The Bowling Industry Loses a Great Ambassador with Jim Welch's Passing

EULESS, TX – James (Jim) Thomas Welch of Euless--beloved friend, son, brother, uncle, and bowling enthusiast--passed away unexpectedly at age 63 on December 29th, 2019. At the time of his passing, he was surrounded by family and loved ones.

Jim was born in Tampa, Florida in 1956, the eldest of five children in an Air Force family. He spent his childhood all over the world, from Maine to Okinawa, and graduated from L.D. Bell High School in Hurst, Texas. Jim cherished time spent golfing with friends, starting chess clubs, playing basketball, and competing in bowling leagues. He attended the University of Texas at Arlington, graduating in 1978 with a business degree. After graduation, Jim was a lifelong learner.

Jim's passion for bowling began early and led to a career



USBC National High Average and High Series Awards Determined for 2018-2019 Season

Kameleon Sportswear of Frisco earned National High Team Game for 2-men, 2-women with 1069

ARLINGTON. Texas - For the third consecutive season, **Team USA member Shannon** Pluhowsky has earned a **United States Bowling Congress** National High Average and High Series Award after posting the highest women's average for the 2018-2019 season.

Pluhowsky, an Ohio native who is in her first season as an assistant coach for the University of Nebraska women's bowling team, posted a 247 average over 78 games during the Inland Owls league at Capri Lanes in Columbus, Ohio.

Competing in USBC-certified leagues, she has claimed the high average award four times and also owns a national high series award.

The 19-time Team USA member, who competes on the Professional Women's Bowling Association (PWBA) Tour, set a record with a 250.7 average in taking the National High Average Award in 2017-2018 and also led the nation for the 2016-2017 season with a 241 average. She earned her first high average award in the 2013-2014 season and was the Sport high average winner in 2008-2009.

Greg McDaniel, 52, of Kimball, Nebraska, took the men's USBC National High Average Award with a 253 average in the Kim-Bowl Scratch Trio league at Kim Bowl. McDaniel, who has competed on the Professional Bowlers Association and PBA50 tours, has owned the eight-lane Kim Bowl in Kimball since 2015.

Kevin McCune and Kiearra Saldi earned the Youth Male and Youth Female USBC National High Average Award winners, respectively, for the 2018-2019 season.

McCune, 20, of Munster, Indiana, posted a 248 average in the Juniors league at Lynwood Bowl in Lynwood, Illinois. He is a junior on the Calumet College of St. Joseph men's team.

Saldi, 19, of Taylor, Pennsylvania, had a 221 average in the All Stars league at Idle Hours North in Scranton, Pennsylvania. A freshman on the Duquesne women's bowling team, she recently was selected as the Northeast Conference Bowler and Rookie of the Week.

Stephanie Zavala, 23, of Downey, California, is the



women's USBC National High Series Award winner. The 2017 Junior Team USA member put together games of 279, 300 and 280 for an 859 series during the Mexican American Bowling Association league at Del Rio Lanes in Downey on July 7.

Jonathan Wilbur and Jeremy Milito are the men's high series winners as each posted a 900 series during the 2018-2019 season.

Wilbur, 37, of North Clarendon, Vermont, had the first perfect set of the 2018-2019 season during the Commercial men's league at Rutland Bowlerama in Rutland, Vermont, on Jan. 14.

Milito, 26, of Patchogue, New York, became the 35th bowler to roll a 900 series, connecting for 36 consecutive strikes during the Epic Edge Trios league on April 25 at Farmingdale Lanes in Farmingdale, New York.

Ashley Cicciarelli, 17, of Endicott, New York, earned the Youth Female USBC National High Series Award with an 854 series on Feb. 9. She had a games of 258, 296 and 300 at

Midway Lanes in Vestal, New York, to lead Union-Endicott High School to the Section IV Class A title.



DiRupo, Allen Elected to USBC Hall of Fame

ARLINGTON, Texas - Marianne DiRupo of Succasunna, New Jersey, and Patrick Allen of Garfield, New Jersey, have been elected to the United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame for Superior Performance.

DiRupo and Allen were on the ballot of six men and two women voted on by a national panel of USBC Hall of Fame members, veteran bowling writers and USBC board members. Though each fell short of the required 70 percent of the votes cast, the USBC Hall of Fame Committee selected the two candidates for induction.

