Professional Bowlers Association Announces 2022 Guaranteed Rate PBA Tour Schedule

New York, NY – The 2022 Guaranteed Rate PBA Tour schedule was announced today, and an action-packed season awaits the world's greatest bowlers.

The 64th Professional Bowlers Association Tour's road to the PBA Playoffs begins in January with the first of 13 official events. Players will battle for titles and positioning until April when the top 16 players on the points list earn a trip to the Playoffs. Every match of the PBA Playoffs elimination bracket will be televised, with the ultimate finals match on FOX Broadcast Channel, Sunday, May 15.

Kyle Troup of Taylorsville, N.C. is the defending champion of the PBA Playoffs. Troup won a record \$496,900 in 2021, propelled by his victory at the PBA Players Championship to start the season.

Among the 13 regular season Tour events are five major



championships, each awarding \$100,000 first-place prizes, with the Playoffs winner also collecting \$100,000, for a record six events paying six-figure first prizes. In total, players will be vying for a season purse of approximately \$4 million.

All of the majors feature distinct characteristics and traditions that have defined the history of bowling:

On January 15 the PBA Players Championship once again starts things off with five

regional qualifying locations for PBA members and the finals in Euless, Texas;

In early February, the prestigious U.S. Open returns to famed Woodland Bowl in Indianapolis;

At the end of February, the PBA's signature event, the PBA Tournament of Champions, is back at historic AMF Riviera Lanes in Fairlawn, Ohio;

In March, the PBA World Championship is the main

Just Paying Attention

Last weekend began one of the first events run by the new International Bowling Federation, successor to World Bowling, headed by CEO Andrew Oram. Included in the International Bowling Federation's World Championships in Dubai was coverage by the brand new StrikeCloud live stream outlet. With cameras on every pair, StrikeCloud (available at strikecloud.com) promises total coverage, wherever a viewer would want to watch.

These are the some of the latest steps by Oram and the IBF to get bowling increased visibility in the international sports scene and eventually, the decades long quest for inclusion into the Olympic Games.

At first glance last weekend, StrikeCloud offered the latest standings from each event, live and on demand video, an area

to compete in a virtual world championship against others online, and something today's sports organizations and platforms offer, brand merchandise. The IBF World Championships conclude November 26.

There will be other features StrikeCloud will offer, according to a November 1 press release on IBF video content provider partner NAGRA's web page, including the world's first immersive coaching program, live and virtual training, all designed to provide live interaction among bowlers and viewers around the world in real time.

When I checked StrikeCloud.com, I downloaded from Google Play what was labeled an early version of the app to have a look. This version of the app had more content, including

Dave's Corner

Bowlero Purchases Famous PBA Venue

If ever there was a friend to the Professional Bowlers Association (PBA), that person would have to be Jim Wangeman, who recently

sold his Harvest Park Bowl in Brentwood, Calif., to Bowlero, the worldwide leader of bowling entertainment with more than 300 bowling centers (and counting!) In North America. The acquisition brings to 42 the number of locations operated by Bowlero in the Golden State.

When I caught up with Jim at his beautiful Discovery Bay home, he was philosophical about the sale to Bowlero. "After 53 years in the bowling industry, I decided that was enough," said the 83-year-old lifelong resident of California. "Bowlero had been after me to sell for the past three years, and I finally decided that the

time was right."

During our telephone conversation earlier this week, I learned a lot about Jim's personal life that never came up while we were both employed by American Recreation Centers (ARC) for a number of years. Wangeman began life in the eclectic neighborhood of Eagle Rock, a suburb of Los Angeles, in 1938. "I weighed only 4 pounds at birth and spent the first two months of life in an incubator," said Wangeman.

Jim's father, Otto, was recruited from Omaha, Neb., to play football for USC. "His scholarship was only \$300 per year, and included one meal per day," remembers Jim. "He was the star fullback on the team, which included a famous teammate, offensive tackle Marion Morris, who later became known as John Wayne."

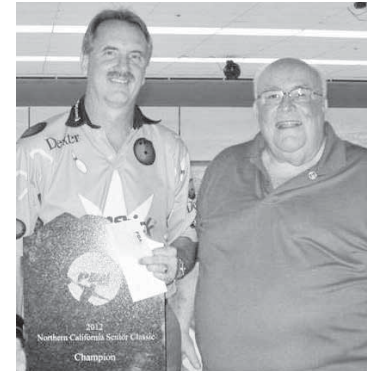
Jim's mother, Coralie, was a talented singer that realized her dream when she moved to Hollywood in the early 1930's and became a member of the popular Paul Whiteman

Orchestra. "Whiteman was known as 'The King of Jazz' in those days," said Wangeman.

In 1956 Jim elected to join the Air Force and was stationed in Merced, Calif., at the Castlewood Air Force Base. With the income provided by his enlistment, Jim was able to marry his high school sweetheart before being shipped off to Guam for a couple of years. In 1959 the Air Force returned him stateside to Riverside, Calif., where he served with the Strategic Air Command.

When his years in the military were complete, Jim went to work for Pacific Gas and Electric (PG&E), and relocated to Redwood City, Calif., touted as having the best climate in the world. With three children to support, and another one on the way, Jim decided to look for a second moonlighting job, and in 1968 became the Blue Chip Clerk at Fiesta Lanes in San Jose.

