EULESS, Texas - AMF Bowlero Euless was recently the host for the annual Texas State USBC Masters and Bluebonnet Queens Tournament on February 22-23. A "Classic" tournament by every stretch of the imagination, brings the elite of Texas bowlers to a grueling

competition of skill, nerves, and stamina.

This year's Masters fielded 107 entries for a total prize fund of \$16,450.00, while the ladies drew 64 entries paying out \$10,000.00. Contestants spent Saturday qualifying, tossing over eight games across the house to place 18 semifinalists for the men and 16 for the ladies. Qualifiers continued Sunday morning with another four games to place the top ten, who then continued on to match play.

Winners for the ladies and men had quite a bit in common. Both finished first after qualifying, first after semis, won each of their ten matches, and carried off the top prize when the dust settled. Joe Findling of Forney topped the field by a wide margin over Mike Bailey, Chris Hibbitts, Jacob Heger, and Brian Hoffman. Diana Zavjalova of Austin did the same against Stephanie Schwartz, Stefanie Johnson, Genie Franklin, and Heather Jones.

Sweden's Jesper Svensson Wins Go Bowling PBA Indianapolis **Open for 9th Career Tour Title**

INDIĂNAPOLIS (Feb. 29, 2020) - Top seed Jesper Svensson of Sweden beat No. 2 seed Shawn Maldonado of Houston, 245-226, in the title match Saturday night to win the Go Bowling PBA Indianapolis Open at Royal Pin Woodland for his first win of the season and ninth of his career.

Down by one pin in the fourth frame, the 25-year-old Svensson was able to take command in the match when he threw five consecutive strikes from the fifth through ninth frames. On his first ball of the 10th frame he left the 2-4-5 but made the spare to clinch the

again? It sure feels like it. Watching the shows lately, there is one thing that sticks out, the audience. The crowd seems to be large at each venue, and they are really into it. Even in the most recent show from last Saturday night in Indianapolis, the crowd was boisterous and you could hear a lot of chatter from the audience.

When that happens, it raises the excitement level for the viewer as well...at least it does for me. It makes me feel like I am watching a real sporting event, which I am, and that's good for bowling.

One thing I'm not sure about is the blue oil or colored oil. I hear a lot of players and media alike mention how important it is that the sport of bowling be able to show the invisible challenges that bowlers face.

From a visual standpoint, I do like the way it looks on TV, but I don't see that it shows the "pattern" or "where to play'

clearly at all. The TV guys rarely reference the colored oil and if it has any bearing on "showing" the players the adjustments they need to make. This enhancement has little value in showing the viewer any true picture of what the bowlers are up against in my opinion. It only shows them that there is "something" out there that bowlers are battling...in addition to the pins and their opponent that is!

X-X-X-X-X Local stud, Anthony Simonsen, has had the hot hand of late, he led the US Open, ultimately falling to Jason Belmonte in the finale, then finished 4th in Indianapolis last week, and qualified 3rd for the Roth/Holman doubles, to be aired this coming Sunday. He's also second in average at 218.8 for the six events.

From an earnings standpoint, the PBA tour is off to a great start through the first six tournaments. Two players have already earned over \$100k, Bill O'Neill and Kris Prather, and six other players have made more than \$40k. Last year, there were 26 players that made over \$40K for the entire season, 27 events, and eight made over \$100K.

It will be interesting to see how it turns out this year with so much more money put in by Bowlero, let's see these great players get paid.

ARLINGTON, Texas - The sectional assignments for the 2020 Intercollegiate Team Championships were announced Wednesday.


The sectional qualifiers will take place March 14-15 at four locations – 30 Strikes in Stratford, New Jersey; Smyrna Bowling Center in Smyrna, Tennessee; Stardust Bowl in Addison, Illinois; and USA Bowl in Dallas.

The top four men's and top four women's teams from each sectional will advance to the ITC, which will be held April 15-18 at Spectrum Lanes in

Wyoming, Michigan.
The Wichita State men and women each finished the 2019-2020 United States Bowling Congress Collegiate season as the top-ranked teams in their respective divisions and will be headed to USA Bowl in Dallas in search of adding another Helmer Cup to the school's storied history.

Each program claimed first-place ranking points at two Tier I events during the regular season, and the Shockers' men's team also won the bracket at the Glenn Carlson Las Vegas Invitational.

Webber International, the defending men's ITC champion, will be heading to Stratford. Robert Morris-Illinois, the 2019 women's ITC champion, will begin their title defense in

"You'd rather get a strike for the win, but I'll take the spare," Svensson said. "I didn't have any splits and didn't miss any spares so overall it was a good game to win."

