Imagine bowling a league or tournament with strings attached to bowling pins. That may be a ways off, in what used to be the Kevin Dornberger led World Bowling, now known as the International Bowling Federation (IBF), now led by CEO Andrew Oram, suggested that time may be closer than previous thought.

In an open letter released Monday November 2, Oram suggested a new direction, incorporating string bowling and a different approach to get bowling into the Olympics.

"Sport bowling has a long history, yet that history often stands in its way. I have heard for the past year from many, that the sport would have to be changed if included in

the Olympic games. This is a flawed vision. We must change to reflect the scale of bowling and the true global representation of the sport. Evidence, fact not fiction. An Olympic bid should not be a rescue strategy

for a sport. An Olympic bid should be an enhancement of a vision for success that is shared from proprietors to administrators to athletes and volunteers," Oram wrote.

Several months ago in Florida, two tournaments were held in back to back days, one with string bowling, the other with standard pins, with many name pros competing, Jason Couch, Norm Duke, and Walter Ray Williams, Jr., among them. Although it was agreed the pins fell differently, averages were within five pins one day to the next.

One proponent for string bowling for sport bowling profiled awhile back in JPA is another outstanding Australian bowler, George Frilingos, stated his agreement to me in a text message.

"I'm totally ok with it... we have an obligation to accept

IBF announced in August an exclusive agreement with QubicaAMF to be an exclusive bowling equipment provider for events, other than scheduled events at South Point Bowling Center in Las Vegas and the National Bowling Stadium in Reno

Another point Oram touched upon was the proprietor, in his view, they are overlooked in the process of hosting higher profile and elite bowler tournaments.

Sport Bowling has in the past ignored the fact that it is bowling center operators that take the financial risk by investing in the business that allows the sport to be played. It is therefore not surprising that some bowling center operators did little or nothing to encourage competitive play in their centers or would listen to suggestions from an organi-

zation, perceived to be ineffective, even though it could enhance the business. We rely totally on those that invest in the appropriate infrastructure for the practice of bowling. We must listen, engage, embrace and support them and make everyone part of the journey. Rules and regulations must compliment the foundation of the sport to allow proprietors, globally, to drive an increase in participation and footfall through their centers," Oram

added. It may not be too far down the road when national teams are bowling for medals on string pinsetters.

Friend of the column Matt McNiel found out recently about what will be certainly one of the first of several career recognitions.

In a Facebook post, McNiel

posted a copy of a letter from the Minnesota State USBC informing him of induction into its Hall of Fame.

The four-time USBC Eagle winner was selected in his first year of eligibility. MNUSBC Hall of Fame guidelines require a minimum of 15 years as a USBC member. For those geographically savvy, you may wonder why McNiel is not yet in either the Minneapolis USBC or St. Paul USBC Halls of Fame. Bother require a 20-year membership minimum.

Among all achievements for this 35-year old lefty, a couple of notes grabbed my eye and

In the 2014-15 season, McNiel had an outside shot at breaking the all-time USBC single season high average, held by former PBA tour player Jeff Carter since 2001 with 261.74 in 84 games. With two weeks to go in the season, he was at 259 plus, coming off a string of 800 series' earlier in his regular trip through his weekly league schedule. Although travel for work cut short his availability. I'm sure his ending average of 258 for 54 games would have been there for the handful of weeks needed for official consideration. He also averaged 251 in another league that season.

We all have had career seasons where everything just clicks. That 2014-15 season fea-

tured something I still consider him only the third bowler ever to win his fourth USBC Eagle before turning 30.

Although it is at tournament's end when the bowlers official age is determined, McNiel took the lead in All-Events he would never relinquish, literally days before turning 30. Only USBC Hall of Famers Therm Gibson and (Texas legend) Bill Lillard, Sr. won four eagles by that age.

His most recent assignment was providing live stream commentary for the Weber Cup in England. His photos and commentary showed his trademark style and penoche, further illustrating he is a true ambassador of the sport and will be for many years.

State. I remember spending hours looking at those cards as my grandma would reminisce about her experiences with relatives in communities such as Clio, Flint, Royal Oak, Dearborn, Detroit, Houghton Lake, Traverse City, Chelsea, Lansing, Mackinaw Čity, Ypsilanti, and even more.

I wonder if during her time in Detroit my grandma ever visited Detroit Recreation, the largest bowling center in the world when it opened in 1917. There were four floors of bowling, with 22 lanes on each floor, and 103 billiards tables spread over two floors. In an article by Dan Austin at HistoricDetroit.org, the seven story structure was hailed as "the greatest recreational temple in the world," according to the **Detroit Chamber of Commerce.**

Austin went on to say that the ground floor contained a number of shops, including a shoeshine, drugstore, laundry, lunch counter and a hat shop. In a slogan that is eerily similar to Main Event's "Eat-Bowl-Play" in the 21st century, the motto at Detroit Recreation was

"Eat-Smoke-Shave-Rest-Play," as stated by The Detroiter Magazine.

Before Detroit Recreation opened, bowling was considered a man's game, but within a few months of its opening, a floor of alleys was set aside for women, and the Detroit Women's Bowling Association was formed in 1918," said Austin. By 1942 there were 89 bowling centers in the city of Detroit, a number that would later grow to more than 300 in the greater metropolitan area.

As more and more factories closed and newer facilities opened in the suburbs (with adjacent parking lots), Detroit Recreation continued to suffer from a decline in league business, but not before it set the stage for many changes in the sport, including the integration of women and african american bowlers into organized league



ARLINGTON, Texas - The **United States Bowling Congress** affirms string pinsetters currently are considered non-approved equipment. String pinsetters may not be used in USBC-certified competition, including USBC-certified leagues and tournaments.

USBC is clarifying its position related to string pinsetters following the recent announcement from the International **Bowling Federation, stating** it will allow the use of the machines in IBF competition.

Currently, there is no empirical data for USBC to determine exactly what additional variables string pinsetters may present related to equipment specifications and standards," **USBC** Executive Director Chad Murphy said. "USBC cannot take a position related to string pinsetter certification until objective research on the subject is conducted, published and properly analyzed.'

USBC Affirms String Pinsetters are Non-approved Equipment

USBC is in the process of conducting research related to string pinsetters. USBC plans to complete an initial phase of the study and publish the results in 2022. However, the results may

or may not provide conclusive data to support a position on string pinsetter certification.
