Some of you might remember Dave Williams, who often visited Texas in a marketing capacity, first for AMF Bowling Centers, and later in his career with American Recreation Centers and Triangle Bowling Centers.





USBC Exploring Alternate Host City for 2021 Women's Championships

ARLINGTON, Texas – The United States Bowling Congress is exploring options for an alternate host city for the 2021 USBC Women's Championships, currently scheduled to be conducted at Stardust Bowl in Addison, Illinois, USBC is look-

ing for greater operational and scheduling flexibility for the Women's Championships due to uncertainty about COVID-19 restrictions.

"USBC is taking steps to create the best opportunity possible to conduct the Women's Championships in 2021," USBC Executive Director Chad Murphy said. "We are exploring options to give USBC more options to operate given the possibility of evolving COVID-19 restrictions. Our partners at Stardust Bowl and DuPage Convention

and Visitors Bureau are supportive and understand USBC's desire to host major events in their venue."

One option under consideration is the swapping of host centers for the 2021 and 2022 events. This would move the 2021 Women's Championships to the newly renovated National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nevada, and Stardust Bowl would host the 2022 tournament.

USBC will provide an additional update to registered team captains by the end of September. If a change in host cities does occur, teams scheduled to bowl at the 2021 tournament will not have to take any additional steps to ensure their reservation as all dates and times will remain the same. Teams that do not want to compete in a new host city will be able to request a full refund or roll their funds over to 2022.

"We apologize for this uncertainty, but we want our bowlers to know a change is possible so they can hold off on travel commitments for now," Murphy said. "If any of our bowlers have questions or concerns, they should feel free to reach out to our tournament staff to assist."

Registration Set to Begin for 2021 Team USA Trials

By: Matt Cannizzaro ARLINGTON, Texas - Registration for the 2021 United States Bowling Congress Team USA Trials will begin Tuesday, Sept. 8.

The event tentatively is scheduled to be held at the Gold Coast Bowling Center in Las Vegas from Jan. 2-7, 2021 and again will feature separate divisions for men and women.

The format, location and entry maximums for the 2021 Team USA Trials are subject to change based on the recommended best practices and social-distancing protocols as the start date of the tournament approaches.

USBC intends to operate the event, even if relocation is required, and advises not booking travel (flight and/or hotel) until further details are announced. Specifics will be available on, or before, Nov. 1, 2020.

The entry fee will be \$350, and the week also will include the United States National Amateur Bowling Championships.

There are two major changes to the tournament rules potential participants should be aware of prior to registering: * Any competitor who will be 18 years of age or older as of the completion of the 2021 Team USA Trials will be required to be current with SafeSport prior to registering for the event.

* In order to be eligible for the adult version of Team USA, a competitor must be 18 or older on, or before, Jan. 7, 2021. Those who do not meet that requirement still will be eligible for Junior Team USA.

The format at the Team USA Trials includes five qualifying rounds on five World Bowling oil patterns and a points-based ranking system to determine the champions.

The top bowler of the round will earn one ranking point, second place will earn two points, etc., with the lowest total of ranking points after five rounds determining the men's and women's Team USA Trials champions.

From the 2021 Team USA Trials, the top four men and top four women (by performance and age-eligible), the two U.S. Amateur champions and two men and two women - selected at-large by the National Selec-




tion Committee - will qualify for Team USA.

The top four boys and top four girls, by performance, who are age-eligible, along with two boys and two girls selected atlarge by the NSC, will be added to the Junior Team USA roster.

They will join the bowlers who qualified in 2020 and were granted an extra year on the teams after the Team USA program went on hiatus due to COVID-19.



Team USA Women Help Usher in New School Year for Fourth-Grade Students

Missy Parkin, Danielle McEwan, Jordan Richard, Stefanie Johnson, Liz Kuhlkin and Shannon O'Keefe, all of whom won gold medals for Team USA in 2019, reunited via Zoom on Sept. 3 to talk bowling with fourth-grade teacher Natalie Wheelock and 40 students from Rocky Ridge Elementary.

