


## PBA Star Tommy Jones, Former Ownership Partners Mike Slade, Rob Glaser Elected to PBA Hall of Fame

Class of 2020 induction ceremonies set for January 18 in Arlington, Texas

CHICAGO (Oct. 17, 2019) – Nineteen-time title winner Tommy Jones of Simpsonville, South Carolina, and former ownership partners Mike Slade and Rob Glaser have been elected to the Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Fame, PBA Commissioner Tom Clark announced today.

Jones was unanimously elected for superior performance by an elite panel of veteran bowling writers and PBA Hall of Famers. Slade and Glaser were elected for meritorious service by the PBA Hall of Fame Board.

Induction ceremonies of the 2020 Hall of Fame Class will take place on Saturday, Jan. 18, at the International Bowling

Museum and Hall of Fame, and the Arlington Hilton, in Arlington, Texas, as part of the PBA Hall of Fame Classic tournament weekend.

Jones, one of five PBA players to win both PBA Rookie (2001-02) and Player of the Year (2005-06) honors, has earned more than \$1.7 million in his 20-year PBA career. The 41-year-old power player owns 17 standard PBA Tour titles plus two majors: the 2006 U.S. Open and 2007 PBA Tournament of Champions. He

has finished in the top 10 in annual PBA Tour earnings nine times and has finished in the top five in 47 of the 326 PBA Tour tournaments he entered, cashing in a remarkable 80.3 percent of those events.

An 11-time member of Team USA, Jones also has been on winning teams in PBA League Elias Cup competition three times and was the recipient of the PBA League Mark Roth Most Valuable Player Award in 2017.

"It's one of those things I probably wouldn't have known was coming if I hadn't seen an article about being on the ballot," Jones said of his election to the Hall. "It's a huge honor to be among all of those players who are in the Hall. It's something you dream about all of your life. It'll probably hit me when I'm standing up in front of the crowd to accept."

Defining moments in Jones' career? "For me, it's a combina-

## Collegiate Ticker

The Notre Dame College women and the Lincoln Memorial men earned wins last weekend at the Orange and Black Classic.

The women's division was contested at Poelking Lanes South in Centerville, Ohio, site of the 2019 Intercollegiate Team Championships, while the men's division was held at Beaver-Vu Bowl in Beavercreek, Ohio.

A total of 25 women's and 33 men's varsity teams were on hand to compete in five traditional games and 16

Baker games before the top eight teams in each division advanced to an eight-team best-of-five match-play bracket to determine the champions.

The Pikeville women grabbed the lead on Day 1 with a 147-pin lead over Lourdes after five traditional games, but Day 2 saw Lourdes post the highest 16-game Baker total to edge Pikeville for the top overall seed heading into bracket match play. After sweeping No. 8 Alma in the opening round, Lourdes went the distance with No. 5 Notre Dame College, but it was the Falcons who emerged

victorious, defeating the Lourdes, 3-2, to advance to the title match.

Notre Dame's effort set up a title match with the host school taking on No. 2 Pikeville. The Lady Bears had opened the bracket with a three-game sweep of Lawrence Tech before defeating Urbana, 3-1, in the semifinals to advance to the title match. In the finals, Notre Dame College knocked off Pikeville, 3-1, for their second tournament victory of the season.

Individually, Pikeville dominated the top five as three

Lady Bears earned spots on the all-tournament team. Pikeville's Lauren Piotrowski, who won the individual crown last weekend at the MSC Louisville Collegiate Classic, claimed the top spot with a five-game total of 983, an average of 196.6. She was followed by teammate Brittney Turcotte (978), Lawrence Tech's Victoria Giardina (977), Concordia's Mikayla Lancioni (972) and Pikeville's Stephanie Crider (970).

On the men's side, Lincoln Memorial used a tournament high game of 1,235 to hold the lead after five traditional games with a total of 5,302. But as many as five teams were in contention to claim the top overall seed during Sunday's Baker competition and the honor went to Notre Dame College (8,580), which edged Lawrence Tech (8,560).

