

Bill O'Neill Wins PBA Playoffs for 13th Title and \$100,000

Centreville, Va.—Bill O'Neill claimed the final title of the 2020 PBA Tour season by defeating Anthony Simonsen in two straight games to win the 2020 PBA Playoffs.

O'Neill's 13th career PBA Tour title and second of the season earned him a \$100,000 first-prize check and an official

WWE championship title.

O'Neill, who finished second in last year's PBA Playoffs, was especially gratified to earn the title this season.

"A lot of redemption," said O'Neill, the overall number two seed. "I didn't want to come in second again in this event. I was confident in my ball reaction and I knew if I made

good shots, I was going to come away with the win."

The championship match featured a race-to-two-points format in which one point was awarded to the winner of each game. If tied after two games, the players would go to a ninth-and-10th-frame roll-off, but O'Neill didn't let that happen. He secured a 235-203 win in game one, then claimed the championship with a 249-195 triumph in game two.

"The back half of game two was some of the best bowling I've done in a long time," said O'Neill, who rolled eight consecutive strikes to finish the second and decisive game.

O'Neill made an adjustment during his quarterfinals match that helped him feel comfortable throughout the rest of the

2021 USBC Women's Championships Moving to Reno, 2022 Event Heading to Chicagoland Area

ARLINGTON, Texas - The 2021 United States Bowling Congress Women's Championships now will be hosted by the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nevada.

The 2021 event previously was scheduled to take place

at Stardust Bowl in Addison, Illinois, while the 2022 tournament was slated for Reno and the NBS.

Agreements between USBC and the Reno-Sparks Convention and Visitors Authority (RSCVA), DuPage Convention

There's an Argument to be Made for South Point Casino

When I first started accumulating names of bowling centers from throughout the world with 80 or more lanes a few weeks ago, there may have been a huge exception that I missed in Las Vegas. It's not entirely my fault because the South Point Casino appeared to have two different bowling centers, one with 64 lanes (South Point Bowling Center) and another with 60 lanes (South Point Bowling Plaza).

Although I spent a fair amount of my early career with AMF in Las Vegas, I have not been back to visit since 1993. There have been a vast number of changes in Las Vegas in the past 27 years, including the

construction of many mega bowling centers, mostly in the 50 to 70 lane size. What caught my eye was the fact that South Point Bowling Center (64 lanes) and the South Point Bowling Plaza (60 lanes) shared the same address.

"We have two bowling

event.

"I moved back on the approach about six inches and it gave me a little bit more time," said O'Neill. "If I got a little too quick to start, I wasn't cramped at the foul line, and even the shots that were just a pinch out of time were still going in the right direction."

O'Neill put himself into the title match for the second straight year with a 235-216 quarterfinals victory over the seventh seed Kyle Troup and a 245-216 win against 14th seed Tom Smallwood in the semifinals. The title is O'Neill's fourth in the last two seasons.

"It's been unbelievable the last couple years," he said. "I certainly didn't expect to have the success I've had. I knew I was going to get back into the winner's circle, but I didn't expect all this. I owe so much

of it to my dad who put in so much work with me and really knows my game in and out. He's the one who got me ready for this event."

Simonsen, the fourth overall seed, earned his way into the championship match by eliminating defending champion Kris Prather, 270-195, in the quarterfinals, then knocked out top seed Jason Belmonte, 285-214, in the semifinals. This was Simonsen's fourth runner-up finish in 2020 and the first time since 2015 that Simonsen did not win at least one title.

In the other quarterfinals matches, Belmonte bested Francois Lavoie, 266-227, and Smallwood ended Brad Miller's run, 242-194.

As a tournament-only venue, the National Bowling Stadium has the capacity to handle an extension of tournament dates if public health concerns with COVID-19 continue into 2021.

"We appreciate our partners at the RSCVA, DCVB and Stardust Bowl working together to make this switch possible for the 2021 and 2022 Women's Championships," USBC Executive Director Chad Murphy said.