It was Svensson's first win since the 2019 PBA/WBT Thailand Open and his first win on television since the 2017 PBA Cheetah Championship. The Indianapolis Open was televised live on FS1.

"I've been bowling well but just feel like I haven't been rewarded for it," said Svensson, who won the 2016 PBA Tournament of Champions at age 20 to become the youngest to win that major. "I'm constantly working on my game and sometimes it's the small things that can make the biggest differences.

"I'm working hard to improve my game to be a more versatile player so when there's a week when you can play to your strength you can take advantage of that opportunity,' he added. "It takes more than being good at one thing and that's especially true when you're bowling on the dual (lane condition) patterns."



Sports television viewership numbers have been falling in the month of February for a handful of major sports television staples. According to SportsMediaWatch.com and showbuzzdaily.com, since its first week with pretty good ratings the weekend after the Super Bowl, XFL viewership dropped each week. The second most popular sports league in this country, the NBA, has been down nearly double digit percentages in viewership all season. PGA, NCAA Men's Basketball are also down, although late March may be a truer viewership indicator as the NCAA National Tournament begins March 19 and the

Masters starts April 9. Although NASCAR viewership on Fox for the February 23 Las Vegas race was up over the 2019 same date race, its overall numbers have also been down the last few years.

OK, I hope you're sitting down for this news flash. Only one professional sports organization has seen rising television viewership ratings the last several years. For those of you scoring at home and regular readers of this column have read numerous times, more viewers are tuning in to PBA telecasts on Fox; viewership numbers we have not reached in a number of years.

According to Nielsen viewership and ratings numbers on showbuzzdaily.com, live and same day average viewership was 1,146,000 (322,000) on Fox February 23 for the U.S. Open, 541,000 (135,000) on FS1 February 16 watching the Players Championship, and 1,464,000 (476,000) for the Tournament of

Champions on Fox February 9.

Since the beginning of television, part of a successful ratings formula has been lead in programming. Part of the success for ABC-TV's "Wide World of Sports" in the 1960's was its lead in program, "Pro Bowlers Tour." PBT also had its own lead in programming, often college basketball.
The PBA On Fox or FS1 had

its own lead in programming the last several weeks. Opening week of the XFL was on before the ToC with an average viewership of 3.3 million,

A NASCAR Infinity Series race on FS1 averaged 1.8 million viewers before the Players Championship February 15, and the WKC Dog Show ratings February 23 are unknown, perhaps a too low to be reported publicly.

Was the growing strength of the PBA brand able to draw the million plus number without a strong lead in program? I think so, but for more proof, look at the advertisers.

Another huge plus has been larger number of the key 18 to 49 year old viewers, the numbers a majority of advertisers look to reach. That's the number in parenthesis beside the total number of viewers. So exactly who is trying to reach that group with its commercials? Higher ratings and

average viewership are nice, but this is one of the ripple effects of those higher numbers.

As a JPA exclusive, here's a look at what we saw in all eight of the four and a half minute U.S Open original live telecast commercial breaks to see who is wanting to reach the PBA's 18 to 49 year old viewers.

For most of the breaks, the first two and a half minutes were national spots, the last were network promos or local commercials. We saw Jack Daniels, 2020 Census, Kit Kat candy bars, Listerine, TGIFridays, Coors Light, AllState, Lowe's, McDonald's, Turbo Tax, 5 Hour Energy, Home Depot, State Farm, Sketchers, XYZal Allergy, Outback Steakhouse, PayDay candy bars, H&R Block, Golden Corral, Reese's, and AsperCreme commercials. Among those airing twice were AllState, Outback, Jack Daniels, TGIFridays, and Listerine.

Digest that for a moment. Notice how many products are geared to a younger audience? Yes, more than a few. From last year's ratings success, advertisers took notice and placed ads with programming drawing anywhere from a quarter to a third of its audience in the key 18 to 49 age demographic. As slight as it may seem on the surface, advertisers are well

Grimm struck out to finish the game with 279, while the rest of the teammates all entered the final frame with a shot at perfection.

Gregg Getzlow tossed a 10th strike before a 9 pin ended his bid for 300. He finished with 289. Ron Testa then notched the team's first 300, and Grimm threw his final three strikes.

Tom Shucart's perfect game then left anchor Mark Hood needing to knock down eight or more pins on his first shot, and deliver a mark, for a chance at the record. Hood, the lone left-hander of the group, struck on his first offering and left a 6 pin on his second shot. He made the spare for a 289 game.

