In the 50-59 division, Doug Ingalsbe led the qualifying and then led all the way to the last game of the matchplay finals with Chuck Gray at his heels.

Going into the final game, Doug led by 4 pins. Chuck won the match 248-204 to claim his first SASBA title. Stoney Burke finished third, Rick Mann claimed fourth and Jack Soria finished fifth.

In the 60-69 division, Mike McHugh qualified 5th then hung around the top in the match play taking the lead after game 5, relinquishing it after game 6 then retaking it going into the final game.

He led Mark Williams by 20 pins and won 258-186 to win his 5th SASBA title!

Mark dropped to fourth, Thomas Young moved up to 2nd, Kenny Gullette finished 3rd and Mark Cozart took 5th.

In the 70 and over division, Roy Chesbro qualified 2nd after the 12 games of qualifying. He took the lead after the first game of match play and never looked back to win his first SASBA title!

South Africa, Australia Win Titles at 2019 QubicaAMF World Cup

PALEMBANG, Indonesia – The 2019 QubicaAMF Bowling World Cup came to a close Saturday at the Jakabaring Sport City Bowling Center, and along with the event's prestigious trophies, this year's winners also earned some much-deserved redemption.

Australia's Rebecca Whiting was extra motivated after failing to make the top eight at last year's event, and she capped her fourth consecutive QubicaAMF World Cup appearance with a 172-162 victory over two-time champion Aumi Guerra of the Dominican Republic.

On the men's side, 2015 World Cup runner-up Francois Louw of South Africa, was dominant for nearly all 40 games this week and used years of competitive experience to help him remain focused in a 237-202 win over Indonesia's Ryan Lalisang.

In the women's title match, Whiting and Guerra combined for just six strikes. Neither player threw a double.

The decision came down to spare shooting, with Guerra missing single-pin spares in the seventh and ninth frames, a 10 pin and 4 pin, respectively, and Whiting converting the 2-4-10 split in the seventh frame to pull ahead.

Whiting could've doubled in her final frame to lock up the title, but she left a 7 pin on her

first shot. A spare and a strike on her fill ball meant Guerra needed two strikes and nine pins to become the first woman to win three World Cup titles. She left a 10 pin on her first offering, giving Australia its first women's title since 2007.

"I can't even feel it right now, and I'm sure it will sink in tonight or tomorrow, but I honestly can't stop smiling or crying," said Whiting, a 29-year-old right-hander. "I couldn't even watch the 10th frame. I had to walk away because I knew if she bagged out, she'd get me. She's a great competitor and great supporter as well. I've gotten to know her over the years, and I'm proud to call her a friend. It was nice to have a friendly final match."

Whiting entered the knockout-style semifinals as the No. 3 seed and defeated No. 2 Natasha Roslan of Malaysia, 199-176, to earn the meeting with Guerra, who topped No. 1 qualifier Kelly Kulick of the United States in the other semifinal, 194-179.

The win was the ninth World Cup title for Australia overall. The women have won seven times, and the men have hoisted the trophy twice, including last year in Las Vegas, when Sam Cooley got the job done.

Louw's path to the 2019 World Cup title also was dramatic, but his two matches

The 2020 PWBA Hall of Fame induction ceremony will be held in May in conjunction with the United States Bowling Congress Queens, a major event on the PWBA Tour. Details will be announced later.

Nomination forms are available at PWBA.com and will be accepted through Jan. 1, 2020. The categories and eligibility criteria for each category are:

* Performance – A minimum of 10 PWBA Tour titles or



a minimum of five PWBA Tour titles that include two majors. Nominee must be at least 50 years of age as of Jan. 1, 2020.

* Ambassador – At least one PWBA Tour title and has made major contributions as an industry veteran or someone who has had a pioneering impact on the PWBA Tour's growth or influence. Minimum age is 50 as of Jan. 1, 2020.

* Meritorious/Builder –

As seen elsewhere in this edition, Bowlero has released the names of the pros and amateurs involved in the final Bowlero Elite Series (BES) tournament of 2019, this time a Texan is among the amateurs. Jay Nephew of Houston, a very familiar name to top bowlers all over the state, is one of the eight amateurs.

Bowlero has done its homework in bringing back a couple of familiar names from the other two tournaments, building several grudge match scenarios, potentially meeting on the telecast. Both prior champions, runners up.

As I and many others know, Jay is the one bowler with enough PBA tournament experience (he's won two regionals) at this level not only to make the TV finals, but to win the whole thing.

As you might expect, Jay is more than thrilled to make the field.

"For me, this is an opportunity, most likely, will never get again. I'm going to enjoy the process and hope for the best," Jay said in a text.

Nephew and another of the eight amateurs, former PBA

Tour regular Greg Thompson, have a distinct advantage of knowing and bowling with some of the eight pros in this event, like Shannon O'Keefe, Jason Belmonte, and Anthony Simonsen, in various tournaments around DFW and elsewhere, like the annual Storm PBA/PWBA Striking Against Mixed Doubles (Luci Doubles) in Houston, as an example.

The finals will air on NBC Sunday December 29 at Noon Central time. After the show airs, you'll read Jay's thoughts and comments as he recalls his experience right here in the January JPA's, exclusively here in TBN.

If the BES is to continue into 2020, conventional wisdom would dictate the telecast would move from NBC to Fox, with the recent purchase of the PBA by Bowlero. Hopefully, we would hear some word from Bowlero Chief Customer Officer (CCO) Colie Edison during or after the tournament.

