

## Four Elected to USBC Hall of Fame for 2020

ARLINGTON, Texas – The United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame will have at least four new members when the 2020 class is inducted April 29, 2020, in Las Vegas.

The USBC Hall of Fame Committee recently elected Patrick Healey Jr. in the USBC Outstanding Performance men's category, Bob Learn Jr. in the Veterans category, and Andrew Cain and Jim Zebehy in the Meritorious Service category.

In addition to the four elected, the USBC Hall of Fame Committee selected eight bowlers – six men and two women – for the Superior Performance ballot that will be distributed to a national panel of USBC Hall of Fame members, USBC board members and veteran bowling writers.

Selected for the men's national ballot are Patrick Allen of Garfield, New Jersey; Bryan Goebel of Shawnee, Kansas; Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas; Randy Pedersen of Orlando, Florida; Mike Scroggins of Amarillo, Texas, and Mark Williams of Beaumont, Texas.

Named to the women's national ballot are Marianne DiRupo of Succasunna, New Jersey, and Tammy Turner of West Palm Beach, Florida.

Healey Jr., 51, of Niagara Falls, New York, was a three-

time member of Team USA (1991-1992, 1995). In Pan American Games competition, he brought home two gold medals (team, Masters) from the 1991 event in Havana, Cuba, and won three golds (doubles, team, Masters) and a silver (singles) at the 1995 event in Buenos Aires, Argentina.

He won gold in doubles and trios at the 1991 World Championships in Singapore, gold in Masters at the 1991 United States Sports Festival, and took the title at the 1995 QubicaAMF World Cup in Sao Paulo, Brazil. He also earned six gold medals at the 1995 Tournament of the Americas.

The 1994 U.S. National Amateur champion, Healey Jr. took third at the 1995 Brunswick World Tournament of Champions as an amateur and also is a two-time World Team Challenge champion (1995, 1997). He is a two-time World Amateur Bowler of the Year (1995, 1996) and was named to the Bowlers Journal All-Century Team for the American Zone (1999).



He was selected the United States Olympic Committee Athlete of the Year for Bowling in 1991 and 1995.

Healey Jr. started bowling in international tournaments in 1990, and has earned 24 wins in international competitions. He has a 300 game in nine countries, and won titles in 14 countries and on six continents. He was invited to be part of the 1992 Olympic Games American Bowling Congress team to help promote the sport of bowling and the sport's quest to gain medal status.

He was a member of the Lodge Lanes team that won the Team All-Events title at the 1997 and 1998 USBC Open Championships. He has four additional top-10 finishes at the event.

A regular on the PBA Tour for nearly a decade, Healey Jr. won three titles, including the PBA Tournament of Champions in 2003. He officially retired

## PBA Adds Nearly Half a Million Dollars to Prize Fund for 2020 Season on FOX

CHICAGO (Nov. 8, 2019) – Building on this year's strong inaugural season on FOX Sports and bolstered by the recent acquisition by Bowlero Corp., the Professional Bowlers Association has announced a \$400,000 boost in prize money for the 2020 Go Bowling! PBA Tour on FOX Sports season.

Every event on the schedule will enjoy prize fund increases and two of the PBA's most prestigious major championships, the PBA Tournament of Champions and PBA World Championship, will now award six-figure first place prizes.

All roads lead towards the PBA Playoffs, with the season's top 24 points earners clinching a spot in the \$320,000 event, which again features a \$100,000 first place prize.

Entries opened today for the full schedule of PBA on FOX season events, which will all pay a 1-in-3 cash ratio (other than the animal pattern stages of World Series of Bowling XI).



Revised competition formats and conditions await, including more dual-pattern events at both classic and new venues around the U.S.

Qualifying and match play rounds of the events will be livestreamed on FloBowling, with the finals on either FOX or FS1. Twenty-three telecasts on FOX or FS1 are live, kicking off with the PBA Hall of Fame Classic on Jan. 19 on FS1. Highlights of the broadcast schedule include three straight majors including the U.S. Open for the first time on FOX during "Big February," and five-straight days of PBA WSOB XI coverage in March.

More detailed tournament information is listed event-by-event in chronological order. Click on the 2020 season tab under the "schedules" link on pba.com. The link to each tournament includes information on how to enter.

## England's Dom Barrett Wins Kuwait Open for Eighth PBA Tour Title

England's Dom Barrett defeated Iceland's Arnar Jonsson, 289-235 and 278-277, Wednesday to win his eighth PBA Tour title in the PBA-World Bowling Tour Kuwait Open in Kuwait City, Kuwait. Barrett, who qualified third for the stepladder finals, had to beat Jonsson, the top qualifier, twice to claim the \$50,000 first prize under tournament rules.

