ARLINGTON, TX – In another busy weekend in college bowling, the Tennessee Wesleyan men had to make a comeback, while the Wright State women didn't disappoint their fans after capturing the Raider Classic in Ohio.

30 men's varsity teams made their way to Beaver-Vu Bowl in Beavercreek, Ohio, while 23 women's varsity teams held competition at Capri Lanes in Kettering, Ohio. The format consisted of five traditional games on Saturday, 20 Baker games on Sunday, and an eliminator-style championship.

The top four teams from each division advanced to the semifinals, where they bowled a four-game Baker match with the two highest pinfall totals advancing to the finals. The

winners in each division were decided by a two-game total-pinfall match using the Baker system.

The Tennessee Wesleyan men found themselves in fourth place after Saturday's traditional team round but used a Baker total of 3,994 on Sunday to finish third in qualifying to advance to the semifinals.

Advancing to the semifinals with Tennessee Wesleyan were No. 1 Marian (IN), No. 2 Pikeville and No. 4 Wright State. After the four-game Baker set, Tennessee Wesleyan advanced to the title match with an 800 total, while top-seed Marian continued their dominance at the event, advancing with an 844 total.

Marian led throughout the traditional team round and

2019 QubicaAMF World Cup Kicks off with Opening Ceremony

PALEMBANG, Indonesia – For the last few days, Team USA's Kelly Kulick of Union, New Jersey, and John Janawicz of Winter Haven, Florida, have been immersed in Indonesian culture.

The two have enjoyed local cuisine and entertainment and met countless residents and bowling fans, all of whom have been incredibly welcoming, some even a little starstruck.

The focus for Kulick and Janawicz now will change from acclimation and exploration to competition, and a formal opening ceremony Sunday at the Jakabaring Sport City Bowling Center signaled the start of the reason the two United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famers are in Palembang - the 2019 QubicaAMF Bowling World Cup.

The festive ceremony offered the perfect transition with a memorable combination of local flair and tradition and a celebration of more than five decades of QubicaAMF World Cup competition.

The kickoff included the parade of countries, words of encouragement from local and bowling dignitaries, player

oath and authentic Indonesian music and dances performed in vibrant costumes.

This week's event is the 55th edition of the storied tournament and will include nearly 140 competitors from 75 countries.

Official practice at the 2019 World Cup took place during the day Sunday, and competition at the 40-lane facility will get underway Monday morning.

The men will hit the lanes for their first round of qualifying at 9 a.m. local time (Sunday at 9 p.m. Eastern), and the women will get going at 3 p.m. local time (Monday at 3 a.m. Eastern). The order will change for each of the four days of qualifying.

All competitors will bowl 24 games of qualifying (six games each day), before the field is cut to the top 24 for eight additional games. Total pinfall after 32 games will determine the eight men and eight women who will advance to round-robin match play.

The top four in each division then will move on to the knockout-style semifinals based on their 40-game totals, including bonus pins for each win in

Just Paying Attention

This was one of those weeks where I had a column pretty much done days ahead of time. It was a slower news week, after the U.S. Open, and before the QubicaAMF World Cup from Indonesia. I had a piece on a career year on a name from of the past all set to go, then a case of "life happens when you're busy making plans" showed up last Friday afternoon. So next week, you'll read this week's original column, a unique JPA Lost Classic piece next week in the November 28 edition of The Bowling News.

What we saw on back to back days last week were examples of "life happens."

In case you missed the internet slowing down Friday, let's recap. According to The Kentucky New Era newspaper and WHOP Radio in Hopkinsville, Kentucky, Ebonite International closed its plant on West 7th Street and the facilities on Dawson Springs Road after 52 years of operation, ending employment for 171 workers.

At the same time, Brunswick announced its purchase of Ebonite in a press release,

stating it will market all of the Ebonite brands, with FloBowling confirming Brunswick moving Ebonite International (EBI) production to its plant in Reynosa, Mexico, just across the U.S. border from McAllen, Texas.

What we saw on social media gave a lot more color between the lines to what happened through the eyes of ball staffers, district sales managers, industry professionals, and even an EBI employee who was about to start his 50th year on the job in January.

Most of us know at least one person with a tie to Ebonite Bowling International. Locally in DFW, the highest profile people are Southwest district sales manager Tyson Branagan, long time national staffer Dino Castillo, and PWBA champion and long-time Team USA member Stefanie Johnson.

It is not the first time in recent memory a major ball manufacturer was bought, just the latest. February 2007 saw Ebonite purchase Columbia Industries, the original manufacturer of the Columbia 300 ball line and makers of the Track

and Dyno-Thane ball brands. In 2005, Brunswick announced it was closing its Muskegon plant, moving ball manufacturing to Mexico, then Brunswick Corporation's decision to divest itself completely of the bowling business. Ebonite purchase the Hammer ball brand in 2002 and Storm Products purchased 900Global in 2014, operating it independently from Storm and Roto Grip.

Only five years ago we saw Bowlmor AMF purchase the Brunswick Recreation Centers (BRC) group from Brunswick Corporation. And before that, the PBA purchase in 2000 by the three former Microsoft execs, then its sale just weeks ago to Bowlero.