This year's USBC Hall of Fame Men's and Women's Superior Performance ballot asked selected bowling writers to choose a maximum of four of

the eight names listed. An issue facing the committee members in recent years, all eight are more than deserving to be enshrined, and I believe at some point, will be enshrined. The only question is when.

As a USBC Hall of Fame voter the last fourteen years, it is an annual task I don't take lightly. But looking at the resumes of all the candidates, it gets tougher and tougher to separate them. It's not at all like the Baseball Writers Association of America (BBWAA) has been dealing with in recent years. According to an item by AwfulAnnouncing.com's Managing Editor Joe Lucia, some BBWAA ballots out of the New York metro area have only one name, former Yankee short-stop and current Miami Marlins CEO Derek Jeter.

Their votes can choose up to ten names, and yet for some warped reason, are trying to get Jeter as the second unanimous choice for the Baseball Hall of Fame, joining fellow Yankee Mariano Rivera, who received that unique distinction last year.

Pretty sure USBC Superior Performance voters don't go that far. This one sure doesn't.

Have a sad note to end with this week, as we've learned of the passing of the inventor of one of the most used bowling training devices over the last forty years.

Former Minnesota Viking kicker Fred Cox passed away last week at the age of 80 following a handful of recent health issues. As the place kicker in their four Super Bowl

appearances in the 1970's, Cox had an idea about a ball for kids they could use almost anywhere.

Ever go to a pro shop and see a Nerf football of to the side and wonder why it's there? More than a few shop operators will have a Nerf on hand to show bowlers how to hook a bowling ball. It's not an over-hand toss mind you, just use a loose grip to throw a spiral using an underhanded motion while twisting the forearm, allowing the bowler to feel and build muscle memory.

I first saw this in the late 1970's where the pro shop owner would check my hook release progress by having me toss the ball underhanded. If you flung the throwing arm elbow, the ball wobbled and floated like a piece of paper in the wind. Once I did 10 satisfactory tosses, we would go outside and run a couple of pass routes, just for fun.

I bought one for the each of last three shops I worked, including Mike Austin's Bowling Dynamix at Houston's Emerald Bowl.

The idea was simple and easy to explain using the smaller than regulation size football. The faster the spin, the tighter the spiral, created a better technique, demonstrating ball lift. Because it was smaller and soft, any size hand could grip it, then use than under-hand swing. Since the humble beginnings dozens of other items in the Nerf product line.

According to an NFL Films piece posted to Twitter last week, a friend in the injection mold business took Cox's suggestion to make the first Nerf football, which eventually added the acronym of NERF (Non Expanding Recreational Foam) to the American sports lexicon.

Cox retired after the Vikings



Saturday featured a lot more strikes.

The 33-year-old right-hander nearly led the event wire to wire, before a 155 game in a position-round loss, his second-lowest game of the week, dropped him from first place to the No. 4 seed for the semifinals.

Knowing he excelled on the fresh 41-foot oil pattern this week, Louw calmly redeemed himself with a 262-196 semi-final win against top-seeded Oliver Morig of Germany. That set up his meeting with No. 3 Lalisang, who ended Cooley's bid for back-to-back titles in a lopsided semifinal matchup, 239-158.

Louw and Lalisang both were lined up to start the title tilt, when a fourth-frame foul from Louw turned the momentum in Lalisang's favor.

The hometown standout, looking to become the fourth competitor in 55 editions of the event to win in his or her home country, had control of the match until failing to convert the 2-8 combination in the eighth frame. A 10 pin on the first shot of his final frame all but sealed the win for Louw.

confidence heading into the semifinals."

Despite Lalisang having the crowd behind him, Louw said he was able to draw on the experiences he's had in the famed Swedish League, where the fans and cheering are like nothing he's ever been a part of.

shot in the 10th frame, but it never read it. If I had to rate that shot on a scale of 1-10, I'd give it an 8.5."

Kulick entered Saturday's eight-player match-play round with a six-pin advantage over Roslan but was able to build on that lead and claimed the top seed for the semifinals by a 189-pin margin, which included 120 bonus pins for her four wins in match play.

The United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famer and 15-time Team USA member was making her World Cup debut, an honor she earned by winning the 2019 USBC Team USA Trials in January.

"The last two days were great, they really were," Kulick said. "My game is still very strong, though my mental game might need a little tweaking. But, I led the World Cup. I

didn't win it, but I led it, and that's pretty special.

"To travel all the way to Indonesia to compete in such a prestigious tournament means a lot, too. It was a long journey to get here, but to meet the amazing people I've met and see this incredible arena has been unforgettable. I did myself and my country proud, and you never know, maybe I'll get another chance."

Janawicz finished 19th on the men's side this week.

All competitors at the 2019 World Cup, 73 men and 60 women representing 75 countries, bowled 24 games over four days (six games each day), before total pinfall determined the 24 men and 24 women who returned Friday for eight additional games.

Total pinfall for 32 games decided the eight men and eight women who advanced to Saturday's round-robin match play, and pinfall for 40 games, including bonus pins for each

win in match play, determined the four semifinalists.

The World Cup first was contested in 1965, and the tournament now is considered one of the sport's most prestigious singles titles. It also is recognized as the largest event in the sport in terms of number of countries competing.