Jonsson, 25, joined the PBA in August. He became the first Iceland native to bowl for a PBA Tour title.

Barrett, 34, advanced to the title match by defeating Venezuela's Ildemaro Ruiz, 276-223, in

the second stepladder match and Canada's Mitch Hupe, 253-230, in the semifinal contest. Ruiz opened the stepladder finals with a 275-234 win over Hong Kong's Michael Mak.

In the World Bowling Tour Men's and Women's Finals held in conjunction with the Kuwait Open, Barrett again defeated Jonsson in the title match, 276-232, after Jonsson eliminated Sean Rash in the semifinal match, 289-223.

Colombia's Maria Jose Rodriguez defeated defending champion Liz Johnson, 252-234, for the women's title after Johnson eliminated Clara Guerrero, 255-232, in semifinal match.

# Just Paying Attention

Fox Sports kicked off its 2020 season of PBA coverage with the PBA Clash, drawing an average of almost 1.5 million viewers, with 485,000 viewers in the key 18-49 age group, garnering a 0.92 rating, according to Nielsen ratings reported at showbuzzdaily.com. The show was nicely inserted in what is usually the late afternoon NFL game time slot for most of the country.

The handful of larger markets with a late NFL game on Fox, like Phoenix, San Francisco, Detroit, and Pittsburgh, saw the telecast where the early Fox produced NFL game would normally be seen. Fox only aired one NFL Sunday game November 3, where CBS had two. (If you care to see how complex NFL coverage is in local broadcast markets nationally, check the weekly coverage maps at 506sports.com., posted Wednesdays on game weeks.)

In the previous Clash, last year on December 23, the inaugural PBA on Fox telecast, average viewership was 1,768,000 with a 1.08 rating, 558,000 in the 18-49 age group.

Before you think only one million viewers is something

to sneeze at, The Association used to draw in the 600,000 to 850,000 range on ESPN, even after the popular Sunday morning SportsCenter, often being a lead in program to college basketball in the winter months.

In last Friday's PBA announcement seen elsewhere in this edition of TBN, the main Fox network will air the Tournament of Champions February 9, and U.S. Open February 23, the USBC Masters March 29, and the PBA Playoffs Final Four and Championship in May 16 and 17. FS1 will host the other coverage. See the complete schedule elsewhere in TBN and at www.pba.com/Television.

PBA CEO Colie Edison also announced increased prize funds, including a \$100,000 first place prize check for the T of C and the World Championship at the end of this year's World Series of Bowling, not seen since Seagram's backed the U.S. Open in the late 1980's when first place checks were six digits for the first time. In case you missed it, Jakob Butturff earned \$50,000 for this year's Clash, versus the \$25,000 Marshall Kent earned for last

year's inaugural Clash.

Unlike the phase The Association went through nearly twenty years ago with the former Microsoft execs keeping the ship afloat with diminishing prize funds and a nearly invisible time slot against NFL Football, the hope of growth in the brand is turning into reality.

NFL on Fox plugged PBA coverage for those seeing the Clash in the late afternoon time slot. Live promos, increasing viewership, and increasing prize funds.

Yes, the times they are a changing.

Getting people to watch anything is not the slam dunk task it once was. Last week, I pointed out MLB World Series ratings have been steadily sinking to all-time lows. It used to be a juggernaut on October weeknights, as NFL games have been on Sundays for decades. Nowadays, nightly World Series average viewership has trouble beating out other broadcast network's regular programming.

(If you can find it, there is a video clip of Keith Olbermann breaking down this trend quite nicely over the last few decades on his former ESPN show, illustrating how baseball is nearly vanishing from national television -- and from kids' interest -- while teams garner more revenue from local and regional television contracts.)

What the PBA benefited from here, by design, is an age old strategy of having a strong lead in program, in this case, NFL Football. Going back to the early days of television, and radio before that, networks purposely do not put highly rated programs back to back, at least at first. One exception may have been the "Must See Thursday" night NBC programming in the 1980s, when it

featured three straight hours of very popular shows, thus the moniker.

The idea was for casual viewers, some NFL fans not likely to watch another game because their team played already, or in the case of those in markets airing the Clash earlier in the day, to leave a TV set on the channel the NFL game is or was on. This practice was magnified in the days before remote controls, when you had to physically get up off the chair or sofa to change channels, but it still holds up today, although the TV may be on just for background noise.