Despite a non-traditional start to the 2020-2021 school year, with everything still taking place virtually due to COVID-19, the current landscape gave the students an opportunity they likely wouldn't have had otherwise.

'Overall, it was a very positive experience for both me and the kids," said Wheelock, who coordinated with another teacher at Rocky Ridge to allow more students to share the opportunity. "It opened up a lot of eyes about the possibility of something they didn't even know existed - being professional bowlers - and the fact that there's this amazing group

of people out in the world representing them and our country on the lanes.

During a time in history that has added uncertainly and stress for students, families and teachers, Wheelock knows that virtual learning continuing into the fall may bring some challenges, but there also will be opportunities, like having six of bowling's biggest stars visit her class.

With the continued help of technology, one thing she hopes to do this year is bring different aspects of the world into her classroom, and that started with the Team USA meet-and-greet.

She also likes to remind her class that no matter what's happening in the world, there's always something to celebrate.

Each day, she posts about an international or national holiday, and the first day of school happened to coincide with U.S. Bowling League Day. Just like the school year, the new league bowling season is getting underway across the country, too.

The Team USA members had a chance to talk about the places they've traveled, when and how they started bowling, some of their favorite moments and triumphs and some challenges they've encountered or

overcome along the way. They also got to share some of their favorite photos.

'It was absolutely amazing to be a part of this and get a look into the new way of teaching and learning and see how (Ms. Wheelock) is using different ways to make it fun and successful," McEwan said. "One of the things we got to tell them was that we'll all be on TV at the end of the month for the (Professional Bowlers Association) League, so hopefully, they'll check it out, and we'll have some new fans out there cheering for us."

The group's most recent success with Team USA included a doubles gold medal for O'Keefe and Johnson at the 2019 Pan American Games in Peru and a pair of gold medals at the 2019 World Bowling Women's Championships Las Vegas - singles for McEwan and trios for Kuhlkin, Parkin and Richard.

Together, the six earned a bronze medal in the team event at the World Women's Championships to complete a six-medal haul at the event.

O'Keefe, McEwan and Richard also found the winner's circle on the Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour in 2019, while O'Keefe was named PWBA Player of the Year for the second consecutive season.

"The ladies did an amazing job and were models of professionalism," Wheelock said. "They were so patient with the kids and had some inspirational things to say about following your dreams."

Though 2020 has not offered the same on-lane opportunities as previous years, having days like last Thursday and getting to serve as role models can be equally as rewarding.

"It was so refreshing to speak with the young kids and share our journey and simply give them hope that no dream is too big to dream," said Johnson, who has been a member of Team USA each year since 2005.

Johnson has two young children, Levi and Kenzie, and has gotten to experience virtual learning as a parent, too.

At the end of the presentation, "Ms. Wheels" allowed the students to use the chat feature on Zoom to share any thoughts or questions they had for the Team USA players, and she said the space was flooded with thank yous and appreciation from the inspired students.



His perspective came from a golfer's point of view. Other than a hole in one or breaking a stroke score of 60 for eighteen holes, golf has no comparable achievement.



Also included is an account of not only how bowling media covered the series, but how the mainstream and sports media covered the event and the subsequent questions as why the American Bowling Congress has not sanctioned it.

Where Have All The Bowling **Newspapers Gone?**

In the September 3rd issue of the California Bowling News, Carol Mancini made a comment that got me to wondering... Where Have All The Bowling Newspapers Gone? My research over the past week has provided for many interesting conversations and an update on a few of the bowling newspapers that are still around, and still being printed on a weekly basis!

When my personal bowling journey brought me to the AMF Bowling Headquarters in Westbury, New York, I remember Publicity Director Jack Graziano providing me with a list of over 30 weekly bowling newspapers that were printed each week and distributed to bowling centers and their bowlers in various parts of the

Previous duties with AMF before being promoted to the corporate headquarters had allowed me to become familiar with many of the cherished individuals that tirelessly published their bowling newspaper as an act of love rather than one of a source for making a living.

