## Johnson, Pate, Smallwood, Miller Fill Out PBA Playoffs Round of 16

Centreville, Va. - AJ Johnson opened his 2020 PBA Playoffs by rolling the highest score on the right-bracket Round of 24 telecast, defeating Kyle Sherman, 223-166. Johnson took an early lead that only grew as the one-game match went on.
"You can never be up by too much," said Johnson. "There's a respect level and we're good friends, but I wanted to beat Sherman and never let up. I kept the pressure on and kept throwing great shots."

Johnson, who is seeking his first PBA Tour title, has spent a fair amount of time bowling
on TV Iately as his PBA League expansion team, Las Vegas High Rollers, advanced all the way to the Elias Cup Finals before finishing second to the Portland Lumberjacks in late September.
"I'm starting to feel a lot more comfortable on TV," said Johnson, who will face 2019 PBA Playoffs runner-up Bill O'Neill in the next round. "W hen the lights come on, it's game time. I'm starting to come into my own, finding what works and letting myself be me."
In another resounding Round of 24 victory, threetime PBA Tour champion Tom Smallwood began his match with the first three strikes and PBA Hall of Famer Chris Barnes couldn't keep up, falling by a

Starting with rave reviews, the Fox Strike Track system showed off a new feature with dots. Yep, simple dots. These dots show exact points marking

targeting at the arrows and mark exact breakpoint location, both board number and distance, further illustrating proficiency of a series of shots.

As we got deeper into the match, viewers got a closer look at the breakpoint area. The board locations and traced ball paths are one thing, but when viewers get to see literally how close the dot locations are to one another, one shot after another, it creates a greater

## Walter Ray Williams Jr. Wins PBA50 Timber Lanes Open for 116th PBA Title

Oxford, Pa. - Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams, Jr. of Oxford, Fla., added to his career PBA Title record when he scored an 88-pin victory over Troy Lint of Blandon, Pa. to win the PBA50 Timber Lanes

Open on Sunday.
Williams, the winningest bowler in PBA history, compiled a 5-2-1 match play record and a 16 -game total of 4,106 pins to score the victory. The win was the 21st PBA50 Regional title

While cruising the internet looking for additional 80+ lane bowling centers, I spotted an article about Satellite Bowl, an 84 Iane facility in Dearborn Heights, Michigan. As I continued searching the internet, I found a photo of Satellite Bowl from the City of Dearborn Heights. The article that accompanied the photo goes on to mention that the famous female bowling star Aleta Sill was a frequent guest at the site which closed in 1994.

For those of you that may not remember, A leta Sill was perhaps the greatest female bowler in history, with the possible exception of fellow

Michigander Marion Ladewig. Her record speaks for itself, with 31 Professional Women's Bowling Association (PW BA) titles, the first woman to win over $\$ 1,000,000$ in earnings, and thirty-seven 300 games.

When I contacted Aleta at her "Aleta Sill's Bowling World Pro Shop" inside Country Lanes in Dearborn Heights, she fondly remembered Satellite Bowl, with a road sign that must have been 3 or 4 stories high. "I first started bowling at Oxford Lanes in Dearborn, and then Thunderbowl in Allen Park," said Sill. "I switched to Satellite Bowl in Dearborn Heights

appreciation of how good these guys and gals really are

Check your DVR for the location of the dots as Frankie starts his approach for the 11th strike at the $54: 45$ point of the telecast, perhaps his best ball of the match, both by execution and pinfall type. All the breakpoint dots appear within a very small area, some literally on top of one another, making any 1960's and 70's PBA player envious. Only one breakpoint dot was away from the others, maybe a foot further dow nlane. Dots at the arrows appeared to be a giant blob, really on top of one another. This is the kind of graphic us bowling nerds have been waiting to see for years, knowing in our minds it existed, but now saw it visually represented.

The ideal execution caused the ideal pinfall. What? For years, we've heard the chain reaction has the ball hitting only four of the pins, creating the perfect strike with the ideal chain reaction of pins falling. For each pin to take out the very next one three times ( 1 2,4 , and 7 pins, then the more critical 3, 6, and 10 pins for a right hander), then all ten end up falling off the deck with a minimum of motion into the pit, but all the way to the front of the pin wheel behind the back cushion is quite the
accomplishment
Analyst Randy Pedersen states from time to time something the ball company reps traveling on tour have been saying for years a factor in determining if a bowler using the right ball is the visual criteria of how the ball travels through the pins, then tracking how the pins fall. Bad ball reaction creates slower, almost a lazy motion of pins falling. The rack of pins on this shot fell very quick, caused by optimum ball speed with matching rev rate.

Years ago, bowlers based a performance on hitting a very small target at the arrows. For example, if third arrow was the target, some would even focus on which portion of the arrow to hit, the left side, splitting it down the middle, or the right side of it. As coach Rick Benoit has show $n$ us over the last thirty plus years, the game has more clues and cues on the back end of the lane to watch, not as much on the front half as backend motion began to vary.

The coolest part of bowling in the year 2020 is what Sean Rash did, that was not possible twenty years ago, and may have even been a PBA fine recently. Rash took out his cell phone and recorded Lavoie's final shot seated in his chair on set, then posted it on social media. Imagine one of those 1970's era player whip out a Super 16 mm camera years ago in the 1970's doing that.


A nother addition in the series of PBA Playoffs telecasts has been the player introductions, both on the first live show and the following taped shows.

Roughly thirty seconds in length, each intro is nothing like the "in center live intros" we've heard over the last few years. Well produced, visually pleasing, and with a smooth voice over artist, these pieces do what they are designed to do, stir the curiosity of the casual viewer to watch and keep the attention of the active viewer to keep watching. Don't know whose idea this was, but it's a good one.

score of 215-180.
"Barnes struggled a bit to start and I threw three pretty good shots for a three-bagger, so I had a 30 - or 40-pin lead through the fifth frame," said Smallwood. "I wasn't trying to coast, but it kind of looked that way. I had a really bad shot for an eight count and then a couple nine counts. But if you wait around for a Hall of Famer, he's going to catch you.

Barnes was one of three PBA Hall of Famers, along with Tommy Jones and Norm Duke, to qualify for the 2020 PBA Playoffs. All three were eliminated in the opening round. Smallwood draws 13-time PBA Tour champion EJ Tackett in the Round of 16.

The key to Nick Pate's 207202 victory over Darren Tang may have been the first frame, when Pate converted a 1-2-10 washout.
"If I get seven and two there," said Pate, who follow ed the conversion with two consecutive strikes, "it's a 279 max instead of 290. That's 11 pins. I expect to make that, and I did, and I was able to settle down and throw some good shots."

Tang started the game with the front three, but after
opening in the fourth, neither player was able to put a double on the board. Pate came up in the 10th frame needing a mark and count to win.
"I threw one and thought I missed it inside, but it just laid there," said Pate of his strike in the 10th. "After that, I needed good count and got it. I didn't throw that many good shots, to be completely honest, but it was a clean game."

Pate advances to face Kyle Troup, who has already won three times on the 2020 PBA Tour.

The final match of the telecast was decided by eight
well-placed strikes by Brad Miller-four in the front of the game and four in the back. In between, Tom Daugherty caught up and passed Miller, when he chopped a three-pin spare attempt in the eighth frame. After Daugherty failed to strike in the ninth, leaving and sparing a single pin, Miller had a chance to clinch the victory.
"When I went up in the ninth frame," said Miller, brushing aside the chopped spare in the eighth, "I told myself there's no way I'm leaving a 10-pin. I'm going to get after it, be as aggressive as I possibly Continued on Page 6