"The more we've had a chance to bowl together since I put this team together a few years ago, the better the chemistry has become, and it helps that everyone is really positive, too," said Testa, the team's captain. "Things have been coming together for us over the last few weeks, and it has been a lot of fun for us lately. There have been nights where we bowled this well but didn't score as well, but that's our sport. We got the carry and some breaks last night, and it all fell into place."

The record is unofficial until the required paperwork has been filed and verified

aware of what new markets are reachable. For the first time in many a moon, the PBA on Fox and FS1 have opened up a new market. In an industry losing younger viewers across the board, the PBA is a welcome oasis for advertisers often seen on primetime and other highly rated programming, and now the The Association could be considered on the cutting edge in this changing media environment.

Didn't see those ads on PBA telecasts in the last ten years on ESPN, did we?

And the lead in program for NASCAR Las Vegas race on Sunday February 23 on Fox averaging 5.5 million viewers was, wait for it, the U.S. Open, which according to the PBA Spare Shots you have seen or will see elsewhere in TBN, spiked to a couple thousand viewers shy of two million, a number not seen since the Saturday afternoons on ABC-TV in the early 1990's.

Although it's a FS1 broadcast week, I and many others are curious about the PBA India-

by USBC. The previous mark of 1,434, also rolled in the St. Louis area, was posted by Buckets on Deck in November 2011.

This year marks Shelter Insurance's third season together in the top-tier 18-team league, though they have been bowling with and against each other locally for decades. They also spent some time testing their skills in Professional Bowlers Association competition over the years.

Åt 53, Grimm is the youngest member of the team, Hood is 58, Testa is 60, Shucart is 61 and Getzlow will turn 62 on Sunday.

There were some aches and pains and learning curves for the team in getting comfortable at the 32-lane center and getting in rhythm, but it's something they planned for with a roster that has included as many as 10 players.

Now, they're all healthy and sharp, and the consistent lineup and bowling order have allowed their strengths and personalities to shine.

"This is a big-time money league, and we knew going in it was going to be pretty competitive," Testa said. "But, there's no defense in this sport. No matter how old you are, the goal simply is to out-strike the other guy. We may be older, but we still love it and still have a lot to prove.'

Even though Grimm had the lowest game in the monumental performance Friday and lost his point to opponent Bryan Jones, who shot 300, the effort

did earn Grimm a second spot in the USBC record book for the highest "low game" in a five-player game.

Four players, all from the same area, previously shared the record with 278.

The list includes Connor Druhm of St. Peters, Missouri, who was a member of Buckets on Deck. and Jim Hankemever. LeRoy Bornhop and Randy Lightfoot of St. Charles, Missouri, who were O.T. Hill's team that shot 1,413 in St. Charles in February 2001.

"It's great to have our names associated with those guys, and it just goes to show you what a great bowling tradition there is in this area," Testa said. "That says the players that came before us paved the way and bred the players here today. They taught us how to play and act. They helped create a really competitive environment, and what we have today is a direct result of their success, going back many, many years.'

The momentum of the record start carried into Shelter Insurance's second game Friday night, but the team did not end up making a run at the highest five-player team series in USBC history, a 3,986 mark owned by The Bj's, also from St. Louis, on March 10, 2016.

Shelter Insurance added games of 1,233 and 1,099 for a 3,789 total.

Testa led the effort with a 791 series and was followed by Hood (769), Getzlow (754), Grimm (743) and Shucart (732).

Regardless of the way the

Remember how shocked, surprised, and stunned our little corner of the world was when the International Olympic Committee (IOC) announced bowling would not be included in the 2020 Tokyo Games several years ago? Perhaps it was a small blessing in disguise.

According to a February 25 Associated Press item, the IOC has until the end of May before deciding whether to cancel the 2020 Summer Games due to the coronavirus outbreak.

Canadian IOC member and current chairman of Olympic **Broadcast Services Dick Pound** was quoted as saying if action is taken, cancellation is more likely rather than a postponement. Although the COVID-19 coronavirus has been less severe in Japan, claiming only four deaths and hundreds of cases, the virus continues to

spread through China and has been reported in South Korea, the Middle East, Europe, and in the U.S.

The IOC and Tokyo Games organizers have been consulting the World Health Organization and are confident the Games will take place as scheduled in late July. Also according to Pound, another factor favoring cancellation is the competition schedule of all the other sports. Although the two to three week window to conduct the Games is known years in advance, shuffling the other suppliers and support schedules to a different time would be prohibitive.

Railroad Track Bowling

I wish there was a formula or correlation we could use for this, like crossing X number of boards on the lane means you should walk Q number of boards in that direction. Alas, there is no such formula.