# Just Paying Attention

With the final major tournament of the PBA Tour being contested this week, the U.S. Open has offered more than its share of memorable and noteworthy moments over the years. More than a few of those moments have been authored by those who have resided in TBN coverage area. Like today's Open, they were contested on oil patterns tour players of the day rarely saw or bowled, demanding great patience and a great ball roll.

Let's go back to the final year the Open was known by its original name and format, the BPAA All Star.

1970 - Arkansas native Bobby Cooper grew up in Dallas, earning both 1966 PBA and 1966 Sporting News Rookie of the Year honors. His biggest win was the 1970 BPAA All Star, back when the tournament was 100 games bowled over six to seven days. Cooper passed away in 2006.

1983 - Gary Dickinson was one of the steadiest tour players of this era, his smooth style often seen in major and longer format tournament finals. How often you ask? Longtime TBN readers remember the

three Firestone Tournament of Champions finals, three Brunswick World Open finals (winning in 1976), three PBA National Championship finals, and four U.S. Open finals from 1976 to 1987. The third of those four Open appearances earned the Fort Worth native his lone major, a 214-202 win over Steve Neff.

1987 - Another Texan stepped into the winner's circle in his second straight Open television finals appearance. With \$100,000 awaiting the winner, Del Ballard, Jr. claimed his first PBA title and the first of two Open wins with a 247-209 over Pete Weber. Ballard would best Walter Ray Williams, Jr. for the 1993 Open.

1992 - Austin's Robert Lawrence appeared in two other longer format tournament finals in the early 1990's (1990 Brunswick World Open, 1991 Japan Cup). In his lone Open television finals,

Lawrence ousted Amleto Monacelli 196-186 in the semifinal, then "Captain Crossover" (his tour nickname at the time), needing a double and a four count, tossed one, then a crossover strike in the second ball in the tenth frame, sealing a 226-221 win over top seeded Scott Devers. Needing a win to get back into the ToC field, RobLaw received a three year exemption. Monacelli also went over the million dollar mark in career earnings on this telecast. 2008 - In the second of three straight Open finals appearances, Fort Worth native Norm Duke ran the four-man stepladder final ousted Doug Kent and Chris Loschetter before defeating Mika Koivuniemi, 224 - 216. Much like his second Open win three years later featuring Mika's infamous whiff of a tenth frame 10 pin spare, ending the 225-216 championship match, Duke converted the 2-4-5-8 bucket spare and got a nine count on the fill ball for this win. To date, Duke has nine Open final appearances. Here's this show (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=IPSVq0bChUU>).

2009 - Amarillo's Mike Scroggins was near the peak of his PBA Hall of Fame career, making the first of two Open finals, helped by a turkey, defeated defending champion Duke, 191-173. In 2010, Scroggins become the second

defending champ in as many years to fall in the finale, a 267-207 decision to Bill O'Neill. Scroggins was also the first left hander to win since Mike Aulby in 1989.

2013 - Wes Malott became the second graduate of Austin's Davy Crockett High School (joining good friend and 1992 champ Robert Lawrence) to nab his Open title in his third of five, so far, Open finals appearances. Helped by a double and a turkey, Malott downed Jason Belmonte, 214-156.

This edition featured the U.S. Women's Open finals in the same telecast and a challenge match with women's winner Liz Johnson.

In his 2016 Open win, Canada's Francois Lavoie threw the first TV 300 in an Open finals, defeating Houston's

Shawn Maldonado in the semifinal, 300-211.

The Lone Star State has also hosted the Open on a handful of occasions, offering unique story lines while starting and adding to great careers, showing again things really are bigger in Texas.

1975 - In the first of two consecutive Opens at The Forum Bowl in Grand Prairie, Steve Neff averaged 232 for the week before defeating Paul

tion of things. The U.S. Open title was big and being selected No. 30 among the top 50 players in PBA history (in 2009) as the youngest one (age 30) also was pretty cool for me," Jones said. "The U.S. Open was defining because I bowled so bad the previous year. The Tournament of Champions at Mohegan Sun also was a great win because that's the one title every PBA member wants to win. It's really special to be on that list of winners."

