



Liz Johnson Wins 2017 PBA Chameleon Championship



Liz Johnson

RENO, Nev. – Three-time reigning Professional Women's Bowling Association Player of the Year Liz Johnson of Palatine, Illinois, has made a career out of producing historic moments on the lanes, and now she's added arguably the greatest accomplishment of her historic career.

Johnson defeated Anthony Pepe of Elmhurst, New York, 220-206, to win the Professional Bowlers Association Chameleon Championship on Saturday at the National Bowling Stadium to become the second woman to win a PBA

Tour title.

She joins Kelly Kulick of Union, New Jersey, who won the 2010 PBA Tournament of Champions, as the only women to capture victories on the PBA Tour. The PBA first allowed women to compete in 2004 after the PWBA abruptly went on hiatus in 2003.

Germany's Tobias Börding Wins Inaugural PBA Don Carano WSOB Award

RENO, Nev. (Nov. 17, 2017) – Tobias Börding, a third-year Professional Bowlers Association member from Pucheim, Germany, has been named winner of the inaugural PBA Don Carano WSOB Award in recognition of his performance in the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling IX, presented by Eldorado Reno Resorts Properties. The new award, created by

the PBA, honors the memory of the late Don Carano and his entire family for their long-time support of the PBA. The award is a tribute to Don Carano's life-long pursuit of personal improvement, and specifically applies to Börding as the player who showed the most improvement in PBA

"YOUNGEST PBA TOUR TITLE WINNER" RECORD IS SAFE...FOR NOW

Norm Duke's record as the youngest player ever to win a PBA Tour title is safe... for now...after 17-year-old Trey Ford III of Bartlesville, Okla., lost his best-of-five-game, Round of 16 match to South Africa's Francois Louw in Thursday's PBA Cheetah Championship presented by PBA Bowling Challenge Mobile Game.

If Ford, bowling in his second PBA World Series of Bowling, had continued to advance and actually won the Cheetah Championship title on Saturday, he would have eclipsed Duke's record more

than full year. Duke was 18 years, 345 days old when he won the Cleveland Open back in 1983. Ford will be 17 years, 85 days old on Saturday.

Ford, a two-handed player, had his best previous finish as a PBA member in the Grand Casino Hotel & Resort Oklahoma Open in July when he finished 11th. In his WSOB debut in 2015 at age 15, Ford averaged 196.36 and finished in 195th place. After skipping WSOB XIII in 2016, Ford returned to Reno at age 17 and averaged 225.05 for his 40 games on the four animal patterns, qualifying for the PBA World Championship cashers' round in a tie for 42nd as well

Just Paying Attention

Boston Red Sox all-star outfielder Mookie Betts shot a 300 game. It was where he did it and how much time he had to prepare that is a little mind-boggling. A carrot is dangling in front of the mainstream sports media to bite, but will they take a nibble?

With literally two weeks of daily practice to get into bowling shape and getting in reps, Betts may have rolled one of the more important 300 games in PBA history at this year's PBA World Series of Bowling at Reno's National Bowling Stadium. Perfect games get rolled at almost every PBA tournament. But when its rolled by guy who doesn't bowl league because his full time job takes way too much time and is one of most recognizable young stars on a team with one of the most highly-energized fan bases in American professional sports, yes, it is can be a little bigger deal.

Besides the ESPN SportCenter mentions the story got five to ten minutes of coverage on MLB Network, 'Intentional Talk', with Chris Rose and Kevin Millar, Chris Russo's 'High Heat', and 'Hot Stove', the off-season late morning show Matt Vasgersian and

Harold Reynolds.

'I-T' has mentioned Betts as a bowler before, even showing video of his 2015 WSOB appearance. Millar then usually chimes in about his mom and uncle being league bowlers while growing up in southern California. PBA SW Regional Director Pete McCordic recently told me Millar's brother, Jensen, has bowled in several SW Regional tournaments in the last ten years. The 'real One-Five' as he is at times referred, will then brag about his skills on the lanes. As an example this past season, while doing a live interview with current Arizona Diamondback and former Red Sox outfielder Chris Young, Millar showed off his fingertip bowling ball and shoes to prove he isn't just talking the talk.

Russo's 'High Heat' on MLB Network spent a couple of minutes talking about it, but one point may show how high the hurdle may be. The on-screen graphic accompanying the story read that it takes 12 strikes to bowl a 300 game. Yeah, I know. That makes a bigger point about who his audience is. They haven't ever stepped into a center, or even Wii-bowled before? That would

be an interesting marketing study to find out the bowling knowledge and preferences of that group. (Let's see how many marketing people I hear from on that one.) A golden opportunity is in front of us. But will it be taken advantage of or will forces beyond our reach deny us again?