The selection of DiRupo and Allen completes the six-member 2020 USBC Hall of Fame class. Patrick Healey Jr. (USBC Outstanding Performance), Bob Learn Jr. (Veterans), and Andrew Cain and Jim Zebehazy (both in Meritorious Service) were elected by the **USBC** Hall of Fame committee in late October.

The 2020 USBC Hall of Fame Class will be inducted April 29, during the USBC Convention at The Orleans Hotel and Casino in Las Vegas.

DiRupo, 52, joined the Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour in 1992 and was the rookie of the year that season. She won the first of her eight career titles at the 1993 **Ebonite Three Rivers Open at** Princess Lanes in Pittsburgh.

She won the first of her three major titles at the 1997 **Hammer Players Championship** in Rockford, Illinois, beating Wendy Macpherson in the title match. She also won the Miller **High Life National Players** Championship in 2002 and the USBC Queens in 2004.

DiRupo owns a USBC Women's Championships title, teaming with Timi McCorvey to win doubles in 1999, and also has eight other top-10 finishes at the event. She earned **Bowlers Journal All-American** first-team honors in 1996, 1997 and 1999.

Prior to her stellar bowling career, she was on the South Carolina softball team from 1986-1989, leading the team in RBIs in her senior season. She was a four-time National **Softball Coaches Association** All-Region selection and earned a spot on the CoSIDA Academic All-America second team in 1989.

Allen, 49, is the owner of 13 Professional Bowlers Associa-

tion (PBA) titles.

He captured his first PBA title at the 2001 Greater Detroit Open, winning in his first TV appearance. He had multiple wins in 2005, 2007 and 2009, and earned his second major title at the 2009 H&R Block Tournament of Champions.

Allen had his best season in 2004-2005, winning three titles, including his first major at the 2005 Denny's World Championship, and finishing in the top five of the other three major events to earn PBA Player of the Year honors.

The 13 titles in the 2000s tied Allen with Parker Bohn III for most PBA Tour victories by a left-hander.

Allen was No. 44 on the list of the 50 Greatest Players in PBA History, released in 2009 as part of the PBA's 50th anniversary, and was inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in 2019

Allen also was a Team USA member from 2008-2012.

He was part of the "Dream Team" selected for the 2008 World Bowling Men's Championships in Bangkok, after the world governing body decided to allow professional athletes compete in international events. He won gold in doubles and team and a bronze in trios and captured two more golds (trios, team) and a bronze (trios) at the 2010 event in Munich.

In addition to Allen, the men's national ballot included Bryan Goebel of Shawnee. Kansas; Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas; Randy Pedersen of Orlando, Florida; Mike Scroggins of Amarillo, Texas, and Mark Williams of Beaumont,

The women's national ballot also had Tammy Turner of West Palm Beach, Florida.

Through 2019, there are 432 members of the USBC Hall of Fame - 223 in Superior Performance, 120 in Meritorious Service, 51 in Veterans, 22 in Pioneer and 16 in Outstanding **USBC** Performance.

The USBC Hall of Fame was created in 2005 by merging the former American Bowling Congress and Women's International Bowling Congress Halls

PBA 2019: The Year's Top Stories

By: Jerry Schneider CHICAGO (Dec. 19, 2019) There was no shortage of historic news coming out of the Professional Bowlers Association's 61st season in 2019. The purchase of PBA by Bowlero Corp, the first season of television coverage by FOX Sports and livestreaming by partner FloBowling, another recordbreaking year by Australian two-hander Jason Belmonte and Kris Prather's historic win in the inaugural PBA Playoffs were just a few of the landmark stories in 2019.

Here's a look back at some of the PBA's headline events in 2019:

Bowlero Corp purchases PBA - Bowlero Corp, the world's largest owner and operator of bowling centers, became the third owner of the Professional Bowlers Association (PBA), the pinnacle of professional bowling since 1958, when it purchased the organization from principal owner Mike Slade. The purchase brought an end to the nearly two-decade ownership era of Microsoft executives that included Slade, Rob Glaser and bowling enthusiast Chris Peters who was the driving force

