



Lavoie Prepared for Title Defense at U.S. Open

ARLINGTON, Texas – Canada's Francois Lavoie rolled a historic 300 on his way to victory at the 2016 U.S. Open, and the 24-year-old right-hander is ready for his title defense, which begins this week as the 2017 event heads to Liverpool, New York.

The U.S. Open will make its eighth trip to New York and kicks off Wednesday at Flamingo Bowl. It will conclude Nov. 1 with a live broadcast of the stepladder finals on CBS Sports Network at 7:30 p.m. Eastern. The champion will earn a \$30,000 top prize and coveted green jacket.

The U.S. Open is the fourth of five major championships on the 2017 Professional Bowlers Association Tour schedule and is conducted jointly by the United States Bowling Congress and Bowling Proprietors' Association of America.

On the way to the title in 2016, Lavoie made history as the first player to roll a perfect game during the event's TV finals. He tossed 12 consecutive strikes in his 300-211 semifinal win against Houston's Shawn Maldonado.

The momentum carried into the championship match, as Lavoie went on to win his first

career PBA Tour title by defeating top seed Marshall Kent of Yakima, Washington, 228-194.

Lavoie's win at the South Point Bowling Plaza in Las Vegas helped him become just the second foreign-born player to claim the title, joining Finland's Mika Koivuniemi, who won the U.S. Open in 2001.

"I had expectations for myself when I first went out on Tour, and one of my goals was to win a PBA title," Lavoie said. "But, I certainly didn't expect

Kenneth Harlan Tops PBA Lubbock Sports Southwest Challenge Field

Lubbock, Texas, (October 16, 2017) – Kenneth Harlan from Lubbock, Texas, completed his quest for his first Professional Bowlers Association title in the final position round match, overtaking tournament leaders Cole Schroyer of Stanton, Texas, and Dylan Macon of Lubbock, Texas, to win the PBA Lubbock Sports Southwest Challenge, presented by Ebonite, Sunday at South Plains Lanes.

With only 49 pins separating the top four finalists and 30 match play bonus pins also at stake going into position round, Schroyer, an amateur, was the tournament leader but he struggled to defeat Macon, 181-178, while Harlan was rolling to a 245-228 victory over Cody Meiers, also from Lubbock. Picking up 75 pins allowed Harlan to leapfrog the other three to claim the victory.

Harlan, who qualified seventh for the round robin

match play finals, won seven of his eight matches to finish with 5,015 total pins, including match play bonus pins. Schroyer held on to second place with a 4,982 total and earned \$1,300. Macon dropped to third place and Meiers finished fourth.

PBA Challenge events are open to amateurs who have not won a PBA event and to PBA

The Notre Dame-Ohio women and men went undefeated in bracket play last weekend to sweep the top spots at the Orange and Black Classic in Dayton, Ohio.

The women's competition was held at Poelking Lanes South and featured 25 varsity teams, while 29 men's varsity teams made their way to Beaver-Vu Bowl. Qualifying consisted of five traditional games and 16 Baker games, with total pinfall determining the top eight teams in each division for match play. Match play featured a best-of-five Baker format to determine the champions.

The Notre Dame-Ohio women, the No. 3 seed, went to

the deciding game against No. 8 Campbellsville but cruised to a 222-143 win to secure the victory, 3-2. Notre Dame-Ohio defeated No. 2 Wright State, 3-1, to advance to the finals, while Campbellsville bested No. 4 Concordia in its semifinal match up, 3-1.

Muskingum's Summer Finley posted the top individual effort in the women's field, firing a five-game score of 1,077, a 215.4 average. Wright State's Tori Pappas finished second with 1,075, and a trio of student-athletes from Pikeville - Jessica Wolfe (1,007), Jenna Coldiron (1,006) and Megan Hedgespeth (1,006) - rounded out the top five.

Just Paying Attention

Two weeks ago, Mound Westonka High School in Minneapolis suburb of Minnetrista, Minnesota, defeated Minneapolis Southwest for its 2017 Homecoming win, 29-17, clinching a playoff berth in the upcoming Minnesota State High School League playoffs. The Homecoming court is led by King Jonny Neve and Queen Rose Helland.

Not only is Rose Helland one of the most recognizable faces at school among fellow students and teachers alike, but she is not your ordinary bowler. Currently averaging in the low 190s, Helland has been on the varsity team since her freshman year and on the team since seventh grade. She is also a five-year member of the Student Senate, a member of the National Honor Society, and carries a 4.0 GPA. Yes, you read that right, the most popular girl at this high school of 900 students is most known as a bowler.