So it's not the first blockbuster deal, but this one seemed a little different, a little more personal. Having known and met the handful of current and regional sales managers, some dating back as far as 30 years ago, it's hard to really put into words the depth of the moment, so I'll leave it at that. We got used to Brunswick not being as big as it was, we're getting used to Bowlero centers, and in due time, get used to this as well.

On social media, it's nice to see the heartfelt thanks of current ball staffers, former ball staffers, and many fans of the brand express their support for the 171 men and women who start the next chapter in their lives right now, albeit very unexpectedly.

Over the coming weeks, more details will be announced with plans for where things go from here for the former EBI. Stay tuned.

As remembrance of Ebonite during its Fuqua ownership days for this week's JPA Lost Classic, here's a 1973 commercial on Pro Bowlers Tour

What happened the day before the Ebonite sale announcement was another fateful business decision, but one meant to build for the future.

On his Facebook page November 14, my aforementioned former boss Mike Austin announced he and Emerald Bowl proprietor Don Ellis would add an additional \$10,000 to the annual PBA/PBA50 Houston Southwest Doubles Open, hosted at Emerald Bowl the weekend before Christmas since 2013, this year Saturday December 20 through Sunday December 22. The annual doubles tournament features one player under 50 years of age with an over 50 player, or two over 50 players, if they so choose.

Past players have been pretty

much a who's who of local and regional legends. Here's a partial list, Chris Barnes, Mike Scroggins, Carolyn Dorin-Ballard, Hall of Fame eligible Wes Malott, PWBA champ Clara Guerrero, and frequent PBA telecast participants Anthony Simonsen, the pride of Pasadena, Sean Lavery-Spahr, brother Anthony Lavery-Spahr, along with D.J. Archer, and Shawn Maldonado. Regional standouts have included Chris Hibbitts II, David Anthony, Nathan Bohr, Mike Bailey, and Kurt Gengelbach.

Some of the over 50ers have included August PBA Challenger regional champ and former MLB pitcher (and friend of the column) John Burkett, two time Tournament of Champions winner Mark Williams, 1984 USBC Masters finalist Rick Minier, 1992 U.S. Open winner Robert Lawrence, and 2017 USBC Senior Masters

VISA DELAY FORCES EJ TACKETT OUT OF TRIP TO COMPETE IN PBA CHINA TIGER CUP

Former PBA Rookie and Player of the Year EJ Tackett has been forced to cancel plans to compete in next week's PBA China Tiger Cup in suburban Shanghai, China, because of a delay in obtaining a visa in time to make the trip.

Tackett was scheduled to be part of an eight-player PBA contingent competing in the PBA's first-ever competition in mainland China. The invitational China Cup field, based on competition points earned during the FloBowling PBA Summer Tour, will include Sean Rash, Jason Sterner, AJ Johnson, Bill O'Neill, Kyle Sherman, newly-elected PBA Hall of Famer Tommy Jones and Kyle Troup, who will replace Anthony Simonsen. Simonsen declined his invitation due to a prior commitment, but Tackett's spot in the field won't be filled due to time constraints.

The tournament will now include seven PBA Tour players who have earned expenses-paid trips to China. The PBA qualifiers will join a contingent of bowlers from China, Korean, Japan and other Asian countries in a singles tournament with a \$20,000 first prize. A special USA vs. China team

Baker competition, but in the end, it was the Bulldogs of Tennessee Wesleyan who snatched the title after besting Marian in the finals by 20 pins, 424-404.

Kentucky Wesleyan's Tanner Johnson led the individual standings with a five-game total of 1,104, an average of 220.8. Pikeville's Michael Gallitz (1,087), Northern Kentucky's Trevor Mattingly (1,079), Marian's Jordan Shepherd (1,074) and Pikeville's Jonathan Lovett (1,060) rounded out the top five.

In the women's division, tournament host Wright State was part of a three-team battle for the lead after Saturday's round and settled into third after five traditional games. The Raiders used a 3,645 Baker total to help them into the lead and nab the top spot heading into the semifinals.

Wright State was joined in the semifinals by No. 2 Alma, No. 3 Notre Dame College and No. 4 Urbana. Notre Dame College was out of the top five but had the highest Baker total (3,755) to jump from fifth to third.


In the semifinals, it was Alma who had the highest four-game Baker semifinal

WESLEY LOW TO BEGIN CHASING PBA DREAMS

The widely anticipated arrival of Wesley Low Jr. to the PBA ranks will begin in January when the highly decorated two-handed left-hander begins his quest for 2020 PBA Rookie of the Year honors.

Low, now 22 and a graduate of the famous Wichita State University collegiate program, was the youngest bowler ever to win a PBA Regional tournament when he won a PBA West Region "challenge" event for non-title winners in Las Vegas in 2013 at the age of 15 years, 336 days. He didn't get credit for an official title because he was not a PBA member at the time.

He also was the second-youngest player ever to "cash" in a PBA Regional when he finished third in the same non-champions event in Las Vegas the previous year at age 14. The youngest casher record is held by 2018 PBA Rookie of the Year Kamron Doyle who was 12 when he "cashed" in a PBA Regional in Canton, Ga., in 2010. In both cases, Low and Doyle competed as youth bowlers and accepted prize money in the form of contributions to their SMART scholarship funds.

Low, who has achieved success at virtually every level of youth and collegiate bowling leading up to his PBA debut, announced he will begin chasing his PBA dreams in an interview with FloBowling Senior Editor Lucas Wiseman.
