Derek Williams Wins PBA50 Beaumont Southwest Open

Beaumont, Texas, (December 3, 2019) – Former PBA member Derek Williams from Groves, Texas, shot 256 the first game of the tournament and continued to out-score the field as he held the lead after each round of the PBA50 Beaumont Southwest Open at Crossroads Bowling Center Sunday, coasting to his first PBA50 Region victory.

Williams, who recorded his eighth overall PBA Regional victory and his fourth win in Beaumont, held a 120-pin lead going into the eight-game round robin finals where he won five of his eight matches to build his margin of victory to 220 pins over PBA Southwest Region Hall of Famer, Rick Lawrence from Waxahachie, Texas. Williams collected the \$2,500 first place check.

Lawrence won \$1,400 for second place as 2018 Beaumont winner Mike Bailey of Irving, Texas, finished third for \$950, and Paul McCordic from Sugarland, Texas, collected \$750 for fourth place.

The PBA Southwest Region's final event in 2019 will be the PBA/PBA50 Houston Southwest Doubles presented by Mike Austin's Bowling Dynamix at Emerald Bowl in Houston, December 20-22.

PWBA to Kick off 2020 Regional Schedule in January with 10 Events

ARLINGTON, Texas – The Professional Women's Bowling Association Regional program will hold a minimum of 10 events during the 2020 season, highlighted by six regionals conducted in conjunction with 2020 PWBA Tour stops, and the top 10 regional players will earn a season-end bonus as part of the BowlTV PWBA Regional Cup.

The PWBA Sarasota Re-

The PWBA Sarasota Regional, set for Jan. 18, 2020, at Sarasota Lanes in Sarasota, Florida, is the first of four PWBA Regional tournaments that will be held prior to the start of the 2020 PWBA Tour.

"The addition of PWBA Regional events to the offseason calendar was a high priority to encourage more athletes to experience PWBA competition," said PWBA Director of Operations Tennelle Milligan. "It is important to provide high-level



competitions to women bowlers throughout the year and to offer a starting point for those who want to compete on the PWBA Tour."

The BowlTV PWBA Regional Cup will award season-ending bonuses to the top 10 players, based on points earned in all regional events. The highest points-earner will receive a \$3,500 bonus, while 10th place in points will earn \$500. The total prize fund for the Regional Cup is \$13,000.

All PWBA Regionals are one-day events. The off-season tournaments will take place on either Saturday or Sunday, while the tournaments held

Back by popular demand in this column is a regular feature new projects and displays at The International Bowling Hall of Fame and Museum on the **Bowling Campus in Arlington. Curator and Program Manager** Kari Smith, who took over for Jessica Bell earlier this year, give us her first JPA update into preparations for the PBA Hall of Fame Classic in January and new displays for 2020.

JPA: Thanks for taking time out of your busy schedule, especially at this time of year, to update us on the latest at IBMHoF. Since this is your first

time in this column, go ahead and introduce yourself.

Kari Smith: I am the Curator/Program Manager at the IBMHOF. Previously I was Group Tour Director/Gift Shop Manager for four years, focusing on day to day operations like tours, admission sales, and event coordination. This is my first year as Curator, although in past museums I have had curatorial roles.

JPA: The biggest project over the last few years was planning and opening an online display. What has been the response

Smith: With the support of BPAA, the Bowling Virtual Vault was launched in August and we've gotten a lot of interest so far. For those that don't know. like most museums. a significant amount of the permanent collection cannot be displayed in the museum because of space constraints, etc. One way museums combat that is by creating an online collection, which is exactly what The Vault is. Through this virtual collection, we are able to display items that have never before been seen and is a practical way to serve a

wider audience that is unable to visit our physical locations in Arlington or Reno. Even just during this soft opening stage, there's been many inquiries pouring into my inbox looking for further information into specific items on the site. It's been a lot of fun to speak with people so deeply interested in our sport's history

JPA: What will be the theme of the next display at the National Bowling Stadium in

Smith: The theme of this year's display at the National **Bowling Stadium is Varieties of** Bowling. We have cases on ancient forms of bowling, quilles de neuf, candlepin, duckpin, and nine-pin. There are also cases on Bowling Fashion, Cartoons, Toys, Olympics, Scoring, History of ABC, Youth, Science & Technology and the like, so there's a little bit for everyone. We've done the install, but the building won't be open after the larger building renovations are completed in 2020 so stay tuned!

JPA: What film and video pieces have been the latest to be restored in the Frame4Frame

Smith: So far this year we have digitized just over 205,000 feet of film. To name a few pieces: footage from the 16th **Annual Masters Tournament** of ABC from 1966, a narrated feature called "America Bowls" that includes demonstrations from major bowlers from the 1950's, some B-Roll of President Richard Nixon bowling at the White House, Andy Varipapa appearing on "What's My Line" (1957-1961). If you're wondering if they guessed what his occupation, they couldn't figure it out! We are selecting items based on those at highest risk for unsalvageable degradation, and we still have a long way to go, some estimates put us at 1.5 million feet of film for our entire film-reel collection.

JPA: The second year of the

PBA Hall of Fame Classic is approaching, involving understandably a great deal of time. What new things can bowling fans and participants expect to see at the Museum for this year's tournament?

JPA: We are looking forward to improving on last year's PBA Hall of Fame Classic, which will be hard to top but we are up to the challenge. The Classic will kick off on January 13th and end with the televised event on Sunday, January 19th on Fox Sports 1. Before the induction ceremony on Saturday. the Museum is hosting a PBA **HOF Class of 2020 Inductee** exhibition opening, which will be open to the public the following day on Sunday and open through May. This year we are adding a silent auction to our booth at the tournament. We will be auctioning historical bowling keepsakes not in the collection, with all the proceeds going back to the museum.

JPA: Jessica said last year the new interactive portion of the Museum was going over very well. Are there any plans expand it?

Smith: We are always looking for new ways to expand hands-on experiences in the museum. For example, over the past couple of months we have upgraded some television monitors in the museum, and we are in the concept phase of developing a new Science and Technology Exhibition that will be more interactive.

JPA: What's in the pipeline for new displays, whether be in in the Museum, online, and remote locations like The Stadium in Reno or the USBC Women's Championships?

Smith: In addition to the PBA HOF Class of 2020 Exhibition, in March, I have planned a new exhibition for the USBC Open and fortunately in 2020 we will have a display at the Women's Championships as well. I just took a trip to Reno to refresh the exhibition space we have at the National Bowling Stadium, and that will be on view starting next year when the building is set to reopen.

JPA: What have been some of the pleasant surprises you've Continued on Page 7