Try this: Without a ball in your hand and without looking down at your feet, stand wherever you need to on the approach to feel you could throw a shot which crosses 15 at the arrows and gets to the 2nd board a couple of feet past the arrows.

Want to read that again? 15 at the arrows to the 2nd board two feet past the arrows. Pretty steep angle, huh? Ignore the fact that the ball will go in the ditch. This is only an alignment exercise to help you more clearly see the railroad track effect of walking parallel to your intended ball path. In order to execute this shot, you would

have to be on the approach of the lane to your left, launching the channel.

Now let's change your ball path. On this shot, you're still going to target 15 at the arrows but you don't want to get to the 2nd board until the ball is halfway down the lane. You can see that even though this angle is less severe, you'd still need to be standing in a weird place, about the middle of the ball return for a righty, to hit these two reference points (15th board at the arrows and the 2nd board at 30 feet).

Again, let's change the ball path. This time you again want to hit 15 at the arrows but you don't want the ball to get to the 2nd board until it is much farther down the lane, say 45 feet or so. Ahhh, back on your own approach. In fact, you can be right of 35 with your feet!

All three of these shots played from 15 to 2. You

can see that what is critical about alignment is when you intended the ball to get to the 2nd board. You can see there are different angles to be played from a single target and how proper body alignment can make the shot look doable and even easy. It also shows you the importance of seeing a path in your mind so that you can get your body aligned to execute that visualization.

Once you have your feet where you think they need to be, slowly rotate your shoulders and hips until you feel like you would miss right and then rotate enough to feel like you'd miss left, all without moving your feet. Somewhere in between is the correct body alignment. Notice you have not changed your target, only the way you cross it. You hit the 15th board on each shot, but the ball traveled three very different directions after it hit the target.

PBA Spare Shots

THURSDAY IS KEY DAY
IN SETTING UP 2020 PBA
LEAGUE DRAFT POOL

While PBA players continue to earn as many competition points as possible during this week's Go Bowling Indianapolis Open and Mark Roth-Marshall Holman PBA Doubles Championship, the 2020 PBA League Draft also is looming with next Thursday being a key day in setting up this year's league draft pool.

Players hoping to become eligible for the 2020 PBA League Draft have this week in Indy and the qualifying rounds of the PBA World Series of Bowling XI to compile points, but Thursday, March 5, is the deadline for the eight existing PBA League managers to decide which of their 2019 rostered players they want to "protect" for 2020. Each manager can retain up to three players from last season's roster.

The players not protected will be returned to the PBAL draft pool. Assuming each team returns two players to the draft, that will mean 16 spots available to join teams this year. And thanks to the expansion of the PBA League from eight to 10 teams, another 10 players will get a chance to participate when the league's Elias Cup competition returns to Bayside Bowl in Portland, Maine, July 20.23

After Thursday's protected players are announced, the draft picture will be a lot clearer. The PBAL Draft will take place on Sunday, March 15

at 4:30 p.m. Eastern/1:30 p.m. Pacific at South Point Bowling Plaza in Las Vegas, the host center for PBA World Series of Bowling XI. The list of eligible players will be published on March 13

ALMOST 2 MILLION FOX VIEWERS WATCHED BELMO'S HISTORIC U.S. OPEN WIN

FOX Sports has confirmed that Sunday's live U.S. Open telecast was watched by an average of 1,146,000 viewers over the two hours of coverage, an impressive 17 percent increase over the February 2019 audience average for FOX Sports/PBA telecasts.

In addition, viewership spiked to 1.97 million during the finals when Australia's Jason Belmonte made PBA history, defeating top qualifier Anthony Simonsen, 226-201, for his record 12th major championship as well as completing the PBA Triple Crown, Grand Slam and Super Slam.

NO SURPRISE: BELMO JUMPS INTO 2020 PBA PLAYOFFS POINTS LEAD

After top-five finishes in each of the past three tournaments – all Tier 1 major championships in the PBA competition points structure – Jason Belmonte has assumed the lead in the 2020 Go Bowling PBA Tour points race as it heads toward the second annual PBA Playoffs.

Belmonte picked up 7,500 points for his historic U.S. Open win, following a third-place finish in the PBA Players Championship and a fourth-place finish in the PBA Tournament of Champions, to boost his total for the year to 17,195 points, overtaking previous leader Bill O'Neill of Langhorne, Pa. Defending PBA Playoffs champion

Kris Prather slipped to third place after six of 13 events.

Belmonte was the points leader for the inaugural PBA Playoffs in 2019, but was eliminated in the "race to two points" quarterfinal round by Prather, 197-165, 224-214.