Jason Belmonte completes another record-setting season - Just two weeks after winning the PBA Tournament of Champions for a record-tying 10th PBA major title, Jason Belmonte successfully defended his PBA World Championship title for a record 11th major victory. The 35-year-old twohander defeated Jakob Butturff of Tempe, Ariz., 236-227, in the stepladder finals televised live by FS1 at Thunderbowl Lanes in suburban Detroit. In his 11th season on tour, Belmonte broke a tie with PBA Hall of Famers **Earl Anthony and Pete Weber** for the most major titles. In the process, he became the youngest player to win 10 majors, and with a runner-up finish in the PBA Players Championship plus a fourth-place finish in the U.S. Open, he became the first player ever to record championship round finishes in four majors in a single season twice (he also achieved that feat in 2013). By winning his third TOC, he tied Hall of Famers Jason Couch and Mike Durbin for most Tournament of Cham\$288,290 in earnings, Belmonte won his fifth Chris Schenkel PBA Player of the Year award. Other 2019 award winners were Mykel Holliman, Harry Golden PBA Rookie of the Year; Martin Larsen winning his second **Steve Nagy Sportsmanship** Award and Chuck Gardner receiving the Tony Reyes Community Service Award.

Kris Prather wins inaugural PBA Playoffs - Kris Prather of Plainfield, Illinois, made critical shot after critical shot in defeating Bill O'Neill, 226-215 and 216-185, in the Raceto-Two Points finale to win the inaugural PBA Playoffs and the \$100,000 first prize at Bayside Bowl. The championship match aired live on FOX, concluding a 13-tournament qualifying series that led into a 24-player match play elimination competition to determine the champion.

Two-hander Anthony Simonsen becomes youngest to win two majors at age 22 - At age 22, No. 2 seed **Anthony Simonsen of Little** Elm, Texas, defeated top seed Jason Belmonte, 232-212, in the championship match of the PBA Players Championship at Wayne Webb's Columbus Bowl to become the youngest player to win two PBA Tour majors. In 2016 he won the USBC Masters at age 19 to become the youngest to win a PBA Tour major.

Norm Duke wins back-toback PBA Tour titles at age **54** – Three weeks shy of his 55th birthday, PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke of Clermont, Florida, won the Go Bowling

Indianapolis Open and Go Bowling Jonesboro Open backto-back to become the oldest player to win consecutive tour titles. The wins also increased his career titles total to 40, third all-time behind Walter Ray Williams Jr. with 47 and Earl Anthony with 43.

Go Bowling PBA Tour completes first season on FOX Sports - The robust multiplatform PBA-FOX Sports agreement, announced in March of 2018, featured four telecasts on FOX and 26 on FS1. The 2019 TV schedule included 60 hours of coverage, nearly double the previous year's schedule, and the most in decades. Nineteen

2020 Team USA Trials, U.S. Amateur Set to Begin in Las Vegas

LAS VEGAS - Just like other top-tier athletes, Kelly Kulick of Union, New Jersey, and John Janawicz of Winter Haven, Florida, know there's an expiration date on their careers.

It may not be as matterof-fact in bowling, which is a lifetime sport, but certainly at the elite level, where the two longtime Team USA members have found success throughout their hall-of-fame careers.

They have watched contemporaries retire from the Team USA program in recent years, and they've wondered when they'll know the right time to step away, too.

That time is not now, however, as the two United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famers head to Las Vegas for the 2020 USBC Team USA Trials, where they'll look to defend their titles and hopefully add a few final touches to their Team USA resumes.

'I have had the chance to experience so many things and see some incredible places, but I want to go out on my own terms and when I feel like I've done all I can on the lanes for Team USA," Kulick said. "The main goal right now is to make the team again. I'd love to have a World Cup title, as well, but I'm also starting to learn to enjoy the experiences as a whole, win or lose. Yes, every time I put on my shoes I want to win, but that's not always realistic.

The Team USA Trials will take place at the Gold Coast Bowling Center in Las Vegas from Jan. 3-7.

The week also will include

the United States Amateur Bowling Championships.

A sold-out men's field of 175 players and record field of more than 165 female competitors will begin the first of five qualifying blocks Friday at 11 a.m. Eastern. All rounds of competition will be broadcast live at BowlTV.com.

The event returns to the place where Kulick and Janawicz showcased their skills across five challenging oil patterns in 2019 to become the oldest champions in their respective divisions at 41 and 46, respectively.