When ABC Sports chief Boone Arledge scheduled this unique program called "Wide World of Sports," in the network's early sports programming days almost sixty years ago, he found an equally unique program to air in front of WWoS, attracting viewers to ABC on Saturday afternoons

in the winter. Starting in 1962, ABC began airing "Pro Bowlers Tour" ahead of Wide World, benefitting both programs and their respective audiences.

Realize it or not, with last week's announcement we breached another crossroad in national television coverage of professional bowling this past week. We saw the recent past and future of PBA television finals literally four days apart.

Wednesday, we saw Francois Lavoie win his second U.S. Open in three years, I believe the youngest to win two, both wins airing on CBS Sports Network. How many people watched those? I have no idea, because I'm not one of the handful people who do know. CBS doesn't release CBSSN viewership ratings, so only CBS and perhaps USBC execs know. I once heard an unconfirmed viewership number about Frankie's 2016 win which

## PBA Spare Shots

### JAKOB BUTTURFF NEWS: A UNIQUE TROPHY AND AN UNEXPECTED SETBACK

Unorthodox left-hander Jakob Butturff of Tempe, Ariz., made PBA news for a couple of different reasons over the past couple of weeks.

On the good news side, the 25-year-old Arizona native defeated EJ Tackett, 258-244, to claim the \$50,000 winner-take-all prize in the PBA Clash. Along with his cash prize, he also received a unique bowling pin trophy made of Legos by a company called "Custom Brick Sculptures."

Unique trophies are kind of a badge of honor to distinguish certain events, but this trophy was the first one made of Legos. The tie-in to Legos is that the popular Legoland Theme Park Florida is located in Winter Haven, Fla., just up the road from the Kegel Training Center in Lake Wales, Fla.

On the bad news side, Butturff was noticeably absent from the ranks of contenders in the U.S. Open in Mooresville, N.C., especially after finishing as U.S. Open runner-up in both 2017 and '18. He was forced

to withdraw after suffering a severe, but mysterious, allergic reaction that landed him in the emergency room at a nearby hospital.

Butturff came into the U.S. Open as a three-time PBA Tour title winner in 2019 but suffered a setback in his bid for 2019 PBA Player of the Year consideration when he was forced to withdraw.

Butturff has since recovered and expects to make the trip to China later this month to compete for the inaugural PBA China Tiger Cup.





from competition in 2008.

The 1986 Chuck Hall Star of Tomorrow award winner, he attended Wichita State University from 1986-1990, and was a National Collegiate Bowling Coaches Association (NCBCA) first-team All-America selection in 1988.

Learn Jr., 57, a native of Erie, Pennsylvania, currently serves as the head coach of the men's and women's bowling programs at Martin Methodist College in Tennessee.

He joined the PBA Tour in 1981, winning five titles, including the 1999 U.S. Open. In 1996, he rolled a 300 game in the opening match of the PBA Flagship Open televised finals, the 10th perfect game in a televised PBA event, to earn a \$100,000 bonus and the nickname Mr. 300. He then posted games of 270, 280 and 279 to win the title

and shatter the highest two-game (570), three-game (850), and four-game (1,129) series in PBA television history.

He also owns three PBA50 titles and, in 2017, made the stepladder finals is six of 11 events.

A two-time member of Senior Team USA, he earned a gold medal in team at the 2015 World Bowling Senior Championships in Las Vegas, and captured gold in doubles and team at the 2017 event in Unterföhring, Germany.

A USBC Silver coach, Learn Jr. is a former Team USA coach and has conducted bowling clinics throughout the world.

He won the ESPY Award for bowling in 1997, was a Bowlers Journal All-America first-team selection in 1995-1996, and a USBC first-team All-American in 1996 and 1999. He is a member of the Erie Bowling Association and Pennsylvania State Halls of Fame.

Cain, 38, of Phoenix, was a five-time member of Team USA

and has bowled on the PBA Tour since 2007, but made his biggest mark in the sport off the lanes.

He joined the USBC Board of Directors in 2007, was named vice president in 2010, and then took the reins as president in 2012. During his three-and-a-half years as USBC president, Cain was instrumental in the creation of International Bowling Campus Youth Development, combining the youth forces of USBC and the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America (BPAA) to streamline and improve participation in youth bowling.

Also, during his tenure, the Professional Women's Bowling Association (PWBA) was restarted through a joint effort with BPAA, as was the U.S. Open, also with support from BPAA.

Cain served on the BPAA, Strike Ten Entertainment and The Bowling Foundation






