A staple of this column over the years has been not only televised bowling programming, but also about who watches. Some of the points I try to explain are the importance of how many watch, compared to other programming at the same time, that day, and that week.

The circle works like this. Network/ broadcasters get to sell their commercial time based on how many and who watches. Getting view ers with the most disposable income, mainly viewers between 18 to 49 years of age, are just as important and at times more so than the total number of viewers.

There were a handful of certainties with television viewership. NFL games often pull in the largest average view ership numbers of the week, the Super Bowl draws over 100 million viewers, making Super Bowl Sunday a unofficial national holiday.

Nielsen ratings for the PBA in the 1960's surprised ABCTV executives, thus became a staple on Saturday afternoons for decades, even airing finals on as many as three different sources in the early to mid-1980's in the same season (ABC, ESPN, NBC).

And then, life happed in the middle of $M$ arch 2020. At the conclusion of the 2020 PBA World Championship on Fox, the daily, weekly, and monthly routines everyone followed disappeared, large public gatherings and live television sports included.

Live PBA programming, the last to go, was one of the first to return and ratings have been down slightly. But wait, average viewership for all live sports has been down across the board. The PBA on Fox draws better numbers than when FS1 airs shows, but all the replays on FS1 and FS2 boost those numbers. That pattern has remained true after mid-M arch.

What we've seen the main Fox network television ratings for the PBA are strong, yet the FS1 original offerings and subsequent replays show much less average viewership.

The Strike Derby averaged a solid 776,000 on a Saturday night in June, followed an 890,000 average view ership the week after for the Summer Clash. Subsequent FS1 telecasts didn't rank high enough to be listed, usually needing a minimum of 300,000 average viewers.

Jon Lewis, founder and editor of Sports Media Watch (sportsmediawatch.com), one of the sources I check for PBA Nielsen ratings, put together a chart he first posted October 15 on Twitter showing the drop in the various live sports programming (https:// twitter.com/paulsen smw/ status/ 1316911369162̄280961).

Decreases range betw een 13 to 61 percent, with the bulk in the $40 \%$ to $50 \%$ range. The only increases were W NBA, final round of the PGA Championship, and regular PGA Tour events on CBS. Even the World Series going on at Globe Life Field in Arlington now has lower average viewership. More on that later.

Further analysis can be found on prolific sports news website The Athletic (theathletic.com), posted October 23 by writer Richard Deitsch. He invited marketing executives from ESPN, Fox, and Sports Business Journal and Sports Business Daily to comment on what they are seeing pre and post pandemic.

Some adjustments were

in place, further detailing a point made in a prior JPA Troy Walker Media Column series, outlining the separation between watching sports on demand online versus live sports on broadcast outlets.

Among the rationale was many sports with shortened seasons completing out of season, available time to watch has been squeezed, and people are just tired of life since midMarch. Unique programming ike NFL Draft on ABC and ESPN's "The Last Dance" had impressive viewership numbers.

The best thing is enough people are still finding time to watch the PBA.

 Is Still Number One}

During my conversation with Aleta Sill last week, I commented to her that I had never really spent a lot of time in Detroit because of the tremendous good health of the bowling business in Michigan. One statistic that I often referenced during my time at AMF was that Detroit had twice as many league members as Chicago, which was the second largest city league membership in the USBC!

Sill confirmed my comment by stating, "Detroit once had more than 300 bowling centers in the metropolitan area, and now it's approaching only fifty centers." A look at the Metro Detroit USBC website authenticates Aleta's quote, with only three bowling centers remaining within the city limits of Detroit, and less than 60 in the entire suburban area.

Although the population
of Detroit has fallen to only 672,662 residents, the metropolitan area still remains strong with 4,292,060 individuals. Of the remaining bowling centers, there's a total of 1,962 lane beds, or one lane for every 2,187 people. While their num bers have diminished greatly, the population to lane ratio is probably still tops among all metropolitan markets, with only Las Vegas, now highly regarded as the "new" capital of bowling, approaching the numbers presented by Detroit. A quick look at the Las Vegas market shows that there are 740 lanes in the greater metro area with a population of $2,227,053$, or one lane for every 3,009 people. Both of the numbers for Detroit and Las Vegas are much more healthy in terms of lane beds than our previous investigation of Phoenix, Los Angeles and Northern

New Jersey.
Detroit has a total of ten bowling centers with more than 50 lanes, and another 12 between 40 to 48 lanes. Las Vegas weighs in with 9 large bowling centers of more than 50 lanes. My guess is that Detroit is much more dependent on league bowlers, while Las Vegas relies more on tournament and casual bowling from casino patrons.

Last time that we talked about this subject I shared an Area Survey Form that I used to determine the viability of building a bowling center in a particular market, much to the delight and interest of both the publishers and readers. The other form that was used in regards to a market potential for new construction or purchase of an existing location was a Competitive Pricing Survey.

Taking a look at the accompanying form, which was filled out roughly 35 years ago, provides an astonishing look at the increases in league and open bowling prices... and even shoe rental! As startling as those figures look, they represent "only" a $267 \%$ increase over the time frame mentioned However, the bowling industry is not alone in this regard, as I often refer to similar increases in McDonald's prices as a comparison.

When I first visited a McDonald's (in Novato, Calif., circa the early 1970's), I can remember ordering two hamburgers ( 20 cents each), one order of french fries ( 25 cents), and a milkshake ( 30 cents)... all for less than $\$ 1$ dollar! Today the milkshake alone is more than $\$ 5.00$, and the total fee for the four items is roughly $\$ 10.50$, or over a 1,000\% increase.

What will the future hold for bowling? It's a difficult question to answer, but one thing is for sure... bowling will continue. It's a remarkable game that is so easy that anyone can do it, and yet so difficult that no one can master it on a consistent basis. Not even J ason Belmonte.