Jones admits his career isn't over; his ultimate goal is to reach 25 PBA Tour titles and that goal is still alive.

"It's not unrealistic," Jones said. "My body is finally healthy again. My back was bad for a while, but now it seems to be good."

Slade and Glaser will join their original PBA ownership partner, Chris Peters, in the PBA Hall of Fame. All three were former Microsoft executives who combined resources to purchase the PBA in 2000, pulling the organization back from the brink of bankruptcy, and providing the organization with leadership from their board of directors positions and the financial support to remain viable until its recent sale to Bowlero Corp.

Slade's creativity and contacts at ESPN and with leaders in sports media were key assets in advancing the PBA brand and opening doors with new partners including FOX Sports.

Slade began his career at Microsoft in 1983 and spent seven years there in a variety of product marketing roles. In 1993 he was hired as CEO of Starwave, Paul Allen's trailblazing venture into the Internet and multimedia where he launched ESPN.com, NBA.com, NFL.com, NASCAR.com, ABCNews.com and the Go.com network. He retired as Chairman and CEO of Starwave following its sale to the Walt Disney Corp. in 1998.

Slade then served as strategic advisor for Apple Computer CEO Steve Jobs, and as a strategic consultant for ESPN, NBA.com, NFL.com, Starbucks, Real Networks, Disney, and various Paul Allen companies. In 2000, he co-founded the venture capital firm Second Avenue Partners and he became a co-owner and board member of the PBA.

"It's a real honor to be elected," Slade said. "I kind of got involved with the PBA by accident and I wound up being the owner."

"When we left Microsoft, Chris Peters got into bowling instead of golf, and he was really excited about it," Slade reflected. "Then he found out the PBA was about to go out of business, so he approached Rob

and me about buying the Tour. I had a sports background; I was once a sportswriter and the company I was affiliated with at the time was involved with a number of sports.

"I had a lot of experience at the intersection of sports and tech(nology), so I was excited to get involved. When we did the deal with ESPN way back when, that was me getting involved.

"We hired good people and we ran the PBA like a real professional sport," Slade added.

Glaser, a New York City native, was the PBA's principle investor financially, largely funding the early 2000's efforts to boost prize funds, regulate TV exposure and further explore arena settings. After a 10-year career in a variety of positions with Microsoft, Glaser founded RealNetworks in 1994, a company that produces RealAudio, RealVideo, RealPlayer, and Helix, among other products and services. A Yale graduate with degrees in Computer Science and Economics, Glaser has been a major donor supporting a wide range of humanitarian causes throughout his career.

"It's a true honor (to be elected)," he added. "I have so much respect for the incredible athletes who make up the core of the PBA Hall of Fame. Other than Mike Slade, I am certainly the worst bowler ever elected to the PBA. But the last time I bowled I rolled a 217, so that's something."

In addition to the inductions in Arlington on Jan. 18, the PBA also will present the 2019 Chris Schenkel Player of the Year; Harry Golden Rookie of the Year; Steve Nagy Sportsmanship Award winner and PBA Tony Reyes Memorial Community Service Award winner. The winners of those annual awards will be announced later this year.

Colwell 279-217, for his lone major title. With its signature chandeliers of the time, Forum Bowl would become a fixture to television viewers as the center would host the PBA Quaker State Open for the next twenty years.

1976 – Seemingly snakebit in television finals, especially in title matches, Paul Moser won the first of two PBA titles, downing Jim Frazier, 226-195.

1981 – The old Big Texan Lanes in the near north side of Houston was host as Marshall Holman won the first of his two Open titles, a 200-179 decision over close friend Mark Roth. Holman had also won the previous week at Forum Bowl.

1982 – David Husted announced his arrival as a major champion, running through the stepladder finals, shooting a four game total of 1,011 defeating in order Frank Ellenburg, friend of the column Charlie Tapp, Earl Anthony, and Gil Sliker, including the front seven strikes in the finale. Husted would also win the Open in 1995 and 1996, the only back to back winner.