It all started just a few years ago after going to her local center, Country Club Lanes in nearby Orono. Rose and her family heard about the Kids Bowl Free summertime bowling program, and after going a few times, found that she really

enjoyed it, and asked to go a few more. Helland then joined the youth program where she encountered a couple of the coaches you may recognize. The two are members of what you might call Minnesota bowling royalty, multi-USBC titlist and 1994 Minnesota State USBC Hall of Famer John Eiss. The second is his daughter, former Team USA member and gold medalist Lisa Duenow. Not bad coaching, especially if you're just starting out.

According to her father Bryan, a world-class archer in his own right, Rose picked up the game quickly.

"Before ninth grade, she had been put on the varsity squad. Over that summer, expectations of her were higher, so then that's when she really wanted to get better by practicing more, paying attention to more things, and learning what it took to get better," her dad and coach Bryan said.

Keep in mind, the house condition at Country Club Lanes is not the usual stand left-throw right house china. It plays more like a sport pattern with good shot-making and physical execution rewarded.

In addition, Helland's mental game approach has been

very steady over her young career. One simple reason may be the basic, as dad Bryan details.

"She bowls from the positive, telling herself, I'm going to get it, I'm going to get it. Rose doesn't worry about not getting a shot just right. If she doesn't execute one well, she'll get surprised, then tells herself to get it next time. She won't sit there and lambast over it forever, scratch her head and stomp her foot. As a coach, I don't want to know what didn't go right, I want to know how to do it right. I think that's where bowlers, archers, most individual sport people over-analyze one thing of bad and discredit ninety-nine percent of good. That's where you end up with problems," he added.

Another clue into Helland's success is how she welcomes new students at Mound Westonka. She has been picked by school administrators to tag along with new students on their first day, but she's also not afraid to do it on her own, something sometimes tough at what often for many is a socially-awkward time in life.

"Rose is just one of those people who is always happy, always positive, and friendly to everybody. We have gotten notes and postcards from teachers going back to middle school, if there was a new kid in school and were sitting by themselves at lunch, Rose would go over and make sure someone would be with them and see how things were going. When you get postcards from teachers telling you that, it's very special" dad Bryan explained.

Helland's older brother, Jackson, recently concluded a stint on the North Dakota State men's team. Rose and her 4.0 GPA are heading to the University of Wisconsin-River Falls next year.

Dad Bryan also told me as a world-class archer, he's experienced first-hand the mentally managing competition. More recently, he's given seminars to others wanting to fine tune and customize the process, including a high-profile bowler. I'll explain Helland's work with that player in future columns.

In case you're wondering, Rose had a bowling match Homecoming week and did wear her tiara. They won, she bowled well, and the tiara stayed on her head.

As is seen elsewhere in TBN this week, Joe Novara of East Patchogue, New York became the 33rd USBC sanctioned 900 series bowler, the fourth during the calendar year of 2017. After the last piece about developing a sound and smart mental process during competition, a thought occurred to me. Over the years, we have heard about, like Houston's Sean Osbourn setting the Texas state record last November with his 900 series, and the nearly fatal story behind Bill Fong's legendary 899 at the start of this

decade. A couple of numbers you almost never hear about are 897 and 898. You could probably throw in just about everything in between 891 to 896 in there, too.

Since I haven't gotten close to those numbers in roughly twenty-eight years since the date of this edition of TBN (who's counting, although it was an association record at the time), I thought I'd ask a couple of experts, two of the more recent 900 series shooters, Brady Stearns and the aforementioned Sean Osbourn.

"Yes, it is very much like being on autopilot, you're just that focused," Stearns said.

Osborn was a little more detailed; adding luck isn't a bad thing, either.

"I was pretty much in a different zone mentally the last half of the third game. I just couldn't miss until tugging the last ball. Luck was clearly on my side as it is with anyone else who has done that," Osbourn said.

Going back to that day in the sun, I can remember letting the subconscious memory just take over, rolling the shots as close to the muscle memory template established in warmup and the first game over and over again. The conscience memory watched the pattern change, telling me when it was the best time to move, allowing the chess part of the game to become easier.