"In hindsight, that week was very special," Kulick said. "We were the oldest in history to win, and I'd just found out I had been elected to the USBC Hall of Fame. Unfortunately, that light didn't stay lit for me in 2019. I'm hoping 2020 can get off to another great start, but that I'll be able to carry that momentum throughout the year. I don't have anything to prove to anyone but myself. I want to prove that age is just a number and see if I'm still good enough.

Their victories at the 2019 Team USA Trials earned Kulick and Janawicz the opportunity to represent the United States at the 2019 QubicaAMF Bowling World Cup in Palembang, Indonesia.

It was the first appearance for each at the prestigious event, and coming up short there also will be a motivator for the duo heading into the 2020 Team USA Trials. Kulick, who is looking to make Team USA for the 16th time, finished tied for third place at the

World Cup, while Janawicz, a nine-time Team USA member, finished 19th on the men's side.

"It was a bucket-list item just to bowl in the World Cup, but to put on the performance I did was pretty disappointing," Janawicz said. "My execution could've been better, and to lay an egg in what could be my only appearance was disappointing, too. I don't really want that to be my only World Cup performance, so I'd love another chance. There's only one way to get there, and that is to win the Team Trials, so that's extra motivation."

As the 2019 calendar year wound down, the two did not ignore the things they needed to work on to ensure another solid effort in Las Vegas.

Kulick was very focused on her release, which she feels will help her ball reaction on some of the tougher oil patterns she'll face in 2020, not only at the Team USA Trials, but also on the Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour.

Janawicz, who flew back and forth between the United States and Asia many times in 2019 for both work and bowling reasons, returned home from the World Cup and immediately started working on some fit changes in his bowling balls to hopefully correct the things that didn't feel quite right in Indonesia. He also admitted to struggling with repeating shots, so there has been some focus on that.

"You're always trying to find ways to score, especially as the game and equipment changes," Janawicz said. "You

It Shouldn't Have Been There Anyway

What folly. It is certainly tough when your best effort sticks a 9 pin or you leave a "ringing" 10. However, leaving those after your first shot is not the problem. It's leaving them after your second that causes real grief.

Good shots are not always rewarded with strikes. That seems so unfair, doesn't it? You work really hard on your game and take lessons and read magazines and yes, even practice and still they stand. You knew it was great off your hand. The pins just didn't fall.

There are so many things going on once you let the ball go, it's mind-boggling. Valleys, and slopes and warped panels and non-resilient kickbacks and old pins...the list is plenty long and absolutely NONE of it is in your control. However, to make your best shot and have a pin stand is not what the phrase "It shouldn't have been there anyway" is referring to. That's what folks say to you after you

have to find ways to stay competitive with the talented young players, who are so far ahead of where I was at their ages. As you get older and your body changes, you have to be more creative. Winning in 2019, when scores were a little lower, spare shooting was key for me."

Also among the talented field at the 2020 Team USA Trials will be reigning U.S. Amateur champions Breanna Clemmer of Clover, South Carolina, and Wesley Low of Palmdale, California, and a slew of recent and past winners from the prestigious Junior Gold Championships.

Competitors at this week's event will earn ranking points based on their finishing positions in each of the five qualifying rounds - the top bowler of the round will earn one ranking point, second place will earn two points, etc. - with the lowest total of ranking points after five rounds determining the men's and women's Team USA Trials champions. Each will earn an automatic spot on Team USA for 2020.

In addition to the title and spot on the team, the winner of each division again will represent Team USA at the World Cup. The 2020 event will miss that stone 9 pin with your spare shot.

Do you know how you know if the 9 should have been there? It was there, that's how. Something didn't happen properly at the pin deck and it stood. There's no solace in "it shouldn't have been there anyway." It was there. The issue is that the sweep knocked it down instead of you doing the deed. Your now job is to demolish it with your second chance. What a blessing. You get another chance at the little bugger! Not many sports give you that.

I Hit the Pocket

That's not quite all it takes to strike. You've got to have a higher standard than just hitting the pocket. It takes the proper angle, speed, and rotation to carry. If any one of those things is off, something will be standing.

Angle - USBC studies indicate that the optimum entry angle into the pocket is around 4 to 6 degrees. That would be great knowledge to have if we knew where the ball needed

be held in Kuwait.

