to show off the ball.

These are two examples of how world class athletics and media sophistication have merged, showing us a wonderful insight into how they do what they do oh so well and still move merchandise.

I'll totally agree with my media comrades stating Tommy Jones should be a first ballot Hall of Famer. Knowing the group is much smaller than the Baseball Writers of America, whom votes on those eventually making speeches every July in Cooperstown, New York, I know we don't have the behind the scenes deals and bureaucracy as they do.

Currently, Jones has 19 PBA titles. His majors include a Tournament of Champions, a U.S. Open, and two Japan Cups. An easy choice for us voters, a no doubt "Yes."

Upon examining the October 7 story and list on FloBowling.com by Lucas Wiseman, the all-time titles list reflects the

evolution of the PBA Tour from a 35 weeks/year tour to what it is now.

Thirty titles then was considered the gold standard. Due to fewer tournaments today, that number may be twenty. Jones and Chris Barnes both have 19. Could both reach 20? Absolutely. Barnes won in Lubbock last year, and Jones made a show at the PBA Summer Swing weeks ago.

You don't think reaching 20 is a big deal? When I bowled the 2014 USBC OC 2014 with Wayne Webb, I asked about a piece of his jewelry with the number "20" on it, knowing full well what it represented. Told me with a rye smile it's a nice round number and damned proud of it. Webb's 20th and last tour title was in 1997. Barnes and Jones began their careers in the backend of the 35 week tour era, Chris winning his first in 1999, Tommy in 2004.

If thirty was gold and forty platinum then, who knows what 40 is now, with Norm Duke reaching it earlier this year after the win in Jonesboro. But what does that make twenty now? And who is next to reach it? Besides Barnes and TJ being prohibitive favorites, the next current players are Sean Rash with 14 titles, E.J. Tackett with 13, Bill O'Neill with 11, and Wes Malott with 10.

Being only 26, Tackett has the best shot having at least ten more productive years, although Rash and his 2019 season would say otherwise.

Finally, this week, a little commentary about how times have changed in professional sports.

I get asked from time to time why I include items from years ago. My usual answer is to find out where you are and where you are going, you have to know where you've been. The "where we've been" part is often a little stunning to newer readers or younger readers who are stunned to find out athletes haven't always pounded their chests after a slam dunk, acrobatic touchdown catch, a nuclear messenger strike, or bat flip after a late inning home run.

An ad running during the MLB playoffs begins with the phrase, "They say baseball isn't like it used to be." It shows current players doing what they do to celebrate after a successful play inserted into classic MLB black and white film footage dating back to the days before television. The point of the ad is illustrating how today's players "Play Loud." Younger fans are surprised to discover athletes weren't always like this.

One answer to "where we've been" is in baseball video series that has found its way to YouTube. The 1969 New York Mets won the World Series as a 100 to 1 shot (+ 10000 in today's sports betting number) after seven prior years either near or in last place, another story is of the other team who early on that season appeared to be headed that way, only to be caught and passed by those Mets, the 1969 Chicago Cubs.

Produced by the Cubs, the five part series takes viewers (my Cub fan wife among them) and relives the one of the most

loved second place teams in MLB history. In Part Two, the origins of Cub third baseman Ron Santo's habit of clicking his heels after a home win as the players headed to their left field clubhouse door, at first, an impromptu celebratory statement, is told as Santo endeared himself to the first of several generations of fans. I know of one gal who wore her #10 Santo jersey as her "wedding dress."

New York Met right fielder Ron Swoboda explains opposing players really took offense to it and used Santo's habit

PBA TONY REYES COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD NOMINATIONS DUE NOV. 22

Nominations are now being accepted for one of the PBA's most prestigious awards, the PBA Tony Reyes Community Service award, which is presented annually to a current PBA member who does extraordinary community service, charitable and/or educational contributions over the course of a PBA Tour season. To be eligible, the nominee must be a PBA member in good standing.

The community service award was first presented in 2013, a year after the PBA Tour champion died as a result of injuries sustained in an automobile accident near his home in northern California. Reyes, one of the PBA's most popular players, was a former collegiate All-American bowler, an eight-time PBA Regional title winner and the 18th player in PBA history to bowl a nationally-televised 300 game.

Following Reyes' death on Sept. 28, 2012, a group of his fellow competitors gathered in front of a tribute masking unit created in Reyes' honor for the PBA World Series of Bowling at South Point in Las Vegas.

DICK RITGER REFLECTS ON PBA'S "MOST MEMORABLE MOMENT"

"When Don Johnson collapsed on the alley after leaving the 10-pin standing to finish with a 299 in the finals of the 1970 Firestone Tournament of Champions, Dick Ritger was there to pick him up."

That statement by Bob Burrows summarized Burrows' interview with 80-year-old PBA Hall of Famer Dick Ritger at his northern Wisconsin home, published in the Hudson (Wis.) Star-Observer, in which Ritger addressed his role in the event that was ranked No. 1 in the PBA's 60 Most Memorable Moments, celebrated during the PBA's 60th anniversary season in 2018.

Ritger, Johnson's victim in that famous match, was sitting on the bench watching the historic almost-perfect shot unfold, and he related his recollections about Johnson's 299 game and his own career in Burrows' feature story (<https://www.rivertowns.net/sports/4560493-one-ages-ritger-part-pbas-no-1-greatest-moment>).