CHINA BOOSTS WSOB IX FIELD TO 28 COUNTRIES; BRITISH VIRGIN ISLANDS IS OUT

After losing his home and his job to Hurricanes Irma and Maria, 33-year-old Adrian McCoy of Road Town in the British Virgin Islands had to forego his fourth visit to GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling IX, presented by Eldorado Reno Properties, preventing the international field from being even larger than its record entry of 28 countries.

The opening events of the Go Bowling! PBA Tour season grew to 28 nations with the entry of China's Fang Jiafei, but also will be without an entry from Bermuda for the first time since 2012.

"My family is good as well as I am," McCoy, a corporate administrator for a trust company, told the PBA Media



Relations staff. "The devastation of hurricane Irma and Maria left me without a home and a job, so regrettably I won't be able to make it to the World Series this year. I've had an awesome time for the past three years and hoped to make it this year.

"Currently I'm still in the British Virgin Islands, but I'm anticipating traveling to Boston for a few weeks to get away from it all and do some bowling. I managed to save my equipment during the storm (that was a plus for me).

"I just want to let the PBA know that I'm okay for the most part," he continued "I hope to be logged into Xtra Frame to watch all the action of the PBA qualifiers. Watch Belmo, Bob Learn, (Kyle) Troup, everyone that I've met over the years vie for the title."

Also missing from the field will be Bermuda's LeVinc

Samuels, who said his island nation mostly escaped the hurricane devastation, but is unable to attend anyway. He noted he is already at work preparing for 2018.



it to happen that fast, and it was a very special moment for sure."

During Lavoie's historic semifinal performance, his demeanor was business-like as he focused on his title tilt with Kent, who led the field through 56 games by nearly 275 pins.

Nearly a year later, Lavoie is able to enjoy the moment through his fans.

"When it was happening, I was just trying to do my job and get to the next match," Lavoie said. "I didn't realize how special it was. Now, a year later, people still come up to me to talk and ask about it, and it's great to witness how special it was from other people's points of view. It was definitely something special."

Lavoie's overall success

throughout the 2016 season earned him PBA Rookie of the Year honors, and he added a second title at the PBA Shark Championship.

His third career title came in June at the PBA Xtra Frame Greater Jonesboro Open, and Lavoie finished July with two European Bowling Tour victories and a gold medal for Canada in doubles, with Dan MacLelland, at the World Games in Wroclaw, Poland.

Despite the run of success, Lavoie constantly is fine-tuning his craft. After returning from Europe, he struggled with a few aspects of his game but worked through them to regain his feel, winning a pair PBA regional titles this month.

"There have been some very high highs, but I've had to work through some lows as well," Lavoie said. "I've been working on a few things to get my touch back, so hopefully

I can keep that going with a busy end of the year. I always make sure I'm prepared heading into an event, and I still think there are a few things I need to tweak before getting started at the U.S. Open."

Although his game is a constant work in progress, Lavoie will focus on the same mentality that has helped him in the past as he looks to become the first champion to successfully defend a U.S. Open title since USBC Hall of Famer Dave Husted in 1996.

"I've been fortunate to find success early in my career," Lavoie said. "I think a lot of that success has happened because as I approach an event for the first time, I keep an open mind and don't necessarily set my expectations too high. I try to enjoy the moment and do the best that I can. I'm going to try and keep that mentality going throughout my career, even though first times are becoming fewer and fewer."

Lavoie will lead a select field of 144 of the best bowlers in the world.

The participants in the limited field earned their spots primarily through invitations based on their on-lane performances throughout 2016. Some spots will be earned through a pre-tournament qualifier (PTQ), taking place at Flamingo Bowl on Wednesday.

The PTQ will consist of eight games, with total pinfall determining the competitors who advance to the main tournament. The full 144-player field will begin qualifying Friday at 8 a.m. Eastern.

Qualifying will consist of three eight-game blocks over three days. After 24 games, the field will be cut to the top fourth (36 players) for Monday's cashers' round, which will consist of an additional eight games to determine the top 24 players for round-robin match play.

Match play will begin Monday at 6 p.m. Eastern with the first of three eight-game rounds. Match play resumes Tuesday at 10 a.m. Eastern

with the final two blocks of qualifying, including a position round. The five finalists will be determined by total pinfall, including bonus pins, for 56 games.

Starting Friday, each round of the 2017 U.S. Open leading up to the stepladder finals will be broadcast live on Xtra Frame, the exclusive online bowling channel for the PBA.