"Returning to the Midwest has been a priority for us, though, so we're excited to be able to bring the tradition and history of the Women's Championships to Stardust Bowl and DuPage County in 2022."

Reno and the National Bowling Stadium share a long history with the Women's Championships, with the 2021 event marking the tournament's 12th visit to the city and ninth appearance at the famed and newly remodeled venue.

The 2020 USBC Open Championships originally was scheduled to be held in Reno's 78-lane facility prior to being canceled in July due to the pandemic.

The NBS had undergone a \$4.5 million renovation leading up to the 2020 Open Championships, including the removal of stadium seating, an expanded settee area and new furnishings across the fourth floor of the venue.

"The entire Reno-Tahoe community is honored to welcome the USBC Women's Championships back to the National Bowling Stadium for the first major tournament at the NBS since its recent \$4.5 million transformation," RSCVA Interim President and CEO Jennifer Cunningham said. "It feels very symbolic that the ladies will be the first to bowl at the all-new facility. I think we're all excited for a fresh start."

The DuPage Convention and Visitors Bureau worked with Stardust Bowl to submit a Request for Proposal (RFP) to host the Women's Championships and was selected by USBC in 2017 to host the event in 2021.

The Women's Championships will be making its first visit to the Chicagoland area in more than 85 years. Chicago hosted the tournament in 1920 and 1935.

"DuPage County has enjoyed a long legacy of hosting championship tournaments, and we are delighted to welcome the USBC Women's Championships in 2022," DuPage Convention and Visitors Bureau Executive Director Beth Marchetti said. "With only a handful of large venues in the United States able to accommodate a national event of this size, Stardust Bowl in the Village of Addison stands ready to welcome nearly 30,000

guests. Discover DuPage and the DuPage Sports Commission have been planning this event for years, and we will be ready to invite the bowlers and their families to visit our charming communities."

Stardust Bowl is the largest bowling center in Illinois, featuring 84 lanes. It has hosted several national events, including the 2016 U.S. Women's Open and 2015 Junior Gold Championships. The center also has hosted the Intercollegiate Team Championships and Intercollegiate Singles Championships sectional events many times.

for a vast number of Sweeper Leagues that would converge upon the center every weekend.

Monyak returned to Tacoma in 1989 to care for his father before he passed away. He was then approached by a friend to return to Las Vegas and help him with a pro shop operation at the Gold Coast Bowling Center. After Mike made the move back to Las Vegas, another opportunity opened up with the construction of the Silver Nugget Bowling Lanes, a facility that essentially took the place of New College Park Bowl that had been razed a few years earlier.

Following the successful opening of the Silver Nugget project, an entrepreneur in the bowling industry, Michael Gaughan, began to take notice of Monyak and offered him a job to come and work for the Orleans, a powerhouse in the Las Vegas marketplace with multiple bowling locations. "That was in 1994, and not long after that Gaughan sold all of his stock and purchased the South Point Casino from the Orleans chain," added Mike.

"I came with the package," said Mike, who has been the Director of Bowling Operations at South Point since 1999, and an employee of the conglomerate since 1994.

We now have a new leader in the currently operating largest bowling centers in the world, with the South Point Bowling Properties overtaking Inazawa Grand Bowl in Inazawa City, Japan, with 116 lanes, although we will have to preface South Point with a footnote regarding the two separate sections within the same building. It should also be noted that the Tokyo World Bowling Center in Tokyo, Japan, with 512 lanes, reportedly had multiple sections of lanes that might have been housed in separate buildings.

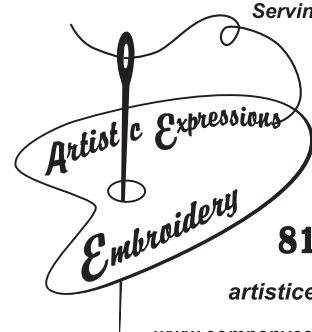