My first introduction to one of these publications was the California Bowling News, which arrived every Friday afternoon to the small bowling center where I grew up in Sebastopol, California. I remember as a youngster taking a free copy of the newspaper home and reading it from cover to cover, learning about all of the amazing tournaments and other activities that took place every week.

As I grew up and became somewhat proficient at the game of bowling, the California Bowling News was the first to highlight my success and catalogue my scores, often on the front page of the journal. Ken Lowman, publisher of the newspaper for many years, confided to me that when he first came upon the bowling scene, he remembers Helen Kibbe "skipping over to the file cabinet" to pull out a mug shot of me whenever news of a high score came their way.

At that time, the California Bowling News was "only" 30 years old. The publication is now celebrating their 80th year of continuous service to the bowlers of California. Only the Sports Reporter of New Jersey, which also began in 1940, can match their uninterrupted string of printing a newspaper each week... for 80 years!

As I began to research online for any remaining bowling newspapers, I was reminded of the many friendships that I had developed over the years with the unsung heroes that published these bowling documents on a weekly basis. I could write an entire article about each of them, but for now I will provide an encapsulated paragraph for each:

Bowling World: Red Pfeiffer somehow managed to print (and deliver!) this newspaper throughout Northern California, often containing as many as 80 pages. His legacy continues online through the efforts of Donna Hazel, and I'm honored to write articles for her periodically. The Coronavirus has placed a hardship on the paper, which has not published since February.

California Kegler: Alice Meglemre was another of those unsung heroes that kept her paper going in spite of many bowling centers closing in the Long Beach area. I remember her love and devotion coming through with a personal note inscribed in a copy whenever an article or advertisement was included from AMF or American Recreation Centers

Pacific Bowler: Although I don't believe that I ever met Joe Lyou, that didn't prevent him from writing about many of my bowling exploits throughout the years, both on the lanes and later with AMF and American Recreation Centers. Chuck Pezzano, one of the most legendary bowling writers of all time, used to share a story that he would always introduce Joe as the most famous Korean bowling writer in America. The joke was that Joe was the only Korean bowling writer.

San Diego Bowling Beat and Arizona Bowling Beat: Cody Skelton began with a publication in San Diego, expanded to Arizona, and was also arranging for a Utah edition when AMF moved me from my San Diego location... a

beautiful place to live! During my time with Cody's publications, I was able to continue "A Pro's View," a column that I began in my Northern California hometown newspapers in Sebastopol and Santa Rosa.

Oregon Bowler: Howard and Ethel Sitter were the epitome of bowling devotion in the pacific northwest. They operated a print shop and used the newspaper to fill their downtime. Whenever I had a bowling party or special event that was noteworthy, I would call and invite Howard and Ethel to join me and cover the proceeding. They never let me down! Their daughter, Debbie Deane, continues an Old Timer's Tournament, now in it's 50th year, in their honor.

Chicago Bowler: While I was stationed in Chicago for AMF, I utilized the time to meet every Friday morning with Joe Kissel, owner and publisher of the Chicago Bowler. We talked about anything involving bowling and discussed advertising placements for the next issue. His office was a mess! I hope that someone saved all of his bowling memorabilia.

Long Island Bowling News: Ed Leahy provided coverage of bowling scores for more than 100,000 league members in Nassau and Suffolk Counties, a real hotbed of bowling. The fact that AMF was located in Westbury, a city in Nassau County, meant that I was often called upon by Mr. Leahy for bowling related topics; as well as for my own bowling exploits at Deer Park Bowl, a bowling center that is noted for action bowling to this day.