"The general manager of Fiesta Lanes unexpectedly died, and Bob Feuchter, the president

of ARC, offered me the job," said Wangeman. "I didn't want to leave the security of my position at PG&E, so my reply to him at the time was that he could not afford me." But Feuchter, an astute judge of character, offered Jim a salary equivalent to both jobs, plus a

streaming video, replays, live scoring, and news releases. Among those were stories of PBA Commissioner Tom Clark adding IBF Director of Sport and Competitions to his work duties, appointing Funk Group as the exclusive global equipment partner of ninepin bowling, and one of more eye-opening issues facing world class and other elite competitive bowling in upcoming years, string pinsetters.

In an effort to address reducing bowling’s carbon footprint with current pinsetters while providing more locations to host world class competitions, IBF partner QubicaAMF will be installing its Edge String pinsetters with next July’s 2022 World Games in Birmingham, Alabama. Originally slated for an existing center, the bowling competition will be conducted in the North Exhibition Hall of the Birmingham Jefferson Convention Complex.

String pinsetters are the latest in the historical long line of technological evolution the USBC has addressed. With the latest USBC research highlighted here in this YouTube video (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=GyeM2FwLf4>), you can see the questions and concerns about making the integrity of string pinsetters

matching that of free fall pinsetters.

The video explains a number of factors are being examined, including how string length affects pinfall, how easier or more difficult it is to strike with different string lengths, string flexibility, how string to pin anchoring system alters pin dynamics, do pins become out of spec with certain string fasteners, and how split conversion percentage changes due to string length. In one example, you’d be surprised how easy it was to pick up the 2-8-10 split.

The IBF is moving forward with string pinsetters for its preferred tournament locales for the foreseeable future, with or without USBC blessing. In a November 2020 IBF press release approving string pinsetters for its tournament play, it was a response to a United Nations call for a smaller carbon footprint in the world of sport.

“As part of honoring our commitment to the United Nations Sport for Climate Action Framework initiative, this decision was made to ensure a more environmentally and economically sustainable business option for bowling centers worldwide. The sport of bowling is not corrupted nor damaged or diminished by the inclusion of approved string centers and string technology as an additional playing field. An additional playing field will

only make the game and the sport of bowling more engaging, attractive, and challenging for bowlers and fans alike,” Oram said.

The U.N. Sports for Climate Action initiative of December 2018 asked sports leagues and associations to review their strategies for lowering carbon footprints while working toward climate neutrality. Numerous world sport organizations signed on, including the International Olympic Committee, Tokyo 2020 and Paris 2024 Summer Olympic organizers, and Federation Internationale de Football Association (FIFA).

In an interview last week with Jeff Richgels’ 11thframe.com, Oram goes into great detail about his experience as first a consultant, then as IBF CEO. With his athletic background as a world class cricket bowler, then as television producer and director, he explains the differences of presenting world sports verses pro sports to both a viewing audience and prospective sponsors, the disconnect between world sports administrators and the grandeur of world class competitive bowling and how his strategy could get bowling into the Olympics.

If successful, Oram will have solved one of the biggest mystery’s bowlers have wondered and asked out loud for decades.

bonus package.

Jim and his wife Anne decided to take the risk and join ARC. Through a series of promotions, Wangeman was eventually responsible for eleven of ARC’s properties in the San Francisco Bay Area. His dedication to the Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) also became evident throughout his years with ARC.

“I first became involved with the PBA in the late 1960’s, when ARC purchased Saratoga Lanes from the legendary Frank Thatcher,” said Wangeman. Over the course of those years with ARC, Wangeman played host to a winter tour stop with some celebrated outcomes. “No one will ever forget the event at Saratoga in which the top 16 players were all left-handed,” remembers Jim. “The next two in line were Dick Weber and Nelson Burton Jr., who were both fined for throwing back-up balls.”

"We also played host to the infamous tournament when the lights went out for 40 minutes in 1989, and the final match was shown on ABC's Wide World of Sports. And there was the time that Mark Roth picked up the 7-10 split (in 1980) at Mel's Southshore Bowl in Alameda," Jim recalls. "And who can ever forget the two 300 games that were televised, first by Johnny Guenther at Saratoga Lanes in 1968, and then by Jim Stefanich at Mel's Southshore Bowl in 1974."

Over the years, Jim was the man behind the scenes that kept ARC interested in those PBA tournaments, despite a loss of revenue for the week. It's hard to measure the impact of a professional tournament, but the way that Jim sold it to Mr. Feuchter and the Board of Directors for all of those years was something that's referred to as "image advertising."

You can't measure image advertising on the negative impact of revenue for just one week at one location, without considering the overall effect upon the entire chain of bowling centers. ARC was known as the place where the pro's bowl, and Jim was really a master at image advertising. He once convinced me to run an ad campaign on cable television where no words were spoken until the very end of the 60 second spot.

The results, along with other marketing efforts, were record revenues and profits for ARC



each successive year, culminating in 1993 when ARC sold their business to AMF. Jim and I both left American Recreation Centers that year - Jim to pursue his dream of opening his very own bowling center, Harvest Park Bowl in Brentwood; while I returned back to the east coast where I began a stretch with Nationwide Bowling Corporation for a period of 16 years.

Wangeman continued his love for the PBA when he carried on with the sponsorship of a yearly Northern California

event, after AMF concluded that it was not in their best interest at the time. Harvest Park Bowl became one of the favorite spots for the PBA50 Senior Bowlers Tour, and included wins by some of their most famous members, including Parker Bohn III, Amleto Monacelli and Walter Ray Williams Jr.

"Walter Ray paid me one of the highest compliments when he told me as long as I hosted a PBA event, he would be there, and he was true to his word," said Wangeman. "He never let me down."