We need someone in the mainstream sports media to break through another glass ceiling and ask about the complexity of lane patterns. With information on their variety and how they are played, that could present enough info for the light bulb (LED or virtual will also do in this case) to go off for even the most tech-minded viewers to realize something us hard-cores have known for years.

In the 'Hot Stove' live phone interview, Vasgersian began to ask a little more than the usual softball questions from someone who hasn't bowled in an atmosphere with beer and pizza on the line while enjoying two hours of videos shown on the masking units and woofers and tweeters from nearby speakers playing the latest Adele, Taylor Swift, or Garth Brooks selections (He did work in a big bowling town, Milwaukee, with Bob Uecker in the late 1990's). He got closer than most have dared, but it looked like they were out of time for that segment.

Betts' line to the pocket during the game was between 10-15, looking familiar to the average casual bowler, but the fact he rolled a trey at a PBA event with the limited amount of practice after the season, really is a big deal. The serious sports talk radio crowd, the ones who really sit around snarfing potato chips, pretzels, pizza, and burgers (once a week from the neighborhood wings joint) while screaming at whatever Chris Russo and local versions say or don't say, may be out of touch just enough not to have ventured into a bowling center in the last twenty years to know it does take twelve strikes for a perfect game. You know the ones; they only watch sports with prefixes of 'foot', 'basket', and 'base', in that order.

This could be the game that doesn't scare sports reporters about getting into the complexities of why we know this is a sport. Then again, these are the same people who are considering e-gaming a sport. Doesn't feel good, does it you professional e-gamers?

So where was Mookie during last year's WSOB? According to an Associated Press report, the 2016 All Star, Gold Glove, and Silver Slugger winner had arthroscopic surgery on his right knee, repairing cartilage, and removing loose fragments in the second week of November 2016. Not his bowling slide knee, but his push off knee in the batter's box and throwing motion.

So why haven't I posted any Motiv ball reviews lately?

Because I also had knee surgery, repairing damaged meniscus on my left knee in September, my bowling slide knee. Now that physical therapy is just about done, I'm ready jump, well, maybe to gently step back into league play. I also want to be ready for the PBA/PBA50 Houston Doubles Southwest Regional Open, presented by Mike Austin's Bowling Dynamix on December 15 - 17.

Those Motiv reviews of the new Trident Quest, Lethal Paranoia, and maybe one more will be coming as soon as I get through the feeling of walking like Bambi on the approach. It has certainly made me further appreciate good balance and have been blessed to have gone through the last twenty years with what was a 35-year-old body, five of those being the most productive of my career.



"It feels absolutely amazing," said Johnson, who also finished 14th in the PBA World Championship this week in Reno. "It's officially one of the best bowling days of my life and probably the icing on the cake as far as my career goes. I've been very lucky to have the career that I've had. I never thought having the chance to win a PBA title would come when it did. It's been an awesome journey."

The event was livestreamed online through ESPN 3 (WatchESPN.com) and the WatchESPN app. The show will be broadcast on ESPN on Dec. 17 at 1 p.m. Eastern.

The Chameleon Championship is part of the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling IX, presented by Eldorado Reno Resorts Properties and the 2017 Go Bowling! PBA Tour schedule. Johnson started the title match of the Chameleon Championship with three consecutive strikes, before a 10 pin stopped the run in the fourth frame, but she'd built a sizeable lead as Pepe missed a 7 pin in the second frame.

Pepe quickly got back on track and struck in frames four, five and six to stay in the match. Johnson picked up where she left off by stringing three more strikes.

Stepping up first in the 10th frame, Pepe had the opportunity to put pressure on Johnson, but a 4-7 leave on his

first attempt handed Johnson the win and \$20,000 top prize.

Johnson and Pepe advanced to the title match by outdancing PBA Tour champions Tom Smallwood of Saginaw, Michigan, and Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, in the opening four-player shootout round. All four players competed simultaneously, and the two highest scores advanced to the championship.

The shootout was exactly as described with every player having an opportunity to advance through the final frames. Pepe was the first player to finish and solidified his spot in the championship match with a strike on the first shot in the 10th frame to finish with 255.

Johnson, a United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famer, needed a double to lock out Malott and Smallwood, who finished with 248 and 236, respectively. With the help of a late-falling 10 pin on her second offering, she finished with all three strikes in the 10th for 257.

"My legs were shaking and felt really light at that point," Johnson said. "I was trying to focus on staying down and coming through the shot, but the nerves were going. I was just trying to focus on making the shots I needed, and to punch out at that moment was pretty awesome."

This year's Chameleon Championship was Johnson's third career PBA TV appearance and fourth championship-

The Robert Morris-Illinois men and Wichita State women battled through match play to claim titles last weekend at the Leatherneck Classic.