National Bowlers Review: John and Donna Buckley were another very devoted couple that spent their life documenting bowling scores, primarily in an area from Maine to Florida. Because AMF had so many bowling centers in this region, we actually began an AMF Bowling Centers Newsletter as an insert to the National **Bowlers Review.**

With the exception of Bowling World, all of these publications are gone.

In addition to the California

I Heart My Bowling Shoes Shoes are so important that if you had to decide between buying real bowling shoes and buying a bowling ball, the choice would be shoes.

Check your shoes and the approaches every time you bowl - whether practice or competition. If there's frosting on the approach or someone has used those nasty illegal powders, you need to know that. You can never assume the approaches are okay before you start and, indeed, every time you step on the approach throughout an event.

Check both your shoes and the approach. Some people start at the back of the approach and run toward the foul line to see if they can slide. Well, duh! What if they can't? They'll figure that out as soon as they

How to Quickly and Effectively Check Approaches

• Stand in the middle of the approach three to four feet behind the foul line. WITH YOUR BALL SIDE FOOT STAYING IN CONTACT WITH THE FLOOR, bend your slide knee as you slide toward the foul line.

To test approaches, don't just stand upright and delicately slide your foot back and forth a few inches like you're sticking your toe in the water. That's not how you slide and it can't

Bend your knees and slide your whole body forward on the ball of your foot and then apply pressure to the heel for braking just like you do when you slide.

• Next, slide at a slight angle between the 25th and 35th board. This is approximately where you'll be sliding for right side spares (for a righty). If the approaches are synthetic, there might be a seam. Be sure you test the feel of sliding across it, whether you think you'll be doing that or not. Better to be prepared for anything.

 Slide at a slight angle toward the left corner of the deck between about the 12th and 17th boards. This is close to where you'll be sliding for left side spare conversions or if

you get to play the ditch. This will allow you to sliiiiiide, have a nice long flat spot, post your shot, and be able to see that thing of beauty all the way down the lane.

Bowling News and New Jersey Sports Reporter, there are still a few bowling newspapers that are printed each week. Perhaps the most noteworthy is The **Bowling News of Dallas-Fort** Worth, Texas, which has been printing continuously since 1956. Tony and Genie Franklin purchased the publication of The Bowling News (Texas) when founder Joe Gennaro retired in 2009.

Another bowling newspaper that still prints a hard copy is the Metro Bowler in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Juette Holseth reports that they have been printing since 1976. The remainder of the publications that I've been able to locate are now only provided online. There's also a number of USBC newsletters online, including calusbc.com, which I'm honored to write articles for in a column known as "Dave's Corner.'

The near extinction of bowling newspapers parallels the closings of bowling centers nationally. Here's hoping that we can overturn this trend, and return to a happier time for bowling centers, and bowling newspapers.

Bowling Update

From Ten Pins & More

* New Mexico's Bowling Centers were re-opened somewhat for business after enduring a record 185 day closure that started on March 17. It was the last state to ever be allowed to bowl, even though Georgia got it's go-ahead on April 30, followed by dozens of other states in May, June and

California, after opening up in June, remains closed in most counties following a spike in COVID-19 cases.

New Mexico's 33 Bowling Centers are a "mixed bag" including military Centers which opened in July, a casino-based house in Espanola that got going early last month, a few other casino houses that are still closed pending the re-opening of the gaming areas, commercial "mom and pop" Centers, at 25% of fire code capacity along with corporate giants, Main Event and Round One, which both rely heavily on added attractions, which remain "off limits" under the current Public Health Order.

Centers that re-opened last month are scrambling to sign up

fall league bowlers, given they had zero summer leagues to recruit, plus all were unable to create schedules without knowing league start dates.

"All owners and managers are optimistic we'll end up with a decent turn-out," said Steve Mackie, president of the NM Bowling Centers Association, "Other states and the national BPAA are suggesting if we get a less than twenty percent drop-out rate, we'll survive this unintended business interruption," he said.

League bowlers - the only ones who are allowed to play in New Mexico at present - are excited to get back on the lanes.