Included in the interview is Ritger's personal reflection of a memorable perfect game of his own:

"I bowled a 300 at the Miller Tournament in Milwaukee one year and you know what I got for a prize? Beer for a year," he said. "Fifty-two cases. I didn't drink so we donated the money to the Milwaukee Children's hospital."





competitors at the upcoming event, which will take place at Victory Lanes in Mooresville, North Carolina, from Oct. 23-30.

A pre-tournament qualifier will be held Oct. 23, and the three days of U.S. Open qualifying will begin Oct. 25. The tournament will conclude live on CBS Sports Network on Oct. 30 at 8 p.m. Eastern.

And, even though winter in Australia is over, Belmonte would love to return home wearing a new jacket, the coveted green jacket given to each U.S. Open champion. It's something he's never experienced, despite owning the most major titles in PBA Tour history with 11, including two this season.

In 10 appearances at the U.S. Open, Belmonte has a pair of top-five performance. He finished second to Wes Malott in 2013.

"It's a tricky psychological thing to not constantly think about the U.S. Open being the one I haven't won," Belmonte said. "I believe I have the ability and that sometime in my career I'll win it. I know this won't be my last one, so there's no added pressure there. I'm hoping that someday the stars align, but I'm not looking at this as a must-win. I'll certainly give it my all, and if I execute to the best of my ability, there's no reason I can't be in contention."

Belmonte won two of the season's first four majors, the PBA Tournament of Champions and PBA World Championship,

while finishing second in the PBA Players Championship in between. The victory at the World Championship moved him ahead of Pete Weber and Earl Anthony, who each own 10 major titles.

In the year's other major, the United States Bowling Congress Masters, a severe finger injury kept Belmonte from making a run in the storied event, one he has won a record four times. He finished 169th.

Even when he's at his best, Belmonte sometimes has to battle the jet lag that comes with traveling more than 10,000 miles to compete on the PBA Tour. It's not an excuse, but it is a reality that can slow him down early in an event.

This is something he has worked on during his career, with the ultimate takeaway being that winning doesn't mean leading from Game 1.

This time, though, he'll already be acclimated, since he'll be in the United States early to compete in the PBA Clash, a special event featuring the top eight money winners from the 2019 season.

He's hoping the combination of comfort and confidence lead to success at Victory Lanes.

"Success leads to confidence, and a wave of confidence in any sport definitely helps the athletes do well," Belmonte said. "I feel like it has been a decade-long wave for me, and the last 10 years have gone better than I ever could've expected. I enjoy the format at the U.S. Open, and I've bowled well, even though it hasn't ended with me holding the trophy and wearing the green jacket."

U.S. Open will bowl 24 games of qualifying over three days, before the field is cut to the top 36 performers for a cashers' round, which will whittle the field down to 24 bowlers.

Each day will feature eight games on a different oil pattern. The cashers' round, all 24 games of match play and the televised finals all will be contested on the same lane condition.

As much as Belmonte has embraced his role as a pioneer in bowling, he also appreciates the sport's long history and those who paved the way for him to make a career on the lanes.

When it comes to the U.S. Open, he recognizes the toughness of those who have been able to navigate the 56-game grind and find success at one of the sport's most prestigious tournaments.

He expects to be exhausted, but proud, when the 2019 U.S. Open concludes, win or lose.

"This event should always be a grind on some tough conditions, and you should want to sleep for a long time when it's over," Belmonte said. "Even though I haven't won, I've always been drained, in a good way, when it was over. It would mean everything to win a 12th major and the green jacket. It's probably the most prestigious event, and if you look at the list of winners, it is one I absolutely would love to add my own name to."

Belmonte's maturity and balance extend beyond his home or the bowling center, and he's constantly preparing for the day when traveling and bowling no longer make sense for him and his family.

Built into his daily responsibilities are other points of focus and roles as an ambassador and entrepreneur. He's using his influence to grow the sport globally and building his own brand to help secure his post-bowling future.

He spends countless hours making appearances and participating in projects that help bowling's visibility, like his recent partnership with NASCAR's Aric Almirola, in which the two teamed up at Charlotte Motor Speedway to record the world's fastest strike.

Almirola drove around the track at 140 miles per hour, and Belmonte threw a bowling ball out of the car window into a full rack of pins.

The feat received hundreds of thousands of views, gaining exposure for both sports. Bowling fans got a closer look at NASCAR, and the NASCAR nation got to learn a little about bowling.

Within the industry, Belmonte recently has contributed

as "bulletin board material," something that they used as incentive to win and not to get shown up by the heel clicking. If a player would draw attention to himself in that way then, a fastball in the ribcage or hip was the usual remedy or message sent during that player's next at bat. That's just how things were.

Bowling social media is

full of comments about how things used to be and the way they were, often longing for 1970's before Marshall Holman or even the pre 2000's PDW's crotch chop. Much of the same has been said about the Bowlero/PBA deal. Pro bowling will be ruined by encouraging the loud shouts from the diaphragm, chest pounding, or even a phrase meant to be heard by the opponent.

What the newer entities into the bowling industry (Bowlero and FloSports) are starting to

realize is there is still an older fan base that has seen its sport go from higher profile network television to near extinction only twenty years ago.

Reflecting the times in which we live, the PBA has had to reinvent itself to get the next generation to watch, then hope it cares enough to watch some more. Let's see what Bowlero has to fuel the Fox telecasts and FloBowling live streams. Who knows, 40 PBA titles may be reachable again.