The top four men and top four women at the 2020 Team USA Trials, based on ranking points, will earn automatic spots on Team USA, while two additional men and two additional women will be selected by the National Selection Committee from the pool of players that competed during the week at the Gold Coast Bowling Center.

The National Selection Committee also will select a maximum of five men and five women for the team based on submitted resumes. Those applicants must have been Team USA or Junior Team USA members within the last 10 years or among the top 25

to break to create 4, 5, or 6 degrees of entry angle. Thinking that the ball should have been on the 9th board at 44 feet, 61/4 inches instead of the 9th board at 44 feet, 3½ inches is enough minutiae to get you off your game. If you have to be that perfect, you hope everyone else does as well. We really just need to know when it's too much and when it's too little.

Speed - It's pretty easy to have too much or too little. There can be some variation in "just right", of course. We've all seen grandpa or the betweenthe-legs kid hit the pocket. They just didn't have the speed to benefit from a pocket hit. When you have discovered the speed that gets you to the hole and carries well, do it again (and again and again)...

Rotation - If you have the right speed and angle into the pocket and the wrong axis rotation, your carry percentage will be lower than it would be otherwise. Axis rotation not only helps your ball traverse the hazards of the lane surface and pattern, it helps or hinders how your ball travels through the pins.

To say you "hit the pocket" may be technically correct, but in the real bowling world, it's just not enough.

After the final qualifying round at the Team Trials, the top three amateur men and top three amateur women will advance to a stepladder final to determine the U.S. Amateur champions. Both winners will earn spots on Team USA.

If the U.S. Amateur champion already has earned a spot on the team, the spot will be awarded to the next-highest Team USA Trials qualifier based on ranking points.

To be eligible for this year's U.S. Amateur, a bowler must







PBA Spare Shots

By: Bill Vint **BOWLERS JOURNAL** HONORS JASON BEL-MONTE, COLIE EDISON

Bowlers Journal International magazine has selected Australia's Jason Belmonte as its Male Bowler of the Decade for the 2010s and new PBA CEO Colie Edison as its 2019 Person of the Year.

In what was arguably the most dominant decade by a bowler in PBA history, Belmonte set a number of records, including winning 11 major championships including four USBC Masters titles (three of those in a row). He won 21 of his 22 career titles in the 2010s, earned PBA Player of the Year honors five times and joined the PBA "Millionaire's Club" in a record-shattering 131 tournaments.

But maybe Belmonte's most impressive feat was establishing the two-handed delivery as a dominant technique that has been mimicked by thousands of young bowlers in the wake of his success.

Edison rose to prominence in the bowling world when Bowlero Corp purchased the PBA in September, and the **Bowlero Chief Customer Officer** was named PBA CEO. Within two months of becoming the first woman to hold the PBA's top executive position, Edison won the favor of PBA players and fans by announcing the 2020 Go Bowling PBA Tour would receive a nearly \$500,000 boost in prize money, including \$100,000 first prize

checks for winners of the 2020 PBA Tournament of Champions, PBA World Championship and PBA Playoffs.

TOMMY JONES WINS BOWLERO ELITE SERIES FOR \$100,000 PAYDAY

Nineteen-time PBA Tour champion Tommy Jones of Simpsonville, S.C., who will be inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in Arlington, Texas, on Jan. 18, defeated Bowlero league bowler Garrett Shovan of Denver, Colo., 266-200, to win the \$100,000 first prize in the final Bowlero Elite Series tournament of 2019 at Bowlero Jupiter in Florida to conclude the season.

Jones, 41, defeated 2019 PBA Player of the Year Jason Belmonte, 279-216, to win the professional side of the pro-am bracket and advance to the championship match where he equaled the largest payday of his career, matching the \$100,000 he collected for winning the 2006 U.S. Open.

Shovan, a pro shop operator and former Saginaw Valley State collegiate bowler, won the right to bowl against Jones by winning the league bowler side of the 16-player invitational field. He defeated Chicago's Luis Gonzalez, 236-202, in the amateur bracket final match. Shovan won \$25,000 as runner-up.

The third event in the **Bowlero Elite Series aired** Sunday on NBC. Other PBA stars who were invited to participate in the special event were Marshall Kent of Yakima, Wash.; Anthony Simonsen of Little Elm, Texas; Kyle Troup of Taylorsville, N.C.; and Kyle Sherman of O'Fallon, Mo. 