Men's competition was held at Highland Park Bowl in Moline, Illinois, and featured 46 varsity teams, while the women's event was contested at Big River Bowl in Davenport, Iowa, with 39 varsity teams.

The event schedule consisted of six traditional games and 16 Baker games to determine the eight teams in each division to advance to the match-play bracket. The bracket consisted of best-of-three Baker matches to determine the winner.

The Robert Morris-Illinois men qualified second for match play and rolled in the title match against No. 5 St. Ambrose, 2-0. The Eagles posted wins of 256-191 and 195-174 in the championship round.

Robert Morris-Illinois bested No. 6 Wichita State in the semifinals, 2-1, to earn its spot in the finals, while St. Ambrose swept No. 8 Lindenwood, 2-0.

Newman's Chance Rivera fired games of 232, 279 and 299 for an 810 series on his way to a six-game total of 1,492 (248.66 average) to pace the men's individual standings. Calumet's Tyler James finished second with 1,388, and McKendree's Bryan Hahlen (1,388), Robert Morris-Illinois' Michael Martell (1,360) and Grand View's Sam Cantrell (1,353) also earned spots on the all-tournament team.

On the women's side, Wichita State claimed the top seed in qualifying, and the Shockers swept No. 6 Newman in the title match, 177-172 and 209-150, to claim the title.

Wichita State defeated No. 5 St. Francis-Illinois, 2-1, to advance to the finals, and Newman knocked off No. 7 Robert Morris-Illinois, 2-1.

Reigning National Collegiate Bowling Coaches Association Most Valuable Player Sydney Brummett of Wichita State claimed her second individual win of the 2017-2018 season, posting a 1,335 total to edge teammate Hollyann Johansen (1,331) for the top spot. St. Ambrose's Kaitlyn Keith (1,265), Midland's Candice Goldfinch (1,255) and Nicole Troha of St. Francis-Illinois (1,248) also finished in the top five.

In other USBC Collegiate action over the weekend:

- At the Sonic Boom Invitational in Jackson, Mississippi, the Louisiana Tech women defeated top-seed Alabama State in the title match, 4-1.

- At the Wolverine Hoosier Athletic Conference No. 2 in Jackson, Michigan, the Indiana Tech women and Concordia men finished at the top of the standings.

- At the FMCC Baker Tournament in Johnstown, New York, the Schenectady men and women completed the sweep.

- At the Warhawk Classic in Kenosha, Wisconsin, the Arkansas State women won the final three games against Nebraska to claim the win, 4-3.

- At the Raider Classic in Beavercreek, Ohio, and Kettering, Ohio, the Notre Dame-Ohio men and women swept the top spots. The women's team posted a Baker 300 game on

their way to a 540-428 victory over Wright State in the two-game title match.

- At the AMCC No. 1 in Altoona, Pennsylvania, the Mount Aloysius women posted the highest pinfall total on the way to a 7-0 record.

- At the MEAC North No. 1 in Baltimore, the Delaware State women put together a 7-1 record to lead the way.

- At the MEAC South No. 1 in Chesapeake, Virginia, the

round appearance overall.

She made history by becoming the first woman to make a televised appearance on the PBA Tour at the 2005 PBA Banquet Open, where she was the runner-up to Tommy Jones, 219-192.

Johnson also owns a pair of fourth-place finishes at the 2014 PBA Cheetah Championship and 2015 DHC Japan Invitational (championship round streamed on Xtra Frame).

With the victory, Johnson added another layer to her immeasurable legacy that continues to grow. Her accomplishments in 2017 now include three PWBA titles (two majors), including her sixth U.S. Women's Open and the Go Bowling PWBA Players Championship, a third consecutive PWBA Player of the Year award and the 2017 PBA Chameleon Championship.

It's a legacy that Johnson is not only proud of, but one which she hopes inspires other young ladies not only within bowling, but all sports.

"I'm not good at giving

myself those perks, but this ranks up there," Johnson said. "There are so many great bowlers that I've always looked up to and are part of the reason why I'm here today. Hopefully, I can give back in that way to the girls who are coming up in the sport. It's a pretty amazing and very surreal day. I'm very proud of myself and what I've been able to accomplish over the years. These two weeks have been exhausting but couldn't have ended on a better note."


The journey to the title for Johnson began on Nov. 8 when she bowled 10 qualifying games, with the top 16 competitors advancing to match play Nov. 15.

After qualifying 12th for match play, Johnson defeated Ryan Ciminelli of Cheektowaga, New York, 3-2, in a best-of-five format in her opening match. She advanced to the show by defeating Josh Blanchard of Mesa, Arizona, in the best-of-three quarterfinals, 2-0.

The PBA Chameleon Championship featured 195 players, including six PWBA members.
