The Savannah College of Art and Design-Savannah women and men swept the titles last weekend at the Midwest Collegiate Championships in the greater Milwaukee area.

The first Tier I event of the 2021-2022 United States Bowling Congress Collegiate season was contested at AMF West Lanes for the women's division and Bowlero Wauwatosa for men's competition. The tournament featured 30 varsity women's programs and 41 men's varsity teams.

The event featured six traditional games Saturday and 16 Baker games Sunday to determine the eight teams in each division advancing to bracket competition. All bracket matches featured a best-of-three Baker format.

Broadcast coverage from both centers was provided by BowlTV.com.

In the women's division, SCAD-Savannah qualified fifth overall and defeated No. 4 St. Ambrose (2-0) and top qualifier Mount Mercy (2-1) to set up a title tilt against No. 2 Webber International. Webber had swept No. 7 Lindenwood and bested No. 6 St. Francis-Illinois, 2-1, to advance.

After winning Game 1 (182-176) and dropping Game 2 (164-159), SCAD-Savannah's Pamela Perez filled 20 pins in the 10th frame of the deciding game to force Webber to strike to win the Midwest Collegiate Championships. Webber was unable to connect on its first delivery, leaving a 4-6-7 split,

and the open frame helped the Bees capture the victory,

Mount Mercy earned the top seed for the bracket with an 8,859 qualifying total. Webber finished with 8,799, and Midland was third with 8,577. William Penn qualified eighth and earned the final spot in bracket play with 8,158.

In the women's individual standings, Mount Mercy's Ayra Aminuddin rolled 241 in her final game to earn top honors, finishing with a six-game total of 1,258, a 209.66 average.

Aminuddin was joined on the all-tournament team by William Penn's Gabriella Evans (1,242), Morningside's Carissa Johnson (1,240), Midland's Chloe Herman (1,226) and

Pop artist (and fellow yinzer) Andy Warhol is closely associated with the concept of everyone in the future being famous for fifteen minutes. That association ironically began in 1968, the year after a Texas bowling legend began his venture into that concept of pop culture.

But as the Houston bowling community can tell you, Jack Biondolillo's contribution to bowling was much, much more than the fifteen to twenty minutes it took to throw a twelve bagger in front of fifteen million people on national television.

Biondolillo passed away on Saturday, October 2 at the age of 81. Nationally, he is most famous for the first nationally televised 300 game in the opening match of the 1967 PBA Tournament of Champions, known more at the time as "The Firestone," the original and thirty-year tournament

From his early years in Midtown Houston, then the Oak Forest neighborhoods before playing football and bowling before graduating from St. Thomas High School, Jack took the road bowling offered at the time to a life of wonderment.

Around Houston, he was much more. After his tour career, there was managing at several centers, most notably at old Stadium Bowl, just northwest of The Astrodome. It was here the Houston and Texas bowling communities got to know Biondolillo as someone who as his sister Barbara told me for the tribute I wrote for pba.com and seen elsewhere in TBN, she and Jack agreed he really lived life five times over.



Sporting News on Jack's first tour win, the one over Don Carter in

Birmingham, Alabama, when bowling stories were common in any newspaper.

There's a photo of Jack's then record 6' 3" 25lb. sailfish catch off the Texas Gulf Coast in the Billy Wilson Deep Sea Rodeo.

There's a pair of photos from the Japan Gold Cup win with runner-up Earl Anthony while Jack held a large wider cup filled with what looks like beer.

Then there are others, like a 1960 photo of Jack as a Brunswick staffer at a Bowlers Victory Legion event at the Veterans Administration hospital in Tomah, Wisconsin donating his time entertaining patients.

After the 300 game, Jack became enough of a name around Houston to be asked to appear in a clothing ad. Along with the one and only Jamie Brooks, fellow proprietor Clay Stone, Jack appeared dressed in a leisure suit with Houston clothier Harold Wiesenthal in an ad for his clothing store, Harold's, not far from old All Star Lanes. For the younger readers, yes that is Jamie in his Ron Burgundy mustache days of the early 1970's.

Another sign of tributes came in before Jack's passing. I couldn't count how many customers I helped at Mike

Austin's Bowling Dynamix Pro Shop about how Biondolillo gave a couple lessons, gave tips, drilled a ball, or just stopped by to say hello and spend a few minutes catching up at Stadium Bowl or later at Emerald Bowl. Jack was proud to share his charisma and personality with everyone. He wanted everyone around to have a good time.

While setting pins as a youth in his home of Idaho, Dan Lovett became a fan of bowling at an

early age. After Jack rolled his game, Lovett, now a sportscaster at Houston's ABC affiliate KTRK, thought it was time to do a story on Jack on the game that aired on his station that Saturday afternoon April 1, 1967.

That story began a friendship lasting over 50 years. As Lovett wrote in his 2014 memoir, "Anybody Seen Dan Lovett Memoirs Of A Media Nomad, he included a chapter just about Jack and that game. I'll summarize it as best I can; Lovett includes the position round win by a single pin the night before over Bill Tucker sneaking into the telecast as the fifth seed, a conversation ABC-TV lead announcer Chris Schenkel jokingly tells Jack at breakfast the day of the telecast not to shoot 300 on the show because Schenkel couldn't work due to the ongoing AFTRA strike (Biondolillo had worked numerous telecasts as a scorekeeper in the booth for Schenkel and analyst, fellow Houstonian Billy

Welu), and the fateful glass of ice water former Oklahoma football coach Bud Wilkinson tried to keep from Jack, who still believed decades later that kept him from winning the tournament he would have cherished.

There was the Funtime Bowling, a Houston television bowling show in the mid 2000's featuring various challenge matches. According to Lovett, he and Lollipop worked very well together, sounding like they had a great time calling these matches. Jack would not be afraid to get technical when needed, but not to a point of being a distraction. Like he was on his "Pro Bowlers Tour" and "Championship Bowling" matches, Jack drew you into watching and listening to him commentate.

In the Bowlers Journal International podcast appearing shortly, if it isn't posted already, Lovett and I reminisced with **Editor Gianmarc Manzione** about Jack, his bowling life, and his contributions beyond the twenty minutes he owned on April 1, 1967.

In the following five years after the 2017 BJI interview, I would periodically call to check in and say hello, something I did with my Dad who was also in assisted living by this point in his life. Jack had

I wondered to myself as I was reading what might have happened to Bowlero's relationship with iStar, which at last count held the leases of at least 157 of the bowling center properties, according to a 2019 news release. I put feelers out to Bowlero, Isos and iStar, but at press time had not heard from any of them.

One cannot help but speculate on what could be happening within the locker room of the PBA as a result of these changes. My thought process has led me to the origins of professional bowling... long before the PBA, or even the fabulous team era of the 1940's and 1950's.

It was a time in professional bowling when the home-andhome match play format was dominant. That arrangement ushered in the World Match Game Championship, which was initially conducted in 1906 between Jimmy Smith, bowling's first superstar, and Johnny Voorhies. Smith defeated Voorhies in the eleven-game exhibition, 6 games to 3.

Beginning to see the comparison here? It's just like a professional wrestling match...






